This will acknowledge receipt of your letter, dated 15 May 1947, requesting separate consideration of the "Malvar Guerrilla Forces," an element of President Quezon's Own Guerrillas.

As you were informed in a letter, this headquarters, dated 28 April 1947, a complete study was made of all elements of President Quezon's Own Guerrillas (PQOG). Recognition was extended only to personnel of the PQOG General Headquarters and to the 2nd Infantry Regiment, PQOG, a composite unit from the overall command. It is felt that this recognition constitutes just and adequate acknowledgement of military service performed by all PQOG units.

Your request for separate consideration of the Malvar Guerrilla Forces, is considered as a new application for recognition. A special press release from Public Relations Office, AFWESPAC, dated 1 February 1946, stated that no applications for recognition of guerrilla units would be accepted by this headquarters after 15 March 1946. As your request for separate consideration of your unit was made in your letter of 15 May 1947, it does not comply with the above closing date and therefore cannot be accepted.

With reference to your request for appropriate forms for casualty recognition, you are informed that such forms are sent only to each individual who is qualified and feels justified in entering a casualty claim and who individually sends specific request to this office in his own behalf.



It was really formed and created by the undersigned as a unit, independent and distinct from any other, and in fact, it existed until demobilized, in such a category. Its attachment with the PQOG was just a matter of form and expediency, but as a matter of fact, it never had any dealings with any other guerrilla unit, except in so far as it had to curb or stop any untoward acts of lawlessness and banditry within its territory of operation in the Municipality of Malvar, of some units which sought cover in the guise of guerrillas. I have done my best to present evidences of our guerrilla activities, as well as the facts of our military operations, and now, I am only seeking justice in the light of circumstances which I squarely presented.

As intimated in yours of the April 28, 1947, it is further requested that appropriate forms for casualty recognition be also furnished.

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

JOINT AFFIDAVIT

We, the undersigned, Filipinos, of legal ages, and residents of the Municipality of Malvar, Province of Batangas, after being duly sworn in accordance with law, depose and say:

That of our own knowledge, we know the existence of the Guerrilla Forces in our Municipality under the overall command of Atty. Wenceslao L. Cornejo;

That to the best of our knowledge, information, and belief, it was initiated with a handful of men a few months after the Japanese Forces landed in our place, on or about December, 1942;

That gradually, it grew into a big organization until members of our family were soldiers thereof;

That from the lips of our own male household members and from casual conversation with the commanding officer, it was primarily organized to combat and counteract the Japanese deprivations, as well as to eradicate from our midst and to prevent the infiltration of bad and lawless elements who posed themselves as Guerrillas and pry into our weakness;

That said organization really prevented the inflow of bad elements into our town;

That the Commanding Officer, thru his special couriers, has, in most instances, been instrumental in saving plenty of lives by wanton arrests and the protection of property from Japanese deprivation and confiscation by being always ahead of them and advising the people of the impending peril;

That the early part of the occupation, we know that the said organization took care and hid from the Japanese Forces in our town some American Evacuees who were found by some of the men thereof on the outskirts of the town, almost dying from hunger and sickness;

That the commanding officer fed his men who are in active duty either by himself or with contributions solicited from the town people.

That he was the one responsible for the mass evacuation of the town people during the first bombings made by the American Forces; being always in the midst of his own people;

That those of us who are living today, and the little property that we were able to save, we owe them all to Atty. Cornejo and his gallant men who defied the Japanese Soldiers and fought against them, even with the meager supply of arms and ammunitions;

That we have seen in most occasions Japanese Pistols and Rifles which were confiscated from them either by stealth, force, or after a fight, and which were proudly displayed to us and the lot among us, and built up greatly our morale;

That during the last days of the occupation of our town, they did and cause havoc and chaos in the midst of the Japanese Garrison by blowing up their ammunition dumps in our airfield, burning their

bodegas, cutting supply lines and communications;

That they too were the ones responsible for the mass evacuation of the whole town people when the Japanese Forces began their dastardly and inhuman slaughter and massacre of non-combatant civilians and the burning of their homes in the neighboring towns of ours, from the ravines and forests of our town across to the west in the mountain fastness of Pulo Islands, guarding our retreat and the lot of us until the whole town was safely conveyed across; thanks to the commanding officer and his men, the massacring forces did not catch us;

That these acts may have been the cause of the burning of our homes and the little property that were left behind, but still we are grateful to that organization because we were tided and brought over to this better times;

That some of sons and husbands, members of this guerrilla force were killed or executed either in the line of a fight against the Japanese or caught wounded by them;

That we and the rest of those who have not signed this affidavit would not be alive today, if it were not for this organization which took care of us and covered our retreat at the foot of the Tagaytay Ridge when a menegada of some four hundred (400) Japanese soldiers swept upon us from the fastness of the mountains and where they fought a gallant battle until everybody was safe on top of the ridge but which cost the lives of some of his men.

The Commanding General has directed that you be informed that the "Malver Guerrilla Forces, P.C.O.G.", purporting to be a guerrilla organization under your nominal control, is not favorably considered for recognition as an element of the Philippine Army.

A set of general requirements for guerrilla recognition, established by General MacArthur during the liberation of the Philippines, has been used as a guide in considering the record of this unit. After careful investigation and full consideration of all substantiating records and testimony of witnesses having pertinent knowledge, recognition of this guerrilla unit is not deemed to be warranted because of reasons mentioned below:

- a. The unit was not maintained satisfactorily in the field in opposition to the enemy.
- b. Activities of the unit did not contribute materially to the eventual defeat of the enemy.
- c. Adequate records were not maintained (names, ranks, dates of enlistment or joining, dates of promotions, and necessary related information).
- d. Unit did not show satisfactory continuity of activity and organization.
- e. Members of the unit did not devote their entire effort to military activities in the field to the exclusion of normal civilian occupation and family obligations.
- f. Many members apparently lived at home, supporting their families by means of farming or other civilian pursuits, and assisted the guerrilla unit on a part time basis only.
- g. Record of service was not substantiated by sufficient acceptable evidence.

Report on "Malvar Guerrilla Forces, PQOG"

15 January 1947

1. Lt. Grant S. Wilcox and M/Sgt Sebastian G. Song-song proceeded to Malvar, Batangas, on 5 September 1946, to investigate the Malvar Guerrilla Forces, PQOG.

2. ALLEGED HISTORY: (See attached unit file)

3. FINDINGS:

a. The following persons were interviewed and their statements are reflected in the findings;

b. Record of service was not substantiated by sufficient acceptable evidence. This organization, under the command of Lt. Col. (Gr1a rank) Wenceslao L. Cornejo, remained absolutely passive during the occupation. There is no supporting evidence presented to substantiate claims to have actively engaged in any form of guerrilla activity. The unit CO said that no rosters were ever made, no induction or promotion papers issued, and no service records ever kept. This unit never had any supply or financial problems since all the members lived at home and looked after their own subsistence.

c. The unit was not maintained satisfactorily in the field in opposition to the enemy. The unit never engaged in action against the Japanese. The reason given for this was "Once you harmed a Jap at that time, the whole town would be burned". The only activity of the unit during the liberation was to evacuate the town from Malvar to Tagaytay Ridge with the rest of the civilians of the town. The unit had no attachment with the U.S. Army units during the liberation. Col. Quintin Gellison, overall guerrilla coordinator with the 11th AB Division, stated the 11th AB Div. operated in the Malvar area yet never heard of this unit.

d. A definite organization was not established, members, when interviewed by the contact team had to refer to a copy of the roster turned in with request for recognition when questioned as to their ranks or position in the unit.

e. Performance of the unit did not indicate adequate control by its commanding officer. This unit in no manner resembled a military organization.

f. The unit did not show satisfactory continuity of activity and organization. If this unit ever existed, it was only as a homeguard unit in the strictest sense of the term.

g. The unit claims that the taking care of four American fliers as one of its activities. The date the Americans were taken in is about six months prior to the date which the unit claims to have organized and started activities.

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Upon questioning the unit as to the aid given the four American fliers, it was admitted that after caring for the fliers for about six months, the unit persuaded the Americans to give themselves up to the Japanese. There was too much danger of the Japanese discovering the Americans hiding in Malvar so the Leaders of this unit decided that they could not hide the Americans any longer and urged them to give themselves to the Japs. This they did after the leaders of the unit arranged for them to do so.

h. Despite the claims in the alleged history that the unit has letters and testimony of their accomplishments and sacrifices, the unit could not produce a single piece of evidence. In the alleged history the unit also claims to have mined the streets and to have blown up Japanese trucks, waylaid Japanese soldiers and to have caused havoc and chaos with the Japanese Army. However, the officers and enlisted men of the unit did not make any such claims during the interview when questioned about such activities.

i. This unit is not a PQCG unit. There are some PQCG men in Malvar, but they are members of the Red Lion Division, PQCG, of which this unit is not a part. Lt Col Phil C. Avancena, CO of the Red Lion Division, asserted that the unit is wholly fraud. Col Vicente S. Umali, CO of the PQCG Command, stated that PQCG had some men in Malvar under the Red Lion Division and that the Malvar Guerrilla Forces was not a PQCG unit. The unit leaders explained that they used PQCG as part of the Unit's name because they had planned to join the PQCG Command in 1943, but because the unit did not get arms and money from the PQCG, they did not join up. However, they continued to use PQCG as part of the unit's name.

j. No useful purpose will be served by further investigation of this unit. All worthy members have been recognized and a separate casualty roster has been submitted.

4. POLITICAL ASPECTS:

This unit does not appear to have any political affiliations, or aspirations.

5. RECOMMENDATIONS:

It is recommended that the Malvar Guerrilla Forces PQCG, be not favorably considered for recognition.


Brief History of Organization and Activities:

This organization of the guerilla forces in the town of Malvar, Province of Batangas came into being on December 6, 1942, as an initial move of the underground resistance against the Japanese Forces. At first, I gathered trusted and confidential men around me and swore them to strict secrecy. We then started clandestine meetings in remote barrios and inducted men to this perilous and dangerous game and enterprise. Once, for some months, we took care and nursed to health and strength some American Pilots, right under the very noses of the Japanese soldiers in our town, whom we found in the out-laying skirts of our town, almost dying of hunger and illness. Today, we have letters, testimonials of what we have^{done} /-- of the sacrifices we have made, only to give life and hope to these momentary unfortunates. When the news of liberation came to us, we helped and guided the civilian population of the town to remote and yet safe evacuation places. Then, when the whole town was cleared of the people, we started waylaying Japanese soldiers-- burned their warehouses and stores of ammunitions. We mined the streets and blew up Japanese Army Trucks, loaded sometimes with

soldiers, and at other times, with ammunitions and food, or stolen cows and carabaos. We were then very short of arms and ammunitions even at the inception of this organization. Very few of my men were armed, but with the little that we have and the strong faith and belief of the aid to come, we did our best during the last days of the murderous occupation of the Japanese Army, to cause havoc and chaos among them.

This may be a self-styled organization, but we did were all done for a common cause -- a cause for which other brother organizations have been created-- a spirit for which eighteen million souls have felt.

And now, we seek what others have sought and found-- a dressing of our hardships and tribulations, that our strong faith and belief since and now in an unequalled democratic justice of America and the American people shall stand and long endure, although, dressing or no dressing, we shall not falter and waver in that ever strong belief in the great principles of democracy which America has always stood for and for which other liberty-loving people of this universe have fought and died for.

Major Vidal Esleigue, inducted on Dec. 6, 1942 and was killed in the Barrio of San Andres, Malvar, Batangas in an encounter with Japanese soldiers, on Sept. 28, 1944.

Capt. Ulpiano Resma, inducted on Dec. 6, 1942 and was killed on April 18, 1944, during espionage work.

Capt. Victorio Capule, inducted on January 17, 1945, and was killed in the Barrio of Sampalocan, Talisay, Batangas, in an encounter with Japanese soldiers, while trying to cover some thirty civilians in retreat, March 8, 1945.

Cpl. Catalino Abrenica, inducted on January 17, 1945, and was killed on March 8, 1945, in an encounter with Japanese soldiers in the Barrio of Sampalocan, Talisay, Batangas, while trying to cover the retreat of some thirty civilians, in the company of Capt. Victorio Capule.

Cpl. Modesto Unigo, inducted on January 17, 1945, and was killed on March 18, 1945, in the Malvar Landing Field doing espionage work.

Cpl. Inocencio Lat, inducted on January 17, 1945, and was killed together with Cpl. Modesto Unigo as of date aforementioned and on causes stated.

Pfc. Valentin Trinidad, inducted on January 17, 1945, and was killed on March 7, 1945, on the Eastern part of the town of Malvar, Province of Batangas, while on an espionage mission.

These men have died for a worthy cause -- a cause for which thousands of other men have died for. They have left a trail of blazing valor and glory, and have left too, beneficiaries and heirs who are in wanton need. May have they not died in vain!!!

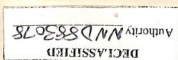
