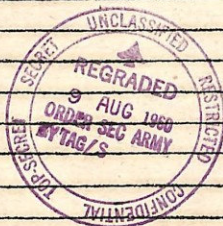

Upon orders of the Chief of Section, Guerrilla Affairs Section, this Headquarters, the undersigned proceeded to the Headquarters of the USPIF Santa Rosa Unit, 2nd Bn (Anderson Unit) in Santa Rosa, province of Nueva Ecija.

**(HISTORICAL DATA)**

The organization of this unit was supposed to have been started October 14, 1943 in Santa Rosa.

This unit was one of the three that was supposed to have operated in the Southern Nueva Ecija sector under the overall command of Major Bernard L. Anderson. The unit started with about fifteen arms which was later supplanted with 20 Thompson sub-machine gun and a few more rifles given to them by Major Bernard L. Anderson. During U.S. Armed Forces invasion, this unit was supposed to have been used by the 43rd Division.

**(POLITICAL ASPECTS)**

It is not believed that this unit is involved in politics, local or national.

**(RECOMMENDATIONS)**

1. Recommend that no further action be taken by this Headquarters in as much as this unit was used by the 43rd Division.
2. Recommend that recommendation for recognition by initiated by the 43rd Division.

1. EXECUTIVE ORDER NO. 21 BY THE PRESIDENT OF THE PHILIPPINES.  
The following Executive Order No. 21 by the President of the Phil. is published  
for the information and guidance of all concerned:

Executive Order No. 21

DECLARING TO BE ON ACTIVE SERVICE IN THE PHILIPPINE ARMY ALL PERSONS  
NOW ACTIVELY SERVING IN RECOGNIZED MILITARY FORCES IN THE PHILIPPINES

WHEREAS, many civilians residing in the Philippines of Filipino, American  
and other foreign citizenships, and officers and enlisted men of the Philippine  
Army, of the armed forces of the United States and of Allied Nations have con-  
tinued armed resistance against the Imperial Japanese Government since the  
sixth of May, 1942.

WHEREAS, this action has written in blood an epic of the Courage, devo-  
tion and loyalty to the Government and the people of the Philippines;

WHEREAS, these military forces have contributed in a large measure to  
the Allied military effort and to the liberation of the Filipino people from  
the yoke of the Japanese invader;

WHEREAS, it is the desire of the government of the Philippines to recog-  
nize this allegiance;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, SERGIO OSMEÑA, President of the Philippines by virtue  
of the authority vested in me by the Emergency Power Law, Section 22 a and  
Section 27 of the Commonwealth Act Numbered One notwithstanding, do hereby  
ordain and promulgated the following:

1. All persons, of any nationality of citizenship, who are actively  
serving in recognized military forces in the Philippines, are hereby considered  
to be on active service in the Philippine Army.
2. The temporary grades of enlisted men, enlisted or promoted in the  
field by Commanders of recognized military forces or by their delegated autho-  
rity are hereby confirmed.
3. The temporary ranks of all officers, appointed or promoted in the  
field prior to this date by the Commanders of recognized military forces are  
hereby confirmed.
4. The date of entry into active service in the Philippine Army will be  
that of joining of recognized military force.
5. The effective date of rank for commissioned officers and enlisted men  
will be the date on which they were appointed or promoted to such rank by the  
Commanders of recognized military forces.
6. All recognized military force, as used herein, as defined as a force  
under a commander who has been appointed, designed, or recognized by the Comman-  
der in Chief Southwest Pacific Area.

Done at the seat of Government in the Field, the 28th day of Octo-  
ber, in the year of our Lord, nineteen hundred and forty four and of the Com-  
monwealth of the Philippine the ninth.



HISTORY OF ORGANIZATION

I. ORGANIZATION:

This Unit was originally formed in the outlying barrio of La Fuente, Santa Rosa, Nueva Ecija, wherein ex-USAFFE Lt. Carlos Pangyarihan and his soldiers were in hiding. It was my understanding that I was to support this lieutenant and his men, both in the way of material aid as well as in concealing his position from the Japanese, until the arrival of reinforcements which were supposed to arrive in March, 1942. However, in February 1942, an unexpected attack was launched by the Japanese Military Police, resulting in the death of one soldier and ten civilians. The "Ganaps" (a group of Filipinos who sympathized with the Japs), headed by Captain Manuel Tayao now serving at Muntinglupa Prison, had furnished the Japanese with information of the hiding place. In view of this, the camp was transferred to Sinaguinan, later to Capitan Juan. But again, the Ganap guided Japanese raided the Camp, killing 3 soldiers and burning all houses and "camarins" in which rice was stored. This brought about the dispersal of the small band of soldiers under Lt. Pangyarihan.

By now the Japanese believed that there was a well-organized underground unit. In order to live up to their expectation, I conceived the idea of forming such a unit. So on August 14, 1942, I went to Manila to see Major Edwin P. Ramsey. There I joined the newly organized guerrilla outfit and stayed for two months until the set-up was completed. Major Ramsey's chief of staff ordered me afterwards to return to Santa Rosa, Nueva Ecija, to organize the 1st Unit. This unit was placed under Captain Duret (alias Dominador Tombo) and was composed of ex-USAFFE soldiers formerly under Lt. Pangyarihan. But the organization of which I was Sector Commander, was in a sad state; we had no arms nor ammunition of any kind, so I went to see Major Ramsey but without success. This failed to dishearten me; in October 1943 I was able to see Major Bernard Anderson and we talked of matters relative to the organization. There I came in contact with Major Bonderful, official representative of General MacArthur. The Major sent me to Santa Rosa, Penaranda, and Cabanatuan, to report all military objectives in said municipalities. I was able to secure the desired information, which I gave to Captain Manzano, executive officer of Major Anderson in Tayabas.

When I returned to Santa Rosa, I was given 20 Thompsons and 2 carbines. From then on, we were in active operation, and our Unit was later incorporated with the Southern Nueva Ecija Sector under Colonel C. A. Ilteto.

#### II. BASE CAMPS:

From the original site we occupied in La Fuente, we were forced to move to Sinaguinan, and later to Capitan Juan. From there we transferred to Mount Sumacbac, then to Suck, Bayukbok, Pias, Callos, and Caranglaan, which are outlying places and mountains of Penaranda and Papaya, of this province. Such frequent shifting was necessitated by our desire to keep our positions secret, for spies swarmed all over the province. When the American Forces came, we shifted to San Isidro, then back to Santa Rosa. In March 1945, the 112th Cavalry of the U. S. Army took some of my men to raid the Japs at Minalungao. On April 22, 1945, 34 of them were attached to the 950 AAA AW Bn, then stationed at Floridablanca, Pampanga; 20 were taken to Porac, Pampanga by the 472 AAA AW Bn. On May 6, 1945, 49, including myself, were attached to the "C" Company and 118th Engrs, "C" Bn, U. S. Army, and were brought to Sapang Buho and Salabusob, Bongabon, Nueva Ecija.

#### IV. SUPPORTERS OF OUR CAUSE:

Most of the law-abiding citizens of Santa Rosa gave us material and spiritual aid. Among those who contributed to our cause by giving us rice, meat, vegetables, sweet potatoes and money are Fernando Manubay, Eulalio Adriano, Francisco de Borja, Pedro Villaroman. Jose Padilla, Aurelio Gonzales, Apolonio Lucero, Eusebio Desiderio, Apolonio Manubay, Valentin Constantino, Mariano Francisco, Emilio de Guzman, Sofronio Oliveros, Florencio Talusan, Felipe Dayao, Jose Vergara, Marcelo Abelardo, Jose Sinaguinan, and a woman named Catalina Manabat. Dr. Melquiades R. Ronquillo of Papaya, Nueva Ecija gave us material support during our stay in that town.

#### V. ACTIVITIES:

##### (a) Killing Japs and seizing their arms:-

When the Unit was organized, we had but 6 U. S. rifles, (model 1917), 1 automatic rifle, 5 pistols and several hand grenades. Therefore we concentrated our activities first in killing every Jap we met in remote places and seizing their arms in order to strengthen our force. We captured 3 Jap rifles, and 1 Jap heavy machine gun. When our Unit was placed under the command of Major Bernard L. Anderson, we were furnished

with 20 Thompsons and 2 carbines, thus swelling our little equipment.

(b) Espionage:-

We were ever on the watch for any suspicious action and behavior of government officials as well as the misguided Filipinos. We punished and reformed several Makapilis and spies of the Japs.

(c) Easing the rice situation:-

When the Biba (Japanese Prime Commodities Distribution Agency), later replaced by the Ricoa, failed to purchase enough rice at the controlled price, the Japs (including the Army and Navy) went to the town and competed with the Filipinos by bidding higher prices for this commodity and offering premiums in the form of clothes to people who would sell rice. To prevent the people from selling rice to the Japs and to enable the starving people of Manila and non-rice producing provinces to obtain rice at a reasonable price, all rice sellers were contacted and threatened with punishment if they should sell to the Japs. Thus the Japs were thwarted in their efforts to obtain rice in Santa Rosa.

(d) Spreading propaganda:-

During the Japanese occupation, the people heard and read news only from Japanese-controlled broadcasts and newspaper. News so obtained, was at most atrocious lies. Some guerrilla units had hidden radios which could pick up foreign broadcasts. From such sources we were able to supply printed copies to the people, thus keeping them posted with news from the United States and from the theaters of war.

(e) Furnishing Reports to the General Headquarters:-

In the middle part of December 1944, the Japs were rushing the threshing and milling of rice in this community. We could do nothing to stop this, but we did send information to Captain Manzano regarding this and their military objectives, together with a map of this town indicating the latter. We recommended the bombing of the Ricoa and the strafing of the rice threshers in the fields.

(f) Maintenance of Peace and Order:-

Upon the receipt of President Osmena's procla-

mation calling on all Filipinos to rally behind General MacArthur's forces, we immediately asked the people to evacuate the town and stay away from the Japs. We designated their evacuation places wherein we maintained peace and order. We enforced the laws of the Commonwealth Government, protected the lives and properties of the people and patrolled the area. We killed and captured several Japanese soldiers and officers. The prisoners were turned over to the American Forces upon their arrival.

(g) Fixing the Price of Prime Commodities:-

Before the organization of the Municipal Government we took it upon ourselves to fix the price of prime commodities (which were being sold at exorbitant prices) as a measure to protect the people. We posted lists of prices in conspicuous places. Sometimes we had to supervise the sale of some goods in the market, in order to save the buyers from the clutches of black market profiteers.

(h) Assistance Rendered to U. S. Units:-

In response to the rally urged by President Osmena, to harass the Japanese and lighten the burden of both, we cut telegraph lines and machine-gunned Japanese trucks in retreat, prior to the entry of American Forces. Our Unit furnished the information desired by the advance guards of the U. S. Army who came into town. We also assisted the CIC by turning over to them all papers taken from the Japanese, as well as other pertinent information they asked for. In addition, we also rendered assistance in various ways to the following units:

HISTORY OF ORGANIZATION

1. Organization:

This Unit was originally formed at the outlying place of Barrio La Fuente, Sta. Rosa, Nueva Ecija, wherein Ex-USAFEE Lt. Carlos Pangyarihan with his soldiers were secretly hiding. At the outset, it was then my understanding with Lt. Pangyarihan to support him and his soldiers with everything I can in their secret hiding place away from the knowledge of the Japanese until after the arrival of the reinforcement that was then expected to arrive by March, 1943. But unfortunately on February, 1943, an unexpected attack on the camping place from Japanese Military Police lead by the then "Ganaps" (Filipinos that sympathetic with the Japs) headed by Capt. Manuel Tayao, now serving at Muntinglupa Prison Camp, resulted in the killing of one (1) soldier of Lt. Pangyarihan and ten (10) civilians. With such occurrence, the Camp was transferred to a secret place, better known as "Sinaguinan", then to "Capitan Juan". With the tip of the "Ganaps" the Camp was raided again that resulted in the killing of three (3) civilians and burning all the houses and "comarins" in which rice is stocked as the Japs thought that the places were infested with guerillas and the rice is being used by them. After that, the soldiers of Lt. Pangyarihan were scattered with resulted again in the death of two (2) soldiers and one (1) civilian. Because the Japs then believed that there existed already a unit of underground I made it a point that I will have a unit formed really so that on August 14, 1943, I went to Manila to see Major Edwin P. Ramsey and joined the newly organized guerilla, staying there for about two (2) months until the set-up was completed. Major Ramsey, *chief of staff* ordered me afterward to return to Sta. Rosa, Nueva Ecija, and organized the Unit, I, being its Sector Commander under the then Capt. Durct, alias Dominador Tombo of this municipality. The first organization was then composed of ex-USAFEE soldiers who were formerly under Lt. Pangyarihan. It should not be amiss to state in this connection that the ~~home~~ address of Maj. Ramsey is 825 Dangal street, Manila. Because of lack of arms during the process of organization, I again went to see Maj. Ramsey but unfortunately I was not able to meet him. In view of my desire to form the Unit which was almost completed by October 10, 1943, I went to Major Bernard Andersons in the said month of *1943* which I was able to see him and talked matters relative to the Unit I have formed. I was then sent back by Maj. Ponderful, official representative of Gen. MacArthur who was then in Tayabas with Maj. Anderson, to Sta. Rosa, Penaranda and Cabanatuan to report all military objectives in the said municipalities and in my second trip to Tayabas I was able to bring then with me the desired objectives, handed them to Capt. Manzano, Ex-

cutive Officer of Maj. Anderson. And when I return to Sta. Rosa, I was given twenty (20) Thompsons and two (2) Carbines. From that time we actively operated that resulted in the fusing our Unit with the Southern Nueva Ecija Sector under Col. C. A. Ilteto.

### 2. Base Camps:


From the place we originally organized at Sta. Rosa, we moved to Mount Sumabao then transferred to Suok, Bayubok, Pias, Callos and Carranglaan which are outlying <sup>places</sup> and mountainous of Penaranda and Papaya, this province, to be away from the Japs, who were then hunting for us. When the American Forces arrived, we shifted to San Isidro, Nueva Ecija then to Sta. Rosa. In March, 1945, the 113th Cavalry of the U. S. Army took some of my men to raid the Japs at "Minalungao" who were then hiding in a cave in that place. On April 23, 1945, 34 of my men were attached to the 950 AAA AW En., then stationed at Florida Blanco, Pampanga; 20 were taken to Forge, Pampanga, by the 473 AAA AW En., and on May 8, 1945, 49 <sup>men</sup> including myself, were attached to the "C" Co. 118th Engr., "C" En, U. Answer to Question 8.

Page 1

8. The following are the activities of this unit since its formation on October 14, 1943 to the present date:

(1) Killing Japs and Seizing their Arms.

When this unit was organized, we had but 6 U.S. rifles (Model of 1917), 1 automatic rifle, 5 pistols and several hand grenades. We therefore concentrated our activity first on killing every Jap we met in remote places and seized their arms in order to strengthen our force. Thru this tactics, we had captured 3 Jap rifles and 1 Jap heavy machine gun. However, when this unit was placed under the command of Major Bernard L. Anderson, we were furnished with 20 Thompsons and 2 carbines thus making our stand more firm. To further strengthen our force, this unit was affiliated with the San Isidro and Cabanatuan units thru Major Anderson's order placing this 3 units of 1 battalion each under a Regimental Commander and naming the regiment Southern Nueva Ecija Sector.

(2) Espionage.

The pro-Japs were also our enemies. We had been closely watching for these misguided Filipinos, including the actions and behaviors of the Government officials. We had punished and reformed several Makapilis (formerly Ganaps) and spies of the Japanese.

(3) Stopped the Sale of Rice to Japs.

When the BIBA (which name was changed to RICOA) failed to purchase enough rice at the controlled price, the band was lifted. The Japs then including their Army and Navy went to this town to compete with the Filipinos by raising the price of this commodity and offering premiums in the form of clothes to the people who would sell rice. To prevent the people from selling rice to the Japs and to enable the people of the City of Manila and the non-producing rice provinces who were at that time suffering of starvation, we threatened the rice sellers. As a result, the Japs failed to buy rice in this community.

(4) Propaganda.

During the Japs occupation, the people never had any news from the United States except those placed in their papers. Their papers were one-sided and the speeches of the Filipino leaders were nothing but to show and convinced the people of the good intentions Japan had with this Islands, create ill feeling between the Filipinos and the Americans and the Might of the Japanese Empire. All radios were likewise reconditioned with the exceptions of those kept by some Guerrilla

units. To keep the morale of the people, we got news broadcasted by the United States from other Guerrilla Headquarters possessing radios and furnished copies of those news from the U. S. to the people.

(5) Furnishing Intelligent Reports to the GHQ.

In the middle part of December, 1944, the Japs were rushing the thrashing and the milling of the rice in this community. As we could do nothing to stop them - it being their practice to punish the whole town in case any of them would be killed and fearing that we may not be able to defend the whole town because of their numerical superiority and superiority in arms inasmuch that they have some tanks, cannons and armored cars stationed in this municipality during that time, we therefore send our report to Capt. Manzano, executive officer of Major Anderson, regarding their military objectives. We had furnished a map of this town indicating the military objectives. We had also recommended the bombing of the RICCOA which was then milling the rice of the Japs and the bombing or machine gunning by the U. S. planes of the rice threshers in the fields.

(6) Maintenance of Peace and Order.

Upon receipt of Pres. Osmeña's Proclamation calling on every Filipino to rally behind Gen. Mac Arthur's forces, we immediately asked the people to evacuate and stay away from the Japs. We designated their evacuation places and in there we maintained peace and order. Before the reorganization of the Municipal Government of this municipality, we also see to it that peace and order was maintained. We issued passes to law-abiding citizens of this community. We had attended the needs and complaints of the people concerning military and civil affairs. We also see to it that the laws of the Commonwealth Government were enforced and that the life and property of the people were protected. We had been patrolling the area covered by this unit frequently to be sure that there were no Japs around this town. We had killed and captured several Japanese soldiers and officers which were the remnants of the Japanese Army that scattered from the neighboring provinces and towns when the American Forces arrived. Those captured were being turned over immediately to the nearest American Forces.

(7) Fixing the Price of Prime Commodities.

Before the reorganization of the Municipal

Government, this unit had fixed the prices of prime commodities as most of these goods were being sold at exorbitant prices. Copies of those list had been posted in the market and other public places. Sometimes we had to supervise the sale of some goods in the market to stop the vendors from selling their goods at black market price.

## (8) Assistance Rendered U. S. Units by this Unit.

In response to Pres. Osamega's Proclamation urging all Guerrillas to rally with Gen. Mac Arthur's forces in order to lighten the burden of battle, we harassed the Japs by cutting their telegraph lines and machine gunning some of the trucks of the retreating Japanese Forces before the American Forces arrived in this town. This unit had furnished the informations desired by the advanced guards of the U. S. Army who came to this town. We had also assisted the CIC who used to come to our Headquarters frequently to get informations. We had also turned over to the CIC all papers taken from the Japanese. In addition to the aforementioned units of the U. S. Army we had assisted, we had also rendered assistance to the following units who requested assistance from this unit, to wit;
