Dear Mr. Novou'rou:

This will acknowledge receipt of your two letters, the first, dated 25 September 1947, directed to the President of the United States requesting the President's intervention in behalf of the untimely initial claim for recognition of Faros Brigade, Fil-American Irregular Troops; the second, dated 20 November 1947, to the Commanding General, this headquarters, requesting recognition of the George-Andre Unit, Fil-American, and forwarding pertinent papers in support of the claim thereof.

It is desired to inform you that this headquarters had been conducting a program of guerrilla recognition for one year prior to the announcement, on 1 February 1946, of the deadline date of 15 March 1946 for the submission of applications for recognition of guerrilla units. Subsequent press and radio releases announcing the final dates for the acceptance by this headquarters of application for individual guerrilla claims, reiterated the deadline date of 15 March 1946 for the acceptance of unit claims. Inasmuch as information regarding this closing date was widely disseminated throughout the Philippines by press, radio, and municipal agencies, it is considered that all concerned had ample opportunity to prepare unit applications for recognition by 15 March 1946.

During this entire period the question of guerrilla recognition was constantly brought before the citizens of the Philippines to such degree that it would appear indeed unusual that records of a unit could not be found and submitted to this headquarters within this extended period. It is desired to point out that this headquarters has never been arbitrary in reaching a decision, the presentation of compelling evidence ever being a deciding factor. Perusal of the records and evidence presented in behalf of the George-Andre Unit, Fil-American, fails to reveal such compelling evidence. It reveals, however, that all records and evidence are of very recent origin and do not satisfy the criteria used as a guide in the recognition of guerrilla units.

In cognizance of the foregoing facts, it is with regret that this Headquarters must inform you that your request for recognition of the George-Andre Unit, Fil-American, cannot be accepted for consideration.

HIS EXCELLENCY

THE PRESIDENT OF THE UNITED STATES

WASHINGTON, D. C., USA Excellency, we pray your highly intervention that the FAROS BRIGADE, FAIT, under my command; and the Sir: UNIT, FAIT, under the command of Brig. Gen. NATIVIDAD B. Matta, and all other units under the overall command of the late Colonel I am writing this sentimental missive to appeal to your Excellency the sentiments of approximately 2,000 members of my organization, FAROS BRIGADE, Fil-American Irregular Troops, under the overall command of the late Colonel HUGH STRAUGHN, O-2515 US Army.

I do not know where I and my guerrilla members are going to present and to voice the deep sentiment that is all the time present in our persons, which sentiment I humbly believe will never go out but stay within ourselves, unless otherwise given due justice. We are seeking for JUSTICE.

AFEWAPAC command stationed in the Philippines made a policy and set aside a date, 15 March 1947, as deadline for submission of guerrilla rosters seeking recognition. With this deadline I failed to comply with the said policy on account of my failure to locate or find on due time our old papers or rosters of my organization. I did not make or submit a roster of our men only thru memory, but exerted our efforts to look for our old papers which will produce the true evidence of the existence of our organization, of our activities and of our genuine members.

Now ... that I have found our old documents (but late) and everything in our hands, I am afraid that it will be only considered as "no more" if I am going to submit it just now to HQ PH'LRYCOM, APO 707.

I do not give any bit of criticism to the Deadline Policy of AFWESPA (now PHILRYCOM). But ... I just would like to voice out that our patriotism in fighting for DEMOCRACY has no deadline. My men fought and died not for anything else, but in defense of DEMOCRACY itself. They do not know exactly what DEMOCRACY is, yet, thru President Manuel L. Quezon who called on us (before he left for the States), thru the "Voice of Freedom", and who left us words to stand upright and defend for and our rights and of Democracy against Imperialism, thru our leadership with deeds and motto "DO & DIE"; "NO VOW IN ROW", these men of ours fought and die with and together with the spirit of democracy, as well as of the late Colonel Hugh Straughn who inspired us the strength of fighting spirit.

We are not seeking for any due compensation, but, for just RECOGNITION. We all want only RECOGNITION in the name of DEMOCRACY.

In another particular case, the MATTAS UNIT, FAIT. Brig. Gen. Natividad B. Matta, Commanding, had already submitted the roster of the unit, dated, 17 December 1945, to AFWESPA, with over 6,000 members, and with concrete evidences and history and activities. But up to now no favorable action has been taken. WHERE is JUSTICE IN this case?

We are referring our cases to you, Mr. President. We know exactly that there is contentment in your decision, and here we are under your powers and authorities.
