Memorandum to Chief of Staff, USAFFE.

1. On the night of 6 February 1945, certain instructions were received, including the request to determine the authenticity of the attached list of reported killed or missing Prisoners of War who were shipped to Formosa or Japan.
2. Inquiry disclosed that when a shipment of Prisoners of War from any part of the Philippine Islands was contemplated, the Japanese prison officials instructed Major Warren A. Wilson, the Bilibid POW Prison Commandant, and his assistant, Captain William S. Gochenour, to segregate the file cards of those men being transferred. When the ship arrived in Japan, or its destination, the Japanese Government furnished Bilibid Prison with a roster of prisoners who had arrived safely, so that their file cards would be pulled from the active records.
3. In the group that left Luzon in October, 1944, the Japanese Government in Tokyo notified Bilibid, by name, those POWs who were known to have been killed or missing. Of a second group who departed on or about 13 December 1944, the Japanese military authorities in Manila notified Bilibid Prison officials, by name, those POWs known killed or missing.
4. Further first-hand information on this matter may be obtained from Mr. Earl G. Schweizer, WO (jg), Electrician, U.S. Navy, who was acting as prison warden and who personally handled the files of all prisoners transferred from the Philippines to Japan or other Japanese possessions.
5. Considering the manner in which the attached list was compiled, it is concluded that the information contained thereon is authentic.
