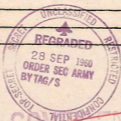

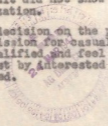
Dear Mr. Aclan:

The Commanding General has directed that you be informed that the Central Intelligence Bureau, purporting to be a guerrilla organization under your nominal control, is not favorably considered for recognition as an element of the Philippine Army.

A set of general requirements for guerrilla recognition, established by General MacArthur during the liberation of the Philippines, has been used as a guide in considering the record of this unit. After careful investigation and full consideration of all substantiating records and testimony of witnesses having pertinent knowledge, recognition of this guerrilla unit is not deemed to be warranted because of reasons mentioned below:

- a. Record of service was not substantiated by sufficient acceptable evidence.
- b. The unit was not maintained satisfactorily in the field in opposition to the enemy.
- c. Adequate records were not maintained (dates of enlistment or joining and necessary related information).
- d. The number of officers, commissioned and non-commissioned, was excessive and not reasonably proportionate to the United States Army or to pre-war Philippine Army tables of organization.
- e. Unit did not show satisfactory continuity of activity and organization.

This decision on the proposed unit roster does not preclude submission for casualty recognition by those individuals who are qualified and feel justified in entering such claims. Upon request by interested individuals, appropriate forms will be forwarded.

Report on "Central Intelligence Bureau, Luzon"

1. 1st Lt Charles L. Homewood proceeded to Manila, P. I., on 15 January 1947, to investigate the Central Intelligence Bureau, Luzon.

2. ALLEGED HISTORY: (See attached unit file)

3. FINDINGS:

a. The following persons were interviewed and their statements are reflected in the findings:

1st Lt G. M. Aclan	CO, Central Intl Bu, Luzon
2nd Lt Wenceslao Mesina	Member, Central Intl Bu, Luzon
2nd Lt Fernando G Paraiso	" " " " "
2nd Lt Fidel Bagulgagal	" " " " "

b. Record of service was not substantiated by sufficient acceptable evidence. When the commanding officer was asked for papers to support the unit claims, he said the unit had none. Attachment was claimed but no attachment papers could be presented to the Contact Team.

c. The unit was not maintained satisfactorily in the field in opposition to the enemy. The commanding officer stated that due to the activities of the Huks in the area where they were assigned, they could not carry on their intelligence work because they were afraid of being killed by the Huks.

d. Adequate records of dates of enlistment or joining, and necessary related information were not maintained.

e. The number of officers, commissioned and non-commissioned, was excessive and not reasonably proportionate to the United States Army or to the pre-war Philippine Army tables of organization. There are eleven (11) officers on the roster of thirteen (13) members, the total personnel of the subject unit.

f. Unit did not show satisfactory continuity of activity and organization. There are no records that could be traced to substantiate the claims of activities of this unit. Members of the unit could not tell the contact team of any one intelligence report that was turned over to higher headquarters.

g. No useful purpose will be accomplished by further investigation of this unit. There are no members worthy of recognition and the unit suffered no casualties.

4. POLITICAL ASPECTS:

This unit does not appear to have any political affiliations or aspirations.

5. RECOMMENDATIONS:

It is recommended that the Central Intelligence Bureau, Luzon, be not favorably considered for recognition.

THE CENTRAL LUZON INTELLIGENCE BUREAUUNIT HISTORY AND RECORD OF
ACHIEVEMENTS

The organization of the Central Luzon Intelligence Bureau had been brought about at the instance of Capt. ENRIQUE L. TORRES, O-888748, AC (AUS), the group leader of the F-29 Group, Allied Intelligence Bureau, a unit detached from the 1st Reconnaissance Battalion, (Special), US Army. The F-29 Group leader urged the undersigned to organize a unit which could collect valuable information about the enemy among the different towns of Nueva Ecija, Pampanga, Pangasinan and the city of Manila. In this regard, the F-29 Group, AIB was handicapped due to the fact that most of the members of the said group were not very well acquainted with localities and also, most of the members of the same group do not speak the dialect of these localities. Their presence in these localities, where most of the Jap troops and installations were located, would arouse the suspicion of Jap Ken Pei Tai and Jap spies. Pending the organization of the unit, Capt Torres assigned Nueva Ecija as the principal area of operation, but the sending of intelligence agents to places where information could be gathered was left at the discretion of the undersigned.

Six men volunteered to undertake the risky undertaking with the undersigned. It was well-known to them that if ever they were caught by the Japs, death was the penalty that would be given to them - death as a common spy. What made the matters worse was the expiration of the Executive Order of the puppet President of the puppet Republic that offered clemency to all persons that were caught on suspicion of being a subversive element. But those who volunteered were not deterred by these promulgations. To them the sense of duty prevailed at the sacrifice of personal safety.

Because the mission assigned to this unit was purely intelligence in nature, basic military training was sacrificed to intelligence training. Also, the fact that five of the men were USAFFE soldiers who saw action in Bataan until its fall; one had been a cadet in the Philippine Military Academy; and the rest have had military training in ROTC courses in colleges made basic military training unnecessary. However, the personnel were taught the use of Philippine Intelligence Guide, issued by GHQ, SWPA dtd February, 1944, the preparation of intelligence reports and evaluation of information.

GLIB - Unit History & Record of Achievements (Cont'd)

The organization of the unit did not follow any of the conventional T/O & E of units. Grades as appear on the attached roster were given on the basis of military and educational qualifications and to give a better incentive to the personnel in pursuing a risky and dangerous work.

ACHIEVEMENTS - For the whole period of operation of the unit, the reports it rendered to the Group Leader, F-29 Group AIB covered the following:

- a. Information on enemy fortifications in Nueva Ecija, Pangasinan and Sinagalan Bay areas, in Taybas;
- b. Location of Jap supply depots, dumps, and caves;
- c. Jap construction of air fields in Nabalocot and Clark Field in Pampanga;
- d. Jap Troop concentrations;
- e. Activities of puppet government officials, the Bureau of Constabulary, Sinsapili, Kalitapi, WCOIN, and Jap counter-espionage agencies;
- f. Movement of troops passing through Nueva Ecija;
- g. Airplane Concentration and types;
- h. Places of storage of air material;
- i. Rendezvous points of Jap fighters with bombers;
- j. Location of enemy gasoline storage tanks;
- k. Conduct of AA defense just prior to, during and after Allied air raids;
- l. Places of Jap tank concentrations and location of tank repair shops in Nueva Ecija and Bulacan Areas;
- m. New Jap armament found in the assigned areas;
- n. Jap tactics and systems of maneuver noted in the areas;
- o. Drawings of Jap tanks;
- p. Personal information of Jap field officers;

g. Data on extent of damages done to Jap installations after Allied air raids;

f. Identification, combat experience and morale of Jap troops found in the assigned area;

e. Organization, strength and activities of USAFIP in the area;

d. Organization, strength, activities and aims of independent guerrilla units in the area; and,

c. Jap procurement agencies.

Aside from the above, the unit undertook the following:

a. The publication of a mimeograph newsletter for the dissemination of Allied newsbroadcasts;

b. The collection of Jap propaganda materials for submission to the Group Leader, F-29 Group, AIB.

On 6 January, personnel from this unit were detailed to go with 1st Lt. Jose B. Nalan, O-1314382, FA (AIB), Asst Group Leader, F-29 AIB, to Guayapo, Nueva Ecija to set up a radio station for relaying the information gathered by the intelligence agents in the Pampasinan area. When the landing of the American troops in Lingayen Gulf area came, this detail moved further behind the Jap lines to continue their observation and transmitting all information collected to the American troops.

On February 1945 when the 63d Infantry Regiment of the 6th Army reached Binal, Nueva Ecija personnel from this unit volunteered their services with the S-2 section of the 63d Infantry and with the S-2 Section of the attached Field Artillery.

On 5 March 1945, with the detail of the undersigned and Capt Torres to attend an AAF School in the United States and transfer of 1st Lt Jose B Nalan to another overseas station, the USAFIP personnel of this unit reported to the FA replacement battalions for processing and the civilian volunteers returned to their normal callings.

1. The undersigned GERONIMO M. ACLAN, O-21133, 3rd Lieutenant Air Corps, Philippine Army declares the following:

(a) That on 10 September 1944 he was contacted by F-29 Intelligence Unit under the command of Captain Enrique L. Torres, O-888748 A.U.S. to work with him in intelligence operations.

(b) The undersigned formed an Intelligence Unit of his own which rendered regular reports to Capt. Enrique L. Torres about enemy installations, troop movements, and other data pertinent to intelligence work in the undersigned assigned area which extended from Cabanatuan, Nueva Ecija up to Dingalan Bay, Luzon.

(c) Pending recognition, the undersigned gave assumed ranks to the following men in his unit in order to obtain better results of their work and because the undersigned believes they are capable as such: PEDRO TOLEDO cadet 4th class Philippine Military Academy as 2nd Lieutenant; ARISTON HORLADOR Sgt. Air Corps Philippine Army as 2nd Lieutenant; MOISES MESINA, Pvt. Signal Corps Philippine Army as 3rd Lieutenant; CIRIACO R. SERRAL Sgt. Infantry Philippine Army as 2nd Lieutenant; Fernando PARASO Sgt. Infantry Philippine Army as 2nd Lieutenant; FELICISIMO OCAÑO (civilian) as 2nd Lieutenant; SALVADOR MARTINEZ (civilian) as 3rd Lieutenant; MOISES MARTINEZ (civilian) as Sergeant; and a handful of civilians who were willing to work for the cause without a single thought of personal merit. All of these men with the exception of PEDRO TOLEDO, SALVADOR MARTINEZ, MOISES MARTINEZ and FELICISIMO OCAÑO were servicemen who saw actions in Bataan.

(d) The undersigned further declares that he named his unit as Central Luzon Intelligence Bureau.

(e) In the Central Intelligence Bureau, the undersigned had the rank of 1st Lieutenant, Air Corps, Philippine Army, the same rank given him by the CO, Marking's Guerilla Intelligence Unit in Manila on 15 June 1943 and recognized by the CO, Mango Area Intelligence Unit, 6 MD on 8 October 1943.

(f) The undersigned received orders to report to CG, 1st Replacement Battalion in Leyte on 28 January 1945 and his men were placed under the direct charge of Captain Enrique L. Torres.

(g) On 22nd February 1945 the undersigned departed the Philippines for the United States to take refresher courses in flying.

2. The undersigned therefore requests the proper authorities for the recognition of his unit and for the confirmation of the ranks given his men.

1. Lt. G. Aclan, an officer of the Phil. Army Air Corps reserve has worked with the GHQ SWPA (U.S. Army) as an Intelligence Agent from Sept. 1944 to Jan. 1945. He has rendered valuable services as head of his CLIB Espionage organization operating in Central Luzon working directly under me, then a GHQ Representative and head of the Infiltration Party sent from Australia six months before the Luzon landings.
2. I have forwarded the recommendations for recognition and promotions of these men to the GHQ U.S. Army through my second command 1st Lt. Jose Malan Inf. U.S.A. before leaving the Phil. for Flying Training.
3. I Have learned that Intelligence Agents (including some of my own) and some Guerilla groups including that of Captain Markings (where Lt. Aclan served before he joined me) working on the capacity were recognized and their ranks confirmed.

Request therefore appropriate actions taken re this group of deserving guerillas.
