Honorable Secretary:

Herewith attached, I am sending to your Office a copy of Solicited Men under Company K (Transportation Service of the Philippine Army Militia, Babatagon Sector under command of our former General Filomon Pavilion and also under detachment commander, Colonel Gregorio J. Mariano which services as civilians attached to the Guerilla Forces were rendered during that time.

These men have shown their courage and loyalty to serve in defence and in connivance with the armed guerilla soldiers who bravely fought behind against our enemy, the Japanese.

The Transportation Service Co. although not armed, had also sacrificed much to guard and transport the guerillistas during their patrol in order to protect the lives and property of the aggrieved poor civilians as a result of the Japanese aggression.

In this connection, we have men under the Service Co. earnestly hope that although the time of life or death struggles had already gone by during that darkest period, do hereby claim that we might also be given small compensation which may not be equivalent to the genuine guerilla soldiers because we were only civilians attached, but, at least, our names may be recorded that we have done also services for our country during war time for I fully understand that without the co-operation of the loyal filipino civilians especially those who were attached to the guerilla forces, those armed men could have never attained the goal of the much desired victory over our enemy.

The municipality of Babatagon has been marked to be the best conduct during the occupation of the Japanese forces in Leyte and there was not a single person, man or woman, boy or girl, young or old who turned traitor.

In conclusion, I respectfully and humbly refer to you our former Commander in Chief, Gen. Filomon Pavilion and our former detachment commander, Colonel Gregorio Mariano whose ranks prevailed during that time and these officers will no doubt testify the Honorable, The Secretary of National Defense regarding our activities.

Please allow me to take this opportunity to extend our fullest gratitude of your heart felt co-operation with our claim, and by return mail, we hope that an advice from you may be had whatever opinion you give us.
