Dear Mr. Ali,

The "Solo Battalion Unit, 78th 1st Separate Battalion, Lanao Sector, purporting to be a guerrilla organization under your nominal control, has not been favorably considered for recognition as an element of the Philippine Army.

A set of general requirements for guerrilla recognition, established by General MacArthur during the liberation of the Philippines, has been used as a guide in considering the record of this unit. After careful investigation and full consideration of all available substantiating records and testimony of witnesses having pertinent knowledge, recognition of this guerrilla unit is not deemed to be warranted because of reasons mentioned below:

- a. The unit was not maintained satisfactorily in the field in opposition to the enemy, during the occupation.
- b. Activities of the unit did not contribute materially to the eventual defeat of the enemy.
- c. Many members apparently lived at home, supporting their families by means of farming or other civilian pursuits, and visited the guerrilla unit on a part time basis only.
- d. Record of service was not established by sufficient acceptable evidence.

It is requested that you comply with the provisions of Executive Order No. 68, by the President of the Philippines, dated 26 September 1945, copy attached.

Your Excellency:

With humility and with due respect, I am again writing you. I am deeply touched upon receipt of the letter sent me by W. F. MOORE, Colonel AGD, Ass't Adj Gen, regarding my request for payment of my personnel in my guerrilla organization and requesting that my claim for recognition be forwarded with the comment and recommendation of the Headquarters of Colonel Windell W. Fertig. However, I am appealing before you for your merciful pardon in addressing my request direct to the Supreme Commander, Allied Army of Occupation on the ground that when the Philippines was under his direct Command, General Guy O. Fort of Northern Mindanao being under him had commissioned me as one among the other officers to organize the "BLADE WEAPON BOLO BATTALION UNIT" in Lanao Military Sector.

The "BOLO BATTALION UNIT", Lanao Military Sector, was began by General Guy O. Fort and General Sharp in which case we do not know their whereabouts at present. We cannot deal with General Fertig because we do not belong to him. The "BOLO BATTALION UNIT" was organized before the coming of the enemy. This is the reason why I am asking you a recognition of the organization thus established to sacrifice and which did sacrificed. My organization is "BLADE WEAPON BATTALION", Lanao Military Sector which was in active duty until the coming of the Army of Liberation.

For further information of this Office about the "BLADE WEAPON BATTALION", I am please to refer this matter to the Supreme Commander.

To Gen. Fertig for direct reply to MacArthur

Tugaya, Lanao, Philippines
March 28, 1946

His Excellency
General Douglas MacArthur
Supreme Commander, Allied Army occupation
United States of America

Your Excellency:

With humility and with due respect I am again writing you. I wish to inform you that in March 1942 when you were the Commanding General of the Fil-American Forces when General Fort and General Sharp recommended to you that in Lanao the people were ready to fight the enemy. Because there were no arms available for distribution by the Usaffee they organized us into the FBB with bolos as our arms. They told us that after the war, we will be paid. I was appointed as one of the Captains thereof. Herewith is the copy of my appointment and the roster of troops of my men. We did our best by guarding all strategic points calculated as passage of the enemy entry.

When the Japs finally came, we members of the Bolo Bn. joined the fight. In May, 1942 up to Dec. 1942 when the USAFFE was in panic, we Bolo Battalions were the ones who fought the strong enemy forces in all sectors of Mindanao.

We had the upper hand on the Cotabato-Iligan National Highway against the enemy, as the Jap forces from Davao could not penetrate our lines. The Japs tried to capture the american remnants but we fought them so that they could not continue their attempt.

In Dec. 1942, we heard Gen. Fertig organizing a guerilla and many members of the Bolo Battalion joined him. I went to him with my men but because we had few arms but blades, he said he would accept as members only those having firearms. So we returned and contented ourselves with our bladed weapons. So with the guerilla members of Gen. Fertig and the BB members not accepted by Gen. Fertig working together, we continued harassing and attacking the Japs.

When the American planes came, they dropped bombs which demolished the Jap garrison at Malabang and so they were forced to run away.

In view of the foregoing, I beseech consideration for the sufferings we felt in defense of democracy. We have no superior officer like General Fort whom we should expound our grievances because we do not know where he is.
