#### Report on the Ath En. Ath Rept, 2nd Div, III Army Corps. Warking's Fil-Apericans

#### ALLECED BISTORY

In 1944, with 600 men, the Pulsho im engaged in three beief contact encounters, "rampang" (askesh) in reture. An estimated 14 Japanese casualties were suffered. Abril was ordered to serve as G-2 with "esdowarters, 2nd Division, Cept.

Ciriaco Euroenas, originally executive officer, 4th En, was appointed acting convaning officer of the new 4th En, 4th Regt, 2nd Div, III Army-Gorpe, MFA. This change of comment was 13 weeks prior to the Education of San Fablo (3 April 1945). During this short period, there is no combat encounter alleged, due to the strengthering of the Japanese garrison.

Upon the arrival of elements of the American 7th Gavelry and the little Attraction, individuals from the Att fin, all equipped to do same, joined the literating forces and proceeded to combat the Japanese at the side of their American allies. In conclusion, it is to the satisfaction of the contact team to report that; this unit was not actually uninterned in the field in opposition to the energy this unit did not have a definite organization; action of this unit does not deconstrate any continuity of activity; and, finally, numbers of this unit have not devoted their entire efforts to military activity, to the exclusion of normal civilian purmits.

Col. Barking, overall Commander Marking's Fil-Americans, stated that he did not know of Capt Abril and Ms unit personally. Col David, Commanding III Army Corps, concurred with Col. Earling's statement, but added that the 2nd Laguna Division was the best unit of his command. Gol. San Fedr commanding 2nd Laguna Division, commanded the organization, but not the flighting ability of the Alb Em.

CHAPTER I - CREATION OF THE 4TH BN

- 1. Faith and loyalty to the Philippines and the United States were banded together for active resistance out of which was born the 4th, Bn, 2rd Regiment, 2nd Laguna Division, 3rd Army Corps, Makring's-Fil-Americans,
- 2. In the second day of Cabistans, 1942, or 26 December to be exact, a group of intelligent, young men and two elder past forty years of age met that sold, showery might in an unpretentious house, only a stone throw from the barrio road of Bulaho and overlooking its barrio public shoot, four and a half miles from the looking is carrie mount smoot, four and a main makes from one city proper of San Fablo. - 5. In that unpretentious house that cold night gathered ber-Villano C. Abril, 36 years old, 3rd year law student and an ROTO graduate in the University of the Philippines, eleven years before the Pacific War and 6 years newspagement connected with the prewer Tribune-Vanguardia-Taliba (T-V-T) Publications, Mapila; the Barconse Problem (Trimoo, 34 and Gomer, 25; both high school students before the war; Fortunate Flores, 32, with high school education ; Benito Torrizo, 48, public school teacher in the barrio ; Gregorio Reyes, 22, PA traines reserve who was disbanded; Eleuterio Eseque, 43 and Ireneo Abril, 28, both with an elementary education.
- 4. With his 2-year basic course in ROTC and three years cliege stwission Servibless Aug Abrilisapias for regulation, as preserve

education Servillano C. Abril applied for commission as reserve officer in the PA on August, 1941 but was rejected by the HPA in view of his "academic deficiency." Eager to be of service to his country he appealed his case to the late President Quequo but was met with a courtecut reply of denial.

- 5. With his papers for mejection stucked in his pocket he bidded his time. On Christmas even of 1941, more than two weeks after the sneak attach on Pearl Harbor by the Japa Abril presented again to the HFA for ismediate draft in the Army. He was immediately accepted. With his papers he went to the medical head-quarters for physical examinations as directed to him by Major Dioquino (now Lt 601). While undergoing the examination with fity-six others about 1035 hours that morning, Port Area was bombed. Manila and suburbs were in alarmed. The medical examination was suspended. Twok days later Abril received information to disband. Thus, cutting off his chance and eager desire to be of direct expective to his country.
- 6. With arrival and occupation of the Philippines by the Japs Abril found his chance to strike against the invaders and performed his service to his country. Thus, one year and two days to the day, on 26 December 1942, he called these men to that simple dilapidated house by the barrio road for a solemn conference to organize the resistance movement. The group unanimously agreed to start the operations right away following a brief, pointed remarks of the organizer who was then designated as the commanding officer. Ciriaco Barcenas was designated as executive officer; Fortunato Flores and Benito Torrizo, intelligence, information and edcuation; Gregorio Reyes and Eleuterio Eseque, plans and training; Ireneo Abril and Gomer Barcenas, personnel records. Ciriaco, Eseque and Torrizo were given the ranks of 1st Lts; Flores, and Reyes, 2nd Lts; Gomer and Ireneo, 1st Sgts. Abril however was only known as the "CO" and was recognized since then by the members of the underground.
- 7. After their commission and designation they were swormed in to fight back the enemy spiritually and physically wherever and whenever possible; to die willingly in the hands of the enemy with their lips scaled to the last breath; to accomplish their mission even at the cost of their life, of their wife, husband or children, of their parents, broches or sisters, of relatives or friend; to observe military descipline and courtesy among the the rank and file of officers and men of the organization.
- 8. With their induction the 4th Bn was born. This designation, 4th Bn, was given when the organization affiliated with the late Col lungh Straughn's Flakamerican Irregular Troops then commanded by Hs jor General Vicente Lim and finally by Col Marcos (Harking) Villa Aquetin. This change of command was made following the capture and subsequent death of Col Straughn at the homestead of Col Quintin Guillodine, his executive officer, at the latter's homestead in Barrio Malaya, Rizal on 6 August 1943.

The San Fablo City sector then of the FAIT was commanded by the youngest San Fedro brothers, Lt Col Gertrudo San Fedro and the affiliation was made on 21 August 1943. Servillano Abril was commissioned Captain and commanding officer of the Bulaho Battalion and the commission of other organizers were retained and recognized.

- 9. The activities of the Bn were more directed at the spiritual and soral phase of the underground, counteracted the Jap beasts and propaganda. This was decided by the staff in view of the brutal and nurderous retaliation the Japs did to the civilians. The Jap propaganda sized to nullify the political, educational and economic life of the Filiphone as shaped by America's forty years of administration of the Fhiliphines. The Bn staff decided to counteract one by one and pointed to the pape philosophy.
- 10. In the political field the Japs taught the Filipinos that the most efficient form of government in the world and best suited to the Filipinos specially at that that of the Facific War was a one party government in which the people were more subservient to the government leaders. The Japs realized that this political philosophy was dangerously strange to the Filipinos and to upset this ubrupt change to the people's slevery to the government she exploited first the racial complexion of the people, calling them brother Asians, from the slogan, "Asia for the Asians."
- 11. The Bu whose membership then was spreading to neighborine barries countersected this Jap appealing slogan by pointing to the people that under such form of political system the free will of the people is suppressed, their opinions are muzzled. Examinative The government will be the master and a criticism of the acts of the government will be tantamount to treason punishable by death. As a tangelle proof of the Jap deafte to whe out the democratic system was the abolition of the Mathaeleta party and the oreation of the Kalibapi. Under the Kalibapi we emphasized to the people in our area, one one, even the humblest government septoye has got to be a member of the Kalibapi or he is kick out. Hence, a Kalibapi membership card was a passport to government service.
- 12. The Japs greeted the Filipinos as brothers and partners in the task of a great and noble dission of creating the "Greeter East Asia Co-prosperity Sphere". Look at our skin, the Japs and their Filipino satellites toldius: were we not of the same color and blood'd they asked. Besides Japan is about three times nearr to the Filipines than America, but more than this the Frilipines and Japan belong to one himesphere and so located geographically by nature to be one, together with China, India, Siam, Indo China, Indonezia and Burna.

13. To this propaganda we told the people that the skin, the distance and the geographical location did not mean to us more than the "freedom of thought, freedom of action, freedom from fear," We would rather die under this freedom than live under the bushido philosopy. The Jap treatment of the Filipinos as brother was manifested in slapping the latter's face, kicking him with his boots, hammering him with the butt of their gun for a slight misteke or sisunderscanding. For slight suspicion with or without basis he was brought to the garrison to starve, to be tortured or executed without the the least benefit of the somblane of a fair twist. Is this the way the Japs called us, Brother Asians? we saked the people.

14. The Jap and Filipino propagandists emphasized that both were on in color, blood and race. Japan, they shouted, was choosen to lead the one billion peoples in East Asia for this "crusade."

15. We countered that while the Jap and the Filipinos were me in maxe and color we it would be the death knell of our democratic ways of life if we subscribe to their Bushido philosophy, their Bapaperr as god, their Shinto religion, their system of education and social casts, their system of coverment and economic structures, their family thes and attitude toward women, in short, the Japs and the Filipinos are two opposite poles in opposite directions. Nowe than this the Jap openly acknowledged that they were the chosen people in East sia to lead their colored "prothers" and of all the colored peoples throughout the world. It was very apparent from this assertion, we explained to the people, the Filipinos and all other colored peoples for that matter would be more subjects of the Jap and remain always followers because they were not the "chosen ones" to rise and lead even in their own country and people.

16. "The Fhilippines for the Filipinos" was another catohy slogan the Laps propagnitized. This slogan was revised by the Bn Staff, thus, "the Fhilippines for the Filipinos under the Jap Emperor. With this slogan the Bn pointed that the Filipinos would be slaves in their very own country as hewers of fuel, carriers of water, plowers of earth inchtain werpconneauxing under the Jap maters. "Look what they have done in Korea and Formosa," we pictured to the people. "The matives their were absorbed by the Japs thu marriages," we emphasized, "and out of it they raised suicide soldiers for their Esperor and then boasted, the soldiers of Dai Hippon are the strongest soldiers in the world." "The Chinese in Manchuria," we cited another example, "what have the done?" Even the very name of that Chinese province was changed. The Jap catapulted Henry Pu Xi to the throne as Esperor and called him; "Emperor of Manchuckou." And then we pointed to the people that right then the high government Filipino rewester officials were considering of changing the meme of the Filippine Islands as handed to us byzour forcebears for many generations. "Yes," we concluded, "the Philippines for the Filiphnos" but under the Jap Lords and Princes.

No sir, not the "samurai" way of life, must we live and be happy.

- 17. The slogan, "Asia for the Asians" and the Kritipinasider "Philippines for the Filipinos" were climated by the grant of "independence" on 14 Cotober 1943 as "promised" by Tojo in the extraordinary session of the Diet in January of that year. With the approach of Kindependence" and during the "celebration" we made clear to the people that it was only a bait for them primarily to get their actual and more tangile cooperation and joint action for Japan's prosecution of her was efforts in the islands.
- 18. To the intelligent we said that the "independence" can't be a genuine one on the basis of International Law. The sovereign power that is Japan was still at war with another sovereign power that is the United States to which the dependent people that is the Filipinos as the subject of that war, still owe allegiance to the latter soveraign power. In the United States there was still our refugee government which was elected duly by the people and recognized by the United States. Hence, the "independence" was only a make-shift one. To the educated and undeducated we posed therefore this distinction; those who believe in the "independence" were pro-Japa and those against it were pro-Americans, loyal to the Philippines and the United States.
- 19. While thousands of Filipinos throughout the controlled area observed the celebration with apparent joy and thanksgiving men and women of the 4th Bn marked it as a D-Day for the Japs and his Filipino puppets. We renewed our hope and faith with America's coming deliverance and pledged to carry on at whatever cost the underground movement to the masses until the day of liberation.
- 20. To sustain the morale of the Bn and the civilians as a whole in its guerilla area general news from friendly foreign broadcasts, mainly from Radio San Francisco and Radio Chungking, were rallied to them verbally or in written form. These news were taken from the "listening posts" secretly installed by a number of operatives.
- 21. Unfortunately, two of these operatives fell to the Japs, one of whom was tortured to death and another was released two weeks later after his gruesome experiences in the garrison.

  2nd Lt Porvernir Carunungan was captured and subsequently executed while noting down the battle results from Radio San Francisco while listening to his short wave radio set at his secluded room in Avenida Rizal. He died a martyr's death for the cause of the underground. Another was Atty. Antonio Azores who lived to tell his story.
- 22. The biggest moral battle the men and women of the 4th Bn faced was the Surrender Proclamation of puppet President Laurel. In response to this proclamation the Bn staff gathered the key men of the organization from their respective sectors. In the conference it was decided that nobdy should surrender at any cost. This decision was rallied to the ranks and file of their respective command. It was also decided that the officers

would be held strictly responsible and answerable to the court martial once a member of his unit surrenders. With this decision the Bn pledged their unswerving devotion to the cause of the resistance movement and once more renewed their faith and loyalty to the United States and the Philippines. Happily enough none dared surrender. On the contrary the men and women voted unaminously to carry on the work already half thru and fight for it to the finish.

- 23. The abhorent spot in the underground resistance of the Bn however, was the underhanded operations of the men of the underground within the underground. These men were welcomed in the fold with the sincere belief of their loyalty and devotion to the cause but got away with their mission leaving their victims of treachery behind. They were found to be wolves of the Japa and enlisted and bored within in sheep clothings.
- 24. For this condemnable operations a number of genuine members were daptured and tortured to death, the biggest casualties occured in 1944. While on their special mission to contact the Vera Guerillas in Southern Tayabas province 2mxHrx \$/\$zt Atanascio Briz and T/\$zt Osias Briz were pointed by the Jap spies and excuted at Padre Burgos garrison, Tayabas on 10 January 44. In barrio Bautista, San Pablo City, on 20 March 1944 \$/\$zt Juan Eseque was captured and never heard from. Five months later in the same barrio \$/\$zt Juvencio Villanueva and Pfc Gertrudo Averion fell on 21 and 25 August, 1944 respectively, who were executed right there in the said barrio. In the second week of November, 1944, a number of Philippine Constabulary and Makapili headed by Graciano Calabia, "terror" of Makapili and considered dead by the guerillas and a score of Japs went to Santiago No. 2 purposely to wife out the Marking's and the PQOG's In this campaign, \$/\$zt Meliton Flores, \$zt Victorio Tolipann and \$/\$zt Sofronio Galac were pointed and picked up. Their bodies were found two days later, tied to a guava planta and coconut trunk.
- 25. For this spionage operations the Filipino spies received P2,000 cash Jap notes and I cavan of rice, for every "head" pointed and disposed of.
- 26. To counteract this deadly operation the Bn employed a catch-trap tactics. A number of intelligence operatives were planted right in the midst of this group; also civilians who rubbed minimax elbows with the Japa were contacted; while others posed as humble laborers in the streets. Two only fell under the treachery: Cpl Arsenio Fernandez and Pfc Emilio Garcia.
- 27. The news of the landing invasion of Leyte on 20 October 1944 brought a tremendous jubilation to our Bn. With this land-

- ing the Bn staff elerted all officers and EM in the field to stand by for any eventual order. The full scope and significance of to the landing were brought to the people in general and once more their faith in America's liberation of the Philippines was kept stlaims in ther hearts.
  - 28. "They have returned," was the talk and subdued comments of the poople in general xxx" The Japs are now downed and out," they said with a sneer.
  - 29. The subsequent landing in Lingayen on 9 January 45 scaled the doubts of those still skeptical in the Philippine liberation. This skepticist though demonstrating was quite sincere in view of the list of "battle victories" the Japa hammered at the people. But to the men and yomen of the Bu the Liberation was an accomplished fact.
  - 30. In the first week of January 1946, the Bu staff received a senoradium from the GMR, 3rd Army Corps, Marking spell-daverdame, thru the division MG of the 2nd Laquam division (certified true copy attached) ordering "Mall the combat perceived and the division to proceed to the GMR for an important conference. In the conference the Bu personnel experience their happitest expents of their lives when they set and were introduced to the three American members of the 5th Air Corps, their first time to see Americans direct from the US, in fish and blood, since the compation of San Pable Gity on 27 December 1941. Also they were exceedingly glad to see the 50 cal machines gun mounted at the GMC. Together with other coulest units the combat personnel of the 4th Bu received instructions from 5th Clifford Britain, gumer of the attack beaber from which they were rescued following their forced landing in the rice paddies at Pila, Laguam, 15 Sanuary 45. The other two sem were Major Charles Howe, pilot and Major Thoughins. The conference decided at construct an air strip on the top of the Magoardam mountain. Three weeks later the three Americans were taken by a cab plane and ten days later the family of Intig. Gen. Carlos Romulo week also taken. This air strip was built by the Labor battalion of the 4th Br.
  - 31. In the early part of the third week of December, 1944, Capt Abril was designated Chief Intelligence Officer of the division as Chief G-2. Under his intelligence planning the operations of the operatives were intensified and extended to Tison, Alaminos, Calauan, as far as Sto. Tomas and Lipa Batangas. The command of the En was transferred to Capt
  - 32. As the liberation forces meaned the military area of the 3rd Army Gorpe the En Staff of the 4th Bu received instructions from Capt April, Chief 0-2 to intensify the

intelligence operations in its military area. Informations gathered showed that the Japs were concentrating their forces, arms and supplies in the area of the 4th En Epscially in what the Japs called their "Little Estaen." This sector comprised the mountains of Anhawan, Pusong Bate and Inararo as fas as the Pataguin and Putho barries of Lipax and Sto. Tomas, Estangas. During the operation of the En intelligence Pfc Francisco Lagurin was captured on 5 January 45 and killed. This week also saw the burning of the barrie of San Jose under Capt Francisco Polutan and the killing of his a number of his men: Pfc Gregorio Arrogancia, Pfc Ramon de los Reyes, Pfc Cayetano Arrogancia and the Excordes, Puts Andres, Teodoro and Jose. On 26 January three more operatives were captured: S/Sgt Servillano Flores, 1st Sgt Ellecer Barcenas and Pfc Silvino Gasilang. In Barrio Santa Maria on 15 February Pfc Valeriano Balitaan was also captured.

33. Before the week-end of the first week of February the 4th Bn was informed by the Division Staff in a special bulletin stating the control and command of "all guerilla forces north of south boundary of Cavite and Laguna provinces" (see certified true copy attached) by Lt Gen Krueger of the 5th Army, USA. The information was based on the radio instructions from Capt Miller, Laiason Officer of Gen MacArthur's GHQ, SWPA, with Luzon Guerillas. With this radio instructions the 4th Bn staff for the second time, alerted all the officer and EM to stand by for any eventual mobblization. Eight days later the different detachment units of the Bn in the barries of San Jose, San Francisco, San Gabriel, San Miguel, San Bartolome, Santiago Nos. 1, 2 & 3, Soldead, Sta. Maria, Santisimo Resario, Santa Anta and Balagbag were ordered by the By Staff for a general mobilization.

34. The mobilization was in pursuant to the General Order No. 1 (see certified true copy attached) of the GMQ, 3rd Army Corps, dated 10 February 45, by Gol Justiniano C. Estrella, Corps Commander. Twelve days later the combat and intelligence units of the 4th Bn under Capt Abril proceeded to Pila. Upon arrival at Pila however, Capt Abril was ordered back and assumed his intelligence operations as operative-at-large in the "Little Bataan" sector.

35. Meanwhile reports received by the Division HQ that S/Sgt Paciencia Biscocho and CPL Adriana Cabellan, while gathering informations about enemy positions along the Banadero river in the last week of February, they were captured, violated and then bayoneted to death. Along the Banadero river, San Pablo city the Japs constructed pill boxes and machine gun nests in anticipation of our attack.

Mix 36. With the whole force of the 3rd Aray Corps specially the combat unit ready for action, it proceeded to Los Baños where sore than 2000 American intermees were concentrated. 39. Certifying on the services rendered by the 2nd Laguna Division with ## Col Gertrudo San Fedro, commanding, Major R. C. Langham (see attached certified true copy), 5-2, said that the with the unit's "unhaset cooperation" they have "set an example to the American soldiers as their own."

40. Paying a glowing tribute to the splendid operations of the 2nd Laguan bivision during the three months of the Luaon campaign, Lt dol Dealow said, There have been numerous Philiphno Guerilla organizations attached to this Organization during the Lugon Campaings, and although me have received valuable assistance from each I would not hestate to may that this Unit surpasses them all in fighting shilly. They have been cool and disolphined under fire, they have proved themselves willing and disolphined conservations and have accomplished their assigned missions in a mathemiastic and superior number.

## CONCLUSION

In our efforts and sacrifices during the whole two years and two months of our resistance activities we were only moved and inspired by freedom and democracy as taught us by the United Stated during the last forty years. We believe that no other form of organized government throughout the world could offer us "freedom of thought, freedom of action, freedom from want and freedom from fear" except America. With that belief over extreme odds and misfortunes, we kept faith with America and her liberation of our country.

As we fought and carried on in rugged clothes and bare feet, with two-meal rations of boiled rice, "nilugao," camote, cassa-va, vegetables and coconuts; lived and quartered thru heat and cold in shacks and shattered houses in the far-flung barries and mountains with herbs and home-mede medicines to ward off the diseases, and with few arms to fight the Japs, Makapili and Constabulary, little or not at all did we think of monetary reward or any form of material compensation. All that we thought of and hope for was to live again as free men and women in the American ways of life.

Many of us had survived the torture dungeons of the dreaded "kempitai" to tell the story, others died thru the Jap beastly brutalities, others died in action or in line of duty, but theirs was a glorious death so taht we the living may live again in the American way.

The officers and EM in the attached roster of the 4th Bn were active members of this organization until the termination of the liberation campaign in South Central Luzon. They served the Bn in the combat unit, intelligence operations, information and propaganda, suppliers and procurers of food supplies, labor battaliion, first aid personnel and other various capacities, before and during the operations of the liberation forces in the provinces of Laguna, Batangas, Tayabas as far as the Bicol provinces. During our attachment with the different US Army units we recieved only clothing, food, cigarrettes, arms and ammunitions and letters of commendation.

The recognition we seek is only justice and fairness to our efforts and sacrifices. We believe itx is not our own right which we claim much less demand but a right and previlige extended by the generosity and spirit of democracy of the United States, to those deserving and worthy of that right.

Because we fully believe we are worthy and desrving, we appeal to you, Sir, for our recognition.

#### HISTORY OF GUERLLA ACTIVITIES OF SAN JOSELBITIN SECTOR

## San Jose-Bitin Sector Organized - January, 1943

- l. The spread of the resistance excession in the barries of San Jose and Bitin, City of San Pablo in January, 1943, brought these two barries under the actual command and military area of the 4th Battalien. This Bn. was organized in December, 1942, at barrie Santiage No. 1, City of San Pablo and was formally called the Bulahe Battalien. It was designated later as the 4th Bn. Tellowing the reorganization of the 2nd Laguna Division, 3rd Army Carps, Harking's Fil-Americans. Pursuant to this reorganization the San Jose-Bitin Sector of the 4th Bn. was redesignated as the "L" Company with Capt. Francisco Pulusan, Commanding Officer, succeeding the late Capt. Perfecte Alvares.
- 2. The sector was eriginally under the ecomand of Capt. Perfects Alvarez who was continued as Commanding Officer until his tragic but hereic death in the hands of the Japs and Massamili in the first week of January, 1945. Capt. Alvarez was one of those few courageous men who were called and inducted into active duty in becamber, 1942. He was given the rank of lating with the order to recruit volunteers in his area. Following his induction and designation he was given successive promotions for his meritorious services and capable leadership. Unfortunately, he died before he witnessed the fruition of his resistance efforts against the energy.
- 3.— For two weeks before he met his fatal death on 8 January 1945 he lied on his bed scriously ill with stemach ulcer, at his hideout at barrie San Jose. The immediate appreach of a group of Japs and Makapili to his hiding place without sufficient warning only gave Capt. Alvares and his men a few minutes of preparation to evacuate. His men were carrying down from the house where he lived when the enemies started shooting, hurriedly and simultaneously closing in. Upon arrival of the ememies he was caught at the foot of the stairs of the house vainly struggling to escape. He was bayenested several times then set the house on fire and tessed his body into the flames, that was the end of the brave registance leader who refused to compromise on his peaceful surrender under the terms of the "Surrender Proclamation" of the puppet President Jose P. Laurel in November, 1943.

## Activities of the Sector - Patroling and Guarding

- 4. The late Capt. Alvarez was assisted in his operations by smother loyal and patriotic guerilla lander, lat. It. Domirador Martinez. It. Rartinez was called and inducted into active duty a week later than the induction of Capt. Alvares. It. Rartiner was killed in action against the energy during his attachment with the 8th Cav. Regiment, US Army during operations in barrie San Cristobal, San Pablo City in the first work of June, 1945.
- 5. With the appointment of Capt, Alvarez volunteers who were proviously checked for their simpred loyalty were called and inducted into active service.
- 6. By the end of 1943, a total of 76 men from the two bar-



were Pfc. Ramon de los Reyes, Pvt. Jose Exconde, Pvt. Andres Exconde, Pvt. Teodoro Exconde, Pfc. Gregorio Arrogancia and Cpl. Cayetano Arrogancia. They were inducted on 3 October 43.

- 7. In the meantime that the volunteers were being called and inducted into active duty those already sworn were assigned in the patroling and guarding of the sector. These designated in this assignment undertook to guard the sector from the inliration of Filipino pro-Japs particulary Makapil. It was also their duty to protect the people from thieves and robbers who menaced the peace and order in the two barries.
- 8. The effective patroling and guarding of the sector great by minimized robbery in the two barries during the year 1943, although it was in this year that robberies in different forms became prevalent in other barries. Robbers in bands of ten to thirty armed men used to parade themselves as guerillas with lefty purposes but mostly preyed upon helpless residents of the barries thru fear and intimidations. This was one of the enemies that genuine guerilla members combated in 1943.
- 9. As the year drew to a close this form of enemy was driven from their nefarious operations. The barrio people in the other hand manifested their loyal and material assistance to the underground activities.

## Information and Propaganda

- 10. With the establishment of the puppet Republic on 14 October 43 the sector undertook to counteract the Jap propaganda of the "Philippines for the Filipines," and the misleading "Philippine Independence." The sector pointed to the people in the two barries that this was merely a bait form them to support the Japs in their war efforts in the Philippines.
- 11. Radio broadcasts noted from maker secret radio sets in typed forms were distributed to the people in the guerilla area thru underground channels. Propaganda leaflets received from the GHQ of the Marking's Fil-Americans were also distributed to the members and the civilians.

## Combat and Intelligence

- 12. The combat and intelligence activities of the sector were usually linked and coordinated with the Hg. of the 2nd Laguna Division thru the 4th Bn. Hq.
- 13. These activities were mainly undertaken by the Division Staff with the combat and intelligence personnel from the different units of the division. They were under the direct command of Cel. Gertrude San Pedro, Commanding Officer of the 2nd Laguna Division. Consequently, all combat encounters against the encounters and intelligence reports were generally taken up by the division.
- 14. The combat personnel of the sector, during the year 1243 participated in six bloody encounters against the Japs and Makapili. Of thise encounters the biggest casualty toll occured on 22 November 44 when the camp Hq. of the 2nd Laguna Division at barrie Santa Isabel, San Fable City was raided by the Japs and Makapili totaling 312 fully equipped and were determined to te stamp the guerilla activities in this part of the province.

15. While the casualties on the side of the Japs and Makapili were not known it was estimated that no less than 12 men were either killed or wounded. On our side however, a total of 21 killed and 6 wounded were registered besides the capture of two of our names including the wife of Col. Gertrude San Pedro.

16. Another tell was inflicted against us on 19 January 45 when our sector itself was raided by around 35 fully armed Japs and 7 Makapili. In this raid 6 of our men were killed during our encounter against them and 50 civilians, men, women and children were bayoneted to death. In this guerilla cam sualties included Pfc. Ramon de los Reyes, and the Excended Pfc. thers, Pyts, Andres, Jose and Toodore, Besides, almost all the barrier houses were burned.

## Supply, Courier Service, Labor Bn., Hospital Attendants

17. While the activities of the sector were primarily concentrated on combat and intelligence, information and propagands, patroling and guarding, the active personnel however, were not wholly assigned in this phase of guerilla operations.

18. The members served on rotation basis in this principal phase of operations in which they served for period of time, then shifted to the supply section, courier service, laborn battalion or hospital attendants. In the supply section the members assigned to this work under the direction and command of the S-4 gathered food supplies from level and sympathetic civilians who gave it voluntarily. In the courier service they were sent to carry messages, bulletins and other communications to other units under the 2nd Leguna Division or to the Hq. of other guerilla organizations. Those designated in the labor battalien undertook the water, fuel, and real details. It was

Tayak, Nagearlan, Laguna where taken in cab plane, on the third week of January, 1945. These three american members of the 5th Air Corps, AAC, were rescued by the lat Laguna Division when they were forced to land in the rice paddies at Manghaya, File on 5 January 45. They were taken care of by the Hq. of the 3rd Army Corps, Marking's Fil-Americans until the airstrip was completed. It was also in this field where the family of Brigadier General Carlos Romulo taok-off in a cab plane.

20. As hospital attendants those designated as such tack care of the sick, comforted them, secured patented drugs or plant herbs for the sick personnel. They were of course aided by female aiders under a dector of medecine. These sick were confined at the wards of the division headquarters.

- 2. The two originals of these Letters as signed by Lt. Col. Scholtens and Lt. Duncan were personally delivered yesterday at about 1550 hours, Thursday, 11 April 46, to Lt. Campbell of the Investigation Section, Guerilla Affairs Section, AFWESPAC, thru his assistant, a Filipino 2"Lt.
- 3. On 1 January 1946 the undersigned communicated by letter to the above American officers requesting them to certify the services rendered for their respective Units by said guerilla officers and men. Happily and fortunately enough these American officers kindly responded to the request. Following the receipt of these Letters by the undersigned he immediately filed it yesterday.
- 4. These officers and EM were among those who composed the 3rd Bn, 3rd Regt, 2nd Laguna Division, 3rd Army Corps. The officers are holding key positions in the said Bn as stated in its roster which was filed with the Guerilla Affairs Section, AFWESPAC, by the undersigned on 30 January 46. The Letter of "Recognition, Request for", signed by Lt. Col. Gertrudo San Pedro, CO, 2nd Laguna Division and its indorsement, "Recommending approval" by Col. Justiniano C. Estrella, CO, 3rd Army Corps, accompanied the Bn roster.



guerrillas organization under your nominal control, is not favorably considered for recognition as an element of the Philippine Army.

A set of general requirements for guerrilla recognition, established by General Macarthur during the liberation of the Philippines, has been used as a guide in considering the record of this unit. After careful investigation and full consideration of all substantiating records and testimony of witnesses having pertinent knowledge, recognition of this guerrilla unit is not deemed to be warranted because of reasons mentioned below:

The unit was not maintained satisfactorily in the field in opposition to the enemy.

Activities of the unit did not contribute materially to the eventual defeat of the energy.

- c. A definite organization was not established.
- d. Adequate records were not maintained (names, ranks, dates of enlistment or joining, dates of promotions, and necessary related information).
- e. Rank of members was considered to be too high for the actual size of the command maintained in the field.
- f. The number of officers, commissioned and non-commissioned, was excessive and not reasonably proportion to to the United States army or to pre-war Philippine army tables of organization.
- g. Performance of the units did not indicate adequate control by its leaders, because of:
  - (1) Desertion of personnel to join other units.
  - (2) Lawless acts committed against the civil population.
  - (3) Unwarranted attacks on other guerrilla units.

h. Sphere of operations and unit strength claimed by the unit were not commensurate with the nature of the terrain, limitation of communication facilities, and the degree of anti-resistance activities of the Japanese in the area during the period concerned.

i. Unit did not show satisfactory continuity of activity and organiazation.

- j. Frequent change of geographic location was not justified.
- At. Members of the unit did not devote their entire effort to military activities in the field to the exclusion of normal civilian occupation and family obligations.
- by means of farming or other civilian puravits, and assisted the guerrilla unit on a part time basis only.
- M. Some personnel listed as members of the unit assisted it by contributing money and supplies but did not serve in a capacity considered to justify such membership.
- n. Record of service was not substantiated by sufficient acceptable evidence.
- o. Application for recognition was received subsequent to 15 March 19. the date announced as the deadline after which such applications would not be accepted.

It is considered that the previous recognition of approximately 36 officers and men from the HTE BN 2ND Laguna Division III ARMY (CRB (Unit) who were recognized by the Commanding Gener 1 (Sixth army) (MFPnC) (AFWESPnO) for their aid during the liberation of the Philippines constitutes adequate and just acknowledgement of military service.

It is requested that you comply with the provisions of Executive Order No. 68, by the President of the Philippines, dated 26 September 1945, copy attached.




