This will acknowledge receipt of your letter, dated 16 June 1947, requesting recognition of the 4th Battalion, Spear-men Unit, Kiangan District.

A special press release from Headquarters AFWESPAC, dated 1 February 1946, announced the closing date for acceptance of unit requests for recognition as 15 March 1946. Your request, dated 16 June 1947, does not comply with the announced closing date and cannot, therefore, be accepted.

Your request that the casualty roster of your unit be included with the 11th Infantry, or 14th Infantry, USAFIP, NL, cannot be considered inasmuch as it was not indorsed by the Commanding Officer of USAFIP, NL. However, the individuals or the claimants of the deceased may submit requests for individual casualty recognition which will receive proper consideration provided they reach this headquarters within sixty (60) days from the date of this letter. Final action on all elements of USAFIP, NL, was taken by Headquarters AFWESPAC, on the 28th of March 1946 and additional unit action thereon is not contemplated.

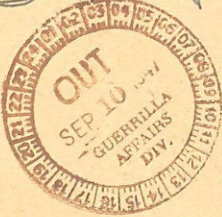

His Excellency,

In behalf of the Spearman Unit or Guerrillas of the Mountain Province who sacrificed their all and their lives for their country, I have the honor to submit the attached papers, requesting his Excellency to help the quiet and humble, and mostly illiterate Mountaineers share the respects, if not the benefits extended the Lowland Guerrillas who were recognized because they could speak for themselves to justify their cause.

These Spearman Igorots live in Kiangnan and Western Bontoc which became the Second Bataan of the Philippines. Most of their homes were burned to the ground, some barrios disappeared completely, and just after the liberation, epidemics of Malaria, dysentery and influenza played havoc to the already suffering people, some families were completely wiped out. Their suffering is beyond description, and if there are really people in the Philippines who needed help, these are the diserving elements of the Filipino race.

SPEARMEN UNIT ORGANIZATION

The Spearmen unit was organized in Kiangnan and Western Bontoc. The organization was patterned exactly in every detail as an Army Organization into two Regiments. There were almost daily Military Training in very town, with the understanding that when the Americans will come, they will be armed and fight as a regular unit. But ~~we~~ when the US Forces finally knocked at the enemy defenses in these sectors, they were attached with Guerrillas and effectively harassed the enemy. The Spearmen Unit served as guides, cargadores or Army Civilian employees instead of being armed to fight. The Colonels and lower ranking officers were appointed Military Governors and Military Mayors respectively in honor of their past services. When the Commonwealth Government took over the administration, the Military appointees were replaced by pre-war incumbents; whether they served the Jap Government or not is immaterial. They were told it is the policy of the present Commonwealth Government.. Now, in this part of the world, our spearmen unit are forgotten, not by the Army because it promised to pay for their past services in terms of cash, but by our Government. We will not go far to see the re-actions of the US Government about these organizations who resisted the enemy. Elsewhere in the past issues of the News papers, we find Colonel Ijams of the US Veterans' Administration officially admitted when he stated that "not only regular Filipino soldiers fought with our forces in many of the battles, but some were covered into the US Army, and Guerrilla leaders likewise organized groups with our approval that counted mightily in our effective victories over the Japanese". These were the circumstances which prevailed in the lowlands, but in Northern Luzon, in Kiangnan and Western Bontoc under Col. Blackburn and Capt. A. Bonnal, the underground resistance movement not only existed throughout the war, but the organization openly entered the stage of open resistance as early as September 1944; these were the regular army unit(1st. Bn. 11th Infantry) who had guns and the gunless Spearmen unit were having Military training in many towns. Thus exposing their lives and all for the sake of their country, and if America did not come earlier the enemy would have exterminated them all including their families, the women who had also their WAS organization.

The President of the US also sympathizes with the elements of the Filipino race who joined in the resistance movements during the Jap ruthless occupation, and directed our Government that "the assistance they rendered in the resistance to the enemy require that they be not dealt with in a ruthless manner". If this is what the Americans think of the Guerrillas, the Spearmen Unit were also Guerrillas but only assumed a different name, under different circumstances. They should also be shared the respect and benefits, if any, by the US Government, and more than that by our Government. These are the true Filipinos and justice demand that should the great Nation of America recognizes and gives the benefits of a full-pledge military organization as her own armed Forces as she had already done to the few but determined groups of Filipino Guerrillas in the Lowlands, the bunch of loyal and hardboiled Mountaineers who waged war against the enemy continuously since the fall of Bataan and continued the resistance movement until the Liberation, in fairness to their cause and for the ventionation of their great sacrifices, giving up their beloved families and comfort of their homes; plead earnestly and sincerely for the same recognition as might be given to any other group of guerrillas in the Philippines. The Spearmen activities are indisputable in classifying them as guerrillas, only most of them are illiterates and could not properly make clear their claim to justify their cause.

AFFIDAVIT

KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS:

We, the undersigned, Emilio Magalalit, and Rufino Sagodang, both of legal age, married, Filipino Citizens, and residents of Somadel, Kayan, Mt. Prov. do hereby jointly declare the following:

That on May 10, 1945 units of the Spearman Unit under Commander Marcos Madalang, Company " ", SU, 7th District, Western Bontoc, in conjunction with Co. "D" 1st. Bn. 11th Infantry under Lt. D. Dagdagan attacked over 100 Japanese soldiers in Hill Bisilan, Somadel, Kayan, Mt. Prov. The engagement lasted one day and one night. The following Morning, May 11, 1945 at about 8:00 A. M., Lino Peypeyan, a SU Pvt. under our squad in a hand-to-hand fight with the enemy who ambushed him, he received two byonnet wounds, one thru the neck, and one thru the stomach which caused his instant death. Later in the day the enemy retreated. The next morning, May 12th, we went and get the remains of Lino Peypeyan and burried in Somadel, Kayan, Mt. Prov. The Spearman accounted for three Japanese dead and several wounded, Captured three Jap rifles.

IN TESTIMONY WHEREOF, we hereby sign this affidavit to the best of our knowledge and belief, that each and every statement stated above is correct and true and done of our free will and deed.
