There does not appear to be any evidence in the attached papers to indicate that this unit was an active guerilla organisation the members of which devoted their entire efforts while in the unit to operations in the field, to the exclusion of normal civilian pursuits.

In view of the lack of evidence to substantiate claims of Guerrilla activities it is considered that recognition of the unit under your nominal control is not warranted.

To: The Commanding General, AFWESPAC, Manila Subject:Recognition of Guerrilla Unit (Del Pilar Regimental Band, Ball Division.)

I have the honor to apply for recognition of the Del Pilar Regimental Band, Ball Division, Bulcan Wiltary Area, as a unit which cooperated in the resistance movement during the pre-Liberation period.

The undersigned who is in command of the unit, has been in the resistance movement since shortly after the surrender of Ba-

taan, having helped in such activities as:

a. The sheltering, treatment, feeding, clothing (with civilian clothes,) securing of forged residence certificates, and transportation home of Bataan boys who did not surren-

der but escaped from the Japanese. b. In May, 1942, at the solicitation of Dr. Jesus Lava of Bulacan, Bulacan, the collection of clothing and cash for the maintenance of such of our boys who decided

to continue the resistance.

der then Lt. Col. Gregorio Panganiban (assasim ted by a Huk at Malolos late in 1944.) This unit was under Major Lapham

whose H. Q. was somewhere in Pangasinan.

d. In May, 1943, a new induction into the Del Pilar Regiment. (Inducting officer was Major Natanael de Pano, now regimental chaplain of the Buenavista Regiment, stationed at Bacnotan, La Union.) The undersigned was assigned 3-2 for the 2nd Bn. of the Del Pilar Regiment, with specific duty of apprehending and investigating those who were suspected of pro-Japanese espionage. To avoid suspicion as to their movements, the undersigned selected as operatives musicians of the local town band who were 100% loyal. These, under the command of the undersigned, functioned as such until the Liberation when they were allowed to function as a real regimental band. As such they functioned, playing for parades and other public functions until the Del Filar Regiment was absorbed by the Buenavista Regiment, which cooperated with the 37th and 32nd Divisions in the Northern Luzon campaign from April to August, 1945, e. Gathering and dissemination of short-wave broad-

casts until the power lines were cut in 1944. It is not known why: (1) the undersigned, with his unit, was not notified when the whole regiment was being mobilized for operation with the 32nd Division, U. S. Army despite assurances of the undersigned to the regimental C.O., Lt. Col. Searáin Vasques, that he and his men were ready to serve as a combat unit; (2) all the responsible officers of the Bulacan Military Area, from the Divisional Commander, down

made no efforts to have the unit recognized, despite assurances to us subordinate officers that our division had direct contact with Gen. MacArthur's H.Q.

Enclosed herewith is the latest roster of this band, minus members who had (a) resigned (b) or were processed into the Philippine Army. Authenticity of this roster will be vouched for by the following officers: Lt. Col. Serafin Vasquez, Buenavista Regiment, Bacnotan, La Union; Captain Alejandro Ballatbat (now resigned), former Regimental S-1, Del Pilar Regiment, Hagonoy, Bulacan; Major Francisco Francisco, Regimental Adjutant, Hagonoy, Bulacan; Major Platon Guevarra, Corps of Engineers, P. A., formerly Regimental Executive Officer, del Pilar Regiment.
