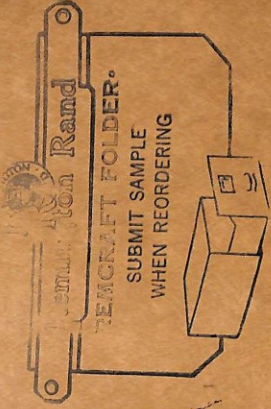





SUBJECT: History of Marking's Fil-American Field Hospital

TO : AFWESPAC

1942:- The Fil-American Guerilla was organized sometime in May, 1942 in Laguna by Colonel Hugh Starbough, U.S.A., Major Alfredo David, Adjutant, at the same time Major David was appointed Commanding Officer of the Laguna Sector. The first camp was located at the outskirts of Lumban, Laguna.

On October 5, 1942, Major Reynoso went to Lumban as commanding officer of the Fil-American Guerilla of Lumban and the neighboring towns. Enlistment was going on safely but later rumor of Japs spies going around with the people put the commanding officer on the alert and dealt severely with the spies if caught. Major Reynoso knew that by this time the guerilleros in Nagcarlan were working together to increase the enlistment thru the commanding officer of the Laguna Sector, Major Alfredo M. David.

1943:- ("oning - means ordering all persons to stay in the town proper to be searched, captured, tortured or killed) Since the beginning of 1943, "oning method was put into practice in some towns in Laguna consequently all persons in different towns who were supporters of underground movement or enlisted guerilleros or in some way connected with the underground movement were jittery.

By March, 1943, some teachers and civilians were caught, tortured then released in Nagcarlan, Laguna. "oning methods now being practised in other towns, Lumban was one of the hard hit so the commanding officer of that company transferred his headquarters in Bo. Calumpang, Nagcarlan, Laguna.

This chaotic condition in Laguna inspired Lt. Col. Chipongian sometime in June, 1943 to establish emergency dispensaries to serve the coming guerilleros from Lumban and other towns to Nagcarlan, beside the one already functioning near the town proper. Nagcarlan had been chosen the best place to hide in because the sakdalistas were now tamed and mostly converted into good supporters of underground movement so they felt safe where Japs spies were few or none at all.

Sometime in July, 1943, Reynoso's outfit from Lumban confident that he was safe in that place (Nagcarlan), more likely than not was followed by spies from Lumban and that before the end of July, 1943, a detachment of Japanese soldiers raided his camp, captured him in the house of Captain Mariano Cordova with Major Bernal. They were taken back to Lumban and executed.

On August 5, 1943, Col. Hugh Straughn was captured in Malaya, Ri<sup>2</sup>al. Later he was brought to Laguna and executed. The execution of the supreme head of the Fil-American Irregular Troops did not at all affect the grim determination of the guerilleros, on the contrary it spurred them to a more effective way of bolstering enlistment and resistance.

Lt. Col. Alfredo M. David succeeded Col. Hugh Straughn. He cautiously sought the hiding places of guerilleros in order to reorgan<sup>2</sup>e them into a solid body. Captain Eliseo de Lumban was found in the mountains of Lumban and made him the executive officer - headquarters being located in Cavinti, Laguna, but moved to Nagcarlan, Laguna sometime in December, 1943.

1944:- In the early part of January, 1944 the men under the command of Col. David held up the train in Masaya, Calauan, Laguna, killed the Japanese in the train and got 33 U.S. rifles and 7000 rounds of ammunitions. This hold up made the Japs looked for the hiding place of the guerilleros so they had to move from place to place. This time began the activities of the guerilleros and Lt. Col. Chipongian was forced to organ<sup>2</sup>e a mobile dispensary in order to follow the hiding guerilleros to any place.

The presence of Marking's Combat Unit under Col. Cabalhin made necessary the fusion of the two units, Marking's and Fil-Americans in order to carry on a more effective and coordinated harassing campaign against the Japs so the fusion was done on June 5, 1944 and became known Marking's - Fil-American their camp being located in Bo. Sibulan, Nagcarlan, Laguna.

The increasing number of sick and wounded soldiers made the establishment of a clinic and infirmary necessary under Lt. Col. Chipongian but on October 1st it became the Marking's - Fil-Americans Field Hospital. On November 2nd, the two trucks loaded with Japs were ambushed by Col. David with a detachment of medical personnel under the command of Lt. Col. Vicente Chipongian in Bo. Buboy, Nagcarlan, Laguna. The Japs were able to evade capture by recklessly speeding the trucks through the raining bullets of the guerilleros but dead Japs were many in the trucks as reported by the people who saw them in San Pablo, Laguna. Demolition of bridges were ordered. The order was carried out effectively. Bridges out of service, another ambush was planned and carried out on January, 1945 in Bo. Putol, Nagcarlan, Laguna.

This harassing campaign made the Japs hot at the heels of the guerilleros thereby forcing the guerilleros to move the camp in San Cristobal Mountain with it the Marking's - Fil-Americans Field Hospital.

Lt. Col. Alvaro Gutierrez<sup>2</sup> was appointed Surgeon General of the III Army Corps and Lt. Col. Vicente Chipongian his assistant and Chief of the Hospital.

The effective harassing campaign and the successful delivery by planes of arms and ammunitions and other supplies on our landing place up on the side of San Cristobal Mountain had so scared the Yamashita Forces that the towns of Lilio, Nagcarlan and Ri<sup>al</sup> became comparatively safe from Japs brutalities.

1945:- The ambush in Bo. Putol, Nagcarlan, Laguna staged by Lt. Col. David's outfit with Lt. Col. Vicente Chipongian at the head of the medical personell, on January, 1945 where many Japanese were killed was the most effective medicine they ever swallowed administered by our unitz and completely made them keep away from Nagcarlan, Lilio and Ri<sup>al</sup> but forced us to move where Japs menace was most felt, that was Pila, Laguna, so to Pila we moved stock and barrel - located the hospital in a big house in front of the church.

The hospital is now ready to receive patients of any kind.

The operation for liberation of Santa Cru<sup>z</sup>, Laguna started on the 6th of March, 1945 and was in full swing on the next day. On the seventh of March, the wounded soldiers and civilians pour in the hospital and by the 10th of the same month, we had in the hospital 22 wounded soldiers, 27 civilians wounded and some 20 medical cases (soldiers and wivilians). Sometime in the latter part of March, 1945 there were only left a few wounded soldiers, so by the help of the American Ambulance we moved to Santa Cru<sup>z</sup> in the provincial hospital building. On the 1st week of April, wounded civilians started to pour in from Mabitac and other lake shore towns. These casualties were due to the operation of the American forces along that region. In the mapping operation of Cavinti, Lousiana, Luchan and Mauban, the American Ambulances brought a few more wounded civilians from those towns.

On May 15, 1945 food supply of the hospital became scarce and Lt. Col. Vicente Chipongian had to dig up his pockets for money in order to carry on feeding the personels of the hospital and still weak wounded civilians and soldiers. On May 26th, Lt. Col. Vicente Chipongian finding himself hardly able to support his own family decided to send home all patients and gave money to pay their transportation. On the 28th of May all went away and the hospital was now empty. Lt. Col. Vicente Chipongian left also the hospital and met in Lilio, Laguna the commanding officer, Col. David and reported to him that he had disbanded the hospital personels. Then Col. David ordered the undersigned to attend to and treat the soldiers and families who up to that time did not receive any pay, from of charge.

1. Upon receipt of Memo from your Hqs. dated 21st Nov. '44 the undersigned sent a Memo on 24th Nov. '44, to all Division and Regimental Commanders in this Corps requiring them to utilize all available licensed physicians and registered nurses as medical officers and members of the Nursing Corps in their units. In a conference on Nov. 25, I was informed that most regiment don't have physicians and ~~no~~ registered nurses and the C. O's concerned were instructed to replace medical officers who are not physicians and assigned them to other branches of the service and members of the Nursing Corps who are not registered nurses as mere first-aiders. The Div. and Regtl. Commanders are expecting to have more physicians in their units.
2. In the same Memo from this office the undersigned ordered the early physical examination of all soldiers to determine those fit for service (distinguishing between labor services and fighting power as emphasize in par. 7 of Memo from your Hqs. of Nov. 21st.
3. Total number of sick confined in the Corps hospital are six (6); one case of tropical ulcer; and the rest are malaria. In Rizal there are four confined, cases of bullet wounds.
4. Medical supplies are constantly arriving in small quantities. There is a very small supply of quinine but no aspirin. On Nov. 25, enough cholera-dysentery-typhoid vaccine and antitetanic serum has been received from Manila and inoculation was made to every one here in the camp on Nov. 27. We are in need of more quinine and aspirin, sulfanilamide, brown mixture tablets.

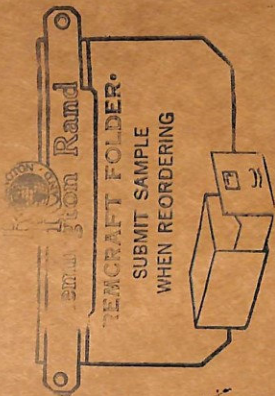
