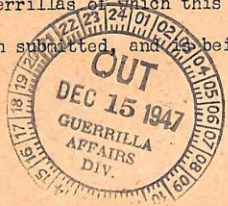

Dear Mr. Antonio:

The Commanding General directs that you be informed that final consideration has been given to the claim for guerrilla recognition of your organization, Pasig Unit, and element of the overall command of Marking's Fil-American Troops (MFAT).

Subsequent to a protracted study of the records of this overall command, it was determined that any favorable consideration, either in full or in part, of claims for recognition of units under the direct control of the MFAT would be accorded in the form of a composite roster.

On 2 October 1947, Mr. Marking V. Agustin, the overall commander of MFAT, submitted a composite roster to this headquarters for approval. With the exception of fifty-five (55) necessary deletions by this headquarters plus the correction by the I Corps Commander of one hundred one (101) officer grades improperly listed on the II Corps and GHQ quota, the roster as submitted by Mr. Agustin has been approved in its entirety. Your unit, as a subordinate element of MFAT under its direct control, was given just and adequate consideration during the preparation of this composite roster. The degree of favorable consideration taken by this headquarters on the request for recognition of your unit may be determined by the number of names of personnel from your unit appearing on this composite roster. Unfavorable consideration of your unit request for recognition will be evidenced by the exclusion of your personnel from this composite roster.

The approval by this headquarters of this composite roster, representing all units under the direct control of MFAT, constitutes the final and conclusive action upon the claim for recognition of all units considered in the recognition study of this composite roster. All queries relative to the above action and/or incident to guerrilla recognition matters concerning your unit should be addressed to your overall commanding officer, Mr. Marking V. Agustin.

REPORT ON PASIG UNIT, MARKING'S GUERRILLAS

Upon orders of the Chief of Section, Guerrilla Affairs Section, this Headquarters, Contact Team "H" proceeded to the Headquarter of the Pasig Unit, Marking's Fil-American Troops located in Pasig, Rizal to determine the feasibility of it being recognized.

HISTORY

This unit was organized in the later part of 1942 under Juan Antonio with the primary mission of furnishing supplies to Marking's Headquarters and furnishing information on Japanese movements around Ft Ma. McKinley. Men who were furnishing the supplies were not active guerrillas, but were working on farms and other civilian employment. They claimed that about 2 platoons were active each day in carrying these supplies to the GHQ and acting as guards in the barrios. The men who were gathering the informations were not working on full-time basis.

At the time Pasig was liberated, this unit furnished around 100 men to the 7th Cavalry for about 5 days. About the same number went with the 8th Cavalry in the operation between Pasig and Antipolo which lasted for about 2 weeks. Following this operation, the 1st Yag Regiment was being organized and about 150 men from the Pasig Unit joined this Regiment and have been recognized. According to the old roster, this 150 (men) includes practically all the combat men who went with the 7th and 8th Cavalry. Remainder of the men were demobilized 10 March 1945.

POLITICAL ASPECTS

T There are no apparent political aspects in the unit, local or national.

RECOMMENDATIONS

It is recommended that this unit be not favorably considered for recognition.

BASIS FOR NON-RECOGNITION:

- (1) Unit was never maintained in opposition to the enemy.
- (2) They did not maintain adequate records of the members.
- (3) Members were not devoting their entire efforts to military activity.
- (4) Unit was not able to show continuity of activity of its organization.

- (a) - Supplied informations of Japs' position at Pasig, Rizal, to one Major Davis, stationed then at Wack Wack Country Club, in the early days of Feb., 1945;
- (b) - Attached with the "E" Troop, 7th Cavalry, U.S.A., under 1st Lt. W.H. McMenus, CO and upon his instructions entered and liberated the town of Pasig, province of Rizal, on February 19-20, 1945, a true copy of the certification by the CO is herewith attached as a part hereof and its activities thereafter;
- (c) - From Pasig, Rizal, a portion of Company "C" of our unit continued with the "E" Troop, 7th Cavalry, up to the towns of Calanta, Paytay and the mountains of Antipolo, Rizal, with the remainder of the unit stayed in Pasig to continue mopping up the remnants of the Japs;
- (d) - Company "E" under Capt. Julian de Guzman (now with the 43rd Division) assisted "G" Troop, 8th Cavalry, 2nd Cavalry Brigade, under Lt. McClevins, in the mountains of Antipolo, Rizal;

Note:-- Unit released by the aforementioned U.S. units and the two companies joined the Yag Regiment of the 43rd Division, and the rest are disbanded for the time being.

Our unit is a part of the Fil-American Irregular Troops, under Col. Hugh Strachan, U.S.A., 02515, who was captured and murdered by the Japs, and Haringas Guerrillas, the combat unit of Col. Hugh Strachan, during the Japs' take-over only that the Fil-American Irregular Troops were under his direct command before he was captured and killed.

- (e) - The Commanding Officer (N. U. Gatchalian, a lawyer by profession) was appointed as Captain on January 1, 1943, by the late Col. Hugh Straughn, U.S.A., O2515, then on May 1, 1943, was promoted to Major, and lastly, on September 1, 1943, to Lieutenant-Colonel;
- (f) - That sometime on August, 1942, while Lt. Col. Gatchalian was still a member of Markings Guerrillas, Combat Unit, he supplied some rifles to the said organization thru the late Lt. Col. Pacifico Licci, operating then at Pasig, Rizal. Lt. Col. Gatchalian was then a 1st Lieutenant in the said outfit;
- (g) - That the said rifles presented to Lt. Col. Licci, were stolen by him and some of his men from the bodega of the Japanese at Ft. Wm. McKinley, Rizal, sometime on July, 1942;
- (h) - That sometime on October, 1942, together with his sabotage unit, entered Camp Murphy, and took some ammunitions for the rifles they had;
- (i) - Just before the fall of Bataan, he dumped dynamite boxes loaded on one of the coaches of the train stranded in Pasig, Rizal, to the Rasig River, and buried some on the lot of one Jorge Walo, an accomplice of the sabotage unit, for our future use. Unfortunately, somebody informed and pointed the place to the Japanese, and these were seized and a man-hunt started for the authors;
- (j) - Acted as mastermind in the sale of whole Japanese army and navy trucks by its respective Filipino drivers, to Filipinos; and instigated thefts and robberies at warehouses of the Japs army and navy;
- (k) - Kept on organizing guerrilla units under the Mil-American Irregular Troops in the different towns of Rizal, Leguna, Batanges and Cavite, until Col. Hugh Straughn was captured by the Japs in 1943, when our unit kept low;
- (l) - When the hit subsided, he continued organizing and spread propaganda received from the short-wave Radio San Francisco, U.S.A., and got informed of the movements of the Japanese army, until the CO contacted the American Armed forces at Mandaluyon, City of Manila, on February, 1945;
- (m) - The Commanding Officer (N. U. Gatchalian, who acted as Municipal Secretary from 1937-1941) Pasig, Rizal, and the same time practised his profession) was a Philippine Army Reserve Officer and was with the rank of 1st Lieutenant, PAR, at the outbreak of the war. Reported for duty when a portion of the personnel at Camp Murphy transferred to Pasig, Rizal, but were left behind together with some of the volunteer-enlisted men who have no arms.



SUBJECT :- DISBANDING PROVISIONALLY
TO :- GENERAL HEADQUARTERS

1. - The CIC, 43rd Division, U.S.A. just moved out, and there is no need for the aid of those few retained for service in apprehending the pro-Jap elements of the town;
 2. - There is no hope of being called to active duty in the battle front, so that the unit is disbanded provisionally;
 3. - Many of the members are without work and no means of livelihood. The different divisions of the U.S. Armed forces could not furnish the entire unit with equipments and arms, so isolated groups of the members could only be sent to the front with the American armed forces fighting in the mountains of Rizal. Some were with the 172nd Infantry, and one company was incorporated with the "EAT REGIMENT" of the 43rd Division, under the Command of Col. Marcos Villa Agustin, known as "Marrings", and the others, were with the labor battalion or working in kitchens, and the majority, without means of work.
 4. - From this date the unit is disbanded temporarily.







1. On the night of February 19, 1945, several Japanese snipers were killed by our detachment post in in the town.
2. On February 20, 1945, mopping-up operations continued, in all the barrios of Pasig, Rizal, Dugnuts and bamboo groves were searched for Japs snipers. Several Japs were killed in this occasion.
3. Our unit presented to the AMERICAN ARMED FORCES, to which we were attached, several machineguns, ammunitions and samurai captured during the Pasig operation by our unit.
4. Our unit continued searching for members of Maka-Pili and Ganap still in town and helped the Japs, at the time. Many Maka-pili deserters were caught and turned over to the Americans.
5. Our unit established our headquarters at the burned house of one of our members, Otilie Angeles, Several outposts at strategic places of the town were established.

1. - On the night of February 18, 1945, our men were assembled at the Headquarters of "E" Troop, 7th Cavalry, U.S.A., where they were given some rifles and hand grenades. Thereafter, they marked to the shores of the River to wait for the zero hour to cross it. At around 10:00 P.M., that night, there was some exchanged of shots with the enemy across the river, hence our unit could not cross it when the zero hour came. So our men waited.

2. At twilight, February 19, 1945, the first bunch of our unit, headed by Capt. Julian de guzman, crossed the river successfully, then it was followed by the rest until all were across the river in the town of Pasig. Several Skermishes with the enemy in town were listed. The members of the R.O.T.C. joined in the attack against the Japs once our unit were seen fighting the enemy in several places in the town. Pasig town was turned into a battle ground. Before sundown, at least around two hundred Japs were killed. Filipino spies in the employ of the Japs were caught and turned over to the Americans Armed Forces in the other side of the river.

3. After a few hours after the encounter, the American Flag were hoisted and raised on the top of the building of Mr. Fortunato Concepcion at Plaza Rizal, which was made as the temporary headquarters of our unit and the post left to guard the captured town during the night.

4. The remaining residents of the town were told to evacuate across the river at Bagong Ilog or in the American occupied area, because our unit in Pasig may not repulse the re-inforcement of the Japs that may come during the night. The evacuation of these civilians was covered and protected by our combat unit until they reached the places of safety.

1. In the afternoon of February 18, 1945, Major Juan R. Antonio of the unit, in collaboration with the artillery officer in the hills of Pineda, adjoining the Rizal General Hospital, pointed to them, the places where the enemy were concentrating at Pasig. The same were shelled accurately and listed several direct hits upon the Japs, one of which was that of the .75 mm. gun placed near the local college for girls. Pvt. Redolfo Cruz, of our unit, was sent to Pasig to find out the result of the shelling and the new positions of the Japs. Pvt. Cruz was wounded during the performance of his mission, and in spite of that, he reported to his superior officers the new Japs' position, such places as the Victoria Theater where around 30 prominent residents of the town, including the town Mayor, Cipriano Raymundo. Lt. Col. Dionisio Ojeda of the P.O. and several others, were being tied waiting execution in the hands of the Japs; the house of Atty. Melandres, the residence of Jose Damian.

Due to the timely shelling of the Victoria Theater, the Japs fled in terror and left their victims who, upon the grace of God, escaped. One of which was Lt. Arturo Ruiz, one of our operatives captured at the time.

2. Before sunset, the officers of our unit were called in conference with the Commanding Officer of the "E" Troop, 7th Cavalry, U.S.A., stationed at the Rizal General Hospital, where they were given instructions to cross the river at midnight to attack the Japs in Pasig, Rizal.

1. As early as February 10, 1945, our Unit crossed the Marikina River, and contacted the American Armed Forces at Wack Wack Contry Club, headed by Major H. U. Gatchalian and his Adjutant Major Juan R. Antonio, and Capt. Tomas de Leon. The reported the Japs' position across the river at Pasig town, and presented in connection therewith, a sketch plan illustrating the facts. These things were given to Major Davis, thru Corporal Reilly ((Div. of Arty., GP).

2. On February 13, 1945, the same group crossed the river and submitted another report to the same office regarding the position of the enemy at Pasig town, and in connection therewith, presented the maps of Pateros, Taguig, and Pasig, all in the Province of Rizal, where the enemies were concentrating at the time, with illustrations of the facts. (Copies of which are herewith attached as parts hereof);

3. On February 14, 1945, another report of the new Japs' position at Pasig, was submitted personally to the same office a copy of which report is herewith reproduced as a part hereof.

4. On February 16, 1945, our unit captured in Ugong Sur Pasig, Rizal, just after sunset, one Jap spy in civilian clothes, together with other proofs of his affiliation and as such. The Headquarters just established therein at the barrio of Ugong, was moved to the hills of the said barrio, together with all the members of the guerrilla unit who crossed the river at that time. Since then, different outposts were established near the river banks as well as in strategic places in the hills near the Wack Wack Country Club.

5. Our unit then sent emissaries across the river to Pasig to tell the people to evacuate to Mandaluyon, and to other American-occupied area for safety.

6. On February 16, 1945, the Jap spy caught was turned over to the American Armed Forces at San Juan Water Reservation, thru Capt. Berkeley; In the afternoon of the same day, a Jap soldier in full uniform was caught at Bagong Ilog, Pasig, Rizal, and was turned over to the "E" Troop, 7th Cavalry, U.S.A. At sunset our patrol unit encountered some Japs at Ugong Norte, Pasig, Rizal, and killed three Japs, and at dusk, our men retreated. The enemy had three machinegun nests at the place.

7. The next day, our special unit captured several Maka-pili who were turned over at San Juan Camp of the U.S. Armed Forces. In the afternoon of the same day, another encounter between our patrol unit and the enemy was made at Ugong Norte, Pasig, Rizal. In this encounter, our patrol unit was aided by some American soldiers. Several casualties were made upon the enemy, before sunset, our men together with the American soldiers retreated to their respective camps. But an all night vigil was made by our unit to forestall any attempt on the part of the enemy to advance during the night.


8. Our unit sent operatives at Pasig to find out the number of Japs left in town and also to find out their positions for an attack behind and the weapons being used by them. Upon arrival the same was reported to the Commanding Officer of the "E" Troop, 7th Cavalry, U.S.A., stationed at the old Rizal General Hospital, Pineda, Pasig, Rizal.

1. The red dot No. 1, is the ammunition dump of the Japanese Marines along the dike on the shore of the Pasig River, located inside the waiting shed on the Rodriguez Park. It is conspicuous because it is the only round edifice with roofings on the park.
2. The red dot No. 2, is a 50 caliber machine gun (permanent emplacement) located on the fourth (4th) steps on the dike. The men consist of 3 to 5 at one time;
3. The red dot No. 3, are fox holes defended by 16 rifles. It runs from the mouth of the Parian River to Blumentrit Street, all along the shore of the river. Included in the defense is one 30 caliber machine gun;
4. The red dots along the dike are machine gun (.50 caliber) nests mounted on the several steps of the said dike. The men on this line runs from 170 to 200 all active and ready during night time. On the day time, only a small contingent remains protected by rifles only
5. The red "x" running from Blumentrit street up to destroyed M. R. Bridge, are rifles and machine guns (can't be ascertained how many, because they are not permanent.) They are few at one time and many at another time;

REPORT NO. 2

1. Japanese soldiers (around 60 strong) arrived after sunset at barrio Sagad from Antipolo to get their food supply.
2. Around 16 of them, have rifles and the rest with spears only;
3. Expected to leave this p.m., Feb. 13, 1945.
4. There are four (4) officers.
5. These are the Japanese who burned the Rizal High School, and the barrios of Caniogan, and Maybunga, when the people refused to give them rice;

REPORT NO. 3

1. Around one company of Japanese Marines crossed the Pasig River from Pateros, at around 6:00 p.m., Feb. 13, and followed the old M.R.R. line to Antipolo;
2. The arms consist of rifles and spears.

2. There are 60 Japanese staying at the chapel at Hagonoy, Taguig; Equipped with ack-ack gun and machine guns.






