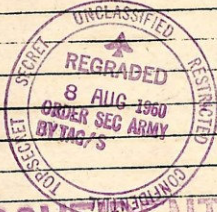

The undersigned is the organizer and Commanding Officer of the DE CASTRO'S GUERRILLA UNIT which took active part in resistance movement against the JAPS during the occupation and up to the liberation. On 27 June 1946 I applied for recognition of my unit but was denied because my application was submitted subsequent to 15 March 1946.

Reason for the delay was due to fact that upon the arrival of our forces here in the Philippines for which I've been waiting since our surrender in Corregidor, I reported immediately to the Naval Base No. 3142, from which they sent me right away aboard the Amphibious Group Communication Flagship USS TETON on way to Japan. We were alongside Yokohama dock, when Japan surrendered. Two weeks later we moved to Tokyo, and was back again in the Philippines in November 1945 in active duty up to the present time.

I am wondering if there is nothing more than can be done towards recognizing my unit and giving its members a square deal. I hereby appeal to you in the hope that justice will be given priority over a mere technicality.

For your information and guidance I am enclosing herewith a copy of our History and Letter addressed to the Commanding General Headquarters AFWESPAC (Guerrilla Affair Section) and the reply to me.

1. Respectfully forwarded herewith are the history and roster of De Castro's Guerrilla Unit.

2. The undersigned is the Organizer and Commanding Officer of Subject Guerrilla Unit. Delay in submitting the necessary papers for the recognition of this unit is due to the fact that he had been sent to the Invasion of Okinawa and Japan last July 1945, and came back last November 1945, when he was assigned CCK. U.S. Navy Philippine Sea Frontier, Anchor Section Navy No. 3142, his present position. He is American Citizen.

3. Therefore, for the benefit of those who really served and resisted the enemy during the occupation and up to the present time are resisting the remnants of Japanese soldiers still at large in places like Barrio Banayaga, Lemery, Batangas, full consideration is earnestly requested with a view towards ultimate recognition if justice and square deal were to be meted out where they are due.

DE CASTRO'S GUERRILLA

History

Marcelo de Castro, with Servillano de Castro and Policarpio de Castro went to Banyaga a barrio of Lemery, Batangas to locate a place for future hideout in case he will be hunted by the Japanese authorities. Marcelo de Castro was steward first class in the United States Navy who saw actions in Europe in World War I and is also in Corrigidor and surrendered to the Japanese during the fall of the Rock. He was released from Capas or Camp O'Donnell concentration camp on September 25, 1942. On November 7, 1942, they came to Montallan hills to view it and take reconnaissance. On the same spot they met several inhabitants of the place who fled from the barrios because there were twelve Japanese soldiers forcing the people to plant cotton. These group of people among them were Julio Austria, Eladio Salisi, Luciano Malabanan, Ricardo Holgado, Alejandro Perez, Demetrio Mendoza, and Marciano de Leon. They fled because they had destroyed the banca on which the Japanese soldiers have ridden, they have already planned the Japanese to be ambushed but they feared that the Japanese might punished the barrio people and burned the barrios.

On the same spot Marcelo de Castro was made the head of movement and to name it as De Castro's Guerrilla with Banayaga as the Headquarters. The organization had planned to secure arms by purchase or to beg from civilians who will be willing to lend their weapons.

The organization grew as was not expected because there are many people who really hated the Japanese due to their atrocities and for using the people to labor compulsory without due pay and rations. The organization was handicapped due to the fact that most of the high officers got sick of malaria. But the sickness of the high ranking officers does not prevent much the organization because the people who are to fond of the Americans and they believed that they will return back to the Philippines found solace and contentment of their cause by joining the guerrilla movements.

Most of the high officers become wanted by the Japanese officers in order to fool them acted mostly as members of the intelligence corps. Quintin Macainan become the intelligent officers in Manila and others as intelligent officers in towns.

The small force mostly armed with paltiks and burned rifles had increased in size at the start of about twenty members it increased to several companies.

On November 14, 1944, two Japanese soldiers due to the failure of the motorboat's motor they were riding landed in Sitio Look Banaga, Lemery, Batangas. The Japanese were hungry and were asking the natives for canoe. The men of our Unit take a tip

and Major Jose P. de Castro instructed, Lt. Julio Austria and Lt. Marciano de Leon, to take with them Crispin Cirilo Landicho, Domingo Mendoza. Mendoza armed only with knives received the Japanese as good citizens. The Japanese thinking them to be as what they presumed to be freely mixed with them. This group were able to knife the Japanese to death and took their two rifles.

The first real encounter was in Sitio Tatlong Ulo barrio Mayasang, Lemery, Batangas against a company of Japanese soldier on December 15, 1944. In this encounter most of the members of our companies and guerrilla of other units were with the encounter. The Japanese were on a very advantageous position being on high thickly covered with thick forest. Most of the Guerillas were on a low place exposed to the bullets of the enemy. There were firing for about two hours but we can hardly aimed at the enemy and so we retreated. In this encounter we lost one man and four of them were wounded.

On the early part of the month of February, 1945 the American forces landed on Nasugbu, Batangas. The Commander in Chief sent eight men to verify. After three days the men went back to our camp with the tidings that the Americans had already landed. One platoon under the command of Lt Demetrio Mendoza, on February 8, 1945 the 11th Airborne landed on parachute in Tagaytay City. A part of our unit were sent to Tagaytay and to stay there. We all welcomed them exchange our Japanese Rifles or revolvers with new one or with carbines as the case may be. The Americans troops give us food, cigarettes and canned meats. Then Lt. Colonel Marcelo de Castro talked with the American Officers. The American officer told them that they should joined with them. Some of our men joined the Americans forces going to Gonzali mountain, some of them also forces going to Manila. Those who went with the Americans to fight in the Gonzali Mountains stayed there for about a month were firing against the enemy took place during the night because the Japanese mostly snipers only gave battle during the night due to their fear of American planes that night strap them.

On February 12, 1945 Lt. Colonel Marcelo de Castro and Captain Servillano de Castro together with Maximo Laurel, Mariano Laurel, Guillermo Perez, Isidro Gomez, and Venancio Luna of other Guerilla unit ambushed four Japanese soldiers armed with revolver and a sack of granade and were able to kill them all on that day. After a day or two they were able to report their works in the 11th Airborne Headquarters in Tagaytay City and were also able to change the Japanese Revolvers with carbines. They given plenty of bullets and hand grenades. The ambushed happened in a cornfield between barrio Look and barrio Luyos of Tanawan, Batangas.

On April 12, 1945, our runner saw a Japanese soldier in barrio Matala looking for camote. Then our runner who was Marciano de Leon reported it to the Headquarters. So we proceeded to barrio Matala with all our men. Japanese soldier digging camote were one of our men shot the Japanese to death. When it was noon all our men are ordered to go to Subic but a report made that there were plenty of Japanese by one of our runner Antonio Malaban. It was a kilometer away from barrio Subic many Japanese soldier some were resting on the ground and some in one house resting. So Lt. Ricardo Holgado and Lt. Luciano Malaban ordered his soldiers to fire and eight of Japanese soldiers were killed. We followed them till they reached the mountain of Poltero near Lemery, Batangas.

After several weeks that the Americans had already landed and the Philippines was partly liberated, Lt. Col. Marcelo de Castro, commander and Captain Adriano Mesferos of our Finance Company, both joined the United States Army on which they were members of said organization before the war and during the battle of Bataan and Corrigidor and both were sent by the Invasion force to Okinawa and then to Japan.

But inspite of the departure of the Commander in Chief, Chief of Staff and the company commanders, the unit left were instructed to fight the Japanese straglers in the hills surrounding, Banaga, Pultero, and the hills bordering the Tagaytay City, such sporadic clashes often occurs, staged by our units under our platoon commanders. There are still at present Japanese straglers in several places and still our men are fighting till those places are cleared of all Japanese.

In the later part of November, 1945 with the American fought in Popolin where the guerilla had killed 11 Japanese. Second encounter was in Payapa, few died but many were wounded. Third encounter was in Calaca where the guerilla have killed nine Japanese, but no casualty was suffered by our unit.

The next encounter was at Subic were one hundred fifteen Japanese were killed but to our unit there was no casualty. On the next morning our unit again engaged the enemy and fifteen Japanese were killed and to our unit no casualty.

The succeeding encounter was in Balagbag were Policarpio Carolina single and Mariano Aguho married were killed and several wounded was suffered by our unit.

At Masim our unit killed 7 Japanese but several men of our unit were wounded.

In your letter to General MacArthur you requested reconsideration of the decision of this headquarters in a letter addressed to you on 23 July 1946.

History

Marcelo de Castro, with Servillano de Castro and Policarpio de Castro went to Banyaga a barrio of Lemery Batangas to locate a place for future hideout in case he will be hunted by the Japanese authorities. Marcelo de Castro was steward first class in the United States Navy who saw actions in Europe in World I and in also in Corrigidor and surrendered to the Japanese during the fall of the Rock. He was released from Capas or Camp O'Donnell concentration camp on September 25, 1942. On November 7, 1942, they came to Montalan hills to view it and take reconnaissance. On the same spot they met several inhabitants of the place who fled from the barrios because there were twelve Japanese soldiers forcing the people to plant cotton. These group of people among them were Julio Austria, Eladio Salisi, Luciano Malabanan, Ricardo Holgado, Alejandro Perez, Demetrio Mendoza, and Marciano de Leon. They fled because they had destroyed the banca on which the Japanese soldiers have ridden, they have already planned the Japanese to be ambushed but they feared that the Japanese might punished the barrio people and burned the barrios.

On the same spot Marcelo de Castro was made the head of movement and to name it as De Castro's Guerrella with Banayaga as the headquarter. The organization had planned to secure arms by purchase or to beg from civilians who will be willing to lend their weapons.

The organization grew as was not expected because there are many people who really hated the Japanese due to their atrocities and for using the people to labor compulsory without due pay and rations. The organization was handicapped due to the fact that most of the high officers got sick of malaria. But the sickness of the high ranking officers does not prevent much the organization because the people who are to fond of the Americans and they believed that they will return back to the Philippines found solace and contentment of their cause by joining the guerrella movements.

Most of the high officers become wanted by the Japanese officers in order to fool them acted mostly as members of the intelligence corps. Quintin Macainan become the intelligent officers in Manila and others as intelligent officers in towns.

Mendoza armed only with knives received the Japanese as good citizens. The two Japanese thinking them to be as what they presumed to be freely mixed with them. This group were able to knife the Japanese to death and took their two rifles.

The first real encounter was in sitio Tetlong Ulo barrio Mayasang, Lemery, Batangas against a company of Japanese soldiers on December 15, 1944. In this encounter most of the members of our companies and guerrellas of other units were with the encounter. The Japanese were on a very advantageous position being on high thickly covered with thick forest. Most of the guerrellas were on a low place exposed to the bullets of the enemy. There were firing for about two hours but we can hardly aimed at the enemy and so we retreated. In this encounter we lost one man and four of them were wounded.

On the early part of the month of February, 1945 the American forces landed on Nasugbu, Batangas. The commander in chief sent eight men to verify. After three days the men went back to our camp with the tidings that the Americans had already landed. One platoon under the command of Lt. Demetrio Mendoza. On February 8, 1945 the 11th Airborne landed on parachute in Tagaytay City. A part of our unit were sent to Tagaytay and to stay there. We all welcomed them exchange our Japanese rifles or revolvers with new one or with carbines as the case may be. The Americans troops give us food, cigarettes and canned meats. Then Lt. Colonel Marcelo de Castro talked with the American officers. The American officer told them that they should joined with them. Some of our men joined the Americans forces going to Gonzali mountain, some of them also forces going to Manila. Those who went with the Americans to fight in the Gonzali Mountains stayed there for about a month where firing against the enemy took place during the night because the Japanese mostly snipers only gave battle during the night due to their fear of American Planes that might strap them.

On February 12, 1945 Lt. Colonel Marcelo de Castro and Captain Servillano de Castro together with Maximo Laurel, Mariano Laurel, Guillermo Berez, Tomas Perez, Isidro Gomez, and Venancio Luna of other guerrella unit ambushed four Japanese soldiers armed with revolver and a sack of grenade and were able to kill them all on that day. After a day or two they were able to report their works in the 11th Airborne Headquarters in Tagaytay City and were also able to change the Japanese revolvers with carbines. They given plenty of bullets and hand grenades. The ambushed happened in a cornfield between barrio Iik and barrio Luyos of Tanawan, Batangas.

On April 12, 1945, our runner saw a Japanese soldiers in barrio Metala looking for camote. The our runner who was Marciano de Leon reported it to the headquarters. So we proceed to barrio Metala with all our men. There we saw a

Japanese soldier digging camote were one of our men shot the Japanese to death. When it was noon all our men are ordered to go to Subic but a report made that there were plenty of Japanese by one of our runner Antonio Malabanan. It was a kilometer away from barrio Subic many Japanese soldiers some were resting on the ground and some in one house resting. So Lt. Ricardo Holgado and Lt. Luciano Malabanan ordered his soldiers to fire and eight of Japanese soldiers were killed. We followed them till they reached the mountain of Poltero near Lemery, Batangas

Lt. Castro took off

After several weeks that the Americans had already landed and the Philippines was partly liberated, Lt. COL. Marcelo de Castro, commander and Captain Adriano Nesferos of our Pincane Company, both joined the United States on which they were members joined it as they are members of said organization before the war and during the battle of Bataan and Corrigidor and both were sent by the Invasion force to Okinawa and them to Japan.

But inspite of the departure of the Commander in chief, Chief of the Staff and the company commanders, the unit left were instructed to fight the Japanese stragglers in the hills surrounding, Banaga, Pultero, and the hills bordering the Tagaytay City, such sporadic clashes often occurs, staged by our units under our platoon commanders. There are still at present Japanese stragglers in several places and still our men are fighting till those places are cleared of all Japanese.

PA had been directed to clean out units by Nov 45. U.S. troops no longer engaged in combat.

In the later part of November, 1945 with the Americans fought in Popolin where the guerrella had killed 11 Japanese.

Second encounter was in Payapa, few died but many were wounded.

Third encounter was in Calaca where the guerrella have killed nine Japanese, but no casualty was suffered by our unit.

The next encounter was at Subic were one hundred-fifteen Japanese were killed but to our unit there was no casualty. On the next morning our unit again engaged the enemy and fifteen Japanese were killed and to our unit no casualty.

The succeeding encounter was in Balagbag were Policarpio Carolina single and Mariano Aguho married were killed and several wounded was suffered by our unit.

At Masim our unit killed 7 Japanese but several men of our unit were wounded.
