2 - Letter of non-recognition
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Report on "Squadron 202, Luzon Guerrilla
Army Forces (LGAF)"

1. 1st Lts. K. Neubauer and E. Sta Romana proceeded to Cabanatuan, Nueva Ecija, on 17 February 1947, to investigate Squadron 202, Luzon Guerrilla Army Forces (LGAF).

2. ALLEGED HISTORY: (See attached unit file)

3. FINDINGS:

a. The following persons were interviewed and their statements are reflected in the findings:

b. Record of service was not substantiated by sufficient acceptable evidence. The Commanding Officer of Squadron 202 could not present any evidence that the Squadron assisted the Liberating Forces which operated in the area. There are three affidavits in the unit file, from three guerrilla leaders, certifying that Regino Bobila was the Squadron Commander, but there is no mention of any activity of Squadron 202 during the occupation and liberation period. When interviewed, the commanding officer of Squadron 202 claimed guerrilla activities which were also claimed by other guerrilla units operative in the same area. The unit's activity was limited to spying, propaganda, counter propaganda and intelligence within the barrio.

c. The unit was not maintained satisfactorily in the field in opposition to the enemy. All the members interviewed were resident of Barrio Bagong Sicat, 7 kilometers away from the POW concentration camp at Cabanatuan. The civilians interviewed who resided near that Barrio, disclosed that the residents of Bagong Sicat were peaceful, and that they had never

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heard of the Squadron under Regino Bobila. The investigating officers concluded that Regino Bobila initiated this roster after his induction by Major Juan Pajota but remained passive throughout the occupation and liberation.

d. Activities of the unit did not contribute materially to the eventual defeat of the enemy. About 60 percent of the members had been sick of malaria during the occupation and liberation. This, in part, caused the unit to be a passive guerrilla organization. They maintained peace and order within their Barrio and did not oppose the enemy. The commanding officer was sick during the liberation and did not command the Squadron at that time. During the liberation of POW's in the Concentration Camp, about five (5) men from Squadron 202 joined the command of Major J. Pajota. About sixteen (16) men from Squadron 202 joined Anderson's Unit and were subsequently recognized.

e. Performance of the unit did not indicate adequate control by its leaders, because the members joined other guerrilla units. The CO was sick during the liberation and the Squadron was disorganized.

f. The unit did not show satisfactory continuity of activity and organization. The commanding officer of this Squadron claimed to have been inducted into LGAF in 1942 and formed his organization with 115 men. There is no evidence that the Squadron, under the command of Regino Bobila, was engaged in opposing the enemy at any time.

g. Members of this unit did not devote their entire effort to military activities in the field to the exclusion of normal civilian occupation and family obligations. The members of Squadron 202 are residents of a small Barrio, who lived with their families and engaged in guerrilla activities occasionally. They apparently lived at their homes supporting their families by means of farming and other civilian pursuits.

h. No useful purpose will be accomplished by further investigation of this unit. There are no members worthy of recognition and no casualty roster was submitted.

4. POLITICAL ASPECTS:

This unit does not appear to have any political affiliations or aspirations.

5. RECOMMENDATION:

It is recommended that the 115 men of Squadron 202, LGAF under the command of Lt Regino Bobila, be not favorably considered for recognition.

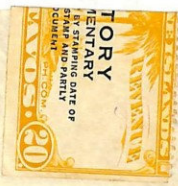

The Commanding General has directed that you be informed that the Squadron 202, Luzon Guerrilla Army Forces (LGAF) purporting to be a guerrillas organization under your nominal control, is not favorably considered for recognition as an element of the Philippine Army.

A set of general requirements for guerrilla recognition, established by General MacArthur during the liberation of the Philippines, has been used as a guide in considering the record of this unit. After careful investigation and full consideration of all substantiating records and testimony of witnesses having pertinent knowledge, recognition of this guerrilla unit is not deemed to be warranted because of reasons mentioned below:

The unit was not maintained satisfactorily in the field in opposition to the enemy.
