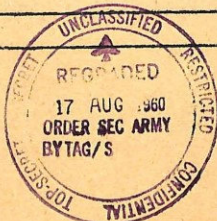

1. An exhaustive search for the initial recognized rosters of the subject units for purpose of reconstruction for permanent record revealed the following information:

a. 100th Bn:

- (1) Recognized 3 Mar 1945 by letter, Headquarters USAFFE, dated 1 April 1945 - strength fifty (50).
- (2) Recognition date was revised to 9 January 1945, by letter Headquarters USAFFE, dated 4 July 1945.
- (3) Letter, Hq AFWESPAC, dated 6 December 1945, subject, "Transmittal of Rosters," to C/S, AP, embodied the names of personnel of the 100th Bn, IGAF, into the roster of the 100th Inf Regt, IGAF and inclosed a roster of the 100th Inf Regt.
- (4) A check of the roster of the 100th Infantry Regiment, indicates that personnel of the 100th Battalion have been included therein.

b. 221st Squadron:

- (1) Recognized 18 Feb 1945 by letter, Headquarters, Sixth Army, dated 18 May 1945 - strength nine (9).
- (2) The nine (9) individuals, initially recognized as 221st Squadron, were later transferred to and are embodied in the recognized roster of Co M, 1st Regt, IGAF.

c. 102nd Pangasinan Sabotage & Demolition Squadron:

- (1) Recognized 25 Jan 1945 by letter, Headquarters USAFFE, dated 1 April 1945 - strength sixty (60).

SUBJECT: Report on Reconstruction of Rosters of 100th Bn,
221st Squadron and 102nd Pangasinan Sabotage and
Demolition Squadron, LGAF.

- (2) Mr. Antonio Estrada, now employed in GAD,
formerly personnel officer of District Hq,
LGAF, stated that no recognized roster was
ever published for the above unit but that its
members had been transferred and are embodied
in the recognized rosters of Hq PMA and the
100th Inf Regt, LGAF.

2. RECOMMENDATION:

In view of the fact that initial rosters cannot be
located and that the personnel are listed in rosters of other
recognized elements of LGAF, it is recommended that no rosters
be reconstructed for the subject units in the strengths men-
tioned. It is further recommended that the total strength of
recognized guerrilla units, recorded by GAD, be reduced by
one hundred and nineteen (119), the initial recognized aggregate
strength of the subject units.

Indicates that activation or organization orders are not available in the files of the USAFFE Luzon Guerrilla Army Forces, but that references to the unit in question appeared in orders during the month stated.

There is no relationship between Squadron 206-A mentioned in paragraph 2c and Squadron 206-A mentioned in paragraph 2e.

Elements of Squadron 320 were transferred to Provisional Regiment, Philippine Scouts, commanded by Lt Col Edgar Wright, Jr. Provisional Regiment, Philippine Scouts was not an LGAF unit but was a Luzon Guerrilla Force unit under the overall command of Col Gyles Merrill, USA..

Although these units did not join LGAF until dates indicated, they are considered revised with LGAF to the indicated dates of organization for administrative purposes.

3. No commissioned ranks above that of Captain were authorized prior to 30 September 1943 with the exception of those USAFFE officers in the rank of captain and above. Subsequent to 30 September 1943, ranks of officers commensurate with their command or staff functions and based on the table of organization of the U. S. Army Infantry Division, less one grade, were authorized.

b. Casualties included and recognized in a separate casualty roster will be entitled to pay whether or not their names appear on the original rosters of the USAFFE Luzon Guerrilla Army Forces.

5. All civilians recruited by or inducted into the USAFFE Luzon Guerrilla Army Forces (LGAF) subsequent to 20 May 42 are considered to have become members of the Philippine Army, serving with the Armed Forces of the United States with entitlement to pay subsequent to that date.

6. The USAFFE Luzon Guerrilla Army Forces has never printed script of any kind, nor have any members of this unit received any pay from the time of its inception until the initial recognition of those units of the USAFFE Luzon

Report of Investigation on Squadrons 1, 111, 206,
221, 265, 269, 267, 300, 311 Luzon Guerrilla
Army Forces (LGAF)

1. On 10 June 1946, Capt John O. Keider reviewed the records and pertinent documents of Squadrons 1, 111, 206, 221, 265, 269, 267, 300, 311 Luzon Guerrilla Army Forces (LGAF) to determine whether or not the supplementary rosters of these units were worthy of recognition. The units were previously recognized for liberation service with the exception of Squadron 300, 96, of whose members were recognized as members of 1st Regt, LGAF and 34 of whose members received current Army pay but were not included in the recognized roster of any LGAF unit.

2. ALLEGED HISTORY:

No useful purpose will be served in discussing the history of units which have been recognized. However, it may be stated that LGAF was composed of numerous squadrons during the occupation period. When a squadron had been recruited to a strength which made it difficult to employ satisfactorily it was divided by order of the CO, LGAF to become two squadrons, each being given numerical designations. These squadrons were attached piecemeal to US Army Forces during the early days of the liberation, when and where needed. In the latter part of February 1945 many of the squadrons were consolidated to become the 1st Regt, LGAF, companies of which were composed of 115 men under the pre-war Philippine Army T/O. At this time those squadron members who were in excess to the requirements of the regiment were discharged and returned to their homes, though they performed service in attachment to US Army units prior to their discharge. This action resulted in non-recognition for the discharged members inasmuch as their names could not be included in rosters submitted for recognition purposes because they were no longer with the unit with which they had been previously attached to US Army units. Reasons why those listed on the attached supplementary rosters should be awarded recognition for service as well as reasons why they were not included in strength rosters submitted for recognition during the liberation period will be treated in this report.

3. FINDINGS:

a. No field investigation was deemed necessary after a careful review of available evidence. Statements of the following former LGAF officers are reflected in the findings:

Major Robert B. Lapham - Former CO, LGAF
Lt Dionisio V Lucas - (PA), Former Asst Adj, 1st Regt,
LGAF

Lt Antonio Estrada - Former Asst Adj, LCAF
Maj Antonio Hernandez - Former Sector Comdr Eastern
Pang. & Former Bn CO, 1st Bn,
1st Regt, LCAF.

b. The record of service for those listed on the attached supplementary rosters was substantiated by sufficient acceptable evidence. Though documentary evidence is lacking excepting dates of service shown on rosters dated 1944 and 1945, it is believed from verbal testimony of LCAF officers and the inclosed certificate of Maj Lapham that the following is true:

(1) Squadron 1, LCAF 23 additional men have been presented for recognition. This squadron came under overall LCAF command on 1 May 1944 and was active through out the occupation and liberation, periods. 23 members of the squadron were not recognized because they were not present with the squadron during liberation attachment. Several had been wounded during fighting immediately prior to the liberation when an attack order was published by Hq LCAF. (Incl 1) (FO No. 4, Hq LCAF dtd 4 January 1945). Others were ill and could not take part in liberation fighting as a result of field activity prior to the landing at Lingayen Gulf of US Army Forces.

(2) Squadron 111 was formed by Maj Lapham in May 1942 and remained active through the occupation and liberation. 59 members were not recognized during the liberation having been released at their own request when Squadron 111 was absorbed into the 1st Regt LCAF in February 1945. All of those members released at their own request had been attached to US Army units prior to release but were no longer present when the Squadron was recognized as part of the 1st Regt, LCAF. The attachment was to the 6th Division from 28 January 1945 to 7 February 1945.

(3) Squadron 206 was formed by Germiniano de Leon, private, Philippine Scouts in July 1942 by authority of Major (then 1st Lt) Robert B. Lapham. Late in 1944 it became squadron 206 and 206-A having been divided when it grew too large to be handled as a single squadron. Squadron 206 was attached to the 112th Cav Regt, 1st Cavalry Division from 31 January to 15 Feb. 1945 during which time they took part in the battle for Manila. When released from attachment, Squadron 206 reported back to Hq LCAF at Guimba Nueva Ecija and was made a part of the 1st Regt LCAF then undergoing training. Part of the Squadron was attached to the 6th, 25th and 32nd Inf Div. 26 January 1945 to 15 February 1945, 22 of these men were never recognized nor paid for their services to the US Divisions operating in Nueva Ecija. 16 of these 22 men were discharged as excess to needs when Squadron 206 incorporated into 1st Regt LCAF while 6 others reported back to duty with the Philippine Army, having previously been USAFFE or Philippine Scouts.

(4) Squadron 221 was formed as a squadron in October 1944, having been previously a detachment directly under command of Capt Harry MacKenzie, Ex O, LGAF. 25 members were not recognized for liberation services though they had been attached to the first Cavalry Brigade from 31 January to 3 March 1945 and took part in the brigades' advance from Guimba, N.E. to Manila. These 25 were disbanded when squadron 221 was absorbed into the 1st Regt as excess to the needs of the regiment and consequently their names were not included on the original roster submitted for recognition although they had performed service during the liberation. Some were Ex-USAFFE and reported to military control before a recognition roster was submitted by Hq LGAF.

(5) Squadron 265 was formed in 1944 from elements of squadron 269 and men who had formerly been under Capt Charles Cushing in Eastern Pangasinan as Squadron 108. Two (2) men of the unit were not present when the unit was recognized with the 25th Division having been discharged at their own request. They had served with the unit when it was attached to the 1st Infantry Regiment, 6th Division from 21 January 1945 to 4 February 1945.

(6) Squadron 269 was formed late in 1942 from elements of Squadron 111 which had that time grown too large to handle administratively and tactically under conditions then obtaining. Squadron 269 was a mounted squadron during a part of the occupation and was made up of members from the same town, Umingan, Pangasinan. 5 men were not recognized with the squadron for service during the liberation of Pangasinan though they had been attached to the 25th Div. US Army. This attachment was from 19 January 1945 to 8 February 1945. The unrecognized members were discharged at their own request when Squadron 269 was absorbed into 1st Bn, 1st Regt, LGAF in the latter part of February 1945 and were not present when the roster was submitted for recognition.

(7) Squadron 267 was formed in October 1944 from elements of Squadron 207 which at that time was divided into two squadrons and available arms distributed equally between the squadrons. Squadron 267 was attached to the 63rd Inf. 6th Div. US Army from 4 February 1945 to 14 February 1945 and to the 622d Ordnance Ammunition Company, 6th Div. from 15 February 1945 to 14 March 1945. Squadron 267 was absorbed into the 2nd Bn, 1st Regt, LGAF in late February 1945 and its roster submitted for recognition. 5 men of the squadron who were attached during the 4-14 February 1945 period and 16 men who were attached during the 15 Feb-March 1945 period were not listed on the roster submitted for recognition in April 1945. The two groups, after release from attachment were excess to the needs of the 2nd Bn, 1st Regt, LGAF and were discharged. They were not present with the unit when its roster was submitted for recognition and therefore were not included on the roster.

(8) Squadron 300 was formed in July 1942 by Alfonso Echevarre, former private 26th Cav (PS) by authority of Major (then Lt) Lapham. The squadron was active throughout the occupation and liberation periods. Squadron 300 was attached to the 20th Inf, 6th Div, US Army during the Lupao San Jose-Munoz, N.E. fighting from 28 January to 7 February 1945. 9 men of squadron 300 who were attached during this period were not recognized for their services. Squadron 300 was absorbed into the 1st Regt LGAF late in February 1945. The 9 men not recognized were discharged as surplus at that time and were not included on the roster submitted for recognition.

(9) Squadron 311 was formed as an independent unit in Sept 1942. The CO contacted Lt Albert A Short, Dist CO, N.E., in Feb 1943 and his squadron was made a part of LGAF operating during the occupation and liberation periods. The squadron was attached at various times to a number of American Units. During the operations of the 6th Div, US Army in the Lupao - San Jose Talavera Munoz, N.E. area the squadron was attached to 1st Regt of the division from 30 January 1945 to 9 February 1945. 10 men of the squadron who were attached during this period were not recognized for their services. Squadron 311, after being released by the 6th Div became a part of the 128th Prov Bn, 32nd Division and took part in the fighting on the Villa Verde trail from San Manuel, Pangasinan to Santa Fe, Nueva Viscaya. The 10 men previously unrecognized had been discharged at their own request prior to the Villa Verde campaign and were not included on the roster submitted for recognition because they were not present at that time.

c. The requirements of the five basic points for guerrilla recognition have been met by the LGAF squadrons with which this report is concerned. The previous recognition of the squadrons during the liberation, while actually in the field is adequate proof of service.

d. During the period of liberation all recognitions were for actual attachment to US Army Forces then active in campaigns on Luzon. Guerrillas receiving recognition must have been present with their units at the time that the unit roster was submitted for recognition. Those bona fide guerrillas who had rendered service to US Army Forces prior to the submission of rosters for recognition for services rendered but who were not present with their guerrilla unit when the roster was compiled could not be included. Therefore they were neither paid nor recognized for service which had been rendered prior to the recognition of the unit if they were not actually present with the unit when rosters were submitted. It is believed that the 178 men with whom this report is concerned were in this category and that they should be recognized for services actually rendered to US Army units or for services occurring immediately prior to the

landing when LGAP squadrons actively took the field against the Japanese. Injuries or sickness occurring as a result of the latter action had precluded their attachment to US Army units.

e. Major Lapham and LGAP staff officers carefully scrutinized and screened the attached rosters and verified the services and ranks of the members listed thereon, as the ranks held by them immediately prior to discharge or separation due to sickness or wounds. Major Lapham has recommended that members on the attached rosters be favorably considered for recognition (Incl 2).

f. All worthy members of squadrons concerned have been included on the roster. A separate casualty roster screened by Major Lapham will be submitted to Casualty Section, GAD, with a recommendation that bona fide casualties be recognized.

4. POLITICAL ASPECTS:

There are no political affiliations or aspirations evidenced by these unit members.

5. RECOMMENDATIONS:

It is recommended that the supplementary rosters of Squadrons listed below in an aggregate strength of 175 be favorably considered for recognition for the periods set opposite the squadron designations, both dates inclusive.

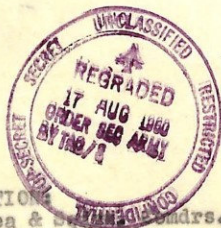

The curtains of liberty and freedom was rung down in these benighted Islands with the fall of Bataan on April 9, 1942 and shortly thereafter of Corregidor on May 2, 1942. Japan's imperial army had secured its' foothold on these trampled shores and with overwhelming might and main crushed the last vestige of organized defense by the USAFFE forces. There was so much heroism and strategy in that defense unparalleled in this side of the Pacific. Nevertheless, the most tragic chapter of Philippine history was then written. What remained of the brave stalwart defenders of the Islands, of the cream of the Filipino youth and American regulars all withered with hunger and disease were herded and forced to the rank humiliating ritual of the death march from the fields of battle to the filth and emptiness of O'Donnell there to die and languish in defeat. A full dress aggression was consummated and once more a nation weaned with the ways of democracy must perforce kowtow to the whims of the conqueror. Japan had expanded further south and west and secured her gains in the Pacific. Succor and effective aid was then a very far cry from the American mainland. General MacArthur betook himself to Australia and the then late President Quezon established himself in Washington there to begin the fight anew. Democracy in the Philippines was a total blackout.

Against this background, grapevine activity in the Philippines surreptitiously grew and expanded throughout the length and breadth of the Archipelago to carry on the battle that was left out in Bataan and Corregidor. It is the natural reaction of an oppressed people seeking expression in open defiance to to ignominy's wrought out by aggression. Japan had succeeded in forcing her might over the Filipino people but never had she succeeded in crushing their spirit, hence the resistance movement.

The history of Squadron 221 is an eloquent manifestation of that spirit of undaunted patriotism by a group of men who vowed to defy the enemy and all that it stood for. Its origin is localized in the northern towns of Nueva Ecija, the rice granary of the Philippines, under the overall command of a brave American regular who successfully evaded capture of the enemy, Major Robert B. Lapham, AUS, commanding the Luzon Guerrilla Army Forces, Nueva Ecija Military Area. The Squadron distinguished itself in guerrilla warfare in this part of the country.

In writing the history of this Squadron, it is indispensable to narrate the guerrilla career of the man whose leadership, courage and undaunted patriotism is responsible in giving name and significance to this particular group. This man is Captain Alberto P. Espiritu, a layman from the rank and file of an oppressed population who rose and distinguished himself an able leader and commander of Squadron 221.

On 25 September 1942, Capt. A.P. Espiritu, then Commanding Officer of Squadron 221, reported for duty to Capt. J. C. Serafica, then Commanding Officer of Squadron 207, to initiate himself for the first time in the cyclonic and tempestuous career of a guerrilla life with the rank of sergeant. At that time the guerrilla organization was rearing its hunted head under the spiting vigilance of the enemy punitive forces and traitors of the cause. Those were dark and fugitive days and nights for the haunted patriots of the National Cause.

On October, 1942, he was assigned to do some intelligence work by Capt. Harry McKenzie, Executive Officer of the Luzon Guerrilla Army Forces. Resourcefulness, courage and efficiency won him the commission of Third Lieutenant. This promotion was effected on February 5th, 1943 by Capt. Harry McKenzie and duly approved by Major Robert B. Lapham.

Gradually but inevitably, because of his inherent ability and proficiency in coping with the risky and trying routine of guerrilla activity, Lt. A. P. Espiritu was fast zooming up into a noted guerrilla figure so much so that on 25 May, 1943, he was promoted to the rank of Second Lieutenant to command the Headquarter's unit which has then a strength of about a handful of men. That provided for the first time the nucleus of Squadron 22,.

Then again on 1st September, 1943, Lt. Espiritu was made full-pledged First Lieutenant and as Commanding Officer of the same Headquarter's Unit. Writing its name in a field full of concerted action, this Unit, aside from its duty to the populace to raise their morale and to keep peace and order, had made several encounters with the combined Japanese and Constabulary forces. The first major encounter was made at Abar 1st, San Jose, Nueva Ecija on May 25th, 1944. The Unit in this engagement gave vent to its pent-up hatred against the enemy and traitors of the country. The enemy suffered one man dead and five wounded while the Unit suffered mournfully the loss of Sergeant Sofronio Atilano who nevertheless exulted inspiration at his death in brilliant action.

Sergeant Guillermo Alvendia, then PFC, at this engagement suffered four bullet wounds about his body which fortunately were not fatal. Against the same enemies, the Unit took up the second major engagement at Sarangay of the same town and province on May 30th, 1944. The enemy felt the brunt of the Unit's savage fury causing again on them several casualties. Again the Unit regretted the loss of Sergeant Pacifico Banez who also died in brilliant action. In both of these encounters, it is worthwhile mentioning and noting on record the commendable and unusual courage, tact and bravery of all the men of the Unit while in action.

Finally on December 1st, 1944, the Headquarters Unit by virtue of a correspondence dated December, 1944 from General Headquarters, Nueva Ecija Military Area, has been turned or converted into the so-called Squadron 221. With its efficient staff of able Officers and brave men consisting of two hundred raring and spirited young blood of an outraged nation, considerable arms and ammunitions brought down from Depot Bay, Baler, Quezon, the Squadron has had the finishing touches of a well organized Military Unit. Worthy of its name and christening it with the filthy blood of the enemy, the Squadron as a Combat Unit, upon order, struck at once at the enemy on the 5th, 9th and 10th of January, 1945, at Abar 2nd, Ca-anawan and Sto. Ninio Iro, all of San Jose, Nueva Ecija, respectively. The Squadron in these successive attacks inflicted three deaths and many wounded in the enemy side, wrecked six transport trucks and one automobile and was able to withdraw without any casualty.

These activities of the Squadron drew the following commendations from the central command:

The whole month of December 1944 was characterized with numerous raids and night patrols against the enemy who were then in systematic withdrawal to the mountain fastnesses of Caraballo and Sierra Madre. Lingayen was then liberated at the latter part of the month and the hordes of the liberation are pushing towards the central plains of Luzon. The American forces were then ashore of Luzon. The distant dins of inland battle could be heard. Fighter planes and bombers were daily making their death dealing excursions against the bewildered enemy. It was an occasion of unrepressed joy by the elements of the Squadron to see that the liberation has come at last. Intelligence reports could then reach the advanced outpost of the Americans and efforts to get these vital informations were redoubled even if the risks were adversely hazardous.

By the early part of January, 1945, messages and orders from General MacArthur were reaching the elements of the LGAF and relayed to the Squadron for execution. The flash of nocturnal battles were then visible and their roars are clearly audible. By the latter part of January the elements of the 1st Cavalry Division reached Guimba, Nueva Ecija and summons to all Squadrons were issued to

integrate these guerrilla forces into effective disposition of the liberating forces.

On January 31, 1945, this Squadron 221 was ordered to report at Guimba to be attached officially with the 1st Cavalry Division in its southward campaign to liberate Manila. Company "A" of Squadron 221 under Captain A. P. Espiritu with a strength of 7 officers and 110 enlisted men promptly reported for the mission ordered. Attached under separate cover is the roster of troops of Co. "A" and their troop disposition with the different elements of the 1st Cavalry Division.

Early in the evening of January 31, 1945 the elements of the 1st Cavalry Division began its advance towards Manila and Co. "A" of Squadron 221 advanced with them in full combat assignment. Except for a minor battle against a pocketed enemy at Cabanatuan, Nueva Ecija on February 1, 1945, advance toward Manila on motorized style was unopposed by a surprised enemy which dispersed easily to avoid decisive encounters. Leaving Cabanatuan early in the morning of February 2, 1945 with the bodies of the annihilated enemy littered on the streets, the spearhead element of the Division consisting of 600 strong pushed southward and slept at Baliuag, Bulacan. With this spearhead element was assigned Capt. Espiritu, his Executive Officer and 9 enlisted men. General Chase, commanding general of the Division was also with the same spearheading troops. It was a great race to the City of Manila with the 37th Division, hotfooting to the Capital and the 11th Airborne Division as zealous contenders.

From Baliuag, Bulacan early on February 3, 1945 these forward elements proceeded towards Manila in a cross-country route via Sta. Maria, Bulacan towards the hilly approaches of Novaliches. Reaching Novaliches at 1700 hours of the same day, a brisk encounter was made against the hidden enemy concealing themselves behind bushes and trees. After an hour, the enemy was silenced and the mad ride to Manila was began at its last stage. This forward element entered Manila via Blumentritt at 1900 hours, February 3, 1945 and gunned its way inside Manila thru sheer courage and daring surprise at the enemy. That night the University of Sto. Tomas with thousands of American internees was secured and Malacanan also liberated. The whole night was a raging inferno fire and battles with all the bridges spanning the Pasig demolished by the enemy. For 12 hours up to late dawn the following day, February 4, 1945, these six hundred liberators held their ground and widened its territory. The following morning, the other elements of the Division followed and the 37th Division also arrived for the total liberation of Manila. On February 5, 1945 General MacArthur raised the American

In compliance with your General Order to commence guerrilla attack against the enemy, this Squadron thus far had had two actual encounters against the enemy on the 9th and 10th of this month at Abar and Sto Ninio respectively. Casualties in the enemy side as has been verified are three dead including one ranking officer and many soldiers wounded, none in our side. One automobile entirely disabled. Enclosed herewith is an inventory which is self-explanatory.

It is worthwhile mentioning here also that this Command is vigilantly at patrol every night in the objective area waiting for opportune moments to strike at the enemy effectively. Actual encounters **however**, were intentionally avoided in order to obviate the occurrence of tactical errors which may do more harm than good to the Squadron.

Should actual encounter occur your Office would be promptly notified.

and Filipino flags at Sto. Tomas University.

The north side of Manila was secured after a week of mopping operation and the enemy had gained the southside where they prepared a network of mines and pillbox defenses. Artillery battles raged amidst destruction and ruins.

Thru a pontoon bridge made overnight at Sta. Ana the 1st Cavalry troopers gained the southside and wormed their way inch by inch against a stubborn enemy that fought almost at every hole and debris of ruined buildings. Fighting was thickest and hardest in Paco and Malate districts where the enemy murdered the civilian population. They were finally localized at the walled city in Intramuros where they were gradually softened and subdued.

Manila was finally liberated and on March 4, 1945, Co. "A" of Squadron 221 was escorted back to Guimba, Nueva Ecija with a mission fulfilled. With a loss of 3 men killed and 11 wounded, the 1st Cavalry Division issued the following commendations for these men:

This unit joined our forces while in Guimba, Nueva Ecija and acted as scouts, guides and in combat both during our advance on Manila and during our Manila operations.

They performed their duties competently and with great courage and were very valuable to the Headquarters to which attached.

We wish to commend this organization, and Lt. ALBERTO P. ESPIRITU and staff, for their fine performance.

New operations in areas with which this unit is unfamiliar make it necessary to release them.

But the history of Squadron 221 did not end there. After a week of rest, it was reorganized and absorbed in a newly organized 1st Regiment, LGAF, all squadrons regimented into a combat force and assigned with the 25th Division. Squadron 221 was absorbed as "M" Co, 3rd Bn of the said 1st Infantry Regiment. It was assigned with the whole batallion to secure the right flank of the 25th Division, reinforced and garrisoned on two hills along the Old Spanish Trail and Cauco Valley along the boundary line of Nueva Ecija and Nueva Vizcaya. This combat duty assignment was instrumental in the final reduction of the enemy resistance at Balete Pass (now Dalton Pass named

after General Dalton who died in this battle). This battle assignment was characterized with extreme risk and near annihilations from the enemy considering the proficiency of said enemy in the art of jungle warfare. On two occasions the enemy was determined to reduce this flank security by staging Panzai attacks but the battallon held its ground with dear costs of lives. Two officers and 47 enlisted men were lost in these night encounters. These elicited commendations from General Mullins, the Division Commander.

On June 1, 1945, the Regiment was relieved of its mission upon the fall of Balete Pass, the last organized and major resistance of the enemy in Northern Luzon. It was reassigned to the 121st Infantry with the mission to secure and protect Highway 5 from Putland River to Balete Pass from enemy harrasing tactics. The 3rd Bn. occupied the hills east of the Putland River with mission to advance and reduce enemy resistance on several pockets between the Putland River and the Old Spanish trail.

After this assignment, the 3rd Bn was committed for duty again with the 475 AA Bn. and mopped up eastern Pangasinan and combed the Villa Verde mountains for Jap stragglers who were harrasing the countryside. "M" Co. has to its credit of capturing 63 Jap stragglers.

On November 1, 1945, the Regiment was relieved entirely of further missions and was ordered to the processing areas in Bacnotan, La Union where the men were finally deactivated.

Jan. 5th, 1945, at 11:00 o'clock P.M., one squad under this command entered the BODEGAS of the Japanese on the mountains of Makaniawed, Lupao, N. E., and took the following articles:

ONE HUNDRED PAIRS (100) of Stockings (Japanese)
 SEVENTY (70) PAIRS of Japanese leggings.
 SEVENTEEN (17) PAIRS of Japanese shoes.

- 2.- That the said articles taken, when presented ^{to} by the undersigned were distributed among my men.
- 3.- Last night, I led Fifteen men to Kanawan and we were able to hit six trucks loaded with Japanese soldiers. I will have my general attack tonight or this afternoon within the area of San Jose, N. E.
- 4.- Sir, Some more news this day, but P.F.C. A. Seroma will relate all the news regarding the bombing of all the military objectives of Makaniawed and San Jose. Happy to hear the ~~roar~~ roaring of our planes over us. Here comes the "VICTORY". Good luck. Waiting for further instructions.



On January 31, 1945, our official attachement with the 1st Cavalry Division was consummated. We were 116 in all including myself. The 1st platoon (37 men) under Lt. Reyes was attached to the 7th Cavalry, Second Brigade. The 2nd platoon (35 men) under Lt. Aquino was attached to the 5th Cavalry, 1st Brigade with Lt. Aban as the Liaison Officer. The 3rd platoon under Lt. Tumibay was attached to the 12th Cavalry, 1st Brigade with Lt. Rosario as the Liaison Officer. It should be noted that one platoon so attached are divided as guides, scouts and combat troops. I remained at the Division Headquarters with the Master, Technical and Staff Sergeants and five other enlisted men.

On February 1st we moved and established our bivouac area at Caalimbanangan, Cabanatuan. We had our first encounter against the Japs inside the town and its suburbs, particularly at Aduas. There were 500 Japs we fought. Encounter started at 2:30 p.m. and lasted early the next morning. Our 2nd and third platoons took active part in breaking and mopping up the enemy. They also incidentally fought against the Pro-Japs elements, the Hubkolahaps which they easily overcame and capturing one Officer, Lt. Valderama later turned over to the C I C for proper investigation and custody. We proceeded that morning leaving many dead Japs and supply trucks to Baliuag, Bulacan where we stopped for the night. We shelled the town just across the river, San Rafael where an enemy garrison was. They were driven out easily.

Early in the morning of February the 3rd we proceeded towards Manila taking the cross-country route via Sta Maria, Bulacan. It's worth mentioning here that three divisions were racing towards Manila in a three pronged attack of Manila at east north and south to slice the enemy organization this 1st Cavalry Division, the 37th Division hitting the main highway via Tarlac and the 11th Airborne Division which parachuted down Tagaytay. These are vying to one another as to who should get in Manila first. Beyond Sta Maria we came upon deserted Jap trucks with evidence clearly showing hasty retreat of the enemy. Mopping operation was made at this area. The two-mile stretch towards the hilly Novaliches gave us for the first time keen alert for snipers as the layout of the road with its bushy sides were alive with snipers. As we proceeded slowly snipers fired on us but we got them dead sprawled along the road sides. When we got up Novaliches we were sort of ambushed as Japs woodpickers (Cal.51 machine gun) began pouring lead upon us from both sides of jungle growth. We silenced their guns in an hour of cross-firing. Atop Novaliches hills we saw in the distance the misty outline of Manila, our prize. It was at this point that Brigadier General Chase joined as up. It was twilight when we made the road to Manila proper passing the La Loma cemetery towards Blumentrit. There we met Japanese convoy trucks and

-----automobiles and then furious street-fighting began them all out. They must have been taken by surprize. We liberated our way up to the Quezon Boulevard where we were caught traversing fires between the Far Eastern University Building and the Bilibid Prison. We fought for more than 3 hours. After that we took up Sto Tomas University where we freed 600 of the American internees. We got the Japs garrison guards trapped at the Eastern building. That night our G I's with the support of our tanks mopped up the area around the University block. Manila that night was a veritable inferno of fires and deafening detonations of blasting dynamites rendered by Japs demolition squads. Paradoxical as it may seem yet it is a fact that it is the Division Headquarter personnel and service troops with a couple of hundred G I's (we were only 600 strong) that came in that hazardous night and took up Sto Tomas University as against the reported 50,000 Japs inside Manila then.

The next morning the 12th Cavalry with my one platoon came in and mopped the enemy up to the Pasig River. They were supported by our artillery and airforce. Civilians casualties were horrible in numbers as the Japs intentionally murder them. As if whole of Manila was burning.

The following day the Japs Garrison in the University surrendered-60 of them. That morning the American and Filipino flags were raised amidst rejoicings, tears and anthem songs. From February 3rd to the 7th (five days) we stayed at the University compound while we gradually mopped up the section north side of the Pasig river. But during the last three days we were subjected to continuous artillery shells of the enemy, night and day. Their spy system was intact still then so they got their right range. The American internees suffered considerable casualties as the main target was the main building where they are. I was nearly powdered to death with my master and technical Sergeants during those enemy shellings as three shells drop just a few yards from us. My main duty then was to help the C I C investigate suspected persons and also properly identify local guerrilla leaders in Manila in coordination with our intelligence system. I do not however neglect my duty in checking our boys right in the firing line. I usually get out with my technical sergeant checking on their strength and step up their morale. I happened too by accident to kill personally a Jap Officer just across the street where we were and by happy coincidence was taken picture in action by a war correspondent, Mr. Shaffer. This won for me deeper respect and regards from Major Bothwell, Div. Int. Officer and General Chase.

On the night of the 7th we moved to San Juan Heights but we could not shake off the enemy artillery shells following us. The next morning we proceeded to Diliman, Quezon City and bivouac at its suburbs. But our 12th Cavalry boys had gone ahead chasing the Japs out of this section of Manila suburbs. They had tough encounters at the U.P. site. It should be noted that during nights in every bivouac area of ours suicide Jap snipers came yelling and penetrating our perimeter with grenades, sabers and dynamite charges. Here in this particular bivouac area one American soldier was butchered and 3 others severely wounded. The clearing of the suburbs of Japs begun with our boys coming in handy.

The next afternoon of the next day, we transferred to the Wack Wack Golf Country Club, Mandaluyong. And as usual mopped the place. As all the bridges along the Pasig river were blasted we were taking the southern section via this suburban detour. We built our pontoon bridge at Sta Ana. Our first pontoon bridge was blasted by enemy shells and suicide enemy demolition squads. We built another and cross it and enter southern Manila on the 12th. On the 11th our 5th Cavalry with our platoon entered the City. They were previously behind guarding bridges and mopping up enemy stragglers in the Bulacan towns. Also our 7th Cavalry, 2nd Brigade came in and pinned up the enemies in the mountains

beyond Balara Filters at Montalban. They were supported by constant artillery and airbombing. Their lines extended to Antipolo checkmating the enemy so called Yamashita line of 20,000 excluding 5,000 native makapile (pro-Jap element). Enemy resistance here is heavy with their big artillery pieces ~~are~~ well dug in at the hills. They are also using here German rocket bombs. There were lots of action for our boys and for the first time they got a hell of jungle fighting. But they fought ferociously side by side with the American Liberators.

In the southern section of Manila where we were and where the greater bulk of the enemy remnants were particularly at the Walled City, our 8th and 12th Cavalry boys fought a furious street to street fighting. They fought almost inch by inch of mined streets and block by block toward the beach. They went as far as clearing the enemy far up Makati and Fort Mckenly where we first had a direct contact with the 11th airborne Division. We had three bivouac areas in the southern district, first in the Sta Ignaciam Church at Herran, Ata Ana, then at President Laurel's residence at Peñafrancia, Paco and lastly at the Army and Navy Club and Manila Hotel. The southern district was almost reduced to mere rubble of ruined buildings. Civilian casualty was heavy especially in the walled city where 7000 civilians were trapped with the enemies. It took us more than one week to overcome the enemy hammering it with incessant artillery fires and aided with flame thrower actions. The relentless enemy does not want to come across with surrenders. As a matter of fact many preferred suicide. Three offers of surrender were given them but they refused flatly. Hence the hell we give them. We were then aided by the 37th Division.

On February 28 and March first the enemy was practically wiped out in the southern district. Manila being freed the 1st Cavalry Division returned to the Wack Wack Country Club for a well earned rest. Here we were then released as Manila had already fallen.

The following is the list of causality and wounded among our men.

1. Pvt. Hilario Marilao- killed by enemy mortar fire at the Nurses home building, Ermita.
2. Pvt. Marcelino Cacayan- seriously wounded by sniper hitting him in the head at the P.G.H. building.
3. Sgt. E. Orcales-wounded by grenade at the U.P. Campos-not serious.
4. Pvt. Roberto Carurucan-wounded at the Rizal Memorial Stadium now in the Medics.
5. Pvt. Zoilo Fortono-seriously wounded also now at the medics.
6. Pvt. Roman Romero-slightly injured by hand grenade.
7. Pvt. Jose Espiritu- machine gun bullet wounds now at the hospital.
8. Pvt. Manuel del Pilar-reported missing last seen was being pursued by Japs.
9. Cpl. Basilio Delizo- shrapnel wounds at the right forehead. Not serious.

In this connection, please be informed farther that I am going with the Boys with a view to ~~xxxx~~ in force discipline among them.

The Officer Incharge of the Unit x to which we are attached is Captain Ferdinand Wenzryn. The place of future operation cannot as yet be determined as this depends upon orders from the High Command. Presently, however, we are in San Jose, Nueva Ecija.
