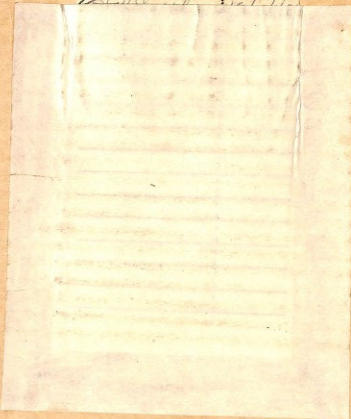

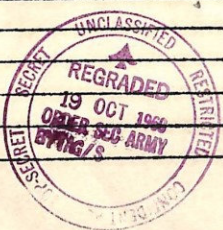



Dear Lieutenant Grande:

The Commanding General has directed that you be informed that the Grande Detachment, a guerrilla unit under your nominal control, recognized by letter Headquarters USAFFE, dated ~~7 Aug~~ ^{MAY} 1945, has not been favorably considered for revision of its present recognition date.

A thorough and detailed examination of all supporting papers submitted by your unit and an exhaustive study of the history of your unit, together with a careful analysis of all other available information of the military activities of your unit from its inception, scrutinized in relation to the overall resistance movement, has failed to justify sufficiently the establishment of a date of recognition other than that presently published.

This letter constitutes the final determination of and action upon the period of official recognition of the Grande Detachment.

REVISION REPORT
GRANDEA DETACHMENT

1. On 4 August 1947, Lt Pete C. Breaz interrogated Andres G. Grandea, CO, Grandea Det., to determine whether or not that unit's present recognition date should be revised. The Grandea Detachment was recognized in a strength of 80 as of 15 Mar 1945 by letter Hq USAFFE, FEPA 370.64, dated 1 April 1945.

2. ALLEGED HISTORY: (See Tab A)

3. FINDINGS:

a. Andres G. Grandea was interviewed, and his statements are reflected in the findings:-

b. Andres G. Grandea, CO, Grandea Det, freely admitted the following facts to the undersigned:

- (1) He originally helped Tapanan organize Tapanan's Guerrillas in early 1943.
- (2) He was Chaplain for Tapanan's Guerrillas and also a Bn Commander. In 1943 he had 200 men; in 1944, 100; in 1945, 80.
- (3) During the occupation his men were encouraged to work for the Japanese with a view toward sabotage. All members of his unit at one time worked for the Japanese. His men can be considered as "homeguards" and devoted the majority of their time to caring for their families.
- (4) With no arms nor money, his men could not actively resist the enemy. However, they were all loyal to the "cause" and continuously attempted to popularize the guerrilla movement.
- (5) In 1944, while fearing capture by the Japanese, he told his men to join whatever units they could. In 1945, he reorganized his Scouts and the unit became active during the Liberation.

c. At one time, Grandea was affiliated with the Tapanan Guerrillas. In 1945, he reorganized his detachment independently and was recognized as an independent unit.

d. No useful purpose will be accomplished by further investigation of this unit. There are no members worthy of revision.

e. This unit suffered no casualties (one man was wounded but recovered without any disability).

4. POLITICAL ASPECTS:

This unit has no apparent political aspirations or affiliations.

5. RECOMMENDATIONS:

It is recommended that the Grandea Detachment be not favorably considered for revision of its present recognition date.

BRIEF
HISTORY
of
GRANDEAR DETACHMENT

1. Personal circumstances:

On or about January 1943 the undersigned affiliated with the United Evangelical Church. I purposely undertook this job not only as a calling but also with a view that I could have an easy access to veterans of Bataan and Corregidor in the province of Cavite and also the general populace in the area of Indang, Naic and Maragondon. In order for me to hide my identity as a leader in the resistance movement I moved around as a preacher, having been licensed as Evangelist, in-charge of three churches situated in Jalang, Naic; Maragondon proper and Mabacao, Maragondon.

2. Meeting Esteban Tapanan:

In Jalang, Naic I met Esteban Tapanan, who was enthusiastic in the resistance movement. Tapanan who was a sympathizer of the Evangelical church came out in the open for the formation of a guerilla organization. I encouraged Tapanan in such a plan for the purpose of sabotaging the business enterprise of the Japanese in Naic, Cavite. Many members of the movement were told to get employment in the cotton fields to slow down the work of the Japanese. The scheme was very effective because the cotton fields yielded no substantial harvest and was forced to close the cotton field in the early part of 1944.

3. Purpose.

The guerilla organization in Jalang, Naic at first was to popularize the resistance movement; second to sabotage the Japanese cotton plantation; third to eliminate the Japanese from Naic and suburbs and lastly to resist any act of vandalism by other factions from neighboring places, which were rampant. The Mayor, Mr Arenas, I understood was in the last scheme mentioned supra although at the time no mention was made of any guerilla leader, due to the gravity of the situation.

I traveled extensively contacting those who were in the Scouts and interested civilians who look up to me for leadership. With no money arm and money which are the most important factors for a well organized fighting guerilla unit, I consented for them to join with any guerilla organization in their vicinity but with the instructions that I will call for them at the right moment.

4. Organizations:

On or about September 1944 with the formal organization of the Tapanans guerillas into fighting units most of the members of the GRANDEAR DETACHMENT were

with the Taparans. The undersigned was the Unit Chaplain and instructor of the 3rd Bn (Mabacoa Battalion). (Note: I commanded this Battalion when we attacked the Japanese in Ternate and as a result from that encounter Col Tapanan was killed in action).

The members of the GRANDEA DETACHMENT composed of members of Philippine Scouts who fought in Bataan and Corregidor in 1941-42 and some civilians who affiliated with other guerilla organization. From Jan 1943 they were scattered in different places in Cavite and Manila.

Upon the landing of the liberation forces in Batangas this detachment gathered and subsequently reported to Colonel Hildebrand, Commanding Officer, 187th Para-glider Inf., 11th Airborne Div at Tagaytay, on or about the early part of ^{Feb} 1945. (Civilians were dropped per order of Col Hildebrand except a few who subsequently became officers in the Philippine Army)

This detachment saw action against the Japanese in Talisay, Tanauan, Mt. Lipa, ~~McCulot~~, Cuenca, etc in Batangas province. This detachment reported to the 5th Replacement on 15 April 1945.

5. RECOMMENDATIONS

Although the above exhibits do not concern the members of the GRANDEA DETACHMENT they give proofs as to my activity as a guerilla leader. Further it will enlighten the burden of proof as to whether or not the men under me could readily be available for combat were they not prepared for quite sometime for a reckoning against those who gave them untold sufferings and defeat both in Bataan and Corregidor and in the Concentration Camp.

It is therefore recommended that -

(1) that the men listed on the roster be advanced one rank higher or the ranks claimed by them in accordance with my recommendation. When the attached roster was submitted data as to ranks furnished were as of Philippine Scouts (pre-war) and were not as of guerilla ranks. I have no record on hand of their

guerilla rank.

(2) That in view of their loyalty and fidelity to the United States and their activity with the resistance movement, together with their voluntary act in organizing themselves into a fighting unit and their actual presence in combat against the enemy during the liberation that they be entitled to complete pay during the Japanese occupation.
