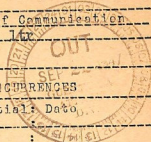

Dear Mr. Cabo Chan:

The Commanding General has directed that you be informed that the Anderson's Blue Eagle Detachment, Squadron 83, purporting to be a guerrilla organization under your nominal control, is not favorably considered for recognition as an element of the Army of the Philippines.

A set of general requirements for guerrilla recognition, established by General MacArthur during the liberation of the Philippines, has been used as a guide in considering the record of this unit. After careful investigation and full consideration of all substantiating records and testimony of witnesses having pertinent knowledge, recognition of this guerrilla unit is not deemed to be warranted because of the reasons mentioned below:

a. Record of service was not substantiated by sufficient acceptable evidence.

b. Unit did not show satisfactory continuity of activity and organization.

It is considered that the previous recognition of approximately eighty (80) officers and men formerly from Squadron 83 who were recognized with the 2nd Battalion, Squadron 87, Anderson's Guerrillas, by the Commanding General AFWESPAC for their aid during the liberation of the Philippines constitutes adequate and just acknowledgement of military service.

Your attention is invited to Presidential Executive Order No. 68, Commonwealth of the Philippines, copy of which is attached, for any necessary action in connection therewith.

REPORT ON ANDERSON'S BLUE EAGLE DETACHMENT
SQUADRON 83

1. INTRODUCTION:

a. Between the period 6 September to 9 September 1947, Captain Robert L. Morton examined the records and supporting papers of the Anderson's Blue Eagle Detachment, Squadron 83, to determine whether or not this unit should be recommended for recognition.

b. The Anderson's Blue Eagle Detachment, Squadron 83, was administratively not favorably considered for recognition for record purposes by report and memorandum for record, dated 18 June 1947. This unit was to be investigated and any members worthy of recognition were to be included in the composite roster of the overall command of the Anderson's Guerrillas.

2. HISTORY:

a. An alleged history of the Anderson's Blue Eagle Detachment, Squadron 83, was not submitted ~~upon~~^{after} their request of recognition. However, upon interviewing Col Viudez, Lt Manzano and Lt Col Anderson, the following is presumed to be a reliable synopsis of the units history:

"On 10 August 1942, Captain Bernard L. Anderson, Chief of Staff, East Central Luzon Area, USAFFE Luzon Guerrilla Army Forces, issued written authority to Manuel Cabo Chan to organize and command Squadron 83, as an integral unit of the East Central Luzon Area, USAFFE, LGAF. The organization was active in the field of intelligence, counter espionage, supply, combat, sabotage and other Pro-Fil-American underground activities during the remainder of the year 1942, but in November 1943, this Unit surrendered to the Japanese and never again became active as a unit. Some of the members of the unit later became active and were inducted into the various units of the Bulacan Military Area. Approximately eighty (80) members of the original Squadron 83 have been previously recognized in the rosters of the 2nd Battalion, Squadron 87."

3. FINDINGS:

a. The following persons were interviewed and their statements are reflected in the findings:

1. Col Pedro Viudez - CO, Bulacan Military Area
2. Lt Col Bernard Anderson -CO, Anderson's Guerrillas
3. Lt J. Manzano -ExO, Anderson's Guerrillas
4. Capt P. Cabo Chan -CO, Squadron 83

b. The unit did not show satisfactory continuity of activity organization. The unit, as an organized unit, was active only until November of 1943, at which time the unit surrendered to the Japanese. After their surrender the members of the unit returned to their normal civilian pursuits and the unit never again was activated as a unit. Later, some of the members of the unit were inducted into the Bulacan Military Area and became active; however, the 83rd Squadron was never reorganized.

c. The statements of Col Viudez, Lt Col Anderson and Lt Manzano were so coincidental that it would be useless to discuss them separately. They all stated that Col Anderson authorized Cabo Chan to organize Squadron 83, in August 1942, and that the unit was active until it surrendered in November of 1943. They further stated that some of the active members of the unit returned to the resistance movement and became members of the Bulacan Military Area, and have subsequently been recognized with the 2nd Bn, Squadron 87. They further stated that recognition of the unit or additional personnel of the unit is not warranted.

d. It is considered that the previous recognition of approximately eighty (80) officers and men of Squadron 83, who were recognized with the 2nd Bn, Squadron 87, constitutes adequate and just acknowledgment of military service.

e. Revision of the recognition dates of the recognized eighty members of the 83rd Squadron will be taken into consideration on the revision of the 2nd Battalion, Squadron 87.

f. Personnel of Squadron 83 who entered a casualty status prior to the surrender of the unit have been included in the casualty reports of the Anderson's Guerrillas, whereas, those persons who became casualties subsequent to their affiliations with the Bulacan Military Area have been included in the casualty rosters of the Bulacan Military Area.

4. POLITICAL ASPECTS:

This unit does not appear to have any political affiliation or aspirations.



5. RECOMMENDATIONS:

a. It is recommended that this unit be not favorably considered for recognition and that no further action be taken upon the units request.

b. That the revision of dates of the recognized personnel be considered on the revision of dates of the Bulacan Military Area.

c. That the casualties who entered a casualty status prior to the surrender of the unit be included in the casualty rosters of Anderson's Guerrillas, where as those who entered a casualty status subsequent to their induction into the Bulacan Military Area be included in the casualty rosters of the Bulacan Military Area. It is further recommended that both rosters be favorably considered.
