MEMORANDUM FOR RECORD

Col Gerald F Lillard:

1. The Quintans Guerrilla Unit, Fil-American Irregular Troops, (Independent) consisting of 623 men has not been favorably considered. No members have been previously recognized. The roster of this unit is identical with that of the roster submitted by Miguel Acosta, commanding officer of the Army of the Agno; however, this is an initial investigation of the unit.
2. This unit does not fulfill the requirements of the five basic points for recognition. See attached Team Leader's Report.

Dear Mr. Quintans:

The Commanding General has directed that you be informed that the Quintans Guerrilla Unit, Fil-American Irregular Troops, purporting to be a guerrilla organization under your nominal control, is not favorably considered for recognition as an element of the Philippine Army.

A set of general requirements for guerrilla recognition, established by General MacArthur during the liberation of the Philippines, has been used as a guide in considering the record of this unit. After careful investigation and full consideration of all substantiating records and testimony of witnesses having pertinent knowledge, recognition of this guerrilla unit is not deemed to be warranted because of reasons mentioned below:

- a. Record of service was not substantiated by sufficient acceptable evidence.
- b. The unit was not maintained satisfactorily in the field in opposition to the enemy.
- c. Activities of the unit did not contribute materially to the eventual defeat of the enemy.
- d. Performance of the unit did not indicate adequate control by its leaders.
- e. Members of the unit did not devote their entire effort to military activities in the field to the exclusion of normal civilian occupation and family obligations.

This decision on the proposed unit roster does not preclude submission for casualty recognition by those individuals who are qualified and feel justified in entering such claims. Upon request by interested individuals, appropriate forms will be forwarded.

Report on "Quintans Guerrilla Unit, Fil-American Irregular Troops"

1. Capt B. G. Tabora Jr., and 1st Lt J. C. Altman proceeded to Malasique, Pangasinan on 20 March 1947, to investigate the Quintans Guerrilla Unit, Fil-American Irregular Troops.

2. ALLEGED HISTORY: (See attached Unit File).

3. FINDINGS:

b. Record of service was not substantiated by sufficient acceptable evidence. Lt Col Pedro Quintans, the commanding officer of the Quintans Guerrilla Unit, FAIT, was formerly the leader of the National Volunteer Guard Organization in the town of Malasique, Pangasinan, prior to the landing of the Japanese Forces in 1941. When the Philippine Forces surrendered in May 1942, the National Volunteer Guard Organization was dissolved and never operated as a guerrilla unit in this vicinity. Major Pascual Pinlac, commanding officer of the 3rd Provisional Bn, 3rd Pangasinan Regt, Pangasinan-Tarlac Military District, East Central Luzon Guerrilla Area, under the overall command of Lt Col Edwin P Ramsey, who was recognized by the United States Army, was the only guerrilla leader who did oppose the Japanese in this locality during the occupation and liberation. After careful consideration of the evidence submitted and personal contact with approximately one hundred twenty (120) members of the unit gathered together for the investigation, it is concluded that the unit's claim to considerable activity could not be proven. The roster of this unit is identical with that submitted by the Army of the Agno, under Miguel Acosta which was not favorably considered by Hq, AFWESPAC for recognition. The commanding officer was unable to present any additional supporting evidence, such as: induction papers, promotion papers, or papers of attachment to American Liberating Forces during the liberation. Capt Tabora, who operated in and around the town of Malasique, as an active guerrilla, never at any time heard of the unit's organization or existence.

c. The unit was not maintained satisfactorily in the field in opposition to the enemy. The commanding officer of the unit and his subordinate officers belong to a big clan in the community and are of the same family circle. These officers did not leave the town to perform guerrilla activities, fearing that the Japanese might detect them. Major Claro J Camacho, recognized as Chief of the Signal Section of the ECLGA, who operated in this area, stated that the unit's roster was prepared after the liberation and also stated that the unit did not exist during the occupation and that the unit's claims regarding sabotage, espionage and active participation against the enemy during the occupation and liberation period are false.

d. Activities of the unit did not contribute materially to the eventual defeat of the enemy. All activities claimed in the unit's history were also claimed by other units. The investigating team visited locations where the unit's training and its encounters against the Japanese supposedly had taken place. In a conversation with several disinterested persons in the vicinity, the remarks of these persons tend to show that the members of the Quintans Guerrilla Unit, FAIT, were homeguards and not actually

a guerrilla unit. The duties of the homeguards was to warn the population of the approach of the Japanese and to maintain peace and order in the community. Lt Col Antonio Jimenez, commanding officer of the 1st Pangasinan Regt, PTMD, ECLGA, recognized, was referred to by the investigating team. He is a native of this area and operated in the towns of Bayambang and Malasique during the occupation and liberation. Col Jimenez stated that the claims of the unit as to their activities are not true and he further stated that the Quintans Guerrilla Unit did not exist during that period. Many encounters against the Japanese were claimed by the unit but corroboration of these activities could not be obtained by written certifications from recognized guerrilla leaders or from disinterested persons of the community. The total amount of weapons possessed by the unit as claimed by the commanding officer in the year 1942 was substantially greater than the entire amount of weapons under the control of Major Pinlac, who was the only guerrilla leader opposing the Japanese in that sector during the occupation and liberation. During the interview with Major Pinlac, all allegations of the commanding officer of the unit in question were flatly denied. All weapons possessed by the unit were claimed to have been turned over to the Liberating Forces, but no receipts were offered as evidence to substantiate the unit's claim.

e. Performance of the unit did not indicate adequate control by its leaders. Several people of the barrio and some municipal officials who are not members of this unit were also interviewed. These people stated that they did not hear of a unit named "Quintans Guerrilla Unit," and that some persons listed as members of the unit were used as homeguards and not as guerrillas. Most of the officers of the unit were well-rehearsed as to their duties and activities but during the course of the investigation, it was noted by the investigating team that the enlisted men were coached as to their duties and activities by the senior members of the unit. Many members of the unit, especially the enlisted personnel did not know who their officers were and did not know the duties of the ranks they were listed as holding on the unit roster. Many enlisted men could not cite an instance where they had encamped in the field or who their officers were, during the occupation and liberation.

f. Members of the unit did not devote their entire effort to military activities in the field to the exclusion of normal civilian occupation and family obligations. Many members apparently lived at home supporting their families by means of farming and other civilian occupations and assisted Major Pinlac on a part time basis only. Col Juan Benitez, Chief of Staff of the Pangasinan-Tarlac Military District, ECLGA, corroborated the fact that the members of the unit lived at home and did not perform guerrilla activities. Most of the junior officers of the unit are teachers by profession and during the occupation were engaged in teaching-thus disproving the statement in the history of the unit that the officers as well as the enlisted men were encamped in the hills of Lareg-lareg during the occupation.

g. No useful purpose will be accomplished by further

investigation of the unit. There are no members worthy of recognition and a casualty roster will be submitted.

4. POLITICAL ASPECTS: The unit does not appear to have any political affiliations or aspirations.

5. RECOMMENDATIONS: It is recommended that the Quintans Guerrilla Unit, FAIT, be not favorably considered for recognition.

SUBJECT: History or organization and activities

TO : WHOM IT MAY CONCERN

Working in conjunction with Col. Wencislao Olitan (alias Col. O. Cruz), and Col. Manuel T. Dikit (alias Col. Manulik) in the organization of guerrilla units per instructions of Col. Hugh Straughn, Col. Emilio Acosta (alias Col. Owl) instructed his relative, Major Miguel R. Acosta to extend the organization to Pangasinan. Major Acosta then contacted ~~Col.~~ Col. Antonio Costes of the National Volunteers, who in turn did the same to Lt. Col. Pedro Quintans, his former co-officer in the National Volunteers. Lt. Col. Quintans' rank as Lt. Col. in the National Volunteers was confirmed by Col. Hugh Straughn upon the recommendation of Col. Emilio Acosta. Lt. Col. Quintans was instructed to appoint and commission officers under his organization.

On 20 December 1942, Lt. Col. Quintans began to organize the Quintans Guerrilla Unit under the FAIT, out of his old members and officers of the National Volunteers in the Lareg-lareg-Canan Hills, where he evacuated upon the Japs occupation of the town.

He assigned and commissioned Domingo Datuin, his right-hand man in the National Volunteers, who also evacuated in the same hills, as Major and Executive Officer.

To have the work more effective the plan of organization adopted called for the location of groups in areas where the members composing such group normally reside. Each barrio formed a platoon, a company was formed from a number of barrios of the municipalities of Malasiqui, San Carlos and Sta. Barbara, with Malasiqui as the Headquarters.

The following Officers were commissioned and were given different assignments:

Atty. Rodolfo M. Santillan as Captain, S-2; Capt. Nemeccio Ceralde as S-3; Ricardo Magleo as Captain, CO Commander in charge of northwestern sector; Alejandro

Sison as Captain and Co. Commander in charge of the northeastern sector; Genaro G. Armas as Captain and Co. Commander in charge of the southeastern sector; Atty. Andres Rangel as Captain and Co. Commander in charge of eastern sector and Dr. Alfredo Quintans as Captain in charge of the central sector.

The above named officers were instructed to organize their companies by recruiting sufficient men to complete their organization. In a short time the organization of the battalion was completed.

The men of the Quintans Guerrilla Unit were trained along underground movements, such as sabotage, espionage and military operations and propaganda. Often times instructions were received on military operations thru a runner from Col. Manuel T. Dikit, who was often consulted. With this short and practical training the battalion had the following activities:

December, 1942 - After a brief training, the men were called to camp in Lareg-lareg and Cabarogan Hills where all pledged to work relentlessly against the enemy. All were inducted formally.

1943

January - We strengthened our entrenchment in Canan-Lareg-lareg - Cabarogan hills. Dugouts and fox holes were dug. At this time we had 120 rifles, pistols and hand grenades which were taken from the retreating USAFFE. In the barrio of Cabeldatan, a patrol of Japanese soldiers were confiscating chickens, eggs and pigs. A platoon of our soldiers under the command of Capt. Armas shot and killed everyone of them. Two rifles and one pistol were captured.

February - In the barrio of Balingueo, Sta. Barbara, a truck load of Japanese soldiers were attacked by a platoon of our soldiers under the command of Lt. Santiago Mejia. Four enemy soldiers were killed, one on our side was wounded. The rest were able to escape.

March - In the far barrio of Tomling, between Mala-siqui and Bayambang, our soldiers cut the enemy telephone wire. Late in the afternoon a squad of Japanese soldiers came to repair it. Our soldiers under the command of Lt. Francisco Mejia attacked them, all were killed and one on our side was wounded. Their arms consisting of two rifles and telephone equipments were captured.

April - A detachment of guerrillas in Urdaneta under Captain Bravo invited our unit to help him attack the

garrison at Urdaneta. One company of our unit under the command of Capt. Alejandro Sison was sent. The attack begun at 2:00 in the morning and lasted for almost three hours. The places attacked were the residence of Atty. Eusebio Sison, market place and Maric warehouse because all these places were occupied by the Japanese soldiers. The enemy suffered heavy casualties while one sergeant on our side was killed. Our men retreated before morning for heavy reinforcement of the enemies arrived.

May - The men under the command of Capt. Quintans attacked the Japs sentry guarding the Bogtong bridge on the way to Calasiao. One Jap soldier was killed while the others were able to escape in the nearby houses. Later they retreated to Dagupan for reinforcement. No casualty was suffered on our side.

June - A truckload of Japanese soldiers went to Lareg-lareg to raid our headquarters. The Nansangaan bridge which was previously destroyed by our men delayed their advance. There a platoon under the command of Lt. Teodorico Bulatao stationed at the place attacked the invading Japs. The fight lasted four hours. We retreated for lack of ammunitions and due to their superior number when the reinforcement arrived. Two of our men were wounded.

July - In the market of Tomling two Japs soldiers were confiscating vegetables, chickens, eggs and other foodstuffs. On their way back to the town in a carretela, they were attacked by the men under the command of Lt. Teofilo Sison. The two soldiers were killed and their foodstuffs were brought back to our headquarters.

September - In the barrio of Calbeg on the approach to Cabaroon Hills a squad of Japs soldiers went from house to house looking for foods, such as rice, chickens, eggs and pigs which they said they would buy. Our men under the command of Lt. Cerezo attacked them on their way back to town. One Jap was killed, the rest were able to escape. No casualty was on our side.

October - In the far off barrio of Tobor, a squad of Japs soldiers from Bayambang garrison went to patrol and search the place. They were ambushed by the men under the command of Lt. de Guzman. Shots were exchanged but no casualty was suffered by either side, because they made good of their escape.

November - In the barrio of Omando, where the headquarters of Major Pinlac of the Ramsey Unit was located was raided by the PG soldiers and some Jap soldiers. Before they could approach the place, they were attacked by the men

under the command of Lt. Rangel. The result was that three men of Major Pinlac were captured by the PC, while two PC soldiers were also captured. Secret arrangement for the exchange of prisoners was effected.

December - In the barrio of Macolnet-Pasima two Jap soldiers were tracing the route of a river creek. These soldiers were shot and killed by the men under Lt. Isabelo Bulatao.

In the barrio of Payas, Patayak, Sta. Barbara, four Jap soldiers were going from house to house searching every house for concealed weapons. Upon learning this fact, Capt. Armas sent his platoon under the command of Lt. S. Mejia to attack them. All the four soldiers were killed and one on our side was killed.

1944

January - The men under Capt. Quintans encountered a truck load of Japanese soldiers in the barrio of Onsad, Villasis. There were exchange of firing but there were no casualty because we retreated due to their superior arms and equipments.

February - A Jap truck suffered an engine trouble in front of the Municipal Building. They asked for a mechanic. We gave one who instead of repairing, removed other spare parts. The truck was not able to move until Jap mechanic repaired it himself.

A patrol of two Japanese soldiers penetrated the barrio of Olea. A platoon under Capt. Andres Rangel shot and killed two Japanese soldiers. We captured their rifles. Olea is an hacienda owned by Esperitu Quintans who used to give us rice and money.

During this month we learned that the Cabaroan-Lareg-lareg-Canan hills were going to be fortified for their defense. They required the Mun. Mayor to supply coconut trunks cut three meters long. These were transported to the hills. This situation really meant a bitter encounter for we were going to be dislodged in our headquarters.

March - A Jap engineering squad went to Lareg-lareg to survey the hills. There our headquarters platoon under the command of Lt. Dacasin encountered the Japs. There was a bitter fight that lasted for some hours. Heavy casualties were suffered by the enemy and 10 of our men were wounded.

Another party of Japs went to Cabaroan hills from Urdenata. Lt. Silverio Garcia and his men under our outfit were assigned for that place for patrol duty. They had skim

skirmishes. The Japs sensing danger did not fight long and they retreated. No casualty was suffered by either side.

April - Lt. Col. Quintans called a conference of his officers and discussed the eminent danger ahead of us for the Japs meant well to fortify the hills. We resolved to move away and transfer our headquarters in hacienda Olea. From there we planned to harrass once in a while the Japs fortification.

They recruited laborers to construct their military installations that required civilian labor. We tried to boycott them by sending away males. The lareg-lareg hills were evacuated by civilians and the region around were also abandoned. Farmers could not plant their fields to corn and rice upon our advise, because it meant good supply for the enemy, concentrations should we allow the farmers to plow.

May - The Japs begun their job. The men under Lt. Francisco Mejia volunteered as laborer. They ^{dug} deep tunnels and caves. These laborers sometimes stole clothes, stationeries while the Japs were away.

A party of Japs directing the project in Nancapian hills of the same region was attacked by the men under the command of Lt. Juan Bulatao. A bitter fight issued, after which the Japs retreated leaving behind them four rifles.

June - A company under the command of Capt. Magleo attacked the San Carlos Garrison and "aric warehouse. The attacking team retreated and were pursued as far as the fields in the barrio of Tarece, three kilometers from the town. There exchange of shots occurred but no casualty was on our side. It was not known on the enemies side.

In the barrio of Salinap, San Carlos, our platoon under the command of Lt. Genaro G. Rosario encountered four Jap soldiers coming from Aguilar. All the four Japs were shot and killed. No arms were captured because they were not armed.

July - Lt. Isabelo Bulatao and his men conducted a campaign to prevent the Japs from getting bull carts and carretelas for transporting their supplies and munitions. As result of this campaign, the Japs failed to move on their scheduled time which resulted in the scolding and almost slapping of the Mun. Mayor by the Japs officer, They pronounced Malasiqui as 99% pro-Americans.

August - The Japs learned the location of our field headquarters at Olea. They raided the place but they failed

to locate anyone of us. A Jap spy reported our Intelligence Officer, Capt. Rodolfo Santillan who was captured in Manila where he transported thru his truck supplies for guerrillas. He was incarcerated on August 23 to September 15 with Pvt. Tomas Macaraeg who died in Fort Santiago. Capt. Santillan almost died of torture, hunger and disease until his release on September 16. During this month too, two Japs patrols in an inhabited field in the barrio of Ican were shot and killed by the men under the command of Lt. Amado Boquiren.

September - A truck loaded with Japanese supplies for their Cabaroan-Lareg-lareg fortifications were ambushed by the men under the command of Lt. Santillan in the barrio of Talospatang. There were exchanges of shots, but Lt. Santillan retreated for lack of sufficient rounds. A Jap soldier was wounded but none was on our side.

The Japs began to be uneasy for the approaching liberation forces. The guerrillas began to collect their courage to resist inspite of lack of arms. The platoon under the command of Lt. Domingo Parlan encountered the Japs patrols in the barrio of Wawa, Bayambang, where our men went to get a supply of fish. While being pursued, Lt. Parlan fired back at the pursuing Japs. Information as to the casualty was not available.

November - The Japs began to concentrate and strengthen their fortifications at Cabaroan-Lareg-lareg hills. They used to travel on foot from Mangataren mountains passing thru rice fields and barrio roads to Lareg-lareg. In the barrio of Cobol, eight Jap soldiers were encountered by the men under the command of Lt. Queñano. All the Japs were killed and two rifles were captured. One of our men was wounded.

December - During this month, leaflets from U. S. planes were dropped advising civilians to evacuate coastal towns, Japs concentrations and munition dumps. Our men advised the people to this effect. Frequent conferences of our staff officers were held for the reception of the Liberation Forces scheduled to land in January, 1945.

The men under the command of Lt. Silverio Garcia stole the clothes and pistol of Jap civilian in charge of Naric in Malasiqui. They took their loots from a parked truck while loading rice for delivery to San Carlos Naric warehouse.

1945

January - Malasiqui was bombed by US planes on January 8, 1945. After bombing we opened the Naric warehouse near the Mun. Building. Rice were carted away. We attacked the sentries and all were killed. Their arms were captured.

In the barrio of Coliling, a Jap civilian with Filipina wife was captured by our men under the command of Lt. Armas.

✓ A carretela loaded with bananas and accompanied by six Jap soldiers were proceeding to San Carlos. The men under the command of Capt. Magleo attacked them in the barrio of Ilang. Four Japs were killed including the horse, but the two escaped which certainly met their death in the hands of other guerrillas.

On January 12, the Liberation Forces arrived at Malasiqui. Upon proper identification of our men of the officers of the 37th Division, asked for some men to act as scouts, guides and helpers in their mopping up operations. A squad under the command of Lt. Pedro Sison guided and helped in the shooting of eight Japanese soldiers hiding under the bridge in the barrio of Lagsan.

In the barrio of Bolaet the men under the command of Lt. Apolonio Garcia helped in killing three Japs who were detached from their Lareg-lafeg unit.

Lt. Santillan and his men furnished the 29th Evacuation Hospital with hospital guards, laborers and helpers. Lt. Francisco Mejia and his men helped in the mopping up of the Cabaroan Hills.

February- Lt. Pedro de Guzman directed the burial of the remains of Lt. John Dougan, a U. S. Aviator that crushed at Calbeg of this municipality. Capt. Armas and his men helped Capt. Ebert of Co. E. of 37th Infantry regiment in its moping operations at Apaya, and Cabeldatan,

Sgt. Catalino Falaganas was detailed by Capt. Rangel to guide the 129th Infantry Regiment, 2nd Bn. 44q. Co. He joined the same company and fought with it at Moncada, Tarlac, Capas, Dau, Manila in the capture of Intramuros. He was a member of the 37 mm Anti-Tank Squad and fought for Naguilian, Santa Fe, Aritao, and Bayombong to Apari.

March - Malasiqui was considered completely liberated from the Japs. However, there were few snipers left in the hills, which were left to our unit to eliminate, which we did. It took us until the month of May to wipe out completely the presence of Japanese snipers.

June - Believing that there were no more Japs in the Cabaroan hills, the farmers began to return to their homes to prepare for the approaching planting season. But at times one or two Japanese appeared and begged for foods. Our patrols were alert to capture them either alive or dead. Lt. Sison brought a Jap alive to the town from the hills who were turned over to the Prison Camp.

From June to the later days of 1945, we continued maintaining our posts in guarding the outskirts of the town for fear of the reappearance of Japanese snipers.

We assisted in the guarding of the railway tracks, and communications, and bridges to prevent any possible infiltrations of Makapils and other pro-Jap elements.

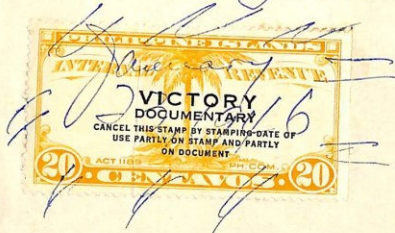

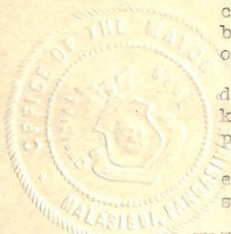

3. That Captain Pastor was especially assigned as Liaison Officer of my unit, a position so badly needed in coordinating and synchronizing guerrilla activities with other units for effective results;
4. As such Officer, he performed his duties with dexterity, diplomacy, and tact resulting in the success of his mission;
5. That due to oversight, he was inadvertently omitted in the original Roster submitted to that office, he being recruited by the PEGAU No. 18 under 32nd Division in Tayug, Pangasinan, to organize and supervise schools, as early as Feb., 1945.
6. The following activities were performed by him:
 - a. On or about Dec. 22, he was sent to Agoo, La Union, to contact a man of Agguerrilla Unit for some information he possessed about the Jap Garrison in Malasiqui. After meeting the man, he was arrested and imprisoned for some hours in Agoo Garrison on suspicion as a guerrilla spy. He was however released later, for lack of incriminating papers found in his possession.

 - c. As a District Supervisor of all schools of Malasiqui before the outbreak of the war, he was ordered to dispose of all schools radios to different units of their own use.

 - e. Ordered to assist in the intelligence work while at the same time performing his duties as a liaison officer.
