In compliance with our verbal agreement in our conference on the 13th of December 1947 in relation with the recognition of my unit under the personal organization of Lt Colonel C A Thorp, foremost guerrilla organizer on Luzon, I beg leave to submit the following:

"RELATION OF FACTS IN ORGANIZING OUR UNIT UNDER OATH"

Before and during the outbreak of the war, I was a duly enlisted Private in the Philippine Scouts, serving as the personal bodyguard and driver of Lt Col C A Thorp, Provost Marshal of Fort Stotsenburg, Pampanga, and as such I continuously rendered 24 hours daily service with him until the time when Bataan was about to surrender. At the very moment of the final decision that Bataan would have to surrender, Lt Col Thorp advised me to accompany him to the mountains and encamped ourselves in the boundaries of Pampanga, Tarlac, Bataan and Zambales. In this place we established our Headquarters from where we organized guerrilla units. During this time our USAFFE was still resisting at Bataan. Among our companions in this organization were some American officers, one veteran of the Philippine Scouts who rendered services during the Philippine Insurrection, Sgt Mauricio Mendoza and two contact men, one Marcos Iaxamana and one Julian Mendoza. Through the movements of these contact men, in a period of three weeks, more or less, we made prominent and respected elements in Pampanga, Tarlac, Zambales and Bataan ready to support the guerrilla movements should our Army surrender.

Bataan sorrowfully surrendered. Our group, headed by Lt Col C A Thorp moved from one place to another, organizing guerrilla units. I took charge of organizing a small squad which rendered services as our vanguards, security guards and runners at the same time. This unit was under my personal command, having with me a young man as my Executive Officer, 1st Lieutenant Policarpio Manalad. The roster of this unit was duly prepared in writing signed by Capt Everett R Brooks, designated District Commanding Officer of Tarlac Area and duly countersigned and approved by Lt Col C A Thorp. This document is now on file in the Guerrilla Affairs Division, PHILRYCOM in connection with the process being carried out for our recognition.

It Col C A Thorp was captured by the enemies on or about October 1943 at Mount Pinatubo. Our American companions distributed themselves in the different hiding places in Bataan, Pangasinan, Tarlac, Zambales and Nueva Ecija, which later place was our rendezvous after finding out that this was an ideal

place for any contact with American submarines on missions. Among the most popular of these American guerrilleros and whom I personally know and with whom I had been in personal contact were Major Robert B Iapham, Lt Col Ramsey, Capt Everret Brooks, Capt McGuire, Capt Hendrikson, Capt Ray C Hunt, Jr, and others whose names I cannot remember.

During this stage of our guerrilla movements, I stayed with my old unit composed of the Officers and Enlisted Men appearing in the roster above referred to, signed by Capt Brooks and Lt Col Thorp. In addition to this, we had with us Sgt Mauricio Mendoza who was in continuous contact with the HUKBAIHAPS organization of Pampanga, Tarlac and Bulacan to convince this organization to unite under the genuine guerrilla movement; we had 2d Lieut Julian Mendoza assigned to campaign for the cooperation of the local governments then being established by the Japanese towards the guerrilla movement and another officer designated as Propaganda Officer with the rank of 2d Lieutenant now recognized as Captain, one Capt Agustin Z Bustos who roamed around the province of Pampanga exhibiting shows and public entertainment to encourage people to support the guerrilla movements. These movements being carried out had been supervised, aided, guided and given protection by my small unit composed of the names in the roster above referred to. Aside from this unit, we had in the municipalities of Masantol Macabebe, Sexmoan and San Fernando, Pampanga, small units supporting our movements secretly but not in active participation in field work which we had been conducting. Our General Headquarters was established at Barrio Patling, O'Donnell, Capas, Tarlac. Aside from these activities above related, this small unit rendered assistance to the escape of Prisoners of War in the said concentration camp and also in securing provisions for the patients in the said interment camp. These movements and activities were carried out actively until the late part of the year 1943 when the HUKBAIHAPS opposed all our movements and dominated Pampanga in their radical movements opposing our organization.

To avoid open conflict with this organization we moved our Headquarters near the boundary of Pangasinan and Tarlac, cooperating in all guerrilla movements with Capt Federico A Sonaco of the Southern District of Pangasinan and with the organization of Capt Hendrikson. Our strength then was increased to 100 Officers and Enlisted Men in active field service. This is how the nucleus of my unit was duly organized and activated in field service.

A few months before the arrival of the American Liberating Forces on Luzon on 9 January 1945, our unit had a scattered strength aside from these encamped in the boundary of Tarlac and Pangasinan as above stated, a strength of 400 Officers and Enlisted Men scattered in Pampanga and Tarlac, ever ready for any call to active duty, roster of which is already on file in the Guerrilla Affairs Division, PHIRYCOM but this group did not actually render field service. They were affiliated to us, having a secret meeting place from where they received orders and instructions once every two

weeks.

On the arrival of the American Liberating Forces, at Dagupan, Pangasinan, I personally reported, leaving my unit at Manaoag, Pangasinan, together with Capt Federico A Sonaco and Capt Agustin Z Bustos to the General Headquarters of General MacArthur at Dagupan, Pangasinan. After two days of conference with Colonel Egeberg and Colonel Courtney Whitney, we were instructed to return to our former sphere of operations and to wait for orders of attachments with the United States Army. I returned with my unit of about 100 Officers and Enlisted Men to San Miguel, Tarlac. My men were distributed to the different units of the United States Army moving from Tarlac to Fort Stotsenburg, Pampanga, Angeles and Mabalacat, Pampanga in small groups. A bigger group composed of around 70 men, more or less, were assigned by me under an attachment with Capt Govonni, the roster of which was the one which was extended terminal recognition without even my knowledge as I did not receive any official communication to this effect. Most of the oldtimers and intelligent officers and enlisted men were attached with the Air Corps, United States Army in groups of five or six. Among these groups was that headed by 1st Lieutenant Policarpio Manalad and 1st Lieut Juan Dizon which was attached as per certificates of attachments which are on file with the Guerrilla Affairs Division with the roster submitted by me for the 31 men in question.

From these relations of facts above stated, there is deducted the reasons and how our rosters were submitted in 3 groups to the Guerrilla Affairs Division, PHILRYCOM, to wit: (1) A general roster composed of 500 Officers and Enlisted Men as of our strength when I reported personally for active duty, mostly of which were not activated; (2) A roster of 71 Officers and Enlisted Men activated and attached with Capt Govonni; and (3) A roster of 31 men as the final reorganization of the old unit of the roster duly signed by Capt Everret Brooks and Lt Col Thorp, thus this last roster was derived from the old roster with the replacements of those who did not continue serving which were in the old roster on file. Hence, this roster in question is the identical roster composed of Officers and Enlisted Men actually in service with our guerrilla activities as of 12 August 1942 with the addition of 2d Lieut Julian B Mendoza and Sergeant Mauricio Mendoza who had been missing since the middle part of the year 1944 and who is believed to have been killed by the HUKBALAHAPS, a casualty named Sgt Fortunato Buena-ventura who was killed in action in February 1945 and another living casualty, Pvt Evaristo Masangcay who was wounded in action and confined in the hospital during the preparation of the roster.

With these allegations, I, as the Commanding Officer of the said unit do hereby petition that the roster composed of 31 Officers and Enlisted Men, revising that roster signed by Capt Brooks and Lt Col Thorp, under my personal command with the addition of the names of 2d Lieut Julian B Mendoza, Sgt Mauricio Mendoza, Sgt Fortunato Buena-ventura and Pvt Evaristo Masangcay be recognized as

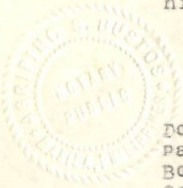

I, FRED SLAIKY of legal age, M/Sgt. Ret., with Serial number R-322867, American citizen, now residing at Barrie Lourdes, municipality of Angeles, province of Pampanga, Philippines, after having been duly sworn to, depose and say:

That I knew personally Mr. Gonzale C. Mendoza, member of the THORP'S USAFFE GUERRILLA, whom I had met even before the outbreak of the PACIFIC WAR, for he, having been a member of the then Military Police, PS. U. S. A. stationed at Fort Stotsenberg, Angeles, Pampanga, under the command of the late Col. Claude A. Therp to whom said Mr. Gonzale C. Mendoza specially served as a driver;

That after the outbreak of the PACIFIC WAR, and when the United States forces retreated to Bataan Peninsula, Mr. Gonzale C. Mendoza was with us rendering valuable and efficient services to the United States Army, while we were stationed at Bagaac, Bataan;

That on or about 26 January, 1942, after the late Col. C. A. Therp received a verbal instruction from General Douglas MacArthur to conduct Guerrilla operations in Central Luzon, we, Col. C. A. Therp, Mr. Gonzale C. Mendoza and I, left Bagaac for Mt. Pinatube where we had set up our Headquarters for our Guerrilla operations, and upon our arrival at Pinatube Mr. Gonzale C. Mendoza was sent to Macabebe, Pampanga to recruit men. He was able to recruit several hundred of men who swore allegiance to the United States of America before Maj. Robert B. Lapham at Mt. Pinatube in the presence of Col. C. A. Therp and I;

That when the late Col. C. A. Therp was captured by the Japanese we were forced by circumstances to separate from each other;

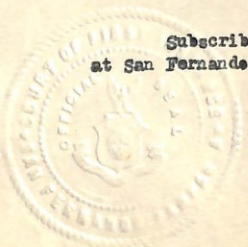
That, for further investigation in the case of Mr. Gonzale C. Mendoza, in connection with the recognition of his Guerrilla Unit, I voluntarily offer my testimony in his favor.

That after the outbreak of the PACIFIC WAR, and when the United States forces retreated to Batang Peninsula, Mr. Gonzale C. Mendosa was with us rendering valuable and efficient services to the United States Army, while we were stationed at Baguac, Batang;

That on or about 26 January, 1942, after the late Col. C. A. Therp received a verbal instruction from General Douglas MacArthur to conduct Guerrilla operations in Central Luzon, we, Col. C. A. Therp, Mr. Gonzale C. Mendosa and I, left Baguac for Mt. Pinatubo where we had set up our Headquarters for our Guerrilla operations, and upon our arrival at Pinatubo Mr. Gonzale C. Mendosa was sent to Macabebe, Pampanga to recruit men. He was able to recruit several hundred of men who swore allegiance to the United States of America before Maj. Robert B. Lapham at Mt. Pinatubo in the presence of Col. C. A. Therp and I;

That when the late Col. C. A. Therp was captured by the Japanese we were forced by circumstances to separate from each other;

That, for further investigation in the case of Mr. Gonzale C. Mendosa, in connection with the recognition of his Guerrilla Unit, I voluntarily offer my testimony in his favor.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, I signed and set my hand this 22nd day of October, 1947, at San Fernando, Pampanga.

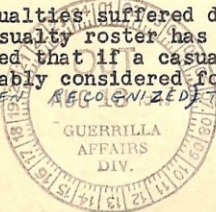

The Commanding General has directed that you be informed that the Southern Pangasinan Guerrilla Forces, a guerrilla unit under your nominal control, recognized by letter Headquarters APPAC, dated 12 July 1945, has not been favorably considered for revision of its present recognition date.

A thorough and detailed examination of all supporting papers submitted by your unit and an exhaustive study of the history of your unit, together with a careful analysis of all other available information of the military activities of your unit from its inception, scrutinized in relation to the overall resistance movement, has failed to justify sufficiently the establishment of a date of recognition other than that presently published. This letter constitutes the final determination of and action upon the period of official recognition of the Southern Pangasinan Guerrilla Forces.

Report on the Southern Pangasinan Guerrilla Forces

1. 1st Lt Kenneth H Neubauer examined the unit file and studied the unit history to determine whether the Southern Pangasinan Guerrilla Forces deserves revision of its present date of recognition. The Southern Pangasinan Guerrilla Forces was recognized in a strength of 71 officers and men by letter Hq AFPAC, AG 370.64, dated 12 July 1945.

2. HISTORY: (See attached Tab A)

3. FINDINGS:

a. The following person was interviewed and his statement is reflected in the findings.

Major Robert B Lapham CO, LGAF

b. The subject unit, organized as a part of the Thorp Guerrilla Forces in April 1942 and consisting of three companies; one in Southern Pangasinan, one in Macabebe Pampanga, and one in the area of Calumpit Pampanga, was commanded by Gonzalo C Mendoza. Mendoza claims 680 men at the unit's activation in April 1942 yet the total strength of the three companies listed in the unit history is only 581 men. He further states in his history that the unit controlled the towns of Urdaneta, Villasis, Bautista, Rosales, and Sto Tomas, Pangasinan. Included in the area of operation were six barrios of the above mentioned communities. The three companies of Mendoza's unit and their approximate areas of operation were as follows:

1. H & S Company Urdaneta and Villasis Pangasinan
2. A Company Macabebe, Pampanga
3. B Company Calumpit, Pampanga

The activities of the unit during the occupation were as follows:

1942: No activities claimed for the year 1942.

1943: A patrol of the H & S Company was given the mission of getting an intelligence report on the enemy movements in the area. The patrol encountered approximately 48 enemy soldiers and a fight ensued. The platoon of the H & S Company claims to have killed 11 Japanese at the loss of 5 killed of their own men. The unit history states that during this engagement the Japanese forces had superiority in numbers of weapons.

1943: On May 9, "A" Company was attacked by the Japanese in the vicinity of Minalin Pampanga. "A" Company claims to have killed 20 Japanese at the loss to them of one man killed and 10 wounded.

1943: On 5 June, one platoon of "B" Company encountered a Japanese force in the barrio of Balibago, Masantol Pampanga; After a brief skirmish the platoon fled as they feared being captured by the Japanese.

1943; From the 7th to the 10th of June the unit claims to have had two platoons engaged in gathering intelligence reports.

1944: During December, "A" Company with the assistance of another guerrilla unit, comprising 150 men, encountered the Japanese in the barrio of Alasas, Macabebe Pampanga. During the subsequent engagement "A" Company claims to have inflicted 27 casualties on the Japanese, with no casualties mentioned to the guerrilla units.

The activities claimed by the subject unit vary greatly with the facts known. Mendoza, originally commissioned by Col Thorp in Thorp's Guerrillas, established an organization in southern Pangasinan which was designated the Southern Pangasinan Guerrilla Forces. Mendoza, as a member of Thorp's Guerrillas, claims in the unit history that in April 1942 he had 680 men under his command. The claim of such a large organization during this period is an impossibility. In April 1942 Col Thorp was in the process of organizing his own unit, and it would have been impossible for Mendoza to have been inducted as a guerrilla and at the same time have such a large organization under his control. This claim of 680 men under Mendoza in April 1942 is further refuted by the fact that the strength of the three companies listed totals only 581 men, and this was the strength of the unit for the years 1943 and 1944.

Major Robert B Lapham (CO LGAF) stated that he knew of Mendoza, and that he was a member of Thorp's Guerrillas, but he further stated that he knew of no such organization as claimed by Mendoza. An organization with the strength of over 600 men should have been well known in the early days of the occupation, but from the statement by Major Lapham this is not the case. Further claims of activities listed in the unit history will substantiate the fact that no such organization existed during the occupation.

During the year 1942 the unit boasts of no activities. During 1943, the unit was active against the Japanese three times, and on two of the three engagements a platoon or less was utilized. During December 1944 one company of the purported organization augmented by another guerrilla unit, claimed to have fought the Japanese. It is noted that from June 1943 until December 1944 the unit makes no claim of activity against the enemy. It is further noted from the unit history that, from the period of April 1942 to December 1944 the units which actively engaged the Japanese had an approximate total of seven hours of combat.

For a period of two days in June 1943 the organization claims to have had two platoons engaged in intelligence activities. No evidence has been presented to substantiate this claim as no useful or direct results are known to have been derived from the intelligence activities claimed by this organization.

The number of casualties that the organization inflicted on the Japanese is not commensurate with the facts presented. The unit history states that the Japanese had superior numbers of weapons and firepower in the various engagements; Therefore it is an impossibility to continuously inflict such heavy losses on a well trained enemy by a unit that was not trained and which had inferior weapons and a fewer number of them.

4. POLITICAL ASPECTS:

This organization has no apparent political affiliations or aspirations.

5. RECOMMENDATION:

It is recommended that the Southern Pangasinan Guerilla Forces be not favorably considered for revision of its present date of recognition.

In the early part of April 1942, Lt. Col. Claude Thorp with U.S. Army Officers and enlisted men left Bataan sector upon orders of General Douglas MacArthur to organize Guerrilla Forces in the East Central Luzon Area. As commander-in-chief of the East Central Luzon Guerrilla Army Forces, he established his General Headquarters at Mt. Pinatubo and from there designated organizers and commanders of the different sectors in the East Central Luzon Area, while the undersigned was appointed organizer and at the same time recruiting officer for and in behalf of the General Headquarters of Lt. Col. Thorp, it being then risky and practically impossible for Americans to go down from the mountains in order to perform such task inasmuch as East Central Luzon was already under the Japanese Army occupation.

The THORP GUERRILLA FORCES, under the command of the undersigned was organized on April 20, 1942 with an initial strength of approximately 680 officers and men. In view of the prevailing rigid pacification campaign then being launched by the Japanese Army in Tarlac and Mt. Pinatubo, the undersigned transferred his General Headquarters to Southern Pangasinan. Its zone of operations included all barrios and towns in this District. Under the zone of operations were the following towns: Urdaneta, Villasis, Bautista, Rosales and Sto. Tomas and under this towns were the following barrios: Sanblas, Carusucan, Pias, Sto. Domingo, Caramutan and Lumboy. Our General Headquarters was established in barrio Pias with "H & S" Company the first company to be organized, under the supervision of the undersigned, Agripino Bustos was the company commander commissioned by the undersigned. The approximate strength of the company was 195 officers and men. Other components of the battalion composed of the following units that were eventually organized in the parts of Luzon:

✓ Company "A" with an approximate strength of 195 officers and men under Captain Inocencio Tolentino was organized on May 7, 1942. Its main zone of action was in the vicinity of Macabebe, Pampanga.

✓ "B" Company under Captain Maglayon G. Mendoza, with an strength of about 195 officers and men was organized in the barrio of Meyto, Calumpit on August 1, 1942 and incorporated into the battalion. It was assigned to cover all outlying barrios and sitios in the vicinity of aforementioned barrios of Meyto, San Jose, Santa Lucia and Bulusan of Calumpit, Bulacan; Bitas, Macabebe extending to Alauli, Balibago, Calfin of Masantol, Pampanga.

*What about
Luzon only?*

In the early part of 1943, "H & S" Company was given a mission to cover the area of Villasis and Urdaneta and the surrounding barrios of these towns, and gather intelligence report on the enemy movements, strength and capabilities. About 48 Japs in the vicinity of Villasis and at the nearby area were armed with rifles, grenades, and machineguns were encountered by an approximate a platoon of our Unit which resulted in the death of 5 and injury of 2 of our men. The enemy lost more or less 11 men and our patrol captured 2 machineguns and ammunitions and several hand grenades. Every movement of the garrison in that vicinity was immediately relayed to Headquarters. Our patrol would 'nt have suffered casualties had it not been for enemy superiority in arms and firepower. Following the encounter in that place the enemy maintained close patrol contact with our troops and reinforcement poured in great numbers, which eventually threatened the main approach to the Headquarters line of communication.

On May 9, 1943 "A" Company organization led by Captain Inocencio Tolentino Met a sudden attack by the enemy while stationed in the vicinity of Sapang Donang, Minalin, Pampanga. Through the keen and alert disposition of the above officer, an exchange of fierce firing lasted almost three hours, though resulting in the death of one and ten wounded men under the command of the above mentioned officer a consoling contrast told and caused an approximate 20 Japanese killed during this actual combat. Fortunately the enemy retreated when they found out that another company ("B" Company) led by Captain Maglayon Mendoza was added to the men of the above heroic officer who courageously upheld his nerves and disposition in that most precise test of valor.

On June 5, 1943, 1 platoon of "B" Company encountered a reenforced platoon of Japs in the barrico of Balibago, Masantol, Pampanga. The enemy was then waging its amnesty campaign. Every suspected inhabitant of this barrico was apprehended, maltreated and some killed by the Japs. The encounter which lasted for 2 hours resulted to an immediate withdrawal of our troops due to the danger of being cut off our route of withdrawal back to our main line of resistance. Lack of natural obstacles prevented our own troops from establishing delaying action and alternate defensive position toward Bitas, Macabebe, Pampanga. From June 7 to 10 of the year 1943, about 2 platoons of the same Companies with 3 officers took active participation and gathering intelligence reports about the enemy and in actual combat. The Japs and Filipino misguided elements had been encountered at different times in the barrios and vicinity of Meyto, Kalumpit; Bitas, Macabebe; Balibago, Masantol from January, 1943 to December, 1944. Total enemy killed or wounded approximately 18 KIA and 6 wounded. Our sides suffered 12 including 11 KIA. Enemy property destroyed or captured consisted of the following:

- (1) One (1) 30 caliber machinegun, two (2) rifles captured plus 2,000 rounds of ammunitions at the barrico of Balibago, Masantol, Pampanga on April 3, 1943.
- (2) Two (2) rifles captured at the intersection of Bitas, Macabebe Meyto, Kalumpit, Bulacan on October 10, 1943.
- (3) Five (5) rifles, four (4) of which were destroyed, several hand grenades and around 1,000 rounds were captured at the barrico of Alasas, Macabebe on or before December 5, 1944.

One more important event which will never be forgotten in the history of organization "A" Company is the encounter in the barrico of Alasas, Macabebe in the early part of December 1944, while stationed in the vicinity of the said barrico. The force met a very tragic and successive attack of approximately 300 Japs, fully armed. After an hour of defense, a big reinforcement of no less than 150 men, another guerrilla organization led by Captain Maglayon Mendoza joined and fought side by side against the aggressive action of the enemies. Being brave and loyal to the UNITED STATES OF AMERICA and COMMONWEALTH of the PHILIPPINES, the men fought for life and death forming a good defensive angle. The advancing enemy fell to the ground like faded leaves from the trees, and by the bright and quick disposition of Captain Innocencio Tolentino together with his brilliant and well experienced platoon officers 27 Japanese were killed and captured some firearms and ammunitions from the fleeing enemies.

The encounter and accomplishment of the whole battalion had been due primarily to the excellent team work of the keymen of the battalion. In spite of our men's fighting spirit and unity we sometimes had a losing fight due to the enemies superiority in number of men and arms.

This daring action of my officers and men continued until the time when the Americans landed and liberated these islands from the hands of the atrocious Japanese in January 1945. By February when our liberators covered up our area of operation, the undersigned luckily became known to Captain Falls of the 8th Fighter Group, stationed at Margot, Fort Stotsenburg, Pampanga. Captain Falls requested me to give him 160 including 2 officers for attachment to his group. This strength of men and officers stated above had been taken from different companies and were given and rendered their services up to the middle part of March 1945 when the said group departed for Mindoro. On March 23, 1945, another squadron the 421st Night Fighter Squadron, under Major Richard D. Klick, Commanding Officer, and Captain Joseph F. Govoni Executive Officer replaced the departed group. Again the services of the undersigned have been asked due to our excellent record. Approximate strength 111 with 5 officers were attached to this outfit. Later another company have been attached to 345th Bomb Group under Lt. Col. Glenn Doolittle and his executive officer Maj. Aldridge R. Nichols,

stationed in the same area. The rest of the men and officers have been attached to different outfits at different time and places as per letters of the outfits hereto attached. The attachment of the components of the battalion ceased up to 15 August 1945.

In view of sacrifices and accomplishments of our Unit during the Japanese Occupation in the Philippines, we earnestly hoped that immediate and favorable action be granted, we remain

Unit "A" - Composed of thirty (30) men, including the officers, duly organized under the initiative of Capt. EVERETT R. BROOKS, and approved by Lt. Col. C.A. THORP, was evidenced by the herein enclosed roster duly signed by the Officers above referred to. This unit was assigned and quartered in Barrio Patling, O'Donnell within the territorial jurisdiction of the municipality of Bamban, Tarlac, as a unit for the preservation of public peace and order in the municipalities of Bamban and Capas, Tarlac, and with specific instructions to render all necessary assistance to war prisoners at Camp O'Donnell for their escapes and for rendering aid and provisions to sick prisoners. These obligations were carried out by this unit until the release of the prisoners of war when this unit dedicates their work in unbushing Japs patrols, and assaults on the different posts, airports, garrisons and camps of the Japanese Imperial Army in Hacienda Luisita, Central Azucarera of Tarlac within the jurisdiction of San Miguel, Tarlac, causing great damages to military installations, arms, ammunitions and provisions of the enemies. This campaign was carried out until the month of October 1944 when this unit was attached with a bigger unit force to assist the THORP INFANTRY REGIMENT at Villasis, Urdaneta, Rosales, Santo Tomas, Alcala, and Bautista, Pangasinan until the landing of the American Liberating Forces at Dagupan, Pangasinan, reporting to the United States Army on 12 January 1945 at Manaoag, Pangasinan.

Unit "B" - Composed of thirty (30) men picked from different units to preserve the strength of UNIT "A" relieving sick soldiers placed under medical care, and soldiers who are transferred to other guerrilla organizations. This guerrilla activities of this unit is the continuation of the above-related campaigns, and upon the arrival of the American Liberating Forces this unit was actually attached with different units of the United States Army Air Corps, as follows:

- (1) Attached with 421st Night Fighter Squadron (Sep) Air Corps, USA from

(1) Attached with 221st Night Fighter Squadron (Sep) Air Corps, USA from 23 March 1945 until 18 June 1945, as evidenced by the herein enclosed EXHIBIT "A", certification of services signed by JOSEPH F. GOVONI, Capt., AC, Executive Officer of the said unit.

(2) Attached with 21st Air Service Group, Air Corps, USA from 19 June 1945 to 8 August 1945 as evidenced by the herein enclosed attached certification of services marked as EXHIBIT "B", signed by HAROLD F. NIFONG, Major, AC, Group S-2.



BRIEF HISTORY

In the early part of April 1942, Lt. Col. Claude Thorp with U.S. Army Officers and enlisted men left Bataan sector upon orders of General Douglas MacArthur to organize Guerrilla Forces in the East Central Luzon Area. As commander-in-chief of the East Central Luzon Guerrilla Army Forces, he established his General Headquarters at Mt. Pinatubo and from there designated organizers and commanders of the different sectors in the East Central Luzon Area, while the undersigned was appointed organizer and at the same time recruiting officer for and in behalf of the General Headquarters of Lt. Col. Thorp, it being then risky and practically impossible for Americans to go down from the mountains in order to perform such task inasmuch as East Central Luzon was already under the Japanese Army occupation.

The THORP GUERRILLA FORCES, under the command of the undersigned was organized on April 20, 1942 with an initial strength of approximately 680 officers and men. In view of the prevailing rigid pacification campaign then being launched by the Japanese Army in Tarlac and Mt. Pinatubo, the undersigned transferred his General Headquarters to Southern Pangasinan. Its zone of operations included all barrios and towns in this District. Under the zone of operations were the following towns: Urdaneta, Villasis, Bautista, Rosales and Sto. Tomas and under this towns were the following barrios: Sanblas, Carusucan, Pias, Sto. Domingo, Caramutan and Lumboy. Our General Headquarters was established in barrio Pias with "H & S" Company the first company to be organized, under the supervision of the undersigned, Agripino Bustos was the company commander commissioned by the undersigned. The approximate strength of the company was 193 officers and men. Other components of the battalion composed of the following units that were eventually organized in the parts of Luzon:

Company "A" with an approximate strength of 193 officers and men under Captain Inocencio Tolentino was organized on May 7, 1942. Its main zone of action was in the vicinity of Macabebe, Pampanga.

"B" Company under Captain Maglayon G. Mendoza, with a strength of about 195 officers and men was organized in the barrio of Meyto, Calumpit on August 1, 1942 and incorporated into the battalion. It was assigned to cover all outlying barrios and sitios in the vicinity of aforementioned barrios of Meyto, San Jose, Santa Lucia and Bulusan of Calumpit, Bulacan; Bitas, Macabebe extending to Alauli, Balibago, Caligin of Masantol, Pampanga.

About 48 Japs in the vicinity of Villasis and at the nearby area were armed with rifles, grenades, and machineguns were encountered by an approximate platoon of our Unit which resulted in the death of 5 and injury of 2 of our men. The enemy lost more or less 11 men and our patrol captured 2 machineguns and ammunitions and several hand grenades. Every movement of the garrison in that vicinity was immediately relayed to Headquarters. Our patrol would'nt have suffered casualties had it not been for enemy superiority in arms and firepower. Following the encounter in that place the enemy maintained close patrol contact with our troops and reinforcement poured in great numbers, which eventually threatened the main approach to the Headquarters line of communication.

On May 9, 1943 "A" Company organization led by Captain Inocencio Tolentino met a sudden attack by the enemy while stationed in the vicinity of Sapang Donang, Minalin, Pampanga. Through the keen and alert disposition of the above officer, an exchange of fierce firing lasted almost three hours, though resulting in the death of one and ten wounded men under the command of the above mentioned officer a consoling contrast tolled and caused an approximate 20 Japanese killed during this actual combat. Fortunately the enemy retreated when they found out that another company ("B" Company) led by Captain Maglayon Mendoza was added to the men of the above heroic officer who courageously upheld his nerves and disposition in that most precise test of valor.

On June 5, 1943, 1 platoon of "B" Company encountered a reenforced platoon of Japs in the barrio of Balibago, Masantol, Pampanga. The enemy was then waging its amnesty campaign. Every suspected inhabitant of this barrio was apprehended, maltreated and some killed by the Japs. The encounter which lasted for 2 hours resulted to an immediate withdrawal of our troops due to the danger of being cut off our route of withdrawal back to our main line of resistance. Lack of natural obstacles prevented our own troops from establishing delaying action and alternate defensive position toward Bitas, Macabebe, Pampanga. From June 7 to 10 of the year 1943, about 2 platoons of the same Company with 3 officers took active participation in gathering intelligence reports about the enemy and in actual combat. The Japs and Filipino misguided elements had been encountered at different times in the barrios and vicinity of Meyto, Kalumpit; Bitas, Macabebe; Balibago, Masantol from January, 1943 to December, 1944. Total enemy killed or wounded approximately 18 KIA and 6 wounded. Our sides suffered 12 including 11 KIA. Enemy property destroyed or captured consisted of the following:

- (1) One (1) 30 caliber machinegun, two (2) rifles captured plus 2,000 rounds of ammunitions at the barrio of Balibago, Masantol, Pampanga on April 3, 1943.
- (2) Two (2) rifles captured at the intersection of Bitas, Macabebe Meyto, Kalumpit, Bulacan on October 10, 1943.
- (3) Five (5) rifles, four (4) of which were destroyed, several hand grenades and around 1,000 rounds were captured at the barrio of Alasas, Macabebe on or before December 5, 1944.

One more important event which will never be forgotten in the history of organization "A" Company is the encounter in the barrio of Alasas, Macabebe in the early part of December 1944, while stationed in the vicinity of the said barrio. The force met a very tragic and successive attack of approximately 300 Japs, fully armed. After an hour of defense, a big reinforcement of no less than 150 men, another guerrilla organization led by Captain MagLayon Mendoza joined and fought side by side against the aggressive action of the enemies. Being brave and loyal to the UNITED STATES OF AMERICA and COMMONWEALTH of the PHILIPPINES, the men fought for life and death forming a good defensive angle. The advancing enemy fell to the ground like faded leaves from the trees, and by the bright and quick disposition of Captain Inocencio Tolentino together with his brilliant and well experienced platoon officers 27 Japanese were killed and captured some firearms and ammunitions from the fleeing enemies.

The encounter and accomplishment of the whole battalion had been due primarily to the excellent team work of the keymen of the battalion. In spite of our men's fighting spirit and unity we sometimes had a losing fight due to the enemies superiority in number of men and arms.

This daring action of my officers and men continued until the time when the Americans landed and liberated these islands from the hands of the atrocious Japanese in January 1945. By February when our liberators covered up our area of operation, the undersigned luckily became known to Captain Falls of the 8th Fighter Group, stationed at Margot, Fort Stotsenburg, Pampanga. Captain Falls requested me to give him 60 including 2 officers for attachment to his group. This strength of men and officers stated above had been taken from different companies and were given and rendered their services up to the middle part of March 1945 when the said group departed for Mindoro. On March 23, 1945, another squadron the 421st Night Fighter Squadron, under Major Richard D. Kiick, Commanding Officer, and Captain Joseph F. Govoni Executive Officer replaced the departed Group. Again the services of the undersigned have been asked due to our excellent record. Approximate strength 111 with 5 officers were attached to this outfit. Later another company have been attached to 345th Bomb Group under Lt. Col. Glean Doolittle and his executive officer Maj. Aldridge R. Nichols,

stationed in the same area. The rest of the men and officers have been attached to different outfits at different time and places as per letters of the outfits hereto attached. The attachment of the components of the battalion ceased up to 15 August 1945.

In view of sacrifices and accomplishments of our Unit during the Japanese Occupation in the Philippines, we earnestly hoped that immediate and favorable action be granted, we remain

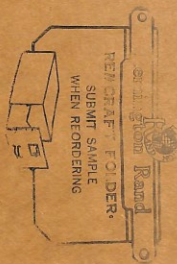
