13 September 1945.

DIARY OF CAPT ENSING (DUTCH) OF FUKUOKA CAMP NO. 1.

1942. 8th. March. Surrender of N.E.I. . Was posted at MALANG, East Java.
- April 13th. Was prisoner of war in Emma School in Malang. 200 P.O.W. (only officers) in the camp.
- Sept. 7th. Was moved to X depot battalion in Malang. Camp Cdr. Lt. Col Drost.
1943. Feb. 2nd. Was moved to Batavia, camp in X Battalion , with 25 officers and 450 men . Total strength of camp 3000 P.O.W.
- March 31st. 7 Doctors (myself included) and 1 Apothecary were moved to Glodak Prison at Batavia . Total strength 1000 P.O.W. (Ambonese and Menadonese).
- April 9th. All prisoners of Glodak Prison were moved to X battalion camp in Batavia.
- July 7th. I was moved to Engineers Camp at Tjemahi (Java). Total strength in camp 500 P.O.W. (150 Dutch and 350 Englishmen) . Then to camp of IV and IX Batalion Infantry at Tjemahi . Total strength 3000 P.O.W. . Camp Cdr. Lt. Col. of Dutch Marines.
- August 31st. Back to X Batalion camp in Batavia and made ready for sea transport. (3000 men from Tjemahi).
- Sept. 10th. Embarked on the "Van Waerwijk" . Strength 500 men (150 Dutch and 350 English) Camp Cdt. Capt Williams British Army and Cdt Dutch group was Res Lt of Marines Strybosch.
- Sept. 14th. Arrived at Singapore and moved to Changi camp.
- Sept. 20th. Embarked on "Ussuri Maru" . Strength 500 men (same group and Commandants) . Passed Manila and Takao (Taiwan).
- Oct. 12th Arrived at Moji (Kyushu). Dutch group (Lt. Strybosch camp cdt.) left for Kudamatsu (Hondo)
1944. June. 4th. Dutch group moved to Fukuoka camp No. 1. for making Aerodrome.
1945. Jan. 10th. Fukuoka camp No. 1. was moved closer to Fukuoka City upon completion of A/D. Strength then 200 Am., 400 British, and 150 Dutch. Lt. Col Saunders Senior officer (British Army).
- June 20th. Lt. Strybosch left for Korea and I took the command of the Dutch group.
- Sept. 13th. Evacuated to Nagasaki by train.

Note 1 : Lt. Stryker (Dutch Commandant Fukuoka Camp No 1) was sent to Korea, approximately on 20 June 1945.

Note 2 : Records of all persons deceased during the period 6 June 44 to 13 Sept 45 were left behind in Fukuoka Camp No 1. Search will be made from this side. The total of the deceased were 150 (different nationalities) One copy of the list should be in hands of the Japanese Camp Commander, Capt. Yeshii.

Note 3 : Some days before the evacuation of Fukuoka Camp No 1 about 64 personnel (Am., Eng., Aust. & 8 Dutch) ~~were~~ left by two Americans Catalinas for Okinawa. Records of evacuees left behind in Camp.

Note 4 : This Camp was not visited by a Recovery Team for evacuation. The Camp Commandant (Dutch) Capt. Ensing left above mentioned records because of necessity of leaving in a hurry.
