The Commanding General has directed that you be informed that Company "B", 1st Battalion, 4th Regiment, purporting to be a guerrilla organization under your nominal control, has not been favorably considered for recognition.

It is felt that the recognition extended to personnel of David's Command, Fil-American Irregular Troops, a composite unit from the overall command, constitutes just and adequate acknowledgement of military service.

This decision does not preclude individual request for casualty recognition by injured personnel or their heirs. Upon request from interested individuals, appropriate casualty forms will be forwarded.

TO : Commanding General, AFWESPAC, APO 707
(Thru Guerrilla Affairs Branch, Phil Army Division
G-3 Section, AFWESPAC)

1. Request recognition of CO. "B", 2nd Div III Army Corps, Markings-Fil-Americans, based on the following considerations:
2. That Co "B", designated as Sto Niño Detachment, is a part and parcel of a recognized guerrilla unit, the 2nd Division, III Army Corps, Markings-Fil-Americans, by the Sixth Army, as of 11 Feb 1945.
3. That the Sto Niño Detachment was originally organized by the undersigned, upon order of Colonel Gertrudo San Pedro, recognized Colonel by the Sixth Army, and as Commanding Officer, 2nd Division.
4. That its tactical location is barrio Sto. Niño, about 3 miles SouthEast of San Pablo City and the said Detachment covered an operation area of Barrio Sto Niño and its vicinity.
5. That its activities are:
 - (a) it was an outpost guard of the Headquarters of the 2nd Division, at Tayak Hills, on San Cristobal mountains.
 - (b) it detected enemy spies and "Makapilis" who were Pro-Japs which affected the security of the 2nd Division.
 - (c) it harrassed or ambushed Japanese trucks going to and from Dolores, Tayabas.
 - (d) it enforced measures for the preservation of peace and order and protection of civilians, specially at the evacuation area at Tayak Hills, during operations for the liberation of San Pablo City area.
6. That in January 1945, a detail of 32 officers and men of this Company, was assigned engineering work, especially on the construction of a landing field, under the supervision of Major Julian M. Artillaga, then Chief of Staff, 2nd Division, a Philippine Military Academy Graduate.
7. That after completion, the landing field was utilized by Major Charles Howe, AC, Major Thompkins, AC, and Sgt. Britain, AC, 5th Attack Group, US Air Squadron, three rescued American pilots at Nanhaya, Pila, Laguna, when they took off to return to their air base at Mindoro.

8. That thru Major Howe's intervention, substantial supplies of medicines, food rations, clothing equipment, arms and ammunition were dropped on this landing field by American planes and were distributed to guerrillas.

9. That on 11 February 1945, Col. Gertrudo San Pedro attached the 2nd Division to the Sixth Army, for which reason, two Operatives, namely, 1st Lieut. Rodolfo Bardelas and 1st Lieut. Benjamin Gesmundo, both of Co. "B", together with two companions, have been detailed on 17 February 1945, for duty directly under 1st Lieut. TOM J. ROUNSAVILLE, Inf. AUS, Alamo Scouts.

10. That their mission was successful when Japanese gun emplacements, ammunition depots, concentration of enemy troops, and other military objectives and targets were pin-pointed by American bombing and strafing in the San Pablo City-Calauan, Bay-Los Baños-Pila-Alaminos area, ---Release of said Operatives having been appreciated, per Letter of 31 March 1945, signed by 1st Lieut. Tom. J. Rounsaville, hereto attached.

11. That upon Liberation of San Pablo City on 3 April, 1945, I was given order by Colonel Gertrudo San Pedro to be on detached services in the same sector, in order only to be available to local U.S. Army Forces for mopping up operations, considering our knowledge of the terrain and other valuable military informations.

12. That on 31 March 1945, because of the necessity of the service, Sofronio Calabria, was detailed for duty with Btry "A", 61st Field Artillery Bn, APO 201, at San Pablo City, as evidenced by his PASS, hereto attached, issued by Lt. Col. ROBERT R. WOODARD, Commanding, 61st FA Bn, USA, and by his Certificate of Identification, hereto attached, dated 21 Aug 1945, issued by Capt. Leslie A. Newman, O-465952, FA, Commanding, Btry "A", 61st Field Artillery Bn. APO 201.

13. That said order for detached service was complied with and contact to render services to the United States Army Forces is evidenced by Letter, hereto attached, of 1st Lieut. JAMES Z. MCHENRY, Commanding, Troop "C", 8th Cavalry Regt, 1st Cavalry Division, APO 201, given to me, being then identified by my alias name as "Captain Lumbagan".

14. That on 9 April 1945, as evidenced by a Letter Re- Acknowledgment of Receipt, hereto attached, signed by said 1st Lieut. JAMES Z. MCHENRY, I delivered one (1) grenade discharger (knee mortar) after our encounter with the enemy.

15. That on 18 May 1945, by reason of our services, Sgt. Alejandro Tapay, of this Company, has been certified to have contracted illness in LINE OF DUTY, by Capt. George A. HAMILTON, MAC, Registrar, 54th Evacuation Hospital, (SM) APO 75, per Certificate to that effect, hereto attached.

16. That for purposes of certification of our services while on detached service, our encounters against the Japanese and aggressive patrols at barrio Sto Niño and other barrios at the vicinity of San Cristobal mountains, are included in the Recommendation of our Commanding Officer, Col. San Pedro.

17. In the final analysis, the very nature of the circumstances under which this Company "B" (Sto Niño Detachment) has been placed on detached service with local U.S. Army Forces stationed at San Pablo City, as may be verified by the Certificates of U.S. Army Officers, is a conclusive evidence that CO, "B", 2nd Division, III Army Corps, Markings-Fil-Americans, has rendered combat duty to the United States Army, which is a primary requisite for recognition.

18. Under Executive Order No. 21, of the President of the Commonwealth of the Philippines, dated 28 October 1944, the status of CO "B" (Sto Niño Detachment) while rendering services under Sixth Army operations, is that of officers and men in active service of the Philippine Army.

19. Considering the foregoing reasons, request that CO "B", 2ND DIV III ARMY CORPS, MARKINGS-FIL-AMERICANS, be duly recognized as of 11 February 1945.

1st Bn, 2nd Div III Army Corps, Markings-Fil-
Americans.

TO : Commanding General, AFWESPAC, APO 707
(Thru Guerrilla Affairs Branch, Phil Army Division
G-3 Section, AFWESPAC)

1. Recommend recognition of COMPANY "B", 1st Bn, 2nd Div III Army Corps, Markings-Fil-Americans, for their services rendered to the US Army, to be included in the approved roster of the 2nd Div III Army Corps, Markings-Fil-Americans, as of 11 February 1945, based on the following:
2. That I am the Commanding Officer of the 2nd Division recognized Colonel, by the Sixth Army, as of 11 February 1945.
3. That as Commanding Officer, I know personally Capt. Eufrosinio Aliasas, who is identified as Capt. "LUMBANGAN" (alias name) for purposes of military security, and was ordered to organize the Sto. Niño Detachment, subsequently redesignated Company "B", on 1 December 1942.
4. That the officers and men of said Company "B" have been active during our guerrilla activities under my Command.
5. That after Capt. Aliasas had been given an operation area at barrio Sto Niño, San Pablo City, his Detachment first operated as outpost guards for the security and defense of the Headquarters of the 2nd Division during emergency, aside from other duties as already stated in the basic of Capt. Aliasas.
6. That on Sept 1, 1944, Sgt. Buenaventura Guerra, an Intelligence Operative, this Detachment, was caught by 4 Makapilis and 4 Japanese Military Police due to his guerrilla activities as such.
7. That despite imprisonment and tortures inflicted by the Japs at Banahao Garrison by throwing him into the swimming pool, hitting his legs with iron bar, hanging and even by starving him, Sgt. Guerra never betrayed military secrets of his Organization until his release on 7 January 1945.
8. That during the mobilization of my whole Command on January and February 1945, I assigned his Detachment for Engineering work on the construction of bamboo huts and cottages for kitchen, mess, and barracks purposes.
9. That after attachment on 27 March 1945 of the 2nd Division to the 5th Cav Regt, 1st Cav Div APO 201, US Army, and upon liberation of San Pablo City on 3 April, 1945, I gave orders to Capt. Aliasas for detached service at San Pablo City, just to be available to the U.S. Liberation Forces in mopping up operations, in view of their knowledge of the locality and military informations.

10. That the real nature of their loyalty to America for which they had been organized, is proven when this Detachment contacted with 1st Lieut. James Z. McHenry, Commanding, Troop "C", 8th Cav Regt, 1st Cav Div US Army, as evidenced by his Letter to Capt. Eufrosinio Aliasas, already attached.

11. That according to the records, the following are the encounters by this Detachment during its aggressive and security patrols from 3 April 1945 to 30 June 1945, at the barrio Sto Niño and other barrios outlying San Cristobal mountains:

- 3 April 45- A.M. 12 Japs encountered by this Detachment at Subac Spring, Sto Niño, SE San Pablo City.
Casualty: Japs 2 KIA, Guerrillas -none.
Captured weapons: 1 Jap rifle and ammunitions, 1 Jap knee mortar with 6 bullets.
Result: Remaining Japs retreated.
- 3 April 45- P.M. This Detachment reinforced another guerrilla unit under Lt. Col. Vicente San Pedro (already recognized as Bn Hq, 2nd Bn 2nd Div III Army Corps, Markings-Fil-Americans), and encountered Japs at "Balugbog Baboy" sitio Lagaslasan, barrio San Jose, E San Pablo City.
Casualty: Japs none, Guerrillas -2 KIA
Result: at 1800 hours, Guerrilla withdrew for being outnumbered by enemy.
- 8 April 45- Approximately 80 Japs encountered at Provincial Road of barrio Sto. Niño, by this Detachment with 12 U.S. soldiers under Capt. James Z. McHenry, 8th Cav Regt, encamped at barrio San Ignacio, San Pablo City.
Casualty: Japs 3 KIA, Guerrillas -none.
Result: Japs burned a house. Guerrillas withdrew upon orders from U.S. soldiers.
- 4 May 45- Captured Jap at house of a civilian during patrol at barrio San Ignacio and San Vicente, near the river bank of Casayaan, barrio San Ignacio, S San Pablo City. Jap delivered under receipt to Major Anderson, 1st Cav Div, at "Mabuhay Rest Camp", Calauan, Laguna. Said Jap turned over to Capt. Carver, Provost Marshal, MP 1st Cav Div at Lucena, Tayabas.
Confiscated: 1 Jap bayonet, and his photograph is hereto attached.

12. That I highly commend Company "B" for its efficiency during our guerrilla activities, because only due to unit efficiency, the 2nd Division has been singled out among guerrilla organizations, with such Commendations, hereto attached, which are self-explanatory:

- (a) Letter of Gratitude, dated 27 Feb 45, from Major General Swing, Commanding, 11th Airborne Division, USA
- (b) Commendation to the undersigned, CO Fil-Americans, dated 27 Feb 45 from Major J.D. Vanderpool, GSC, US Guerrilla Commander
- (c) Certificate, dated 8 June 1945, from Major R.C. Langham, S-2, Troop "C", 5th Cav Regt, 1st Cav Div
- (d) Commendation, dated 22 June 45, from Lt Col Peter H. Dahmlow, Commanding, 1st Squadron, 5th Cav. Regt 1st Cav Div APO 201, U.S. Army.


