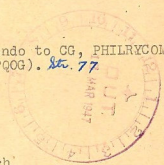

Escondo, Commanding Officer of the Unit at Sector #3 of the P.Q.O.G. at the barrio of Bucal, Tiaong, Tayabas when I first submitted our additional roster pursuant to the General Order regarding the recognition of guerillas, I herewith submit the attached roster for personal recognition.

This unit was organized last April 3, 1943 for intelligent work of patrolling and detecting the movement of the enemy troops coming from the neighboring towns of Lipa, Batangas, Alaminos, Laguna and the City of San Pablo. They have help the civilian in evacuating that place to the evacuation center at Rosario, Batangas, when the enemy troop retreated to the mountain where they are patrolling.

Attached hereto is the affidavit of the Commanding Officer of this Unit stating the activities of the Organization up to the liberation of that place.

In view of their hard labor and sacrifices and their undoubted patriotism to our common cause during the enemy occupation, the undersigned recommend for the immediate approval of recognition of this Unit.

I, Francisco A. Escondo, of legal age, Filipino citizen married and residing in the Municipality of Tiaong, Tayabas and that in accordance to law depose and say:

That, on April 3, 1943 I joined the President Quezon Own Guerilla under the leadership of Col. Vicente Umali, with the first assignment as Drill Master and Instructor.

That, later on I was put in command of the Mountain Patrol Unit at the barrio of Bucal, Tiaong, Tayabas doing intillegent work, patrolling and detecting the movement of the Japanese Troops and Macapili coming from Alaminos, Laguna, Lipa, Batangas, City of San Pablo and from the poblacion of Tiaong to barrio Bucal, Sector No. 3 and to the General Head-quarter of the P.Q.O.G.

That, we have aided the main combat unit of the P.Q.O.G. in supplying them with food and other necissities especially those trainees at Leiya. We have also furnished the General Headquarter with detail information of the enemy developments.

That, on or before April 5, 1945 when the Japanese Troops began their general retreat to the mountain, the Unit under my command assembled all the inhabitants in that vicinities and guided them under heavy guard and protection of my men to the evacuation center at the barrios of Castillo, Tangub, Pansol, Bawe of the town of Rosario, Batangas. We have encountered many Japanese snifers on our ways in which we lost two men and one missing.

That, on or before April 15, 1945 we first come in contact with the 11th Airborne and have help in clearing the way going to Tiaong, Tayabas.

That, we failed to secure any supporting papers from the United States Army during our contact with them.
