The Commanding General directs that you be informed that final consideration has been given to the claim for guerrilla recognition of your organization, Cavite Highlanders, an element of the overall command of Marking's Pil-American Troops (MFAT).

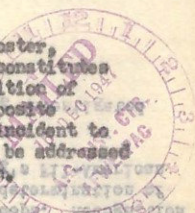
Subsequent to a protracted study of the records of this overall command, it was determined that any favorable consideration, either in full or in part, of claims for recognition of units under the direct control of the MFAT would be accorded in the form of a composite roster.

On 2 October 1947, Mr. Marking V. Agustin, the overall commander of MFAT, submitted a composite roster to this headquarters for approval. With the exception of fifty-five (55) necessary deletions by this headquarters plus the correction by the I Corps Commander of one hundred one (101) officer grades improperly listed on the II Corps and GHQ quota, the roster as submitted by Mr. Agustin has been approved in its entirety. Your unit, as a subordinate element of MFAT under its direct control, was given just and adequate consideration during the preparation of this composite roster. The degree of favorable consideration taken by this headquarters on the request for recognition of your unit may be determined by the number of names of personnel from your unit appearing on this composite roster. Dear Mr. Segismundo:

The Commanding General has directed that you be informed that the "Cavite Highlanders, Marking's Fil-American Guerrillas", purporting to be a guerrilla organization under your nominal control, is not favorably considered for recognition as an element of the Philippine Army.

A set of general requirements for guerrilla recognition, established by General MacArthur during the liberation of the Philippines, has been used as a guide in considering the record of this unit. After careful investigation and full consideration of all substantiating records and testimony of witnesses having pertinent knowledge, recognition of this guerrilla unit is not deemed to be warranted because of reasons mentioned below:

- a. Record of service was not substantiated by sufficient acceptable evidence.
- b. The unit was not maintained satisfactorily in the field in opposition to the enemy.
- c. A definite organization was not established.
- d. Performance of the units did not indicate effective control by its leaders, because of desertion of personnel to other units.
- e. Unit did not show satisfactory continuity of activity and organization.

It is requested that you comply with the provisions of Executive Order No. 68, by the President of the Philippines, dated 25 September 1945, copy attached.

Report on the "Cavite Highlanders, Marking's Fil-American Guerrillas"

1. Lts. Raul Diaz de Rivera and Pete C. Breaz proceeded to Cavite City on 8 January 1946 to investigate the Cavite Highlanders, Marking's Fil-American Guerrillas.

2. ALLEGED HISTORY: (See attached unit file)

3. FINDINGS:

a. The following persons were interviewed and their statements reflected in the findings:

b. Record of service was not substantiated by sufficient acceptable evidence, because the claimed activities of the unit cannot be substantiated other than by the word of the commanding officer. No documentary evidence was presented. The unit has no claim as a combat outfit and possessed no weapons. The unit claims to have engaged actively in intelligence and propaganda work. The majority of the members worked in the Japanese Naval Yard in Cavite City and they stated that they punctured paint cans, threw brushes and similar equipment in the water, delayed work, stole spare parts, oil and gas and failed to put putty in the optical instruments.

c. The unit was not maintained satisfactorily in the field in opposition to the enemy. None of the members was working on a full-time basis, but each contributed a small portion of his free time. Whatever intelligence or sabotage was performed, was the result of individual initiative rather than any planned method of sabotage or intelligence. If a representative of a guerrilla unit happened to be around, they passed on whatever info or news they had, but they made no concerted effort to contact any one who could have profited by the knowledge they had gleaned.

d. A definite organization was not maintained, because almost all of the members were employed as laborers and skilled workers in the Japanese Naval Yard in Cavite, supposedly on orders from their commanding officer. The members at all times conducted their lives in a normal civilian manner, caring for, and living with their families, by working at their regular civilian occupation.

e. Performance of the unit did not indicate adequate control by its leaders because of desertion of personnel to join other units. Magno Iruguin, of the Magirog Unit, a recognized guerrilla, was formerly a Battalion Commander of the subject unit. After the capture of Arsenio dela Cruz, alias Rodolfo Reyes, CO of the Cavite Highlanders Regiment, Iruguin started out as an independent unit. Other officers and men deserted the unit and joined other Marking's units and the independent Albert Skiewaski Unit in Cavite.

f. Unit did not show satisfactory continuity of activity and organization, because the unit disintegrated upon the capture and death of the leaders. It is admitted by Melchor Segismundo that the unit disintegrated upon the capture and death of its leaders. He further stated that the men appearing on the roster is a "skeleton force", of what is left of the former regiment.


g. Various guerrilla leaders and civilians that were interviewed stated that subject unit was passive during the Japanese occupation. Col. Marking Agustin, Overall Commander, Marking's Fil-American Guerrillas was contacted in Malacanán and he stated that the subject unit "wasn't any good". Col. E. Adevoso and Lt Col. E. Ocampo of the Hunters Guerrillas stated that they never knew of any definite activity of the unit. Cols. Q. Gellidon and M. Dikit were contacted and both of them stated that they have heard of the unit but that it was "very passive or inactive".

h. No useful purpose will be accomplished by further investigation of this unit as there are no worthy members and a casualty roster has been submitted.

4. POLITICAL ASPECTS. This unit does not appear to have any political affiliations nor aspirations.

5. RECOMMENDATIONS. It is recommended that the Cavite Highlanders, Marking's Fil-American Guerrillas, be not favorably considered for recognition.

HISTORY

The Marking's Fil-American Guerrillas Cavite Highlanders was officially organized at the early part of May 1943, under the command of Col. Rodolfo Reyes (alias) Arsenio delas Cruz .

The principal aim and purpose of these unit was to do sabotage and intelligence work. Intelligence operatives were formed to gather information throughout the whole Cavite province. Because of its early active worked the commanding officer of these unit found Cavite a hot spot for him, so he left Cavite with instruction to continued the work. However a few months later we learned that he killed. Then with the lost of the commanding officer of these unit his brother Lt. Col. Raymundo Pakiad (alias) Plácido dela Cruz took command.

Sabotage were then formed to worked at the Cavite Navy Yard, Sangley Point Naval Air Base and Varadero de Manila. Instructions were given to do sabotage worked at every opportunity were war equipment were constructed and made. Then sabotage squads gives report of the destructions and throwing away of parts of machineries, throwing away of gasoline and oil drums, throwing away equipments and tools and the destruction of electricial installations and many others which were reported from time to time to the headquarters of Marking's. They have also served in one way as the informer of the progress of the war that the people were kept informed and have served to kept the people their faith and loyalty to America.

The continous active worked of these unit later found the lost from thses unit of its top ranking officers, as follows:  
Lt. Col. Raymundo Pakiad captured by the Jap. Military Police Nov. 1944, 1st Lt. Celestino Sta Elena also Nov. 1944 and also Arsenio Gonzales, 2nd Lt. on Nov. 1944.

The Cavite Highlanders composed of one regiment bu t the untimely captured of the officers of these unit force the members to be separated to the different Cavite guerrilla organizations.


