After careful investigation and full consideration of all substantiating mitten of this guarrilla unit is not dessed to be varranted because of reasons mentioned below

b. The unit was not unfortained satisfacturily in the field in o. Activities of the unit did not emirfrate neterially to the

eventual defect of the energy, d. A definite excenination was not established.

e. Adequate records were not relatated (names, replic, dates of calificant or joining, dates of presettent, and necessary related infor-

f. Name of members was considered to be too high for the setual size of the comund relatained in the field,

g. Performance of the unit did not indicate absorate central by the leaders. h. Ophere of operations and writ strength eligible by the writ were not commencers o with the nature of the terrain, ginitation of communication familities, and the degree of enti-rectifiance activities of the Japanese in the area during the period concerned;

- 2. Unit did not show satisfactory continuity of activity and organization.
- Members of the unit did not devote their entire effort to military activities in the field to the exclusion of normal divilian occupation and faudly obligations.

- scoptable ordence. The unit file state here's contains no record or affiderit which would constitute a satisfactory basis for recognition. There are no allegations in the unit history which establish the existence of this unit, It is extremely doubtful that the members served as home-guards. There is no supporting evidence to prove either phase of existence.
- c. The unit was not maintained satisfactorily in the field in opposition to the enemy. Abree was no maintainence in the field ather alleged or actual, and there was no opposition to the enemy.
- d. There is no proof of the establishment of a definite organization that them e roster. The roster is so erranged that sen of like grade are essigned to squads in alphaebtical order. This is indicetive of hasty preparation and a non-existent unit. Obviously, an attempt to defrend the Government has been made.
- e. Performance of the unit did not indicate adequate control by its commending officer and his subordinetes. This fact is self-evident; there was no performance, hence - no control.
- f. The unit did not demonstrate continuity of activity.
 This fact is self-evident since the unit actually never existed.
 - g. The unit suffered no casualties.
- 4. FOLITICAL ASPECTS: The unit has no apparent political affiliations or aspirations.
 - RECOMMENDATIONS: It is recommended that "D" Company, of the Lightning Regiment, FAIT, be not favorably considered for recognition.

BRIEF HISTORY OF THE PLIPTHO ACERICAN INREGULAR TROOPS, LIGHTNING ANGINENT Go. D. HERROSA, BATAM

Way back in 1942, the undersigned begun espiceage work egainst the Japanese army this town and had closed contact with Captain Magtangol, (Ruben Bundoc) and Col. J. P. Boone and they were informed of military secret . I may be able to get or any danger that they had to confront with. As a matter of fact it was one Friday in the month of October, 1942 when I conferred with Captain Eagtengol, Gol. Boone and the guerrillas fron Paspanga under Captain Poling who were at that time in the ditiow of Damban, Hermona, Bataan regarding the plan of the Japanese Army to raid that place. On the same very night, the Japanese army came and I nearly lost my life when the Japanese army begun shooting for more that one hour but us the guerrillas were duly informed of the natter not a single men was injured. This espionage work was continumber by me alone until the time when Captain Karismo Tamayo came nere and had learned of my activity in the early part of 1943, As Captain Temayo was on the same mission, he conferred with me and discussed the matter of organizing the FAITH ORGANIZATION or the Filipino American Irregular troops in Hermose, Batasm that will engage on espionage work. Captain Matiano Tamayo then organized Co. D. of the organization and made me Commander of the company under the name of Captain Kulas (Captain Dalmacio L. Jorge, Co. D. Lightning Regiment, Filipine American Irregular Troops in Hermosa, Betsan /

After the organization of the Company, a more determined and well organized plan was worked out in order to know the Japanese Military secrets, their activities or any danger that may confront the guerrillas. Some of the numbers were ordered to work with the Japanese lumbering operation in this town in order to detect the Japanese army stationed near the office of the lumber operator. Some were detailed to have closed contact with Captain Armae (Captain Teofile Sieson of the signal corps. Sataan Wilitary District) who had a radio receiving set so that we may be well informed of the status of the war. Some were detailed to observe the Japanese army activities in other towns. the End regiment, Batsan Military District, Captain Nagtangol. Captain Roldam (Captain Protacio Portugalete), Lt. Col. Amionio Trinidad of the lat. regiment Bataan Military District, Major Baynold; Captain Laster Chase, Edy Keith, Hill Saglay, Stil Berry and other American soldiers in the mountain. Service was also were duly informed of the Japanese army activities not only in had to confronts.

On May 2nd and 3rd, 1944 there were several guerrillas in this town attending the fiests and on the very night of May 3rd, 1944, the organization got a tip that the Japanese Army will raid Hermosa on the next morning. Upon learning of the news, the organization immediately informed all the guerrillas in the town to evacuate innediately. I with Captain Magtangol, Captain Roldan with all their men evacuated the town on the same very night. On the next morning the Japaness Army encircled the town and were ready to attack the guerillas but none was to be found.

One day in the month of August 1944, I conferred with

Captain Magtangel and informed him of the Japanese soldiers going with the trucks getting lumber from Timbugan, Hermora, Japanese soldiers there in the nountain and to step them from Japanese testing immer. Our plan materialized as captain further getting immer. Our plan materialized as captain Hugtengel's Gospany was able to kill two Japanese soldiers and all the laborers in the trucks were taken and later joined with lumbering operation at finbugan was paralized. On October 28, 1946, Sienvenico Jorge, a number of this

organization after conferring with captain magtangol was sent to the town to discuse with me the posibility of attacking the Japanese garrison at Hermosa was shot and Killed in the town

One day in November, a few days after the death of Stenvenido Jorge, I went to the sountain to report to the guerrillas that the Japanese army stationed here were increased to a big proportion. Upon arriving at Samban, I set Lt. Col. Wright of U.S. Army, Lt. Alejandro Synesanges of the Philippine Army, Captain Magtangol, Lt Amenias Tayabas with all their men and were roady to go to the town of Hermosa to attack the garrison, After learning of the plan of Captain Magtangol, I objected to attacking the garrison on the ground that his men were not sufficient to attack the parrison and besides it will endanger the position of the civilians. My objection was sustained by Lt. Col. Bright and the plan was discontinued.

In the early part of 1945, we heard from the radio that American forces had landed at Lingayan, then the organization moved on to ask the people tom evacuate the town so that the armed guerrillas may be in a better position to attack the enecies at any time and as a result the people evacuated and the guerrillas took control of the town before the coming of the American forces here.
