1. An exhaustive search for the initial recognized rosters of the subject units for purpose of reconstruction for permanent record revealed the following information:

a. 100th Bn:

- (1) Recognized 3 Mar 1945 by letter, Headquarters USAFFE, dated 1 April 1945 - strength fifty (50).
- (2) Recognition date was revised to 9 January 1945, by letter, Headquarters USAFFE, dated 4 July 1945.
- (3) Letter, Hq AFWESPAC, dated 6 December 1945, subject, "Transmittal of Rosters," to C/S, AP, embodied the names of personnel of the 100th Bn, IGAF, into the roster of the 100th Inf Regt, IGAF and inclosed a roster of the 100th Inf Regt.
- (4) A check of the roster of the 100th Infantry Regiment, indicates that personnel of the 100th Battalion have been included therein.

b. 221st Squadron:

- (1) Recognized 18 Feb 1945 by letter, Headquarters, Sixth Army, dated 18 May 1945 - strength nine (9).
- (2) The nine (9) individuals, initially recognized as 221st Squadron, were later transferred to and are embodied in the recognized roster of Co M, 1st Regt, IGAF.

c. 102nd Pangasinan Sabotage & Demolition Squadron:

- (1) Recognized 25 Jan 1945 by letter, Headquarters USAFFE, dated 1 April 1945 - strength sixty (60).

- (2) Mr. Antonio Estrada, now employed in GAD, formerly personnel officer of District Hq, LGAF, stated that no recognized roster was ever published for the above unit but that its members had been transferred and are embodied in the recognized rosters of Hq PMA and the 100th Inf Regt, LGAF.

2. RECOMMENDATION:

In view of the fact that initial rosters cannot be located and that the personnel are listed in rosters of other recognized elements of LGAF, it is recommended that no rosters be reconstructed for the subject units in the strengths mentioned. It is further recommended that the total strength of recognized guerrilla units, recorded by GAD, be reduced by one hundred and nineteen (119), the initial recognized aggregate strength of the subject units.

6. The USAFFE Luzon Guerrilla Army Forces has never printed script of any kind, nor have any members of this unit received any pay from the time of its inception until the initial recognition of these units of the USAFFE Luzon

Guerrilla Army Forces, at which time they received current pay.

HISTORY

of the

102 Bautista, Pangasinan Sabotage & Demolition Sqdn
LUZON GUERRILLA ARMY FORCES(Under the over-all Command of Major)
(ROBERT B. LAPHAM)

- 1 Sept. 1942 - Lt. Teodulfo Quijano was released from the Jap Concentration Camp at Camp Del Pilar and stayed with his family for recovery for a period of about two (2) months at Dau, Pampanga, until he heard news of Col. Thorpe and other guerrilla leaders at Barrio Timbu, Angeles, Pampanga at the home of the Rodriguez family.
- 10 Oct. 1942 - Lt. Quijano personally contacted Col. Thorpe and Lt. Neylore, with the help of a guide named Talot Rodriguez, an ex-US Navy serviceman between barrios Manawali and Camachile, Angeles, Pampanga. Lt. Quijano was assigned at G-2 by Col. Thorpe.
- 23 Nov. 1942 - Quijano was attacked by his malignant malaria so his family brought him to his brother's home at Pasay, Rizal for treatment. On the train while enroute to Manila, Lt. Severino Alvarez, a trainee at the Phil. Army FA Training school at Camp Del Pilar under Lt. Quijano, then an instructor, came across Lt. Quijano and they talked about plans to form a guerrilla unit composed of Philippine Scouts and Philippine Army servicemen inducted into the USAFFE as well as former trainees incorporated into the Reserve Force of the FA.
- 1 Dec. 1942 - Lt. Severino Alvarez started organizing ex-servicemen of the USAFFE and civilian volunteers into the Old Gold Snipers' Company with the help of Lt. Rafael R. Diaz, a USAFFE officer.
- 24 Dec. 1942 - Lt. Quijano arrived at Bautista, Pangasinan from Manila
- 1 Jan. 1943 - A general meeting of all servicemen was called by Lt. Quijano at the residence of Lt. Rafael Diaz in Bautista, Pangasinan.
- 4 Jan. 1943 - Induction of all men recruited into the 3rd Pangasinan Sabotage & Demolition Squadron under the over-all Command of Major Robert B. Lapham by Lt. Quijano
- 5 - 14 Jan. '43 - Preliminary training of officers and men about Guerrilla warfare.
- 15-23 Jan '43 - Lt. Quijano was taken ill with malaria and was brought to San Lazaro Hospital for treatment, while the training of the Squadron was left in the command of Lt. Rafael Diaz.
- 24 Jan. 1943 - Received reports from operatives that the Japanese Military Police have suspected the existence of guerrilla activities in Bautista and therefore have sent thereat spies to verify, whereupon Lt. Diaz have ordered the temporary dispersal of the men, but intelligence work by operatives have been continued.
- 13 Mar 1943 - Japanese Military Police arrested Lts. Rafael Diaz, and Severino Alvarez, together with Capt. Pastor Lopez of Maj. Ramsey's guerrilla force and Pvt. Basilio Gabon, of our squadron as suspected guerrillas. Basilio Gabon was tortured at his home but was later released, whereas, Lts. Diaz and Alvarez were brought to the home of the

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- Favis family in Bautista where they were both subjected to torture together with Capt. Lopez, Later they were imprisoned and further tortured at the Japanese Kempetai garrison at Urdaneta, Pangasinan, but released on 31 March 1943. For the entire period since the two officers were arrested until 14 April, the entire squadron lay low in the face of the Jap Military Police's attempt to round up the entire squadron.
- 15 April 1943 - Lt. Alvarez went to Manila to report to Lt. Quijano about the activities and experiences of the squadron. Lt. Quijano ordered the regrouping of the squadron and the transfer of the Squadron Headquarters to Mangabed fisheries.
- 2 May 1943 - Lt. Quijano called a conference of all squadron officers at the new headquarters in Mangabed and gave instructions in sabotage and demolition with charges of dynamite.
- 3 -13 May '43 - Instruction of men in the use of dynamite for demolition
- 4 June 1943 - The CO ordered Lt. Alvarez, Corporal Quebral, Pvts. Quisora & Samson to look for more TNT, blasting caps, and fuze.
- 1 July 1943 - Corporal Quebral, et al recovered 1200 sticks of TNT 150 feet of fuze and 100 blasting caps from the cemetery at Bautista and near the old rice mill in the same town.
- 16 July 1943 - Actual demonstration of tamping and setting off of charges of TNT in Mangabed swamps, Lt. Quijano taking charge, with officers and NCO's of the squadron present in the demonstration.
- 17 July to 30 Sept 1943 - Continued training of squadron in various phases of military training and instruction. During this period subsistence for the men and officers consisted of the rice brought in by each individual from his home and fish from the fishery owned by several men from Poponto and the poblacion. No help in terms of food was obtained from the civilians.
- 1 October '43 - Lt. Quijano directed Lt. Padilla as an intelligence officer of the squadron to cover in his reports the activity of the Japanese, the Constabulary and other guerrilla units operating on the eastern side of our sector as well as to act as liaison officer with other friendly units. Lt. Alvarez was assigned liaison with units in Moncada and Paniqui, while S/Sgt. Pedro Medil maintained liaison with the guerrilla unit in Malasiqui, and Lt. Quijano himself maintained contact with (LGE HQ.)
- 25 Oct - 15 Nov 43 - Intelligence reports have constantly poured in at Hq from the operatives of the unit.
- 16 Nov-29 Dec 1943 - Resumed training of the unit.
- 4 Jan. 1944 - Lt. Quijano with Capt. Almerol and Escano went to Capt. Hunt's HQ with the new roster and report of Squadron activities. Mission accomplished.
- ~~XXXXXXXXXX~~ Lt. Padilla was recalled by Lt. Quijano, inducted and designated as officer-in-charge of demolition squad.
- 10 Jan 1944 - Lt. Padilla conducted instruction of the demolition squad in fuze setting, placement of charges and amount of TNT for different purposes and structures to be demolished in preparation for future missions.

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- 14 Jan 1944 - Conducted special instruction in anti-tank assaults with gasoline-filled bottles as per order of Capt. Ray C. Hunt Jr.
- 18 Jan 1944 - Order issued by Lt. Quijano to men to gather empty bottles and to obtain gasoline or alcohol and crude oil.
- 5 Feb 1944 - Actual demonstration of use and effectivity of gasoline and crude oil-filled bottles held in Barrio Visaya, Bautista, Pangasinan.
- 15 Feb 1944 - Lt. Alvarez with picked men was ordered by the CO to obtain gasoline or alcohol and crude oil from the Sugar Central in Paniqui, Tarlac.
- 25 Feb 1944 - Lt. Alvarez and men were able to secure 5-gallons of alcohol and little crude oil through a Sugar Central watchman.
- 26 Feb 1944 to 15 Mar 1944 - Intelligence operations were intensified and even ~~intensified~~ extended as far as Dagupan to check on rumors reaching headquarters that the Jap Military Police planned to zone Bautista.
- 1 April 44 - A Jap garrison was set up in Bautista and Moncada thus hindering the free activity of the unit.
- 15 April 44 - Made plans to attack the Jap garrison at Bautista but plans were not accomplished due to objection of the civilian population.
- 16 April 44 - Moved HQ to Manabong, Bayambang. All records were secured and kept. Men were ordered to disperse in the meantime.
- 1 May 1944 - Assemblage of all men and organized a runner system. Also designated assembly points.
- 15 May 1944 - Granted leave to farmer members for the planting season, until 30 June 1944. In the meanwhile, intelligence work was ordered to go on.
- July to August 1944 - Morale was low until 22 September 1944 when the men actually saw American Grumann Fighters' Planes flying over Bautista after the bombing of Manila and suburbs. Waves of planes flew over Bautista at about 2:00 P.M. amid the exultant cheering of the men.
- 1 Oct 1944 - Squadron was alerted to go to Baler but no further order was received from Capt. Hunt.
- 25 Oct 1944 - The Squadron HQ received news of the landing of American Liberating Forces in Leyte and also the successful landing of a submarine in Baler Bay. The news was disseminated to all the men of the Squadron and to the civilians in order to boost the morale.
- 1 Nov 1944 - Picked men of the squadron escorted Lt. Tomas Mayo of the AIB with Capt. Segundo Gazmin from Moncada, Tarlac to the HQ at Bautista thence to Olea, Malasiqui.
- 10 Dec 1944 - Selected men of the squadron under Lt. Alvarez accompanied Sgts. Palolan and Espiritu of the AIB to deliver a radio set from Moncada to the Hq at Bautista, then to Olea, Malasiqui. Movements were made from midnight till dawn. Safe passage was made notwithstanding the presence of a Jap garrison in Moncada and in Bautista. Mission was accomplished.
- 27 Dec 1944 - Men under Lt. Alvarez successfully demolished the wooden railroad bridge between Poponto and Bautista.
- 28 Dec 1944 - The same group succeeded in removing a rail between Poponto, Bautista and Moncada, Tarlac to prevent the use

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- 29 Dec 1944 - of the railroad by the Japanese Army.
Lt. Padilla and Cpl Quebral and men removed the dynamite from its hiding place to a secret place near the HQ and readied it for use.
- 1 - 2 Jan 45 - (midnight) Lt. Alvarez was ordered to escort Capt. Justiniano of Manila to insure his safe passage to Moncada from Bautista.
- 3 Jan 1945 - The following Officers stayed overnight at the Hq in Bautista: Capt. Segundo L. Gazmin; Lt. Claudio Tamayo alias Lt. Tomas Mayo; and Sgt. Sabado, H.
- 4 Jan 1945 - Runner from Capt. Ray C. Hunt Jr. arrived at Hq to inform the coming of Capt. Soniega with 18 men.
- 5 Jan 1945 - Preparations were made to blow up the railroad bridge at Bayambang.
- 6 Jan 1945 - At 3:00 PM the same railroad bridge was bombed by American planes thus causing abandonment of the plans made by the squadron.
- 7 Jan 1945 - Order was issued from HQ calling all men to stand by for immediate operations.
- 9 Jan 1945 - Assembling and briefing of men for and in preparation for operations with the American Liberation Forces.
- 10 Jan 1945 - By order of the CO, Lt. Avelino C. Padilla, Lt. Severino Alvarez and Cpl Maximino Novida went to contact the first American forces that landed in Lingayen. At 6:00 o'clock that evening the CO of the 3rd Bn 148 Regt, 37th Div 6th Army at Barric Dumpay, San Carlos, Pangasinan. Lt. Anderson, S-2 of the Bn conducted them to the Regimental CP at the Agricultural High School in San Carlos.
- 11 Jan 1945 - The contacting party submitted to Lt. Col. Smith, Regt 148 Regt, 37th Div the intelligence reports compiled by the HQ. Lt. Col. Smith instructed the HQ thru the contact party to return everyday with reports about the enemy. In the afternoon, the contact party returned with a Reconnaissance patrol under Lt. Anderson to Bayambang. Lt. Avelino C. Padilla with Sgt. Samuel Ring Jr. were WIA in an ambushade by seven (7) Japs at the southern approach of the Railroad bridge between Bayambang and Bautista. In this encounter, (4) four Japanese soldiers were killed to the credit of the squadron. Men of the squadron removed the wounded officer (Lt. Padilla).
- 12 Jan 1945 - Lt. Quijano and Sgt. Francisco Palma with men of the squadron brought Lt. Padilla to Bayambang from where he was brought to the Hospital by advanced units of the 37th Division.
- 16 - 23 Jan 1945 - Elements of the squadron were assigned bridge guards between Poponto and Moncada.
- 24 Jan 1945 - Reported to Capt. Ray C. Hunt Jr. at Manaoag, Pangasinan
- 25 Jan 1945 - Unit was attached for duty with 64th FA Bn, 25th Div by order of Capt. Hunt at Binalonan, Pangasinan. 1 Off and 11 men were attached to the 64th FA while 11 men were with the 89th FA Bn. All the rest were in reserve at Manaoag, Pangasinan except Lt. Padilla who was in the Detachment of Patients at the 24th Field Hospital at Birmaley, Pangasinan.
- 26 Jan to 26 June 1945 - The officers and men of the unit that were called to active duty have been on duty and participated in all operations of the 64th FA from Binalonan, Pangasinan thru

- Umingan, Lupao, Rizal in Nueva Ecija, the old Spanish Trail, Pantabangan, Caraglaan, Puncan until Aritao, in Nueva Vizcaya province, Luzon.
- 22 Mar 1945 - S/Sgt Pedro Medil was KIA at Puncan, Nueva Vizcaya
- 7 Mar 1945 - Lt. Padilla was released from the Hospital but was granted leave of absence by Lt. Quijano.
- 25 June 1945 - Pfc Juan Quia was wounded in line of duty at Aritao, Nueva Vizcaya by accidental fire from a .50 cal MG.
- 25 June 1945 - Lt. Padilla reported for duty after his leave of absence at Aritao, NV. & asgnd Actg CO of Squadron
- 26-27 June 1945 - Unit was attached for duty with the 120th FA Bn, 32nd Div at San Francisco, Aritao, NV.
- 28-29 June 1945 - Unit was attached for duty with the 3rd Bn 126th Inf Regt 32nd Div and assigned to patrol the mountains southwest of San Francisco, Aritao, NV
- 30 June to 6 July 1945 - Unit was attached to QM Co 32nd Div at Aritao after being relieved from attachment to the 3rd Bn 126th Inf.
- 7 July to 15 Sept 45 - Sqn 102 was incorporated into the ~~Berline~~ Co 2nd Regt LGAF per GO #1 Hq LGAF dated 29 June 1945 and attached to the 128th Inf 32nd Div at Bayombong, NV. After the regimentation the unit ceased to be known as Squadron 102 inasmuch as it has been absorbed into the Hq Service Co, 2nd Regt. LGAF. Lt. Quijano was assigned CO of the 2nd Bn., 2nd Regt LGAF and Lt. Padilla was assigned Asst S-3.
- 16 Sept to 15 Oct 45 - The 2nd Regt LGAF of which the men of Sqn 102 are a part was attached to the 475th AAA AW Bn. at Bayombong, NV
- 16 Oct to 4 Nov 45 - The 2nd Regt LGAF was reld from attachment with 475th AAA AW Bn and attached for duty to 14th Inf at Bayombong, NV
- 4 October 1945 - The Philippine Scouts in the Squadron were ordered to report to the 29th Repl Depot APO 238 thus were considered losses of the unit.
- 5 Nov. 1945 - The entire 2nd Regt LGAF was transferred from Bayombong to Bacnotan, La Union and attached to the USAFIP-NL.
- 6 Nov 45 to 26 Jan 46 - Absorbed into the Repl & Cas. Bn USAFIP-NL at Bacnotan, La Union from where the men were finally discharged.

He is an excellent disciplinarian and leader and succeeded in organizing the local defense for the battalion in such an excellent manner that night infiltration attacks by Japanese were never successful. Captain Quijano has the physical stamina and the military bearing necessary in an Army Officer and has an excellent knowledge of weapons and their employment, especially small arms. The ability and excellent work shown by Captain Quijano while with our unit indicate to me that he is capable of holding the rank of Captain and that he has the ability, stamina, force, and good judgement necessary in an Army Officer.


