Dear Br. Florendo:

The "Civilian Volunteer Guerrillas." purporting to be a guerrilla organization under your nominal control, is not favorably considered for recognition as an element of the Philippine Army.

A set of general requirements for guerrilla recognition, established by General Magarthur during the liberation of the Philippines, has been used as a suide in considering the record of this unit. After careful investigation and full consideration of all available substantiating records and testimony of witnesses having pertinent knowledge, recognition of this guerrilla unit is not desued to be warranted because of reasons mentioned below:

- a. The unit was not raintained satisfactorily in the field in epoceition to the energy.
- b. Activities of the unit did not contribute naterially to the eventual defeat of the enemy.
- e. Performance of the units did not indicate adequate control by its leaders, because of desertion of personnel to join other units.
- d. Unit did not show satisfactory continuity of sativity and organimation,
- e. Hembers of the unit did not devote their entire effort to military activities in the field to the exclusion of normal civilian occupation and family obligations.
- f. Many members apparently lived at home, supporting their families by means of ferming or other civilian pursuits, and assisted the guerrilla unit on a part time basis only.
- g. Record of service was not substantiated by sufficient acceptable evidence.
- It is requested that you comply with the provisions of Executive Order No. 68, by the President of the Philippines, deted 26 September 1945, copy attached.

s. The "Civilian Volunteer Guerrilles" did not served in the field as a unit, nor eld the manbars of the unit devote their entire efforts to military activity.

b. It is believed that the unit's activities consisted of little more than pilterage and resals of Jap goods, indicating that the unit was concerned triansly with rerocased asia.

d, Nost of the men on the roster appear on rosters of other units, priving that they could not have worked full time with the "Civilian Volunteer Guerrillas."

d. The statement of the commanding officer that all his son appear on the resters of Felsons inite indicates that the "Givilian Volumetter Guerrillas" could not possibly have functioned as an independent unit.

o. The unit could produce no substantisting evidence to support all their claim of having possessed my firearms at all. They chained that all their emporting papers were known.

The unit claimed to have stolen considerable foodstuffs from the Japa-But, as far as the investigating officers could determine, the supplies were used by the unit tiself, and what could not be used was sold to the civilians. This indicated to the investigating officers that the unit was concerned primarily with personal gain.

The unit could produce no evidence to substantiate their claim to having killed 500 Japaneses, nor could they produce any evidence to show that they ever possessed 105 rifles. In fact the unit could show no evidence to prove any of their claims of activity.

In an interview with Golonel Russell W. Volckmann, GO UMATT LL, the contact team learned that Hejor Bartolone Gened, who supposedly granted the authority for the unit to organise, was responsible for the death of two of Colonel Volckmann's couriers during the Japanese competion. 




