My dear Colonel Pales,

I understand that your Office is very busy investigating Guerilla units pending recognition. However, much as I regret to bother you about our unit- the TUGUIGUI- Tuy, Batangas Unit under the late Cel. Straungh, I am compelled to do so in view of a very disturbing information that came to my knowledge to the effect that the said unit is not listed as among these still pending recognition. During the past few months we have been repeatedly given assurance by our Colonels that our case is still pending and that eventual recognition may be forthcoming.

For your information I wish to state here that after the death of our original Colonels- Col. Espina of Batangas, Batangas- and Col. Tuguigui of Tuy Batangas organizers of the said unit, Maj. Calingasan and Major Apacible also members of this unit, took command and both becoming self-appointed Colonels and by invitation of the BLUE EAGLE COMMAND, which was about then to be processed, they attached themselves with the Blue Eagle, including only part of the Tuguigui Unit, and those who did not know about it were left behind- eventually the Blue Eagle has been processed and with them our commanders and part of our unit. So that what happened to us was just like the crews of a ship abandoned by its commanders to take command of another ship. Very strange indeed! We were abandoned by the men on whom we depended much to carry on our unit after the execution of Col. Espina and Col. Tuguigui.

Remember Cel. that we joined the organization without any promise of compensation except that we were told that we are to help in the de-

of our democratic principles and that we are under Col. Straughn (we learn later that he was executed by the Japs.). We joined the organization knowing that a little mistake would cost us our necks.

Remember also Colonel, that if we claim now for eventual recognition, it is because we consider our case also entitled to all the benefits accorded other Guerilla Units. I personally know of some men luckier than us because they have been processed long time ago, and yet some of them have refused to join us- Our Engineer Com. when organized in 1942 (Oct. 12) here in Lumbangan, Nasugbu, Batangas, just a few weeks after its organization with originated in Tuy, Batangas. Was it because the Japs were victorious then? But mind you Colonel Stuart, were Col. Espina and Col. Tuguigui living today, things will be different. Suffice to say then that after all we have contributed something to our Country and to Mother America.

In closing, I only beg of you Col. Pales, on my own behalf, my Co. and fellow officers of the 2nd and 3rd Bn. of the referred unit, to kindly inform us the exact fate of our Unit. I am very much obliged and thank you so much Col. Stuart Pales.

Dear Mr. Calingasan:

The *Tuy Unit PAIT*, purporting to be a guerrilla organization under your nominal control, is not favorably considered for recognition as an element of the Philippine Army.

A set of general requirements for guerrilla recognition, established by General MacArthur during the liberation of the Philippines, has been used as a guide in considering the record of this unit. After careful investigation and full consideration of all available substantiating records and testimony of witnesses having pertinent knowledge, recognition of this guerrilla unit is not deemed to be warranted because of reasons mentioned below:

- a. The unit was not maintained satisfactorily in the field in opposition to the enemy.
- b. Activities of the unit did not contribute materially to the eventual defeat of the enemy.
- c. Adequate records were not maintained (names, ranks, dates of enlistment or joining, dates of promotions, and necessary related information).
- d. Unit did not show satisfactory continuity of activity and organization.
- e. Members of the unit did not devote their entire effort to military activities in the field to the exclusion of normal civilian occupation and family obligations.
- f. Some personnel listed as members of the unit assisted it by contributing money and supplies but did not serve in a capacity considered to justify such membership.
- g. Record of service was not substantiated by sufficient acceptable evidence.

It is requested that you comply with the provisions of Executive Order No. 68, by the President of the Philippines, dated 26 September 1945, copy attached.

REPORT ON "TUY UNIT-FAIT"

In accordance with verbal instructions from Chief of Section, Guerrilla Affairs Branch, G-3, AFWESPAC, lieutenants Leonard J. Aubuchon and Eliseo Sta. Romana proceeded to Tuy, Batangas to contact the Tuy Unit FAIT in order to determine whether or not this organization should be recognized by the United States Army. The following report is a summary of the investigation and basis for the recommendation.

HISTORY

Domingo A. Tuguigui a minister of the Disciples of Christ Church is claimed to have been active in espionage activities, in Manila in early 1942. In August 1942 he learned he was wanted by the Japs, so he left Manila and went to Tuy, Batangas where on 3 September 1942 he began to organize the Tuy Unit FAIT, asserting that he had been given authority to form the unit by Col. Hugh S. Straughn.

During the years of occupation the unit confined its activities to maintenance of peace and order, spreading propaganda, hunting Jap spies, sabotaging the Jap experimental cotton crops and assisting in the organization of other guerrilla units. By 1944 the unit had gained a membership of 2000 members and the arms they possessed totaled forty.

On 5 May 1944 Mr. Tuguigui CO of the Tuy unit was captured by the Japs and executed because of his activities in organizing guerrilla units. After the death of Tuguigui the Tuy Unit became disorganized and each company operated separately. On 15 October 1944 Vicente Calingasan, Mayor of Tuy and Executive Officer of the Tuy Unit FAIT gathered together approximately 700 members of this unit and they were inducted into the Rainbow Regt of the Blue Eagle Command. Due to the disorganization of the Tuy Unit FAIT all members were not inducted into the Blue Eagle. On 10 March 1946 Apolinario Apacible formerly of the FAIT later recognized as a Lt. Col. in the Blue Eagle submitted the roster of the Tuy Unit FAIT requesting recognition.

FINDINGS

The following persons were interviewed and their statements are the basis for the findings:

The Tuy Unit FAIT was organized during September 1942 with Domingo Tuguigui as CO and Vicente Calingasan Mayor of Tuy as Executive Officer. The Unit had very few arms so could not operate as a combat organization. According to the statements of Vicente Calingasan and Apolinario R. Apacible, leaders of the organization, their activities were confined to maintenance of peace and order hunting out spies, spreading propaganda and helping to organize other guerrilla units. They also claim to have sabotaged the Jap cotton raising experiments. All of these activities were patriotic work, but were more minor in nature and cannot be considered as having contributed greatly toward the eventual defeat of the Japanese.

It is apparent that the organization was very loosely knit, for after the death of Domingo Tuguigui, it never operated as a unit and each company worked independently. It is the belief of the investigating officer that the unit actually ceased to exist after Tuguigui's death for the members of the organization were extremely lazy as to activities and operation after this time. On October 1944 Vicente Calingasan and Apolinario Apacible recruited approximately 8700 former members of the Tuy Unit FAIT which group became a part of the Rainbow Regt, Blue Eagle Command that was then in the process of organizing.

An undetermined number of former members of the Tuy Unit were later recognized as members of the Blue Eagle Brigade. It was not until 10 March 1946 five days before the deadline for submitting guerrilla roster, that the roster of the Tuy Unit was submitted by Apolinario Apacible. In this roster he lists himself as Ex C whereas Vicente Calingasan was actually the Ex C. When asked why they were so late in submitting their roster their reason was that when they heard the Blue Eagle Brigade was recognized they felt they had equally as much claim to recognition as submitted a roster. When the members of the unit were interviewed in Tuy they were asked the question "What was the longest period you were a full time guerrilla?" and the answer received was invariably "I never was a full time guerrilla, I worked part time" Many members of the unit were farmers who continued to farm during the occupation and according to the unit history and statements of the members, they were engaged in the raising of cotton which was a Japanese experimental project. In a signed statement in the file of this office, Col. Marking Agustin PA overall commander of Marking Fil-American Guerrillas and Col. Terry Adevosco, overall commander of Hunters ROTC, state that the Tuy Unit FAIT was a passive organization. It is concluded that:

- The unit was never well organized.
- Activities were of a passive nature.
- The members only operated on a part time basis.
- The unit ceased to exist as a unit in May 1944.

POLITICAL ASPECTS

Both Vicente Calingasan and Apolinario R. Apacible are politicians and evidence was found that they used the Blue Eagle

Brigade for political purposes during the recent election campaign however it is believed by the investigating officer that the Tuy unit FAIT was too disorganized to be used effectively as a political weapon.

RECOMMENDATION

After careful consideration of statements made by members of the organization and an analysis of the documents presented, it is recommended that the Tuy Unit FAIT be not favorably considered for recognition.

FIL-AMERICAN IRREGULAR TROOPS
(UNDER COL. HUGH S. STRAUGHN)
TUY UNIT

A BRIEF HISTORY

When the Japanese troops entered Manila on January 2, 1942, the city was dressed in sorrow; it was draped in black. The sun was completely hidden in the heavens as billowing smoke from scuttled ships and oil and gasoline dumps which were set afire rose to obliterate and snuff the light of liberty under which the Filipino people used to live. Added to the mantle of mourning were smoke arising from enemy-bombed targets in Manila and Cavite which had been burning unabatedly for days.

Manila was lost, but fierce fighting was going on in Batan and a fiercer fighting still was going on under the throbbing breast of the unconquerable people. After the fall of Batan the love for freedom manifested itself. Posterity should be thankful that the world produced freedom-loving men, one of whom was Major Domingo A. Tuguigui, to single out one among them, who sacrificed his precious blood that other men might live - live not a life of appeasement with the enemy that he might live unharmed, but a life of dignity and honor, unanswerable to his God, to his fellowmen and more so to his conscience!

The Tuy Unit of the Fil-American Irregular Troops has the signal honor of having Major Domingo A. Tuguigui as its organizer and founder.

Immediately after the fall of Batan Domingo A. Tuguigui busied himself in espionage activities in and around Manila under the employ of Col. Salvador B. Rille, his uncle, who was then in personal contact with and at that time financier of Col. Hugh S. Straughn. After the capture of Col. Rille by the Japanese Kempei Tai sometime in August, 1942, Major Domingo A. Tuguigui learned that he was also being shadowed by the enemy. He immediately went to the home town of his wife, Mrs. Marieta B. Tuguigui and on September 3, 1942, organized, with the assistance of Major Vicente Calingasan, the Tuy Unit of the Fil-American Irregular Troops under Col. Hugh S. Straughn. Appointments and oaths of officers and men were issued and taken in September 1942. Original appointment and oath papers were sent to the headquarters of Col. Jorge Espina in Batangas who commissioned him to issue appointments and take oaths.

Major Domingo A. Tuguigui was a man of action and under him and Major Vicente Calingasan, his Unit was also active. Most important accomplishment in the early days of the Unit was the maintenance of 2 escaped American soldiers from Corregidor, Patrick Malley and Harold Guentner, under the care of Capt. Tomas Panaligan, Major Calingasan and Major Domingo Tuguigui. The two were hidden and cared for in barribe Teeng, located at the foot of Batulac mountains. Sometime in February 24, 1944 they were taken to Mindoro to join Major Phillips. They were escorted personally by Major Domingo A. Tuguigui and Capt. Tomas Panaligan, but upon setting foot on Mindoro shore, the Japs were there to welcome them. Unfortunately, Harold Guentner was captured. Patrick Malley, Capt. Panaligan and Major Tuguigui were able to escape. Patrick Malley reached the headquarters of Major Phillips, while Major Domingo A. Tuguigui and Capt. Tomas Panaligan were able to return to Batangas.

Immediately after the organization of the Unit on September 3, 1943, the Unit at once organized a propaganda section which operated 2 radio receiving sets, one owned by Capt. Tomas Panaligan and the other by Capt. Guillermo Lafable, both members of the propaganda section of the Unit. Incidentally, Capt. Leonarde Almazan, also a member of the propaganda section, is an experienced stenographer and could take radio news broadcasts from San Francisco daily in shorthand and transcribe them on the typewriter. The typewriters in the office of Capt. Clemente Sala, the incumbent municipal treasurer and the municipal mayor's office were always used when doing this transcribing job. Several copies were made. Translations into the local dialect was also made and typewritten copies sent to the non-english reading folks. English transcribed notes were sent to other guerrilla units of neighboring municipalities like Balayan, Nasugbu, Lian, Calatagan, Calaca, Lemery, Tual, Batangas and even as far as Manila. As Jap spies were lurking here and there even the convents of Tuy, with the consent of lat Lt. Rufresino Leuterio, attached chaplain of the Unit, and even the gutters of the municipal building of Tuy, places which were to be least suspected to host anti-Jap activities, were the very places where the receiving sets were kept and news broadcasts taken. To those who heard the "Voice of Freedom" the broadcast was like a shot in the vein to give them renewed life and joy. For America was speaking, America was promising, America was fighting, MacArthur was returning! The way may be lined with crosses from New Guinea to the Philippines, but Democracy and Freedom must return here and with American arms the Filipinos were willing to fight side by side with the Americans until the enemy has recoiled to his homeland and learned his lesson there. Such a desire was not wanting in the officers and men of this Unit. They were hiding their time and limited themselves to keeping up the morale of the people high by means of effective propaganda activities, protecting the civilian population against lawless elements, liquidating Japanese-hired spies like the notorious Herberto Neneles of Nasugbu, Batangas and his men. Neneles was killed together with his men right in the middle of the town of Tuy under the direction of Major Vicente Calingasan in September 1943. Neneles was responsible for the unearthing of arms and ammunition, also gasoline in Nasugbu which the retreating USAFFE men left in the wake of their systematic retreat. Besides this he was a constant menace to the peace of the people as he committed abuses here and there.

On January 12, 1943, Major Domingo A. Tuguigui went to Manila and the day following he went to the Samsonite building to see an important guerrilla figure in connection with his guerrilla activities. He did not know that he was being followed by the Japanese Kempei Tai. He was arrested at Fort Santiago. There he suffered untold punishments - punishments inflicted beyond a human being's capacity to endure calculated to fleece from him some information regarding his guerrilla activities. But Domingo A. Tuguigui held on for he had he squealed his officers and men would have tasted the fangs of Fort Santiago like him, perhaps some of them may not have lived to continue the fight for which he died. Thrice he was brought to his cell unconscious as a result of the brutal punishments the enemy inflicted on him in his vain effort to gather information regarding his guerrilla organization. But he preferred to die or preferred to die slowly or lived in the torture chambers of Fort Santiago where men lived in the future and died in the present - where men lived in the light but groped in the darkness - where men pondered the impendable - where men did not hope for there was no hope - men's only repose was the Almighty and the All-merciful GOD!

Daily from slits in his cell Major Domingo A. Tuguigui could see victims' heads chopped off and carried away in kerosene cans. Even innocent children were no exception. Could there be barbarism lower than this or mockery on civilization more debasing than this? Was there a challenge on civilization bolder than this?

Sometimes the devil lifts his finger from the victim. On February 14, 1943, Domingo A. Tuguigui was released from Fort Santiago and he was received warmly by his officers and men in Tuy. Major Domingo A. Tuguigui was more determined than ever to continue the fight for freedom. With Major Vicente Calingasan and Major Apolinario Apocible they set on their mission of subotage.

The Dai Nippon Deneki Kaisha was a Japanese commercial entity which was run and financed by the Japanese Army. It was engaged in raising and cultivation of cotton to feed the hungry mills of Tokyo. The municipality of Tuy, Batangas was one of the towns in western Batangas included in the Army's program to raise cotton materials for the mills. The intelligence officers of the Tuy Unit of the Fil-American Irregular Troops instructed the men of the unit who were mostly farmers feroced to raise cotton to throw away the fertilizers supplied them and at night uproot the cotton plants halfway when they were blossoming, being careful that they were not to be noticed by the Japanese inspectors upon their inspection. The subotage was successful. The Japanese cotton cultivation in western Batangas especially in the municipality of Tuy was a complete failure. For two years they tried cotton mass cultivation; for two years they failed miserably. The period mentioned was from September, 1942 to September, 1944.

As mentioned somewhere in this history, Harold Queatner was captured in the shores of Abra de Ilog, Mindoro sometime on February 24, 1944. He was brought to the Japanese garrison at Central Don Pedro, Namagbo, Batangas. On March 2, 1944 Major Vicente Calingasan was apprehended by the Japanese soldiers from the Central Don Pedro Garrison at his home in Tuy. Capt. Tomas Paneligan, and Major Domingo A. Tuguigui were also wanted. Fortunately they were still away at the time. When they reached Balayan, they were tipped by the intelligence operatives of the Unit that they were being hunted by the Japanese. They hid. Major Vicente Calingasan was garrisoned at the Central Don Pedro for 37 days and suffered the dreaded water cure; hanging by the back head tie for 12 hours, this punishment being repeated for days and days; the inverted hanging; beatings by baseball bat all over the body and several more processes of punishment only the devil and the Japanese could devise. Capt. Venancio Baez also underwent the same punishment for his activities in the Unit. The charges against him were that he was keeping arms and financing the guerrilla organization of the FAIT in Tuy, and the charges against Major Vicente Calingasan were that he was responsible for the death of the Japanese hired spy Herberto Henales, together with his men, that he supported and maintained 2 Americans in Teang and placed them under the care of Capt. Tomas Paneligan (referring to Cpl. Harold Queatner of 942-H 5th Street., St. Helena, Oregon and Pfc. Patrick Kelly of Spaulding, Buffalo, New York. The family of Cpl. Harold Queatner is now in constant correspondence with Capt. Tomas Paneligan; that he kept radio receiving sets or allowed others to keep them in the municipality of Tuy; that he was a member and co-organizer of the Tuy Unit of the FAIT; that he kept in his custody several unreported arms and ammunition and supporting the guerrilla organization in Tuy. Major Calingasan and Capt. Venancio Baez preferred to

suffer the punishment inflicted on them rather than give any information regarding their guerrilla activities and the Tug Unit of the FAIT. Of course they were tenacious and brave and to them the Unit owes a lasting debt of gratitude.

Capt. Antonio Apacible, 2nd Lt. Apelenio Apacible, 1st Lt. Pedro Macalala and 2nd Lt. Ceame Bayabada were also arrested by the Japanese soldiers and brought to the Central Nasugbu Garrison on April 1, 1944, but evidence against them being insufficient, they were only held for a few questionings regarding their guerrilla activities all of which questions they satisfactorily answered, after which they were sent home but warned that any time they may be arrested and shot. Major Apelinario Apacible was wanted at that time, also Major Demage A. Tuguigui and Capt. Tomas Panaligan. Capt. Venancio Esca was set free on April 6, 1944. He was arrested three times in immediate succession. Harold Quentner was executed by the Japs in the Central Garrison sometime in the beginning of April, 1943. Major Vicente Callagasan was brought to Las Bañas and finally set free on April 9, 1944.

Major Demage A. Tuguigui was all the time busy organizing other guerrilla units of the FAIT in neighboring municipalities. He was the man who suggested and convinced Major Redelfe Bahia and Major Amador Deguita to organize the Palayan Unit of the Fil-American Irregular Troops. He also helped Capt. Casilio, an ex-USAFSA man organize the Nasugbu Unit of the FAIT; Cel. Baquilalar organizer of the Calaca Unit of the FAIT. When all these Units were organized and ready to receive arms, Major Demage A. Tuguigui went to Mindere on February 28, 1944 to contact Major Phillips, who was then in contact with General MacArthur's headquarters in Australia. At dawn, March 5, 1944, he returned in a small sailboat, but the boat was fired upon and sunk by the Japs in Palayan bay. He was able to escape and continued in hiding until April 18, 1944 when he was arrested by Capt. Gedeonede Masala of the puppet Philippine Constabulary and turned over to the Japanese captain at the Garrison in Nasugbu. He has unheard from since then until a certain Freilan Noble of Lemery, Batangas told his wife, Mrs. Marieta B. Tuguigui about his death which took place in a motor launch in the middle of the sea between Mindere and Batangas on May 8, 1944. Seen after Major Vicente Callagasan took command until its induction into the Blue Eagle Command on October 15, 1944.

But due to the haste and therefore lack of time with which the fusion into the Blue Eagle Command was made and the lack of adequate means of communication the officers and men of the Tug Unit of the Fil-American Irregular Troops who now appear in the attached roster were not included in the merger. These men were not wanting in patriotism; they were not wanting in the spirit of struggle in the darkest hours of the occupation and liberation; they were genuine guerrillas; they were simply missed in the merger or induction into the Blue Eagle Command.

Independently, the unattached officers and their respective men were active in the campaign against the enemy during the fight for liberation. 1st Lt. Demianer Santos and his men on Feb. 2, 1945, with 3 rifles and a handful of hand grenades were able to kill 11 Japanese in Tule, Bayubed, Tug and capture 1 Japanese soldier. The prisoner was presented as a souvenir to the Headquarters of the 11th Airborne Division in Nasugbu, Batangas. Capt. Venancio Esca utilized his transportation facilities in transporting helpless civilians to ~~place~~ safety, which was Nasugbu.

2nd Lt. Arcadio Avena and his men engaged the enemy in Dae, Tug on February 4, 1945 in a pitched battle for several hours. Lt. Avena received a severe wound on the hip, but he and his men were able to kill 7 Japanese.

Sad Lt. Cernelio Carandang and his men engaged the Japanese in Nagahis, Tugay on February 5, 1945, for several hours killing 18 Japanese who were caught taking dinner after liquidating the guard. Lt. Carandang suffered no losses.

Sad Lt. Adelito Rodriguez with 16 of his men, on February 8, 1945 encountered the enemy, about 40 strong and engaged them in battle for 6 hours lasting from 1 to 7:00 in the afternoon, killing 18 Japanese. Lt. Rodriguez suffered no casualties. The remnants fled under cover of darkness.

Capt. Jose Carandang gathered arms and ammunition for the men during the fight for liberation. Although he was not able to procure enough rifles, he was able to secure several hand grenades for the men. The rifles did not come from the 11th Airborne Division, but borrowed from friends and sympathizers. The hand grenades came from sympathetic American troops and from the 11th Airborne Division Headquarters in Masugbu which was then distributing them freely to guerrillas.

As the officers and men of the Unit who were not included in the fusion with the Blue Eagle Command at the time thought that they set a raw deal, which later they later on learned that it was not so the main reason being that there was no sufficient time to contact them and the lack of adequate means of communication to get in touch with them, they repented to no use regarding their campaign against the enemy during the fight for liberation and satisfied themselves with the thought that they were fighting for freedom and posterity and that their founder and organizer, Major Domingo A. Tuguigui should not have died in vain.

I, APOLINARIO R. APACIBLE, PA, of legal age, Filipino, married and a resident of the municipality of Nasugbu, Batangas, Philippines, after being duly sworn to in accordance with law, depose and say as follows:

1. That I was the Executive Officer of the Fil-American Irregular Troops, 6th Regiment, Tuy Unit, organized by the late Major Domingo A. Tuguiqui and Major Vicente Galingasan;
2. That I know that the officers and men in the roster of the Tuy Unit of the Fil-American Irregular Troops are bona-fide members of the said organization;
3. That the appointments and oaths of the officers and men of the organization which were then in the possession of Major Domingo A. Tuguiqui, organizer, were burned and destroyed immediately after his arrest for the protection and safety of the organization;
4. That the members of the Unit were active in the campaign against the enemy particularly against Japanese spies; maintenance of peace and order and the protection of the civilian population;
5. That due to the loss of command due to the news of the arrest and execution of our organizer, Major Domingo A. Tuguiqui, the Unit was affiliated to the Blue Eagle Command on October 15, 1944;
6. That in the fusion or attachment to the Blue Eagle Command some of the officers and men of the Fil-American Irregular Troops of the Tuy Unit were not included due to the lack of time and the lack of adequate means of communication;
7. That notwithstanding our attachment and induction into the Blue Eagle Command, the non-affiliated and non-inducted members of the Tuy Unit of the Fil-American Irregular Troops which was organized by Major Domingo A. Tuguiqui on September 3, 1942, suffered likewise untold sufferings and sacrifices for the cause of democracy and freedom, under the risk of losing their own life and beyond the call of duty before and during the liberation.



S i r :

This is to file complaints against Maj. Vicente Calihgasan of Tuy, Batangas, belonging to Rainbow of Blue Eagle Regiment which is now being processed, as follows:

1. Vicente Calihgasan, served as the Municipal Mayor of Tuy during the Japanese regime.
2. As Mayor he terrorized the ignorant barrio people, exacting from them foodstuffs for the consumption of the Japanese Army, often times getting bigger quantities of foodstuffs than the requirement of the Japanese for the purpose of selling them for profits for his own personal benefit.
3. He established a buying corporation for the Army and Navy, of which he is the head, by gaining ₱1.00 per kilo of foodstuffs for his purchases.
4. One time, he gave a reception for F. Concepcion de la Rama, now detained for charge of treason, when said Mr. de la Rama came to Tuy to find out the situation of the Buying Corporation headed by Vicente Calihgasan.
5. Vicente Calihgasan caused the murder of one Rosales of Tuy, brother of Justino Rosales, of the same for criticising the high-handed conduct of the Municipal police of Tuy.
6. Vicente Calihgasan kept some Americans in the mountain during the Japanese occupation, and collected contribution from various people, specially from the officials of the Sugar Central Don Pedro, located in Nasugbu, Batangas, and pocketed the contributions for his own use and benefit.
7. At present he has in the possession of his men who are the lawless elements of the town, about 70 guns of all sizes, and make, in spite of the law requiring all guerillas to surrender their arms. He will use these arms, and he did before, in lawless acts, and hold the people down by means of force and terrorism. Even during the Japanese time he was connected with robbery and looting cases.
8. A policeman was caught with a stolen horse. He confessed that he stole the horse following the instructions of Mayor Calihgasan. After the confession, he instructed the Japanese Kempri to kill him. He was killed immediately.

9. Vicente Califigasan was arrested by the Japanese Military Police as a guerilla suspect. He squealed against almost all the people of Batangas, who were later arrested and tortured.

10. Thru use of intimidation and force Califigasan ordered bamboos cut from private lands and sold them for profit without paying the owners.

11. The elected Mayor of Tuy is Apolinario Apacible, an attorney, and refused to serve the Japanese, but political machinations, returned Vicente Califigasan to the same post he occupied during the Japanese occupation.

12. In the hold-up perpetrated by an American and a dozen Filipinos in Palico, Nasugbu, Batangas, where one man was wounded and over P10,000.00 were taken by the bandits from several people, Vicente Califigasan tried to quash the case because of his connection with the lawless elements.

13. Vicente Califigasan is now busy recruiting men to form his guerilla group to be processed, men who had never taken any active part in the resistance movement, just to get a Colonel rank. Two of his new recruited officer, Tirso Cruz and Domingo Pesia were members of the Makapili organized under Vicente Califigasan. They made speeches asking young men to join the Makapili and organized the Purchasing Corporation for the Japanese Army and Navy.

I recommend that Maj. Rueda in the Criminal Investigation, M. P., Manila, be detailed to investigate secretly the charges against Vicente Califigasan, and his present activity in recruiting men for his guerilla group. Maj. Rueda was once a Constabulary officer of the place and knows all the people around. All should be made secret because Califigasan and his men are armed. These people should be kept in prison instead of processing them in the Philippine Army.

I am a widow with five small children. My husband died because Vicente Califigasan reported him to the Japanese. I live in a farm, and I cannot risk revealing my identity because

Callaghan's men are all armed around my place. So just keep this secret. I requested a friend of mine to write this.
