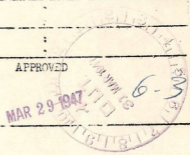

The Commanding General has directed that you be informed that the 3rd Regiment, purporting to be a guerrilla organization under your nominal control, has not been favorably considered for recognition.

It is felt that the recognition extended to personnel of David's Command, Fil-American Irregular Troops, a composite unit from the overall command, constitutes just and adequate acknowledgement of military service.

This decision does not preclude individual request for casualty recognition by injured personnel or their heirs. Upon request from interested individuals, appropriate casualty forms will be forwarded.

1. The unit listed below is recognized by the Commanding General, Philippines-Ryukyus Command, as having been an authorized element of the Philippine Army, serving with the Armed Forces of the United States from 9 January 1945 to 31 September 1945:

2. Under the provisions of Executive Order No. 21, by the President of the Commonwealth of the Philippines, dated 26 October 1944, the status of the members of this unit, during the period above specified, was that of officers and enlisted men of the Philippine Army.

Under the provisions of Executive Order No. 68, by the President of the Commonwealth of the Philippines, dated 26 September 1945, all officers and enlisted men of this unit, other than those who are members of the Regular Force or the Reserve Force of the Philippine Army, will be considered as having been discharged from the Philippine Army as of 1 October 1945.

b. Record of service was substantiated by sufficient acceptable evidence. Attached hereto are documents classified as G-1, G-2, G-3, G-4, and zoning maps which represent the type of record maintained, not the number. The authenticity of evidence submitted in this report is unquestioned. The undersigned has checked and verified each document and has collected part of the evidence to note its source and condition. Generally, evidence hereto attached, defines two facts, the contents of which, later appear as recommendations: to wit, length of active service is demonstrated to be approximately one year; number of active guerrillas is demonstrated to be approximately 3,500. Evidence supports the organization, as alleged, of the subject unit. Documents submitted as evidence include all units under the command of Col David with proper unit designation.

c. That portion of the unit considered for recognition was maintained satisfactorily in the field in opposition to the enemy. Evidence supports the contention that the active service of the unit approximated one year and interrogation and sworn statements verify the same. From each unit there was maintained an alert combat force, which, in the majority of cases, did not concur with roster strengths, but fulfilled the requisites for recognition.

d. A definite organization was established by this unit, although the frequent change of command renders the trace of the same, slightly confused. Briefly, the III Army Corps evolved in this manner; in early 1942, Colonel David was recruiting members for the late Col Hugh Straughn's Fil-American Outfit. The fruits of his labor gave birth to the Laguna-Rizal Brigade, known as the First. When the organization was well under way, Col Straughn was captured in the hills of the barrio of Malaya and later executed. Gen Vicente Lin, alias Edmund P. Ellsworth, assumed command of the Fil-Americans, but soon thereafter was captured and executed. The incumbent highest ranking officer in the organization was Col Marcus Villa Agustin, alias Marking, who, by right, assumed command. However, it was his wish to destroy the organizational labors accomplished by his predecessors, for the purpose of establishing a different organization to be known as "Marking's Guerrillas". This was accomplished although the Laguna Rizal Brigade under Col David remained independent and continued to bear the name of the Fil-Americans. On 18 May 1944, Col Marking invited Col David to confer on matters of policy. David complied and was forthwith held prisoner by Marking until he was forced to fuse the units of his command with those of Marking. Nevertheless, David retained command of his troops and acted, for the most part, completely independently, although his allegiance was sworn to Colonel Marking. David received a new designation; to wit, the III Army Corps, Marking's Fil-Americans, but for the purpose of investigation, the III Army Corps has been treated independently, owing no allegiance to Marking.

e. Performance of the unit indicated adequate control by its commanding officer. Every operation, whether large or small, demonstrated coordination and planning, as well as strict obedience to Col David and his subordinates. On 21 Jan 1945, an American A-20 bomber was forced down and "Belly-landed", in Laguna de Bay, near the barrio of Bay, Laguna. One Maj Arrieta, of David's command, was the first to observe the crash. Immediately he ordered some of his men to pick up the Americans and bring them to his headquarters.

There he administered first aid and arranged transportation for the American fliers (Majs Tompkins, Howe, S/Osgood Britain) to the headquarters of Col David on Mt. Cristobel, Laguna. David received the fliers and commenced to construct a landing field for their possible evacuation. Radio communication was established with Howe's bomber command, and upon completion of the field, two L-5's landed and flew the Americans to safety. The construction of the field was somewhat of an engineering feat, considering the tools available, but more was it a feat of obedience and devotion to duty. The undersigned has visited the field on the first steps of Mt Cristobel, and is satisfied with the history as alleged.

f. Unit showed satisfactory continuity of activity and organization, for the period one year prior to the termination of the liberation. At this time organization was complete; there was no further change of command; inter-unit quarrels were at a minimum; and the feeling that the next few months would see the zero hour was predominant. All alleged unit activities have been authenticated by the undersigned to the best of his ability. All major operations (liberation of Los Banos) have been checked with other guerrilla leaders involved in the same operations. Abnormal activities, not strictly military in nature, are hereupon listed with evidence to substantiate the claims; rescue of Major Howe and party when A-20 medium light bomber was forced down in Laguna de Bay (letter and photographs attached); responsibility for the well-being of the family of Carlos P. Romulo (letter from Gen Romulo attached). Minor activities have been omitted because they are too numerous in an organization of corps strength.

g. Ranks of members conform with Tables of Organization published by the United States Army in 1945.

h. The number of officers, commissioned and non-commissioned, was reasonably proportionate and not excessive to pre-war Philippine Army Tables of organization.

i. Sphere of operations and unit strength claimed by the unit were commensurate with the nature of the terrain, limitation of communication facilities, and the degree of anti-resistance activities of the Japanese in the area during the period concerned. (See attached map)

j. Members of the unit, heretofore designated guerrillas, devoted their entire effort to military activities in the field to the exclusion of normal civilian occupation and family obligations. Several of the members were charged with the problem of supply, several were charged with duties of home-guard, but the combat force remained intact and alerted at all times. During the liberation, a different situation was predominant - several of the personnel previously designated as supply and home-guard, joined the liberation forces with their combat elements, or individually, or in groups conforming to no particular organization. Due to these courses of action, there are several individuals worthy of recognition for the liberation period - approximately, 2,500.

k. Activities of part of the subject unit contributed materially to the eventual defeat of the enemy. The preceding paragraphs, the evidence submitted, conclude this final statement. Also concluded is the size (numerical) of that part of the unit responsible for contribution to defeat.

Briefly, and in summary, the active guerrillas are in one of the following categories:

- (1) Active guerrillas from 1 June 1944 - 26 Sept 1945; approximately 1,500 (Not recognized).
- (2) Active guerrillas from 9 Jan 1945 - 26 Sept 1945 (liberation) approximately 1,000. (Not recognized).
- (3) Active guerrillas previously recognized by 6th Army, AFBC, or AFMESPAC; approximately 1,100. (Roster attached)
- (4) Active guerrilla casualties and not recognized (roster attached) to be included in either category 1 or 2. (No additional number)

1. Col Vicente Unali, comdg. FQOG and bitter enemy of Fil-Americans during the occupation, stated that he believed David's command to have 2,000 men worthy of recognition in addition to those previously recognized. Col Unali's knowledge of David's command is extensive in the province of Laguna but limited in the province of Rizal. Unali praised David personally as an excellent and aggressive fighter and leader, and mentioned several incidents pertaining to the III Army Corps.

Lt Col Bernard Anderson, comdg. Anderson's Guerrillas or Kalayaan Command, stated that he had heard of David's command but that he was not too familiar with any specific activities in that part of Laguna and Rizal. No recommendations were advanced.

S/Sgt Gottlieb Neigun, USA, former Lt Col, GHQ Marking's Fil-Americans, stated that he knew of David's command and is familiar with most of its activities. He praised David highly and some of his subordinates, mentioning several by name. S/Sgt Neigun recommended that 2100 members be recognized in addition to those members previously recognized by 6th Army or AFBC.

Col Manuel Dikit, member Philippine Veteran's Board, and former member of the Fil-American Irregular Troops, stated that he knew David and some of his subordinates personally, and further praised the unit highly, commending many of the individual activities and encounters. He expanded on the close ties that existed between the late Col Hugh Straughn and David, commending David's loyalty to the old Fil-American outfit. The undersigned believes that Col Dikit was in a position to forward a fairly accurate count of the members worthy of recognition. The undersigned further believes that such a recommendation would be favorable to the subject command however, Col Dikit did not feel that his official capacity warranted any such recommendation, and declined to make one.

Col Marcus Villa Agustin, alias Marking, overall commander of Marking's guerrillas, stated that David's command had approximately three (3) active regiments. He qualified this statement by saying that the active elements were to be considered as such only after the fusion of the Fil-Americans and Marking's Guerrillas - May 1944. This qualification supports the findings and the subsequent recommendations; namely that period of active service approximated one year. Col Marking verified two alleged contentions of questionable content: (1), Col David was delegated the authority for the care of the family of Carlos P Remulo; (2), before Col David

consented to the fusion of his command with that of Col Marking, David did receive a letter from Gen Lim, his accepted commanding officer, to the effect that such fusion had his sanction in the interest of the common cause. Generally, Col Marking was complimentary to the units of David's command, especially praising Col Cortrudo San Pedro, commander of the 2nd Laguna Division. At the fusion of the two units, Col David had under his control three regiments of Fil-Americans. Col Marking designated him as commander of the III Army Corps which included an additional seven regiments. In an interview with Col Marking, the undersigned received the impression that Marking believed David to be favoring his original three regiments for recognition. However, Marking's belief is unfounded and untrue.

Col Quintin Collidon, liaison officer, Fil-American Irregular Troops, stated that the III Army Corps (David's command) was the most active corps in Marking's Fil-American Troops, and further, that an additional recognition of 3000 (Minimum) or 4000 (Maximum) should be granted the subject command.

Col Terry Adevaso, alias Magtangel, overall commander of the Hunter's ROTC, stated that he believed David's command to be worthy of additional recognition to the extent of 400 men. Adevaso is not familiar with activities of the subject unit and had not heard of David until late in 1943. The ROTC was active particularly in western Laguna and Batangas.

4. POLITICAL ASPECTS: Several members from the subject unit hold municipal appointments from their respective residences. However, there is no apparent political affiliations among the appointees. Col David has a large following in Laguna, and his members are constantly trying to persuade him to run for governor of the province. Repeatedly he had declined candidacy, and further states that after negotiations with PHILRYCOM have been terminated, he will enter a private import-export concern. Therefore, it may be stated that the subject unit honors no political affiliations nor aspirations as a unit.

5. RECOMMENDATIONS: It is recommended that: (1) 1500 members be favorably considered for recognition from 1 June 1944 through and including 26 Sept 45; (2) 1000 members be favorably considered for recognition from 9 Jan 1945 through and including 26 Sept 1945; (3) that Col David and his integral unit commanders compile these rosters respective of existing Tables of Organization and that the undersigned check the composite rosters against the original rosters to substantiate members and their respective ranks.

N O T E : The undersigned is familiar with units of no recognizable value, and is assured and satisfied with the honesty of Col David and is in a position to state that no inactive guerrillas, or passive units, will be included in the final analysis.

SUBJECT: History of Marking's Fil-American Guerrilla

The first outbreak of the underground activities against the enemy in the earlier part of Japanese occupation in the province of Laguna, was held in this municipality of Lumban, Province of Laguna, last June 11, 1942, when a band of guerrilla headed by Marcos Villa Agustin with some patriotic citizens of this town, raided the Japs garrison at CINE LUMBAN. The raid was purposely to set free the Americans who were then prisoners of the enemy Japs. Said raid was successfully done. Japs contries ten (10) in all were killed and one American was set free.

Four months after (October 1942) when Col. Alfredo M. David, Col. Rafael Reynoso and Col. Valza alias Valera or Rañgil, Laguna, conferred with some prominent men of Lumban, Laguna, namely, Jese Paraiso, Juan M. Liantes, Roman M. Estrella, Generato M. Estrella, Tomas Barrete, Marcelo Mamansares, Marcelo Ninjese, Teodoro Mamansares and Glicerio A. Tabia. The main subject matter of which is to discuss the activities and importance of the FAIT organization headed and organized by Col. Hugh Strangin. Unanimously agreed upon, Jese J. Paraiso was chosen as delegate of this town to confer personally with the American Colonel.

One day after the conference, it was rainy, dark and gloomy night, some of the civic spirited citizens of Lumban prepared a dance for a ride, crossing Laguna del Bay to Quisao, Rizal. Among these men in the dance excluding bestman were: Col. David, Col. Reynoso, Col. Valza, Eliseo de Lumban, and Jese Paraiso. Upon reaching the town of Quisao, they were obliged to hike in a jungle leading to Barrio Leches, Mililia, Rizal, where Col. Strangin's Headquarters was located. The said HQ was heavily guarded by Filipines with full arms and uniforms. Right there at the HQ were only two Americans, Strangin and Atwell. In the headquarter, Mr. Paraiso received instructions from Col. Hugh Strangin with the following order: "Keep the organization secret". Let your people know that the war is going on in the middle in favor of the Americans. Avoid robbery, abuses and banditry. In particular, protect all year civilians under the power of this organization. Solid cooperation among members and masses is necessarily important. Zero hour is fast approaching. I am trying my best to secure arms and ammunitions for our members and officers of this organization.

After a couple of weeks, the organization of Lumban unit began to start with rapid increasing numbers. On November 16, 1942, the first historical camp was established at St. Sinyaye, Lumban, Laguna, 8 miles away from the poblacion. Meetings and conferences were held there to find out ways and means by which the FAIT organization could furnish its members all needs especially arms and war news information. December, 1942, the organization main problems was to secure weapons, receiving set, transmitter and batteries. Luckily the organization was able to secure a receiving set and batteries. With the efforts made by the Lumban Unit, we were able to secure seven rifles from the Bataan soldiers who escaped from the Japanese atrocities. It was during this time that thru our member, James M. Estrella, that American Engineer, Nielson Lind who was at that time a prisoner and helper under pressure of the Japs at the Caliraya Hydro Electric Plant situated in this Municipality, had a direct contact with this organization. He received all war information and gave us advices with respect to the underground activities.

In January, 1943, the camp was moved to the Bc. of Sisilmin, Cavinti, Laguna, under the command of Col. Rafael Reynoso. The situation and topographical location was not good, so that it lasted only for a week. There we moved again our HQ to Barrio Lago in a boundary between Laguna and Tayabas 30 miles

away from Lumban. In Lupa, officers and members of the FAIT received military training. Members, of about 300 in number used to gather forest products. Such as rattans and hagnaya for sale so that all needs of the organization must be supplied.

May 5, 1943, Col. Roynese planned to go to town to make a general survey of how the members stationed in the town were moving on. Reaching the cross roads, a kilometer distant from the Fewer House of the Caliraya Hydro Electric Plant, in the afternoon of the same day, there were eight Japanese soldiers waiting for an army truck allegedly going to Sinilean, Laguna, Col. Roynese had with him two pistols. The Japs suspected him of his mode of action, ordered by the Japs to stop. As Col. Roynese had no more time or escape, immediately he took his pistols left and right began firing at full speed, resulting in this encounter four enemies dead. Roynese ran down town and members of the Lumban Unit took him in a banca for a hide under a thick reeds in the Laguna de Bay. Consequently, after Japs investigation he was considered as passers-by going to bagby town.

It was in the same months of May, 1943, the most critical period ever encountered by the FAIT in Lupa. 20 Jap planes flew very low as low as a road topped making a round tour to the nearest point of the camp. A message was received that the Japs have learned the location of the camp supposedly reported by the pro-Japs. Two days later, approximately 200 Japs soldiers raided the camp. Roynese's order was not to fight, because the number of arms and ammunitions were really outnumbered. He further said that in such nature of attack the opposition was useless and futile. However, thru the brilliant management of the Commanding officer, all food supplies, arms and ammunitions had been transferred to Barrio Maute. The enemy burned all houses in Barrio Mahyon and Talaganan 4 miles away from the camp and the camp itself was totally burned and destroyed by the enemies.

A few weeks after the camp was transferred to Salasid, a barrio in Lumban and the HQ was in a small house at the very northernmost of the population. Early in the morning of July 8, 1943, the HQ was raided by two trucks of Japs soldiers. All the members on guard duty were all in alert, immediately the alarm was made. All members in the HQ met the coming invaders and fought them with their all might. The encounter lasted for 15 minutes. Upon seeing that they were outnumbered they retreated and escaped. Member Feliciano Sayonete who had no time for escape failed in this encounter. Four enemies were killed and others wounded.

The camp was immediately transferred to Calumpang, a barrio in Magaoran, Laguna. After a couple of weeks at the same month, when notification in Lumban was at its height and when the entire population in Laguna lived in fear, the camp was raided by the enemies, resulting to the capture of Col. Roynese with some members of the combat team. Col. Roynese was brought to Lumban last July 19, 1943, and in the morning of the same day he met his death at the Lumban Cemetery under the order of the Jap's officer, Col. Kawasawa.

On August 8, 1943, our Commander Lt. Col. Strangman was captured in So. Malaya, Rizal, later brought to Laguna and executed. Now, we were dispersed and separated, but with a firm conviction and plodging staunch loyalty to the United States of America, we did not change our determination to carry on our mission.

Capt. Elsie de Lumban and many other guerrillas hiding in the mountains of Lumban were wanted by competent, and so they were contacted by Cels Alfredo David and were reorganized on September 28, 1943 in Cavinti, Laguna.

On October of the same year, Col. David reorganized the FAIT under the advice of Col. Edmund Eliswerth alias General Lim.

Major Blaseo de Lumban, alias Col. Mojia was appointed Executive officer. Major Vallemin, an ex-USARFF Captain the organizer of the Fil-American Guerrilla in Cavinti, was killed in action by the Japanese forces.

In the later part of the year of 1943, the camp was transferred to Marri Dayap, Calawan, Laguna. The FAIF had done magnificent activities under the command of Col. Alfredo de David. They had secured plenty of arms and ammunitions. It was at this time when Col. David was informed that Jap soldiers at Santa Cruz, Laguna, will take supplies by train to San rable. Under the direct command of Col. David, the order was made. Col. David and his team (4) men will start from Santa Cruz, Laguna station and the other nine will await in Dayap. Upon ascertaining that the supplies were only guarded by eight soldiers on the train, Col. David with his four men cautiously rode on the train with full precautions and determination. Between Dayap and Sangyas, when the other nine headed by Lt. Col. Mojia were already on the train, by the order of Col. David the train stopped. Right at this vantage point there began the killing of the eight (8) Jap soldiers who were not given time for defense. At this instant with the full speed of command of Col. David, all of them left the train taking with them arms, ammunitions and Jap notes which they got from the dead soldiers, as follows: 50-K Field rifles, 1-Jap rifle, 1-pistol, 2-boxes of bullets and P10,000.00 worth of Jap war notes.

According to observation the camp at Dayap was not safe from enemy attack. The camp was transferred to Magcarlan, Laguna where the FAIF received American magazines, cigarettes, matches, etc. The rest of the Lumban Unit was formed so that officers and members were inspired and hopeful that the American Liberation Forces are coming very soon.

In February 1944, Col. David conferred with Marcos Villa Agustin, for the purpose of fusing the two units or uniting the marking's Fil-American into a Unit. This fusion was agreed upon by the two parties concerned in order to have a strong united command against the Japanese and soldiers.

August of 1944, Col. David and Lt. Col. Mojia conferred with the officers of the Lumban Unit. With them were rifles of U.S. make, such as Thompson, Garand and Carbine. The officers of the Lumban unit were instructed to take care particularly the civilian population at the time of the zero hour.

September 21, 1944, American planes bombed Manila and other bases in Luzon and other islands. Actually we saw American planes flying by hundreds. All men, women, boys and girls were rejoicing and expecting the early American landing.

On October of the same year, the FAIF with the combined Forces of marking's Guerrilla raided the Marri de Taytay, Rizal, Laguna, resulting the capture of one truck loaded with arms and ammunitions. These arms and ammunitions were taken to Sakod na Sate, Rizal, Laguna, the training camp of the 4th Laguna Division.

On November and December of the same year, all men were called for military training at Sakod na Sate, the Division training Camp.

On the 23rd of January 1945, the three American Aviators who made a forced landing in Laguna de Bay, were picked up by our units in So. Mangnaya, So. of Rila Laguna. Col. David ordered Maj. Mojia to bring them safely to the Camp. They were Major Charles Mowe, 2nd in Command of the Flying unit in Calapan, Mindoro, Maj. Thompson and Sergeant Britain. They were treated with good care by our first aiders. Our intelligence unit sent communications for their rescue.

In the early part of February 1945, we started sabotaging and demolishing bridges in Calawan, attacking an ambush the Japanese patrol between Dayap and Rila. We had a surprise attack on a truck of Japanese soldiers, and our combat battalions was actively attacking the Japanese. By the advice of the aviators, the camp was then established in Rila. All men were obliged to construct landing fields in this town of Rila, Laguna, and also bridges and roads leading to this town. While in Rila, our CO received an order to contact Lt. Ronville, an intelligent officer

of the Alamo Scouts, and thru him we received further from the American Forces. We received arms and ammunitions for the liberation of Santa Cruz, Laguna. On March 7, 1945, after two days of street fighting we completely liberated Santa Cruz from the Japanese Forces and stayed there until the arrival of the American Forces. The Japanese retreated to Pagsanjan. But within a short period they were driven to the mountains of Lumban penetrating to Sierra Madre Mountains. All men connected in this Unit were instructed to guide the American soldiers up in the mountains as far as Barrio Caliraya, eastern part of the Municipality of Lumban. Thru the brilliant guidance and help of this Unit, the enemy fox-holes and hideouts were immediately found and destroyed.

Other members of the Unit were fully instructed to carry food and ammunitions to Pagsanjan and Lumban and several of them served to identify macapili resulting the capture of around 300 macapilis at Pagsanjan and Lumban. After the liberation and mopping up operations of Lumban and other municipalities, some of our members were attached to the Liberation Forces and others were under the command of the Saber Force.

This is the brief history and activities of the marking's Fil-American Unit of the 4th Laguna Division, 3rd Army Corps.




