is therefore very great. His battalion is doing excellent work. As a matter of fact it was his battalion that caught two Japanese alive. He was able to arrest over 40 Japanese spies or pro-Jap elements, the Makapilis. Lt. Belanay is the Supreme Commander of the UCAB in Baler, an organization which controlled the town of Baler. From the UCAB were formed two battalions of this regiment.

4. First Lieutenant Ricardo A. Cariño altho joined the 103rd Regiment only on April 15, 1944, has done much for my organization. He has been always with me during the hard days at Dibut. In the two major encounters of my regiment with the enemy when we killed over 200 of the Japanese, Lt. Cariño was the Chief Operations Officer. He is the Commanding Officer of the 2nd Rifle Battalion consisting of 662 officers and enlisted men. From his battalion came the toughest fighters of my regiment.

✓ 5. First Lieutenant Valentin Cervantes is another old-timer guerrilla and organizer and founder of the 103rd Regiment. He is a silent man but a hard worker. He is the Commanding Officer of the 3rd Rifle Battalion consisting of 662 officers and enlisted men. His sector covers the towns of Baler and Gasiguran. This is the toughest place. He has made excellent work. He has cleared the town of Gasiguran. His men were even able to gather intelligence reports from Isabela. In the two major encounters of this regiment with the enemy where over 200 Japanese were killed, he was the Assistant Chief Operations Officer.

6. First Lieutenant Godofredo Sta. Iglesia is the Battalion Commander of the 4th (Rainbow) Battalion consisting of 662 officers and enlisted men. It was his battalion that contacted for us the Liberating Forces. He has to travel a wide strip of no man's land to contact the enemy. A letter of appreciation a copy of which is hereto attached speaks clearly of his activities. This letter came from the CIC which first came to Rizal. His men are very active. They bring to headquarters the heads of Japanese they killed. The Americans exchange them with rifles.

It should be stated that Lt. Sta. Iglesia is a Bataan defender and was already a first lieutenant in the regular U. S. Army at the outbreak of the war. He has to his credit over 25 years of service in the Philippine Scouts, U. S. Army. Prior and at the outbreak of the war, he was the Chief Clerk, General Staff Section, Headquarters Philippine Division until he was called to active duty as First Lieutenant of the U. S. Army.

II. In this connection, it may be stated that other outfits of the LCAF with only two or three hundred men have two or three captains whereas my regiment of over 3,328 officers and men has only one captain. Other squadron commanders of only two or three hundred men are captains in rank whereas

I. In submitting the promotional appointments of the Officers listed below, I took into consideration as the sole basis of their promotion nothing but their efficiency, their conscientiousness in the performance of their duties, the responsibilities of their positions and the work or activities they have already rendered and are now performing.

1. First Lieutenant Esteban Alipio as my Executive Officer is second in Command to me. The responsibility of his position demands his promotion in rank. He has been guerrilla leader since he came from Bataan. His name as a guerrilla leader or officer is widely known. Many new comers to LGAF are now captains but Lt. Alipio an old-timer guerrilla is still a lieutenant. It is only equitable and just that he be promoted.

2. First Lieutenant Gasimiro Nolasco as my Adjutant and Plans and Training Officer is the third ranking officer in my regiment. He is the technical man in my organization and his vast experience in administration has given much profit to my outfit. His Office is the nerve center from which I control more than 3,328 officers and enlisted men. He is also the headquarters commandant or Commanding Officer of the Headquarters and Headquarters Battalion. The Headquarters and Headquarters Battalion in fact is a rifle battalion. It is composed of five (5) rifle companies of 127 men each or a total of 662 officers and enlisted men. The responsibility of Lt. Nolasco is very great. He goes to the front lines. In fact in the two major encounters of this outfit with the enemy where over 200 Japanese killed, I sent him to personally supervise the line and check up the boys. He is an old-timer guerrilla and his promotion is very fitting and just.

3. First Lieutenant Isidoro Belanay is one of the founders of the 103rd Regiment. In spite of the vicissitudes of time, he has stuck to the guerrilla. He is the Battalion Commander of the First Battalion of this Regiment. His sector are the towns of Laur and Sanjeron where he has a rifle battalion composed of 662 officers and enlisted men. In view of the fact that he is at the sector, he exercises a very wide scope of discretion. His responsibility

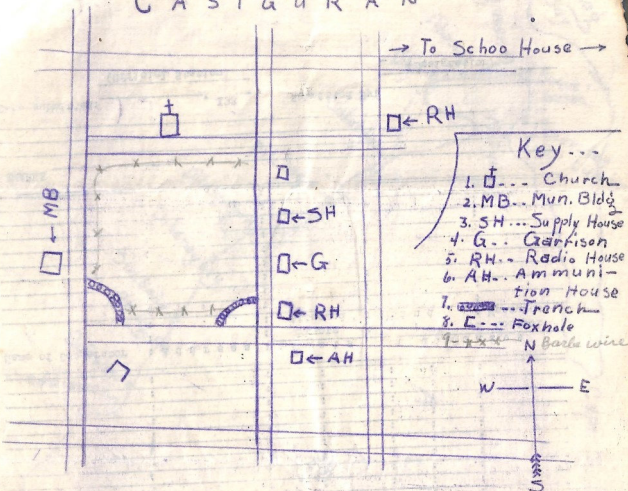

I. ENEMY :

1. DISPOSITION AND STRENGTH:

On Feb. 18 I ordered Pvt. Ares, Alfredo, enlisted man of the Intelligence Section, to spy upon the Japs who fled to Dime-asi, with two Ilongots with him to act as his guide. He reported to me that while he was at Ditali he came to meet two (2) Ilongots from Dinadiawan. He then asked the Ilongots for some information but they can't tell anything about the Japs at Casiguran except that they informed him (Ares) that he will proceed to Dinadiawan to meet someone who had just arrived from Casiguran the next day when the Ilongot left Dinadiawan. So Pvt. Ares, Alfredo proceeded to Dinadiawan with his two (2) Ilongot guides arriving at the Dinadiawan of the following day. He was then informed by the man that; in Ditinagian there are forty (40) Japs heavily armed with rifles, trench mortars and machine gun of 50 caliber. He was also informed about the positions and numbers of foxholes; position of the garrison, observation post, guard house etc. (map herewith attached) while at Casiguran there are at least (30) Japs armed with weapons same as stated above. The only route that connect Casiguran and Ditinagian runs from Casiguran passing through Galabgan and then down to Ditinagian. Machine Gun of 50 caliber is mounted at the beach of Ditinagian. So far the man whom Pvt. Ares, Alfredo had interviewed with is not sure of that mine might be planted at the Casiguran water, and also indoubt of the presence of pillboxes in the areas occupied by the Japs.

The following day after his (Pvt Ares) interview with the man he started for Dipaculao arriving on February 21 at 6:00 oclock P.M.
