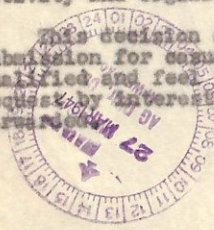
Dear Mr. Nobles:

The Commanding General has directed that you be informed that the "M" Company, USAFFE, San Narciso, Zambales, purporting to be a guerrilla organization under your nominal control, is not favorably considered for recognition as an element of the Philippine Army.

A set of general requirements for guerrilla recognition, established by General MacArthur during the liberation of the Philippines, has been used as a guide in considering the record of this unit. After careful investigation and full consideration of all substantiating records and testimony of witnesses having pertinent knowledge, recognition of this guerrilla unit is not deemed to be warranted because of reasons mentioned below:

- a. Record of service was not substantiated by sufficient acceptable evidence.
- b. The unit was not maintained satisfactorily in the field in opposition to the enemy.
- c. Activities of the unit did not contribute materially to the eventual defeat of the enemy.
- d. A definite organization was not established.
- e. Adequate records were not maintained (names, ranks, dates of enlistment or joining, dates of promotions, and necessary related information).
- f. Unit did not show satisfactory continuity of activity and organization.

This decision on the proposed unit roster does not preclude submission for casualty recognition by those individuals who are qualified and feel justified in entering such claims. Upon request by interested individuals, appropriate forms will be furnished.

Report on "M" Company, USAFFE, San Narciso, Zambales

1. Second Lieutenant James R. Benton proceeded to San Narciso, Zambales, on 11 March 1947, to investigate "M" Company, San Narciso Sector.

2. ALLEGED HISTORY: (See attached unit file)

3. FINDINGS:

a. The following persons were interviewed and their statements are reflected in the findings:

- Capt. Manuel BarrettoCO, Maloma Sector
- Capt. Lazaro CawagasCO, San Narciso Sector
- Capt. Numeriano FabioCO, La Paz Sector
- (Capt) Mrs. Elizabeth Fontillas.Hq. ZMD

b. Record of service was not substantiated by sufficient acceptable evidence. This organization under the command of one Marcelino Nobles remained absolutely passive during the occupation. This unit claims to have been a part of the San Narciso Sector of Zambales Military District. Captain Lazaro Cawagas, the sector commander of San Narciso (appointed by Major Ramon Magsaysay) in an interview stated that the subject unit never existed in his sector nor was the alleged unit's commanding officer ever a guerrilla, much less a guerrilla leader and organizer. Captain Numeriano Fabio, sector commander of La Paz, stated that Marcelino Nobles was unheard of in the San Narciso sector of Zambales as having been a guerrilla and, likewise, so was his unit unheard of as being a guerrilla organization. He stated that it was his opinion that the unit never existed. Mrs. Elizabeth Fontillas, an American woman and a recognized captain in the Headquarters of Zambales Military District, in an interview, stated that she knew Marcelino Nobles personally and that he never commanded or even belonged to any guerrilla unit. She further stated that during the occupation Nobles was a collaborator with the Japanese and was disliked immensely by the Filipino people in San Narciso, Zambales. The investigating officer has reason to believe that the subject unit never existed. None of the members of the recognized guerrilla units in this area ever heard of this unit. It is a clear indication, therefore, that the unit never existed as an active guerrilla unit. Attached is a letter from one Clenton Wolfe (incl.1) who recommends that the subject unit be granted recognition. The investigating officer does not value this letter as being of any importance. Clenton Wolfe was a private in the Army before the war and was in Zambales Mountains during the Japanese occupation. The guerrillas took care of him and fed him. He was never a guerrilla and never participated in any guerrilla activities. His knowledge of the subject unit is doubtful.

c. The unit was not maintained satisfactorily in the field in opposition to the enemy because the unit ~~was~~ never existed ~~as~~ as an organized guerrilla unit.

Document does not seem authentic as not in indicative English.

d. A definite organization was never established by this unit. (See paragraphs b & c, Team Leader's Report).

e. Performance of the unit did not indicate adequate control by its commanding officer, because the alleged commanding officer was a collaborator with the Japanese and worked for the Japanese during the entire occupation.

f. Unit did not show satisfactory continuity of activity because the unit cannot show any outstanding achievement accomplished during the occupation nor show any supporting evidence that the unit ever existed.

g. No useful purpose will be accomplished by further investigation of the subject unit. This is an initial investigation of an initial roster.

h. There are no members worthy of recognition.

i. The unit suffered no casualties.

4. POLITICAL ASPECTS:

The unit does not appear to have any political affiliations or aspirations.

5. RECOMMENDATIONS:

It is recommended that "M" Company, USAFE, San Narcisco, Zambales, be not favorably considered for recognition.

BRIEF HISTORY

Under flickering lights on the night of September 1, 1942, surrounded with guards, Captain Marcelino Nobles convoked prospective members whom he previously selected to become members of his command, and there in the village of Nanganakan, about five kilometers east from the town proper of San Narciso, Zambales, with direct orders from Captain McGuirre, then the Commanding Officer of the Western Luzon Guerrilla Forces, Zambales Military District, solemnly inducted his followers, and thus the secret resistance movement against the Japanese came into being in the eastern section of the town of San Narciso.

Nanganakan village was made the temporary Headquarters. First activities of the organization was the instruction of the recruits with nomenclature and manual of arms. Captain Nobles, a escape scout (USAFFE) from Bataan, and 2nd Lt. Fernandez, an R.O.T.C. cadet, showed their best in training the recruits. Drills, aiming, and firing practice were held, making use of the only rifle Rimington Cal. 30, which 1st Sgt. Isidoro Villanueva had been keeping. 1st Sgt. Isidoro Villanueva is also from the Philippine scouts, and his help was very effective. We had also Sgt. Anatalio Villanueva, a member of the police force of this town, who refused to work under the Japanese.

Patrols were sent to the town at nights. Subversive elements were apprehended, and every effort was made to secure protection to the townspeople. A Japanese Garrison was established in the town, harrassing the people, taking whatever pleased their whims, imprisoning and killing whomever they suspected as guerrillas. There was terror in the town.

Captain Nobles ordered 1st Lt. Torres to proceed to Bataan. Arms had been scattered there and at least he could pick up some. Lt. Torres, Sgt. Fontelera, Cpl. Fontillas, and a group of about ten men were dispatched. Lt. Torres was able to contact Captain E. Angeles of Moron, Bataan, and with the willingness of a comrade in arms, 14 service rifles, 2 automatic rifles, 4 pistols and more than 1,000 rounds of ammunitions were given to Lt. Torres.

The Headquarters at Nanganakan was transferred to Lubong. Lubong is ten kilometers from the town, at the foot of the mountain ranges east of San Narciso. Lt. Alfonso Torres was made the MAA to take charge of the security of the new site.

The first encounter this organization had with the Japs was a bloody one. It took place at the Sto. Tomas river when the Japanese (about a platoon of them) were trying to cross in order to raid guerrilla hang-outs at the base of the hills. Having first received notice of this intention of the Japs, Captain Nobles led his men/ waited untill all of them were in the river. It was learned later on that eight Japanese were cremated in front of the Japanese garrison in the town.

Then on the middle of October, 1943, we met Mr. Clenton V. Wolfe. He had no military uniform, so we did not know his rank. Lt. Torres invited him to stay with the "M" company, and after understanding the nature of our organization, Sgt. Wolfe, a escape soldier (USAFFE) of Bataan, gladly accepted the offer. We made him our adviser and Commanding Officer. His acceptance was an occasion of warm rejoicing among the men. Everybody's cooperation flared up with higher spirits. Our combat platoons, our supply men too, were glad we had an American in our midst, to guide our maneuvers, to promulgate rules and regulations, including actions regarding the handling of cases of pro-Japs and other unrully elements. He ordered that all American aviators who may make forced

landings be safely conducted to the Headquarters of Captain Crane and Col. Merrill. Cpl. Bernabe Villanueva did his part here. With his men he was able to bring an American aviator to the camp of Col. Merrill. Said aviator narrated that Japs bombarded the air port at night in Mindoro. Many of the American planes took off, and this according to Cpl. Villanueva, intended to escape to Leyte. The plane crashed by the pilot was saved. Cpl. Villanueva had to make circling routes to evade the Japs. Some survivors of sunk Japanese ships were also rescued, as when prisoner ships were sank off the coast of this town on the 21st day of September, 1944. Most of them were British prisoners of war.

When the Japs were retreating from the north after the first American landings in the Lingayen Gulf, our men kidnapped them one by one, or killed them as when at the bridge north of the town, six of our men encountered and killed fifteen Japs. These retreating Japs had no arms but they had pointed stakes and they did not care to surrender.

The landing of the American troops in San Narciso made our organization more historic. Our entire company was massed to meet them. Captain Nobles designated assignments to groups. Squads were ordered to guard bridges, ammunition dumps, and supply depots. Some assigned to the 227th Station Hospital of the 11th Corps, and others under T/Sgt. Paulino Espiritu and a platoon of men including his son, T/3 Lee Espiritu, followed the American troops at the ZigZag Pass between Olongapo and Bataan where the Japanese concentrated. Corporal Antonio Fernandez went also there.

As a whole "M" company, organized three years ago, under the most trying circumstances, almost from nothing except the burning patriotism and loyalty of the selected members to the United States and the Philippines and the faith that America will not forsake the Philippines, gave its whole hearted support up to the finish. Victory of the American forces over Japan ended our activities at the end of August, 1945. Grim were the days past, gory were the sacrifices, but tears of joy were shed when the Star Spangled banner and the Sun and Stars were solemnly hoisted again in a simple and impressive ceremony at the kiosko on the public square of the town and this organization with all its staff and men stood saluting at the emblems of Liberty.

As I recall those weird days of 1943-1945, something springs from my heart, something I can not forget in my life: the companionship of a group of people who stood solid against the yoke of Japanese imperialism. This secret organization I later found out was the "M" Company, a guerrilla force under the able leadership of Captain Marcelino Nobles of the San Narciso Sector, Zambales Military District. This organization, I also found later, was organized on the basis of loyalty to the constitution of the United States and the Philippines, as shown in the induction papers of the members, on the first day of September, 1942, by direct orders from Captain Ralph McGuire, then the Commanding Officer of the Western Luzon Guerrilla Forces, Zambales Military District,

How I came to be the Military Adviser of this organization came in this wise. I sent my wife, Cynthia de Guzman, to contact a supply officer within the jurisdiction of the San Narciso Sector. It developed later that this Supply Officer is 1st Lt. Alfonso Torres. Upon our meeting, Lt. Torres gave the names of his superior officer and comrades. He invited me to stay with him in their camp at Lubon at the foot of the hills ten miles east of the town of San Narciso. Accepting the invitation, I was warmly met by the staff and members who at once made me, because of my military qualifications, their adviser. I remember how that American aviators and survivors of Japanese prisoner ships were safely conducted to the mountains, by alert members who made it also possible the continuous transportation of foodstuffs to the organization, by knowing enemy positions off-hand.

Japanese raids were effectively repulsed and evaded by faithful compliance of my commands and orders. I also remember how that my wife, Cynthia de Guzman, as 2nd Lt. for the Medical Corps devotedly and unselfishly attended to the men suffering from malaria. In spite of the hardships then encountered by this organization, its members never showed signs of wavering.

I thank God and congratulate the entire staff and men of "M" company under the able leadership of Captain Marcelino Nobles.
