Some of them died already in the extreme of poverty. Honorable President, if you could only see our everyday life, I am sure you will pity us.

Closing, but with my fervent hope for your action of help. It is respectfully prayed that the earliest possible help be extended to us before it is too late.

The ROSAARIO UNIT, purporting to be a guerrilla organization under your nominal control, is not favorably considered for recognition as an element of the Philippine Army.

A set of general requirements for guerrilla recognition, established by General MacArthur during the liberation of the Philippines, has been used as a guide in considering the record of this unit. After careful investigation and full consideration of all available substantiating records and testimony of witnesses having pertinent knowledge, recognition of this guerrilla unit is not deemed to be warranted because of reasons mentioned below:

a. The unit was not maintained satisfactorily in the field in opposition to the enemy.

~~b. Activities of the unit did not contribute materially to the eventual defeat of the enemy.~~

c. A definite organization was not established.

d. Adequate records were not maintained (names, ranks, dates of enlistment or joining, dates of promotions, and necessary related information).

~~e. Rank of members was considered to be too high for the actual size of the command maintained in the field.~~

~~f. The number of officers, commissioned and non-commissioned, was excessive and not reasonably proportionate to United States Army or to prewar Philippine Army tables of organization.~~

g. Performance of the units did not indicate adequate control by its leaders, because of:

(1) Desertion of personnel to join other units

~~(2) Lawless acts committed against the civil population~~

~~(3) Unwarranted attacks on other guerrilla units.~~

h. Sphere of operations and unit strength claimed by the unit were not commensurate with the nature of the terrain, limitation of communication facilities, and the degree of anti-resistance activities of the Japanese in the area during the period concerned.

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i. Unit did not show satisfactory continuity of activity and organization.

~~j. Frequent change of geographic location was not justified.~~

k. Members of the unit did not devote their entire effort to military activities in the field to the exclusion of normal civilian occupation and family obligations.

l. Many members apparently lived at home, supporting their families by means of farming or other civilian pursuits, and assisted the guerrilla unit on a part time basis only.

m. Some personnel listed as members of the unit assisted it by contributing money and supplies but did not serve in a capacity considered to justify such membership.

n. Record of service was not substantiated by sufficient acceptable evidence.

~~o. Application for recognition was received subsequent to 15 March 1946, the date announced as the deadline after which such applications would not be accepted.~~

It is requested that you comply with the provisions of Executive Order No. 68, by the President of the Philippines, dated 26 September 1945, copy attached.

Report on the "Rosario Unit" (Attached to
the Patangas Units of "Markings Fil-Americans, III
Army Corps.)

In accordance with verbal instructions from Chief of Branch, Guerrilla Affairs, G-3, AFWESPAC, Lieutenants R. L. Norton and D. M. Thompson proceeded to the headquarters of Markings Fil-American Troops, III Army Corps, on 2 September 1946 to contact members of the "Rosario Unit", in order to determine whether or not this unit should be recommended for recognition by the United States Army. The following is a summary of the investigation and is the basis for the recommendations.

ALLEGED HISTORY

In June 1942, Diego An (alias Diego A. Guadez) was contacted by Wenceslao O. Oletan (alias O'Crux) acting Adjutant General of "Straughn's Fil-American Irregular Troops", and Colonel Justiniano C. Estrella (alias Alfredo David) Chief of Staff of "Straughn's Fil-American Irregular Troops" and he, Diego An, was appointed first lieutenant and was assigned as intelligence operator between Rizal and Manila on 1 December 1942. An was promoted to Captain and assigned to organize "Fil-American Irregular Troops" in the province of Patangas, and at the same time assigned Inspector General, Irregular Troops in the province of Patangas.

In the early months of the year 1943, Diego An proceeded to Rosario, Patangas, and started the campaign of inducting personnel into his new organized unit. An contacted Jorge D. Espina, an Ex-USAPTE, 3rd Lieutenant, and offered him the task of organizing the Fil-American Irregular Troops for the province of Patangas; he accepted,

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and An continued with his duties as Inspector General. By December of the year 1943, Espina had increased the size of the unit to approximately 2000 members. Espina continued to be the commander of the organization until 28 March 1944, at which time he proceeded to Manila to confer with Representative Jose B. Laurel Jr., purposely to work for the release of prisoners held by the Japanese. Upon departing from the Malacanang Palace he was seized by the Japanese and was never heard of thereafter. The loss of Espina gave rise to different opinions among the members of the unit, and most of them deserted the unit and affiliated to the "President Quezon's Own Guerrillas (PQOG), "Hunters" (HOG) Patangas Guerrillas (Lushsing Company) and Blue Eagles, and some went into inactive status. The remainder, which consisted of approximately five hundred seventy five (575) were reorganized into the "Escaric Unit."

After the departure of Espina, a Julian Luna was appointed Commanding Officer of the "Escaric Unit", and he maintained this position until the later part of 1944, at which time he reported to President Quezon's Own Guerrillas for liaison purpose, and he was never heard of again. Diego An then took command of the unit, and no alteration of command was made from then on.

During the Japanese occupation the unit claims to have done such works as sabotage, intelligence, and harassing the enemy, but this was done on a small scale by persons or small groups of persons operating more or less independently, and were not organized. Their operations were sporadic and of no lasting consequence. The unit followed the "lay-low" policy, but maintained a headquarters, where a few members would meet and receive instructions for their sporadic operations. The members of the unit aided in the evacuation of the civilians from the designated war zones to the designated evacuation centers from the

period of the arrival of the liberating forces until the liberation of the different towns in the province of Batangas.

During the liberation period, some of the members of this unit joined Major Irving Day and a Colonel Kern, of the 158 Regimental Combat Team, 6th Army, in the mopping and patrolling activities in the towns of San Jose, Lipa, Ibaan, and Batangas, Batangas, during the period 9 April 1945 to 15 April 1945.

Other attachments obtained by this unit was with the 54th Evacuation Hospital, in which approximately nine (9) men participated. And also with portions of the 11th Airborne, of which they could remember only the 511 Airborne Signal Company under the command of 1st Lieutenant Edward F. Morris Jr.

After the attachment with the 158 Regimental Combat Team, the members returned to the town of Rosario and helped in the evacuation of the civilians, and the personnel of the unit lay in wait for further instructions. Unit was disbanded in the latter part of 1945, upon the order of Colonel Estrella (alias David), due to the inactiveness of the unit, and also in that the area in which the unit operated had been cleared of the enemy.

FINDINGS

The "Rosario Unit" has been previously investigated by the late Captain Hirschfelder, who had died prior to the completion of his investigation. The investigation was then completed by Identificants Norton and Thompson, and the following findings are those compiled by both teams. The following named persons were those interrogated and the results of these interrogations are the basis of the findings.

During the Japanese occupation the activities of the "Rosario Unit" were slight. Such activities as sabotage, intelligence, propaganda and harrassing the enemy were done on a small scale by individuals or small groups of persons who were disorganized, and their works were spasmodic and of no lasting consequence. The skirmishes claimed by the unit consisted of a raid against the Japanese sentry post stationed at the entrance to Batangas, Batangas on 13 April 1943. This operation was conducted in a haphazardly manner; and was actually a result of the doings of about fifteen members. The next encounter was not conducted until about a year and a half later, on 3 November 1944, when Celedonio Bolanes was heading a patrolling squad in the barrio of Maalascas, Rosario, Batangas to verify a report that two Japanese soldiers were allegedly shadowing members of guerrillas. The patrol found two Japanese soldiers and claimed to have killed them. But this too was done by only a small group of approximately six members. The third alleged encounter was conducted on 12 March 1945, when a few of the members ambushed a Japanese truck loaded with gasoline. This encounter is also claimed by other guerrilla units operating in this region, and no proof was forthcoming to establish this unit as the one which performed the feat.

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Other activities claimed was that done by a squad led by 1st Lieutenant Pedro Mercado, in which they cut communication lines and burned a gasoline depot, and warehouse; but again there is no proof to whom performed the feat, and it was accomplished by only a small group of men participated.

It was admitted by the commanding officer of this unit, that when such activities as mentioned above were being carried out, the remainder of the unit remained at home carrying on farming or other occupation to aid in the support of their families. Thus indicating a poorly controlled unit, and membership to the unit in a part time fashion.

A definite organization was not established in that the operations were not well planned, but were spasmodic. The unit followed the "lay-low" policy in which the unit did not operate as a controlled or organized unit, for periodically few members would report to headquarters for instructions. Another indication of poorly organized unit was revealed during the investigation of the commanding officer of the unit, for he had a poor knowledge of the units activities, and constantly referred to the written history before answering the questions asked by the interviewing officers. He further completed his part of the interview with the statement that the Rosario Unit was formed to protect the civilians of Rosario from dangers of bandits, etc.

The following periods of attachments to the liberating forces were claimed:

(1) Tivurcio Carandang, leader of the Combat Team or Co B, and nine (9) men employed by Capt Buchanan of the 54th Evacuation Hospital.

3. Manuelo Agoncillo CO, Co C also claims to have had his Company working with the 158 RCT under Maj. Loring Day patrolling during the months of March and April 1945 (1 month).

A radiogram has been sent to WPTAG Washington D. C. in order to locate present addresses of those American officers uncovered in the investigation. These officers will be contacted for statements.

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HISTORY OF ORGANIZATION
(FIL-AMERICAN IRREGULAR TROOPS
UNDER COL. HUGH STRAUGHN, No. 02515, U.S.A., COMDG.)
THIRD ARMY CORPS

Before the fall of Bataan and Corregidor, and immediately after the defeat of our USAFFE men stationed at the towns of Atimonan, Candelaria and Tizang, Tayabas, Col. Hugh Straughn, No. 02515, USA, organized the FIL-AMERICAN IRREGULAR TROOPS, South Central Luzon Forces, with its general headquarters and outfit at the Sierra Madre Mountains. The aims and purposes for which the organization was organized were as follows:

1. To assemble all USAFFE stragglers who fought and suffered defeat in the province of Tayabas against the Japanese soldiers.
2. To get in contact with members of the USAFFE who were left behind and unable to report to Bataan and Corregidor.
3. To gather and assemble all arms and ammunitions in the hands of all USAFFE men and civilians, who for some reasons or another did not join the FIL-AMERICAN IRREGULAR TROOPS, to continue the work of the Philippine Army.
4. To build the morale of the civilians and continue resistance against the Japanese by destroying all Japanese propaganda either physically or thru public discourse.
5. To apprehend Japanese spies.
6. To spread all U. S. Army propaganda received by this Headquarters.
7. To help maintain peace and order in the areas covered by our zone of operation.

In June, 1942, I, DIEGO AN, alias Diego A. Guadez and D. Angeles was contacted by Col. Wenceslao Olitan, alias Col. O. Cruz, and Col. Justiano Estrella, Alias A. David, authorized representatives of Col. Hugh Straughn, No. 02515, Commanding the Fil-American Irregular Troops, South Central Luzon Forces, to join and spread the doctrines of his guerrilla organization. I was brought to barrio Malaya, Municipality of Pililla, Rizal, thence to the General Headquarters and outfit of Col. Hugh Straughn at the Sierra Madre Mountains. I was designated Organizer and Inspector General for the Province of Batangas. The following, marked Exhs. "1" "2" and "3" are true copies of my appointments, the originals of which are signed by Col. Hugh Straughn and are now in my possession;

In January, 1943, I went to Batangas and offered the task of organizing the Fil-American Irregular Troops to Mr. Pedro Adapon but unfortunately the offer was rejected. Then I sought the advice of Father Ramon Abaya and Mr. Antonino Luensing, two prominent and respected citizens of Rosario, Batangas. They gave me valuable information regarding the situation in Rosario, Batangas, as well as their information leading to the discovery of one able leader Jorge D. Espina. Aside from giving his moral support alone, Mr. Antonino Luensing further promised that he would give sufficient financial aid to be spent in pushing thru the organization. I offered the task of organizing to Jorge D. Espina, a native of Tinga, Batangas, Batangas, Ex-USAFFE, 3rd Lieutenant, and one of those who fought and encountered defeat at the town of Atimonan, Tayabas against the Japanese soldiers. Jorge D. Espina accepted the task and was made associate organizer of the Fil-American Irregular

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Troops (Guerrilla) for the Province of Batangas. He was then commissioned Lt. Colonel and was made Division Commander by Col. Hugh Straughn.

Jorge D. Espina and I began to visit some towns in the Province of Batangas and conferred with prominent and respected citizens of every town on the same subject of organizing the Fil-American Irregular Troops (Guerrilla) in his town, explaining to him the objectives and purposes of the organization. We have assigned the following persons to act as associate organizers in their respective towns:

Although membership was considerably big only five rifle companies were organized in Rosario, Batangas. An Engineering Company was also organized. This company had only a skeleton force and was charged with the duties of preparing maps, suitable camp sites, etc. A Battalion Surgeon was also appointed to take charge of the health condition of the members and to give assistance in emergency cases. These inactive members were utilized by the organization as informers and homeguards.

Now and then, Japanese soldiers raided towns and remote vicinities in search of guerrilla members, and/or relative of guerrillas. In a big scale raid in which guerrillas and prominent men were captured, the municipalities of Rosario, San Juan, Lipa, Tanauan and Batangas were used as prison camps. The Japanese Military authorities were in hot pursuit of Col. Espina and would not release even the civilian prisoners without Espina being captured. On March 28, 1944, Col. Jorge D. Espina and Major Marcielo Evangelista went to Manila to confer with Representative Jose B. Laurel, Jr., purposely to work for the release of the prisoners above-mentioned. After their conferance and while Col. Espina and Major Evangelista were going downstairs of the Malacanan Palace, a truck full of Japanese soldiers arrived and right then and there seized them and took them to their truck. That marked the end of the activities of Col. Espina with his difficult task still unfinished. The Loss of this able leader gave rise to different opinions among members. Some members affiliated to the PQOG (President Quezon's Own Guerrillas), some to the ROTC-HUNTERS, some to the BATANGAS GUERRILLAS (Luansing Co.), some to the BLUE EAGLE and some went into inactive service.

After the capture of Col. Espina by the Japanese, Major Julian Luna of Rosario, Batangas was assigned Commanding Officer of the Battalion in Rosario, Batangas. In January, 1945, Major Julian Luna was captured by the PQOG, and has not shown up since then. After his capture, Major Jose P. Recto assumed command of the Battalion. He and his men who remained loyal and faithful to the organization were, however, advised to lay low with instruction to assemble and help the liberating forces as soon as they arrive.

The burning of the house of Donata Espina's house, the living quarters of Col. Jorge D. Espina, and the houses of the members of this organization in the province of Batangas make it difficult or impossible to produce all pertinent records of the Fil-American Irregular Troops, Batangas Unit. The heavy punishment imposed to any one caught in possession of guerrilla papers forced some of the guerrilla members to burn or destroy their credentials and reports and orders received thru Lt. Col. D. Angeles, Inspector General for the Province of Batangas, from and to the General Headquarters and outfit of Col. Hugh Straughn, No. 02515, U. S. A.

ACTIVITIES OF THIS UNIT PRIOR AND DURING THE PERIOD OF LIBERATION
BY THE AMERICAN TROOPS.

Our organization was largely engaged in intelligence work. Col. Jorge D. Espina, thru his transmitter operated by Messrs. Cannint and Blas sent and received reports and messages to and from outside forces during the years when the Japanese Army were still in the Philippines. We sent intelligence reports and maps thru the Adjutant General Col. A. David to Col. Hugh Straughn.

Although this unit was engaged in intelligence work, we have also our rifle companies to fight the Japanese when we were raided.

On April 13, 1943, Col. Jorge D. Espina with several men raided the Japanese sentry post stationed at the gate going to the main town of Batangas, Batangas. During the attack, he killed four Japanese soldiers, wounded one Filipino policeman who tried to help the Japanese soldiers, and wounded also one Japanese soldier who ran away to call for reinforcement.

We do the mopping and patrolling operations from time to time to locate Japanese installations and to report same to the General Headquarters of Col. Hugh Straughn.

We helped in the evacuation of the civilians from the designated war zones to the designated evacuation centers from the arrival of the liberating forces, up to the liberation of the different towns in the province of Batangas.

Some members of this unit joined Major Day and Col. Mann in the mopping and patrolling activities in the towns of San Jose, Lipa, Ibaan, and Batangas, Batangas from April 9 to 15, 1945.

We helped in ambusing one Japanese truck at San Roque, Rosario, Batangas on March 12, 1945, and killed one Japanese Officer and one enlisted man and destroyed and set into fire the truck loaded with gasoline.

On November 3, 1944, one squad headed by 2nd Lieutenant Celedonio Bolaños patrolled the barrioc of Maelasgas, Rosario, Batangas to verify a report that two Japanese soldiers were allegedly shadowing members of guerrillas. The patrol killed the two Japanese soldiers and seized two Japanese rifles.

We cut all enemy lines of communication and installations. In San Jose, Batangas, a squad led by 1st Lieutenant Pedro Mercado cut the telephone wires, burned the gasoline depot, destroyed the warehouse and killed two Japanese soldiers and wounded at least six more.

Joined Capt. Carreon, General Swing's Own Guard in patrolling and mopping up operations in the barrioc of Baybayin, Tiquiwan and Navalor, Rosario, Batangas in search of the reported Japanese Stragglers. In that operation two Japanese soldiers were killed and two rifles were taken and one Japanese flag. The rifles and flag are in the possession of Capt. Carreon.

Maintained peace and order and wiped out thieveries and lawlessness in the locality.

LIST OF CASUALTIES

From the very beginning of this organization it met with many setbacks and several casualties among the members. In March, 1943, while 2nd Lts. Ricardo Roallos, Antonio de los Trinos, Jose Jecutan and several enlisted men were on their way from barrio Cahigan, Rosario, Batangas to confer with Col. Espina in the Poblacion of Rosario, Batangas, they encountered members of the Philippine Constabulary at barrio Bagong-Pook. As they were outnumbered and less armed they were captured after a short engagement. Fortunately they were not accused of being guerrillas. Complaint for Resistance Against persons in Authority was filed against them. They were tried and convicted and are now serving sentence in Iwahig Penal Colony. Hereunder is the list of casualties of this organization and the circumstances by which they met their death:

1. Col. Jorge D. Espina ----- Captured by the Japanese at Malacañan Palace, Manila on or about March 28, 1944. Nothing was heard of him since then.
2. Capt. Nicetas Carandang ----- Captured by the Japanese on March 18, 1944. He was confined for sometime in the Japanese Garrison in Tanauan, Batangas. Later he was taken to the mountains of Tulos, Rosario, Batangas where he was killed.
3. 1st Lt. Patricio Maligaya ----- Captured by the Japanese on March 18, 1944 at barrio Itlugan, Rosario, Batangas. He was taken to the Garrison at Tanauan, Batangas and nothing was heard of him since then.
4. 1st Lt. Eriocio Macatañgay ----- While sick and on bed he was captured by the Japanese on March 18, 1944 at barrio Itlugan, Rosario, Batangas. He was taken to the Japanese Garrison at Tanauan, Batangas and nothing was heard of him since then.
5. Pvt. Paulino Pagkaliwangan ----- Captured at barrio Munting-tubig, Rosario, Batangas, by the Japanese in September, 1944. He was taken to Lipa, Batangas and has not shown up since then.
6. Pvt. Juan Valencia ----- Captured by the Japanese at barrio Munting-tubig, Rosario, Batangas in September, 1944. He was taken to Lipa, Batangas and has not shown up since then.
7. Pvt. Fermin Reyes ----- Captured by the Japanese in the Poblacion of Rosario, Batangas in February, 1945 while on intelligence work. He was brought to Malaking Ilog River where he was killed.

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8. Pvt. Anastacio Ulit ----- Captured by the Japanese in the Poblacion of Rosario, Batangas in February, 1945. He was taken to Malaking Ilog River where he was killed.
9. Pvt. Meliton Panepio ----- Captured by the Japanese at barrio Namaco, Rosario, Batangas. He was a courier. While walking one night from Taysan to Rosario he was apprehended by Japanese patrol. Nothing was heard of him since then.
10. Staff-Sgt. Francisco Clayres----- Captured by the Japanese in the Poblacion of Rosario, Batangas, in October, 1944. He was taken to Maalanas where he was killed.
11. Sgt. Hermogenes Cruzada ----- Captured by the Japanese in the Poblacion of Rosario, Batangas. He was taken to Maalanas, Rosario, Batangas where he was killed. That was in October, 1944.
- >12. Lt. Melecio Sison ----- Wounded during a raid by the PQOG ²⁻⁷⁻⁴⁵ in the Poblacion of Rosario, Batangas on January 16, 1945. He received gun wound on his right leg which may render him incapacitated. ~~He is now confined in the 80th General Hospital, Quezon Institute.~~
13. Pvt. Juan Inendan ----- Captured by the Japanese on November 27, 1944, while on intelligence work in Manila. Nothing was heard of him since then.
14. Pvt. Efipanio Awat ----- Captured by the Japanese on November 27, 1944, while on intelligence work in Manila.
15. Major Julian Luna ----- Captured by the PQOG in January, 1945, ~~xxxxxxx~~ and has not shown up since then.
16. Capt. Lupe Urea ----- Captured by the PQOG in January, 1945, together with Maj. Luna, and has not returned since then.
17. Sgt. Zacarias Die ----- Captured by the PQOG in January, 1945, together with Maj. Luna, and has not returned since then.
