
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

I, being the wife of a Guerrilla leader, suffered, sacrificed and helped for the existence of the Organization until the coming of the Americans. I regret very much that until now our recognition seem to be uncertain. We had been waiting for years.

I have an aged parents-in-law who are already unable to work. They are expecting for a blessing which their only son fails to give them. As for myself, I desire to continue my studies, so that at least, I can be of help to my country as an educated citizen. With regards to our men they seem to be impatient too. It's a pity to see them all turn to lawless elements. Guerrilla widows are plenty. Often times they asked me the day the promised help will be given. Some of them died already in the extreme of poverty. Hohorable President, if you could only see our everyday life, I am sure you will pity us.

Closing, but with my fervent hope for your action of help. It is respectfully prayed that the earliest possible help be extended to us before it is too late.

Dear Mr. AN

The Sastalo ( ), purposting to be a guerrilla organization under your nominal control, is not favorably considered for recognition as an element of the Philippine Army.

A set of general requirements for guerrilla recognition, established by General MacArthur during the liberation of the Philippines, has been used as a guide in considering the record of this unit. After careful investigation and full consderation of all available substantiating records and testimony of withnesses having pertinent knowledge, recognition of this guerrilla unit is not deemed to be warranted because of reasons mentioned below:

- a. The unit was not maintained satisfactority in the field in opposition to the enemy.
- b. Activities of the unit did not contribute materially to the eventual defeat of the enemy.
  - c. A definite organization was not ostablished.
- d. Adequate records were not maintained (names, ranks, dates of enlistment or joining, dates of promotions, and necessary related information).
- c. Rank of members was considered to be too high for the actual size of the command maintained in the field.
- f. The number of officers, commissioned and non-commissioned, was excessive and not reasonably proportionate to United States Army or to prewar Philippine Army tables of organization.
- g. Performance of the units did not indicate adequate control by its leaders, because of:
  - (1) Descrition of personnel to join other units
- (2) Lawless acts committed against the civil population
  - (3) Unwarranted attacks on other guerrilla units.
- h. Sphere of operations and unit strength claimed by the unit were not commensurate with the nature of the terrain, limitation of communication facilities, and the degree of anti-resistance activities of the Japanese in the area during the period concerned.

- i. Unit did not show satisfactory continuity of activity and organization.
  - j. Frequent change of geographic location was not justified.
- k. Members of the unit did not devote their entire effort to military activities in the field to the exclusion of normal civilian occupation and family obligations.
- 1. Many members apparently lived at home, supporting their families by means of farming or other civilian pursuits, and assisted the guerrilla unit on a part time basis only.
- m. Some personnel listed as members of the unit assisted it by contributing money and supplies but did not serve in a capacity considered to justify such membership.
- n. Record of service was not substantiated by sufficient acceptable evidence.
- o. Application for recognition was received subscouent to 15 March 1946, the date announced as the deadline after which such applications would not be accepted.

It is requested that you comply with the provisions of Executive Order No. 68, by the President of the Philippines, dafed 26 September 1945, copy attached.

#### Report on the "Rosario Unit" (Attached to the Batanges Units of "Warkings Fil-Americans, III Army Corps.)

In accordance with verbel instructions from Chief of Branch, Guerrilla Affairs, G-3, AFWESPAC, Lieutenants R. I. Morton and D. M. Thompson proceeded to the headquarters of Markings Fil-American Troops, III Army Gorps, on 2 September 1946 to contact members of the "Roserio Unit", in order to determine whether or not this unit should be recommended for recognition by the United States Army. The following is a summary of the investigation and is the basis for the recommendations.

#### ALLEGED HISTORY

In June 1942, Diego An (elias Diego A. Guadez) was contacted by
Wenceslao O. Oletan (elias O'Cruz) acting Adjutant General of "Straughn's
Fil-American Irregular Troops", and Colorel Justiniano G. Estrella
(alias Alfredo David) Chief of Staff of "Straughn's Fil-American
Irregular Troops" and he, Diego An, was appointed first lieutenant
and was assigned as intelligence operator between kizal and Famila on
1 December 1942. An was promoted to Captain and assigned to organize
"Fil-American Irregular Troops" in the province of Patangas, and at
the same time assigned Inspector General, Irregular Troops in the
province of Estengas.

In the early months of the year 19/3, Diego An proceeded to Roserio, Batanges, and started the campaign of inducting personnel into his new organized unit. An contacted Jorge D. Espina, an Ex-USAFFE, 3rd Lieutenant, and offered him the task of organizing the Fil-American Irregular Troops for the prevince of Patanges; he accepted,

of the year 1943, Espine had increased the size of the unit to approximately 2000 members. Espine continued to be the commander of the organization until 28 March 1974, at which time he proceeded to Limits to confer with Representative Jose B. Laurel Jr., purposely to work for the release of prisoners held by the Japanese. Upon departing from the Valcanan Palace he was selse by the Japanese and was rever board of the eafter.

The loss of Espira gave rise to different opinions emong the semborn of the unit, and nost of them described the unit and affiliated to the "Tresident Quezon's Can Guerrillee (PQCG), "Hunters" (FOTC) Fatanges Querrillee ( Luchsing Corpany) and Flue Lagles, and some went into irective status. The remainder, which consisted of approximately five hundred seventy "ive (575) were reorganized into the Promerio Unit."

Diego in then took command of the unit, and no alteration of command was rade from then on.

Buring the Sepandes occupation the unit claims to have done such works as saletage, intelligence, and betracing the enemy, but this was done on a shall scale by persons or small grows of persons operating more or less independently, and were not organized. Their operations were epasantic and of re lasting consequence. The unit followed the "lay-low" policy, but maintained a headquarters, where a few newters would next and receive instructions for their spanntic operations. The members of the unit mided in the evacuation of the civilians from the designated was zones to the designated evacuation centers from the

period of the arrival of the liberating forces until the liberation of the different towns in the province of Estanbas.

Durier the Itheration period, some of the members of this unit joined Major Loring Day and a Colonel Marm, of the 158 Regimental Combat Team, 6th Army, in the mopping and patrolling activities in the towns of Pan Jose, Lips, Thean, and Patengas, Retengas, during the period 9 April 1945 to 15 April 1945.

Other attachments claimed by this unit was with the 5%th Evecuntion Ecopitel, in which approximately nine (9) can participated. And also with portions of the 11th airborns, of which they could remember only the 511 Adriorns Signal Convery under the content of 1st Lieutenent Edward F. Morris Jr.

after the attachment with the 158 legimental Corint Team, the sembers returned to the town of homento and helped in the evecuation of the civilians, and the personnal of the unit lay in unit for further instructions. Unit was disturded in the latter part of 15%5, upon the order of Colonal Estrella (alias Esvid), due to the inscriveress of the unit, and also in that the area in which the unit opposed had been cleared of the energy.

During the Japanese occupation the activities of the "Rosario Unit were slight. Such activities as sabotage, intelligence, propaganda and harrassing the enemy were done on a small scale by individuals or small groups of persons who were disorganized, and their works were spasmatic and of no lasting consequence. The skirmishers claimed by the unit consisted of a raid against the Japanese sentry post stationed at the entrance to Batanges, Fatanges on 13 arril 1943. This operation was conducted in a haphazardly menner; and was actually a result of the doings of about fifteen members. The next encountered was not conducted until about a year and a half later, on 3 November 1944, when Celedonio Bolanes was beading a patrolling squad in the barrio of Maalascas, Rosario, Estanges to verify a report that two Japanese soldiers were allegedly shadowing members of guerrillas. The ratrol found two Japanese soldiers and claimed to have killed them. But this too was done by only a small group of approximately six remters. The third alleged encounter was conducted on 12 March 1945, when a few of the members ambushed a Japanese truck loaded with pasoline. This encounter is also claimed by other guerrilla units operating in this region, and no proof was forthcoming to establish this unit as the one which erformed the feat,

Other activities claimed was that done by a squad led by 1st
Lieutenant Pedro Mercado, in which they cut communication lines and
burned a gasoline depot, and warehouse; but again there is no proof
to whom performed the feat, and it was accomplished by only a small
group of men participated.

It was admitted by the commanding officer of this unit, that when such activities as mentioned above were being carried out, the remainder of the unit remained at home carrying on farming or other occupation to aid in the support of their families. Thus indicating a poorly controlled unit, and membership to the unit in a part time fashion.

A definite organization was not established in that the operations were not well planned, but were spasmatic. The unit followed the "lay-low" policy in which the unit did not operate as a controlled or organized unit, for periodically few members would report to headquarters for instructions. Another indication of poorly organized unit was revealed during the investigation of the commanding officer of the unit, for he had a poor knowledge of the units activities, and constantly referred to the written history before answering the questions asked by the interviewing officers. He further completed his part of the interview with the statement that the Rosario Unit was formed to protect the civilians of Rosario from dangers of bandits, etc.

(1) Tivurcio Carandang, leader of the Combat Team or Co B, and nine (9) men employed by Capt Buchanan of the 54th Evacuation Hospital.

HISTORY OF ORGANIZATION

(FIL-AMERICAN IRREGULAR TROOPS

UNDER COL. HUGH STRAUGHN, No. 02515, U.S.A., COMDG.)

THIRD ARMY CORPS

Before the fall of Bataan and Corregidor, and immediately after the defeat of our USAFFE men stationed at the towns of Atimonen, Candelaria and Tisong, Tayabas, Col. Hugh Straughn, No. 02515, USA, organized the FIL-AMERICAN IRREGULAR TROOPS, South Control Luzon Forces, with its general headquarters and outfit at the Sierra Madre Mountains. The aims and purposes for which the organization was organized were as follows:

- 1. To assemble all USAFFEE stragglers who fought and suffered defeat in the province of Tayabas against the Japanese soldiers.
- 2. To get in contact with members of the USAFFE who were left behind and unable to report to Bataan and Corregider.
- and a seastle all arms and ammunitions in the hands of all USAFFE men and civilians, who for some reasons or another did not join the FIL-AMERICAN IPREGULAR TROOPS, to continue the work of the Philippine Army.
- 4. To build the morale of the civilians and continue resistance against the Japanese by destorying all Japanese propaganda either physically or thru public discourse.
  - 5. To apprehend Japanese spies.
- 6. To apread all U. S. Army prepaganda received by this Headquarters.
- 7. To help maintain peace and order in the areas covered by our zone of operation.

In June, 1942, I, DIEGO AN, clies Diego A. Guadez and D. Angeles was contacted by Col. Wenceslao Olitan, alies Col. O. Cruz, and Col. Justiano Estrella, Alies A. David, authorized representatives of Col. Hugh Straughn, No. 02515, Commanding the Fil-American Irregular Troops, South Central Luzen Forces, to join and spread the doctrines of his guerrilla organization. I was brought to barrio Malaya, Municipality of Pililla, Rizal, thence to the General Headquarters and outfit of Col. Hugh Straughn at the Sierra Madre Mountains. I was designated Organizer and Inspector General for the Province of Batangas. The following, marked Exhs. "I" "2" and "3" are true copies of my appointments, the originals of which are signed by Col. Hugh Straughn and are now in my possession;

In January, 1943, I went to Batangas and offered the task of organizing the Fil-American Irregular Troops to Mr. Pedro Adapon but unfortunately the offer was rejected. Then I sought the advice of Father Ramon Abaya and Mr. Antonino Luansing, two prominent and respected citizens of Resario, Batangas. They gave me valuable information regarding the situation in Rosario, Batangas, as well as their information leading to the discovery of one abled leader Jorge D. Espina. Aside from giving his moral support alone, Mr. Antonino Luansing further promised that he would give sufficient financial aid to be spent in pushing thru the organization. I offered the task of organizing to Jorge D. Espina, a native of Tinga, Batangas, Batangas, Ex-USAPFE, 3rd Lieutenant; and one of those who fought and encountered defeat at the town of Atimonan, Tayabas against the Japanese soldiers. Jorge D. Espina accepted the task and was made associate organizer of the Fil-American Irregular

Proops (Guerrilla) for the Province of Batangas. He was then commissioned Bt. Colonel and was made Division Commander by Col. Hugh Straughn.

Jorge D. Espina and I began to visit some towns in the Province of Batangas and conferred with prominent and respected eltizons of every sown on the same subject of organizing the Fil-American Integular Troops (Guerrilla) in his town, explaining to him the objectives and purposes of the organization. We have assigned the following persons to get as associate organizers in their respective towns:

Although membership was considerably big only five rifle companies were organized in Roserio, Batangas. An Engineering Company was also organized. This company had only a skeleton force and was charged with the duties of preparing maps, suitable camp sites, etc. A Battalian Surgeon was also appointed to take charge of the health condition of the members and to give assistance in emergency cases. Those inactive members were utilized by the organization as informers and homeguards.

Now and then, Japanese soldiers raided towns and remote vicinities in search of guerrilla members, and/or relative of guerrillas. In a big scale raid in which guerrillas and prominent mon were captured, the municipalities of Resarto, San Juan, Lipa, Tanauen and Batangas were used as prison camps. The Japanese Military authorities were in hot pursuit of Col. Espine and would not release even the civilian prisoners without Espine being captured. On March 28, 1944, Col. Jorge D. Espine and Majer Marciano Evangelista went to Manila to confer with Representative Jose B. Laurel, Jr., purposely to work for the release of the priseners above-mentioned. After their conference and while Col. Espina and Major Evengelista were going downstairs of the Malacanan Palace, a truck full of Japanese soldiers arrived and right then and there seized them and took them to their truck. That marked the end of the activities of Col. Espina with his difficult task still unfinished. The Loss of this able leader gave rise to different opinions among members, Some members affiliated to the PQOG (President Quezon's Own Guerrillas), some to the ROTC-HUNTERS, some to the BATANGAS GULFRILLAS (Luanging Co.), some to the BLUE EAGLE and some went into inactive service.

of Rosario, Batangas was assigned Commanding Officer of the Battalian in Rosario, Batangas. In January, 1945, Major Julian Luna was captured by the PQCG, and has not shown up since then. After his capture, Major Jose P. Rocto assumed command of the Battalian. He and his men who remained loyal and faithful to the organization were, however, addised to lay low with instruction to assemble and help the liberating forces as soon as they arrive.

The burning of the house of Donata Espina's house, the living querters of Col. Jerge D. Espina, and the houses of the members of this organization in the province of Batangas make it difficult or impossible to produce all pertinent records of the Fil-American Irregular Troops, Batangas Unit. The heavy punishment imposed to any one caught in possession of guerrilla papers forced some of the guerrilla members to burn or destory their credentials and reports and orders received thru Lt. Col. D. Angeles, Inspector General for the Province of Batangas, from and to the General Headquarters and outfit of Col. Hagh Straugha, No. 02515, U. S. A.

ACTIVITIES OF THIS UNIT PRIOR AND DURING THE PERIOD OF LIBERATION BY THE AMERICAN TROOPS.

Our organization was largely engaged in intelligence work.

Col. Jorge D. Espina, thru his transmitter operated by Messrs. Cannint and Blaus sent and received reports and messages to and from outside forces during the years when the Japanese Army were still in the Philippines. We sent intelligence reports and maps thru the Adjutant General Col. A. David to Col. Hugh Straughn.

Although this unit was engaged in intelligence work, we have also our rifle companies to fight the Japanese when we were raided.

On April 13, 1943, Col. Jorge D. Espine with several men raided the Japanese sentry post stationed at the gate going to the main town of Batangas, Batangas. During the attack, he killed four Japanese soldiers, wounded one Filipino peliceman who tried to help the Japanese soldiers, and wounded also one Japanese soldier who ran away to call for reinforcement.

We do the mapping and patrolling operations from time to time to locate Japanese installations and to report same to the General Head-Quarters of Col. Hugh Straughn.

We helped in the evacuation of the civilians from the designated war zones to the designated evacuation centers from the arrival of the liberating forces, up to the liberation of the different towns in the province of Batangas.

Some members of this unit joined Major Day and Col. Moun in the mopping and patrolling activities in the towns of San Jose, Lipa, Ibean, and Batangas, Batangas from April 9 to 15, 1945.

We helped in ambusing one Japanese track at San Roque, Rosario, Batangas on March 12, 1945, and killed one Japanese Officer and one enlisted man and destroyed and set into fire the track loaded with gasoline.

On Nevember 3, 1944, one squad headed by 2nd Lieutenant Celedonio Belaños patrolled the barrio of Maclaseas, Reserio, Batangas to verify a report that two Japanese soldiers were allegedly shadowing members of guerrillas. The patrol killed the two Japanese soldiers and seized two Japanese rifles.

We cut all enemy lines of communication and installations. In San Jose, Batangas, a squad led by 1st Lieutenant Pedro Mercado cut the telephone wires, burned the gasoline depot, destroyed the warehouse and killed two Japanese soldiers and wounded at least six more.

Joined Copt. Carreen, General Swing's Own Guard in patrolling and mopping up operations in the barries of Baybayin, Tiquiwan and Mavalor, Resario, Batangas in search of the reported Japanese Stragglers. In that operation two Japanese soldiers were killed and two rifles were taken and one Japanese flag. The fifles and flag are in the possession of Capt. Carreen.

### LIST OF CASUALTIES

From the very beginning of this organization it met with many setbacks and several casualties among the members. In March, 1943, while 2nd Lts. Ricardo Roallos, Antonio de los Trinos, Jose Jocutan and several enlisted men were on their way from barrio Cahigam, Rosario, Batangas to confer with Col. Espins in the Poblacion of Rosario, Batangas, they encountered members of the Philippine Constabulary at barrio Bagong-Pook. As they were outnumbered and less armed they were captured after a short engagement. Fortunately they were not accused of being guerrillas. Complaint for Resistance Against persons in Authority was filed against them. They were tried and convicted and are now serving sentence in Iwahig Penal Colony. Hereunder is the list of casualties of this organization and the circumstances by which they met their death:

- 1. Col. Jorge D. Espina ----- Captured by the Japanese at Malacañan Palace, Manila on or about March 28, 1944.

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
