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



TO THE OFFICERS AND MEN OF THE FILIPINO SCOUTS, XITH DIVISION.

The Japanese Forces are well aware that you are attempting to continue hostilities in the mountain regions behind their backs.

If you do not cease these hostile acts immediately and surrender, the full might of the Japanese Forces will burst over your heads and you will be completely annihilated.

The whole situation is completely clear. You have not the slightest chance. Isolated actions on your part will not make the slightest difference in the outcome of these hostilities.

Surrender immediately to our superior forces and save your lives. If you do not do so, the Japanese Forces will go into action against you and will completely annihilate you. You are given herewith fair warning.

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



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Don't be misled by absurd propaganda. Almost all of the main force of the U.S. Pacific fleet was destroyed by the Japanese naval force at Pearl Harbor in Hawaii on the 8th of December last, and again the remaining of the said main force, including aircraft-carriers, was completely destroyed by the Japanese naval force on the 12th of January last. Moreover, on the 10th of December last the islands of Guam, Wake and Midway were completely occupied by the Japanese forces. Furthermore, the British forces unconditionally surrendered Hongkong to the Japanese forces on the 24th of December fast, and the Island of New Britain was occupied by the Japanese forces on the 23rd of January last. And on the 15th of February last, the much-vaunted and so-called impregnable fortress of the British Far Eastern forces at Singapore also surrendered unconditionally. Moreover, Buenos Aires (March 26, Domei) reported an information from Ottawa that Canadian Prime Minister Mackenzie King anrounced that the Canadian government is more concerned over its own defense than the desperate plight of Australia and has decided not to send expeditionary forces to Australia.

Anyone who thoroughly realizes the above-mentioned facts can understand that the propaganda "that between the 25th of March and the 10th of April substantial reinforcements from the United States of America will be sent to the Philippines" is completely false and absurd, without any explanation.
