MINUTES OF THE MEETING OF COMMANDING OFFICERS OF
DESERVING CIVILIAN GUERRILLAS OF DAGAMI,
LEYTE, HELD AT DAGAMI, LEYTE ON AUG-
UST 15, 1947.



R E S O L U T I O N

WHEREAS, there are still thousands of deserving civilian guerrillas who are not yet recognized;

WHEREAS, the resistance movement in Leyte, was made effective because of the valuable services rendered by the civilian guerrillas;

WHEREAS, it will be injustice to those civilian guerrillas who have rendered full military services if they will not be recognized;

BE IT RESOLVED THEREFORE, as it is hereby resolved by this body, to petition as it is hereby petitioned to PHILMYCOM to recognize the different Units of the Guerrilla Organization of the municipality of Dagami, which was attached to "K" Co. and "T" Co., 95th Inf. Reg., 92nd Division, (GUERRILLA) Leyte Area Command, of which Regiment was under the command of Major Alejandro Balderian, for the sake of justice for which many of our countrymen have died for the cause of Democracy.

BE IT RESOLVED FURTHER, that a copy of this resolution be furnished, His Excellency, the President of the Philippines, the Hon. President of the Senate, the Hon. Secretary of National Defense, the Hon. Representative for the 5th District for Leyte and to Major Alejandro Balderian.



MEMORANDUM FOR RECORD

Lt. Col. Hugh L. Carnahan:

1. The "Division 4, 95th Infantry Regiment, 92nd Division, 9th Military District", consisting of 448 members under the command of Herminegildo Refuerzo has not been favorably considered for recognition. The unit was under the overall command of Colonel Kangleon, but more immediately under Major Alejandro Balderian. None of its members has been previously recognized.
2. Basis for non-recognition:
 - a. The unit was not maintained satisfactorily in the field in opposition to the enemy. The objectives of the unit were primarily passive, personal protection rather than active harassing of the enemy.
 - b. Activities of the unit did not contribute materially to the eventual defeat of the enemy. The only activity that can legitimately be claimed for this unit is the supplying of food for the combat forces of Balderian.
 - c. A definite organization was not established. There was no training, no scheduled meeting of members, or no organized plan of activity.
 - d. Unit did not show satisfactory continuity of activity and organization. As soon as the small contingent of 20 Japanese was stationed in Tabontahon, the unit became inactive.
 - e. Many members apparently lived at home, supporting their families by means of farming or other civilian pursuits, and assisted the guerrilla unit on a part time basis only.
3. The unit was purely a volunteer civilian home guard type unit; it had



Dear Mr. Refuerzo:

The "Division 4, 95th Infantry Regiment, 92nd Division", purporting to be a guerrilla organization under your nominal control, is not favorably considered for recognition as an element of the Philippine Army.


A set of general requirements for guerrilla recognition, established by General MacArthur during the liberation of the Philippines, has been used as a guide in considering the record of this unit. After careful investigation and full consideration of all available substantiating records and testimony of witnesses having pertinent knowledge, recognition of this guerrilla unit is not deemed to be warranted because of reasons mentioned below:

- a. The unit was not maintained satisfactorily in the field in opposition to the enemy.
- b. Activities of the unit did not contribute materially to the eventual defeat of the enemy.
- c. A definite organization was not established.
- d. Unit did not show satisfactory continuity of activity and organization.
- e. Members of the unit did not devote their entire effort to military activities in the field to the exclusion of normal civilian occupation and family obligations.
- It is requested that you comply with the provisions of Executive Order No. 68, by the President of the Philippines, dated 26 September 1945, copy attached.

In accordance with verbal instructions from Chief of Section, Guerrilla Affairs, G-3, AFHESPAc, Lieutenants Preston S. Bentley and Adelbert T. Weber proceeded to Tabon, Tabon, Dagami, Leyte to contact the "Division 4, 95th Infantry Regiment, 92nd Division, 9th Military District" in order to determine whether or not this organization shpuld be recognized b y the United States Army. The following is a summary of the investigation and basis for the recommendation.

HISTORY

In April 1942, Herminegildo Refuerzo, teacher of the barrio of Tabontabon, Dagami, Leyte, on his own initiative organized a unit of Volunteer Guards. At first he had no name for the unit, and really no definite plans for it. In May 1942, Major Alejandro Balderian, who had an armed force of guerrillas, appointed Refuerzo captain, and gave him the task of providing his unit with foodstuffs^{furnishin}, and also passive protection by a watcher system. At this time Refuerzo's unit assumed the name of the unit of Balderian, and was known as "Division 4, 95th Infantry Regiment, 92nd Division".

RESTRICTED

The purpose Refuerzo had in mind when he organized the unit was to preserve peace andorder in the town, to build up the morale of the people and to instill in the populace a faith in the United States and the Philippine Commonwealth. He never had intentions of establishing a combat unit.

Most of the members of this unit are farmers, and they took care of their own farms, and lived with their families at all times.

The unit never had any firearms, not even home made ones. The only weapons they had were bolas. Obviously then this was not a combat unit. After the Japanese came to Tabontabon in 1943, the group did nothing whatever, even giving up their watcher system. There were 20 Japanese garrisoned in that barrio.
