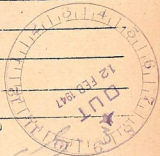

Dear Mr. Perez:

The Commanding General has directed that you be informed that the "Locarpe Unit, II Corps, P400", purporting to be a guerrilla organization under your nominal control, is not favorably considered for recognition as an element of the Philippine Army.

A set of general requirements for guerrilla recognition established by General MacArthur during the liberation of the Philippines, has been used as a guide in considering the records of this unit. After careful investigation and full consideration of all substantiating records and testimony of witnesses having pertinent knowledge, recognition of this guerrilla unit is not deemed to be warranted because of reasons mentioned below:

- a. Record of service was not substantiated as a military unit, by sufficient acceptable evidence.
- b. The unit was not maintained satisfactorily in the field in opposition to the enemy.
- c. Rank of members was considered to be too high for the actual size of the command maintained.
- d. Members of the unit did not devote their entire effort to military activities in the field to the exclusion of normal civilian occupations and family obligations.
- e. Some personnel listed as members of the unit assisted only to the extent of contributing money and supplies.

It is considered that the previous recognition of you and your son with the 1st Battalion, II Corps, P400 which was recognized by the Commanding General, AGD 49740, for its aid during the liberation of the Philippines constitutes adequate and just acknowledgment of military service.

It is requested that you comply with the provisions of Executive Order No. 59, by the President of the Philippines, dated 26 September 1945, copy attached.

Report on "LICARPE UNIT, II CORPS, PQOG"

1. 1st Lts Charles L. Homewood and Lester W. Pierce Jr. proceeded to 949 Santol Ave, Sta Mesa, Manila, on 22 January 1947 to investigate the Licarpe Unit, II Corps, PQOG.

2. ALLEGED HISTORY:

3. FINDINGS:

a. The following persons were interviewed and their statements are reflected in the findings:

P. Figueroa, Capt, MPC, PA, Member II Corps
Vicente Umali, CO, PQOG

b. Record of service was not substantiated by sufficient acceptable evidence. There were no attachment papers and the unit was used for procurement of money and supplies.

c. The unit was not maintained satisfactorily in the field in opposition to the enemy. All members interviewed stated they had no combat contact with the enemy, but lived at home.

d. Rank of members was considered to be too high for the actual size of the command maintained. All members were commissioned officers.

e. Members of the unit did not devote their entire effort to military activities to the exclusion of normal civilian occupations. They lived at home and carried on their civilian occupations.

f. The personnel listed as members of the unit assisted it by contributing money and supplies. Members were chosen from those who had either the means or the necessary contacts to obtain supplies and money.

g. The commanding officer of the unit was recognized as the commanding officer, 1st Bn, II Corps, PQOG. He said he left Manila during the month of January 1945 to join the men in the mountains and was given command of a battalion, therefore could not have commanded the unit during the liberation.

h. The unit had no outlet for intelligence except a courier serving to notify units in the hills that supplies were available.

i. No useful purpose will be served by further investigation of this unit. No members are worthy of recognition and there were no casualties.

4. POLITICAL ASPECTS: This unit does not appear to have any political affiliations or aspirations.

5. RECOMMENDATIONS: It is recommended, with the exception of those two (2) members previously recognized, the Licarpe Unit, II Corps, FQOG be not favorably considered for recognition.

SUBJECT: Admission of additional members
of the II Corps, PQOG in the
Philippine Army

TO : USAFFE TRAINING GROUP, Guerrilla Section

1. It is on record that, on the strength of the proofs submitted to the USAFFE Training Group, Guerrilla Section, the PQOG, II Corps, was officially recognized as a guerrilla unit.

2. A battallion of members of the II Corps, PQOG has already been incorporated into the Philippine Army.

3. In paragraph No. 3 of its letter of 25 June 1945, the PQOG, II Corps had clearly manifested that it was desirous and interested in having more members inducted into the armed service, hoping to receive from proper authorities instructions as to the steps to be taken for the purpose.

4. In view thereof, and as a reiteration of its earnest desire for admission of additional members of the PQOG, II Corps, into the Philippine Army, the undersigned, for and in behalf of the organization, respectfully requests that the men forming the "LECARFE", a unit of the PQOG, II Corps Area, the nature, character, composition, duties and responsibilities of which are stated hereunder, be admitted or inducted into the Philippine Army:

(a) The "LECARFE" was a committee organized by Col. Fernando Perez Canon (now Major in the Philippine Army), upon his release from Fort Santiago early in the year 1943. Colonel Perez Canon, before his arrest by the Japanese Military Police in 1942, headed an intelligent unit of the Military Intelligence Service, USAFFE, under orders from General Simeon de Jesus, now deceased. This committee was formed by two (2) other original members, namely, Lt. Col. Jose A. Leido and Lt. Col. Jose Perez Cardenas. It had connections with Major General Benedicto S. Valenzona, Commander of the PQOG, II Corps Area. It is a fact that Col. Fernando Perez Canon, Lt. Col. Jose A. Leido and Lt. Col. Jose Perez Cardenas, as the original members of this Unit and many of its latter personnel were already working actively with Commanding Officer Benedicto S. Valenzona before its formal organization and official designation.

The original and other members of the PQOG, II Corps, appearing in the LECARFE Roster are named in the attached list marked Exhibit "B" and made an integral part hereof.

The functions of the LECARFE are briefly stated as follows:

(1) To organize and stimulate civilian, non-combatant support for the II Corps Area, PQOG.

(2) To organize and supervise vigilance committees, particularly with regards to the investigation of the activities of officials and employees of the puppet government, the personal records and activities of all persons working for the Japanese, specially those in the employ of the Japanese Military Police and the investigation of all other persons or entities who have and are collaborating with the Japanese Forces.

(3) To solicit and procure financial aid for the II Corps Area, PQOG, whenever and wherever possible.

(4) To advise the Commanding Officer and his Staff in any matter in which the Commanding Officer or his Staff with his approval, might require.


(5) To perform such other duties and carry out such other missions as the Commanding Officer might assign to it from time to time.

(b) A more detailed relation of the powers and duties of this committee appears in Bulletin No. 10 dated January 2, 1945, which is marked Exhibit "A" and made an integral part of this petition.

(c) The LECARPE, as an essential unit of the PQOG, II Corps, had faithfully fulfilled its duties as outlined in said Bulletin No. 10. Thru its original members, namely, Col. Fernando Perez Canon, Lt. Col. Jose A. Leido, and Lt. Col. Jose Perez Cardenas, the committee had secured during the enemy occupation substantial sums of money for the maintenance and support of the PQOG, II Corps, as a guerrilla organization. It procured medicines, food, and other supplies for the organization. Through the above-named members and other members of the unit, the LECARPE secured valuable information regarding the movement of the Japanese armed forces and the Japanese civilians in the City of Manila and other provinces. In various other forms, it engaged in underground activities against the enemy.

5. The PQOG, II Corps, considers it a solemn duty to the original and other members of the LECARPE to secure their induction into the Philippine Army. As in the case of other guerrilla organizations, the induction of the members of the LECARPE would justly be a recognition by the Government of the United States and the Government of the Commonwealth of their loyal and disinterested service to the United States and to the Commonwealth of the Philippines. It would be an official approval on the part of the Government of the United States and the Government of the Commonwealth of the part that they took in the resistance movement against the enemy during the most dangerous period of the war in the Philippines. Finally, it would be a just reward for the sacrifices that they unhesitatingly undertook at the peril of their lives, without effective means of defense, during the period of the enemy occupation.

BULLETIN NO. 10

SUBJECT: The "LECARPE", Its Mission, Powers and Preliminary Instructions.

GENERAL PROVISIONS

1. This bulletin formally creates a committee to be known as the "LECARPE" and officially recognizes its affiliation with the II Corps Area, President Quezon's Own Guerrillas.
2. The "LECARPE" shall function as an independent entity in an advisory capacity as an auxiliary unit to the Staff of the II Corps Area, PQOG, advising it on matters of finance and organization and in other matters as may be solicited by the Commanding Officer.

MISSION

1. The "LECARPE" shall organize and stimulate civilian, non-combatant support for the II Corps Area, PQOG.
2. It shall organize and supervise vigilance committees, particularly with regards to the investigation of the activities of the officials and employees of the puppet government, the personal records and activities of all persons working for the Japanese, specially those in the employ of the Japanese Military Police and the investigation of all other persons or entities who have and are collaborating with the Japanese Forces.
3. The "LECARPE" shall solicit and procure financial aid for the II Corps Area, PQOG, whenever this is possible.
4. The "LECARPE" shall advise the Commanding Officer and his Staff in any capacity or in any matter in which the Commanding Officer or his Staff with his approval, may require such advice.
5. The "LECARPE" shall also function as a liaison office.
6. It shall perform such other duties and carry out such other missions as the Commanding Officer may, from time to time, assign to it.

POWERS

1. The Commanding Officer of the II Corps Area, PQOG, hereby grants to the three original members of the "LECARPE" unlimited powers with regards to the organization, expansion or modification of the committee; in the recruiting of the necessary staff and men and in such other matters as may be absolutely necessary to carry out its functions and duties.
2. The "LECARPE" may submit recommendations in connection with field appointments, commissions, promotions or readjustment of existing ranks.
3. As procurement officers, the members of the "LECARPE" may issue receipts, in the name of the Commanding Officer, for whatever funds, articles or supplies they may procure for the II Corps Area, "PQOG".
4. Whenever absolutely necessary, the "LECARPE" may appoint such operatives as may be required to carry out its mission with regards to the organization and supervision of vigilance committees, as defined in the second paragraph of the immediately preceding enumeration of its mission.


5. The "LECARFE" may also conduct incidental propaganda in connection with its mission to organize and stimulate civilian, non-combatant support and to solicit and procure financial aid, provided however, that such propaganda shall be supplementary to and shall not contravene the main propaganda policy and activity of the II Corps Area, "PQOG", nor shall it conflict in any way with the clearly delineated policy and principles of the organization, specially in matters of public relations.
6. Whenever so required by the Commanding Officer, the "LECARFE" may submit recommendations and act in an advisory capacity to the Court Martial Board.

PRELIMINARY INSTRUCTIONS

1. In the event that American forces land in Luzon, the members of the "LECARFE" or some of their duly authorized members must be ready to join the Commanding Officer and Staff of the II Corps Area, PQOG. In this connection, arrangements should be immediately made and completed to insure contact at any given moment with all the members of the Committee or representatives concerned.
2. All data, names, addresses, personal circumstances and other matters pertaining to the civilian non-combatant organizations, operatives for special investigation, office staff and men and such records should be submitted to the General Headquarters right away.
3. The "LECARFE" shall select and appoint an official courier of its own, to insure greater speed, efficiency and security in delivery of all communications.
4. These instructions, or any part of this Bulletin, may from time to time be modified or supplemented with such other instructions as the Commanding Officer may designate in General Orders, Bulletins, Memoranda and other communications.
5. This Bulletin and its provisions shall take effect upon receipt thereof by the "LECARFE" or any of its three original members. However, this Bulletin or any of its provisions may be given retroactive effect by the order of the Commanding Officer, upon the advice of his Staff or the recommendation of any of the members of the "LECARFE", provided however, that such retroactive effect shall not in any way be contrary to the military or civil law of the lawful government of the Philippines or contrary to the rules, principles and fundamental policies of the II Corps Area, President Quezon's Own Guerrillas.

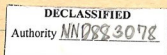
