Dear Mr. Parungao:

The Commanding General has directed that you be informed that the Independent Guerrilla Outfit, purporting to be a guerrilla organization under your nominal control, is not favorably considered for recognition as an element of the Philippine Army.

A set of general requirements for guerrilla recognition, established by General MacArthur during the liberation of the Philippines, has been used as a guide in considering the record of this unit. After careful investigation and full consideration of all substantiating records and testimony of witnesses having pertinent knowledge, recognition of this guerrilla unit is not deemed to be warranted because of reasons mentioned below:

- a. Record of service was not substantiated by sufficient acceptable evidence.
- b. The unit was not maintained satisfactorily in the field in opposition to the enemy.
- c. Activities of the unit did not contribute materially to the eventual defeat of the enemy.
- d. A definite organization was not established.
- e. Adequate records were not maintained (names, ranks, dates of enlistment or joining, dates of promotions, and necessary related information).
- f. ~~Rank~~ ^{AG} of members was considered to be too high for the actual size of the command maintained in the field.
- g. ^{AG} ~~The~~ number of officers, commissioned and non-commissioned, was excessive and not reasonably proportionate to the United States Army or to pre-war Philippine Army Tables of Organization.

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h. Performance of the unit did not indicate adequate control by its leaders, because personnel were members of other guerrilla units.

i. Unit did not show satisfactory continuity of activity and organization.

j. Members of the unit did not devote their entire effort to military activities in the field to the exclusion of normal civilian occupation and family obligations.

k. Many members apparently lived at home, supporting their families by means of farming or other civilian pursuits, and assisted the guerrilla unit on a part time basis only.

It is considered that the previous recognition of approximately two (2) officers of the active combat unit from another company of ECLGA which were recognized by the Commanding General Sixth Army for their aid during the liberation of the Philippines constitutes adequate and just acknowledgment of military service.

This decision on the proposed unit roster does not preclude submission for casualty recognition by those individuals who are qualified and feel justified in entering such claims. Upon request by interested individuals, appropriate forms will be forwarded.

Your attention is invited to Presidential Executive Order No. 68, Commonwealth of the Philippines, copy of which is attached, for any necessary action in connection therewith.

Report on "INDEPENDENT GUERRILLA OUTFIT"
Cabiao, Nueva Ecija

1. 1st Lts Kenneth H. Neubauer and Eliseo Sta Romana, proceeded to Cabiao, Nueva Ecija, on the 18 February 1947, to investigate the Independent Guerrilla Outfit under the command of Capt Felipe Parungao.

2. ALLEGED HISTORY: The "Independent Guerrilla Outfit" was organized in January 1943 by Felipe Parungao. At this time Cabiao was an un-organized town. Capt Parungao gathered together his friends to form this unit. It consisted of 130 men at the time of organization and maintained that strength throughout its existence. Its main objectives as a guerrilla unit were intelligence, propaganda and sabotage. The only action claimed as sabotage was demolition of a bridge on the outskirts of Cabiao. Intelligence work consisted of ascertaining which Japanese policies were to be implemented in the community. Propaganda activities consisted of attempts to bolster the faith of the townspeople in the future of the Philippine Republic, and the eventual return of the American Forces. This organization also tried to maintain law and order in its community.

3. FINDINGS:

a. The following persons were interviewed and their statements are reflected in the findings:

b. Record of service was not substantiated by sufficient acceptable evidence. Felipe Parungao was recognized as a 1st Lt. with the General Service Troops (GST), East Central Luzon Guerrilla Area (ECLGA). No supporting evidence was presented to substantiate unit claims of having been engaged in intelligence, sabotage, or propaganda activities. Capt Parungao was questioned on how he could have been active with the General Service Troops (GST), ECLGA, and simultaneously be able to lead the Independent Guerrilla Outfit. He stated that, from time to time, he would return to Cabiao to give his unit information obtained from the GST, ECLGA. When questioned on why so many men held high ratings in such a small organization, Capt Parungao said that he knew

✓ these men, and that he had given them the ratings. The enlisted personnel of the higher grades had no more specific duties than those of the lower grade. Lack of arms indicates that the unit offered little resistance to the Japanese forces. It is clearly indicated that the organization was not maintained as a unit nor did it offer resistance during the occupation.

c. The unit was not maintained satisfactorily in the field in opposition to the enemy. Many members lived at home and pursued civilian occupations. Some officers were members of guerrilla units other than the Independent Guerrilla Outfit, therefore knew little of its alleged activities.

d. Definite organization was not established by this unit. Adequate records were not kept. The unit had no records of dates of joining or enlistments, dates of promotions, ranks, or any records which would establish it as an organized guerrilla outfit. Ranks of members were excessive for the size of the command, and are not proportionate to U. S. Army or pre-war Philippine Army Table of Organization. Members of the unit did not know the duties of their grades or ranks.

e. Performance of the unit did not indicate adequate control by its commanding officer because officers and men on the roster were members of other guerrilla organizations. Captain Parungao could not effectively control his unit because of his extended periods of absence from it.

f. The unit did not show satisfactory continuity of activity and organization because neither the commanding officer nor his subordinates can show evidence of any accomplishment during the occupation. Members of the unit had no idea of what their duties were, or to whom to report with information.

✓ g. Chief of Police Marcelo Crespo stated that Captain Parungao was a member of another guerrilla organization, and that he had not heard of the Independent Guerrilla Outfit. The Mayor of Cabaio, Pablo Aligado stated that he had not heard of Capt Parungao or of his unit during the occupation.

h. No useful purpose will be accomplished by further investigation of this unit. There are no members worthy of recognition and there were no casualties sustained by this unit.

4. POLITICAL ASPECTS: This unit does not appear to have any political affiliations or aspirations.

5. RECOMMENDATIONS: It is recommended that the Independent Guerrilla Outfit consisting of 115 men be not favorably considered for recognition.
