Sir:-

We have the honor to request information about the present status of the "Petition of the members of the Kalinga Guerrilla Forces", submitted to that honorable office for consideration on 25 May 1947, and acknowledged receipt by the Assistant Adjutant General on 22 July 1947, and our 1st Endorsement 8 Sept. 1947, since and up to this time, we regret to inform that we have never been advised about our humble request.

In order to have a better knowledge of the case, we respectfully quote hereunder the following data as follows:

1. NAME OF ORGANIZATION- "Kalinga Guerrilla Forces", (a part of the 12th Infantry, P.A.)
2. NAME OF ORGANIZER- Major Ali Al-Raschid, (later promoted to the rank of Lt. Colonel by Colonel Martin Moses.
3. AUTHORITY AND APPROVAL-By Lt. Col. Martin Moses, USA, Commanding Officer of all Guerrilla Forces of Northern Luzon, and officially attested by his G-3 Officer, Lt. Col. Arthur E. Noble, on January 4, 1943; that Lt. Col. Martin Moses, USA, was in radio flash communication with GHC in Australia, on or about January 15, 1943.
4. TRANSFERRED AND ABSORBED- The Re-organization of the 11th Inf., USAFIP NL, under Lt. Col. D. Blackburn, and the members of were all transferred to the 3rd Battalion, 11th Inf., USAFIP NL, on November 1, 1944, under Major Joaquin Duzman, our Battalion Commanding Officer.
5. RECOGNITION- The 11th Inf., USAFIP NL., 9 January 1945 as amended as of 1 October 1943.
6. SETTING BACK OF RECOGNITION-That 11th Inf., USAFIP NL., is unfair for the former members of the "Kalinga Guerrilla Forces",
7. REQUEST OF SETTING BACK OF RECOGNITION-The Recognition date of the "Kalinga Guerrilla Forces", should be set back to 1st October 1942, the time of its Organization, to give fair and justice to the deserving members.
8. REQUEST RECOGNITION AS AUE-The members of the Kalinga Guerrilla Forces, should be recognized as Army of the United States as openly promised in public and also written memorandum by Lt. Col. Martin Moses, as a legal representative of the United States Army, on February 14, 1943.
9. APPROXIMATE NUMBER- The Kalinga Guerrilla Forces, composed of deserving Igrrot Officers and Enlisted men, under the Command of the three Colonels- Ali Al-Raschid, Martin Moses and Arthur E. Noble, who remain faithful and loyal to our beloved America. The Kalinga Guerrilla Forces was divided into six Units with approximate strength of 60 men each.

In the name of the "Kalinga Guerrilla Forces, we appeal to your favorable consideration of the matter, as the men are blanking us too much as we are only the Officers available as many of the Officers were either killed by the enemy or missing in action.

Lastly, we remain with best wishes and better service in the days to come.

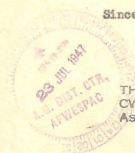

His Excellency:-

We, the remnant Officers, Non-Commissioned Officers and Enlisted men of the "Kalinga Guerrilla Forces of Northern Luzon, USAFIP, have the honor to request and appeal for the recognition of the said Outfit as Army of the United States, for the following reasons:-

1. That the Kalinga Guerrilla Forces of Northern Luzon, USAFIP, composed of six Units with total strength of 60 men each, patiently, honestly, faithfully, bravely fed and cared Lt.Col. Martin Moses, Lt.Col. Arthur K. Noble and nine others.
2. That the Kalinga Guerrilla Forces, was organized as per approval of Lt.Col. Martin Moses and his G-3 man Lt.Col. Arthur K. Noble, in the early part of January, 1943 in the barrio of Asciga, Pinukpuk, Kalinga, Mt. Province, composed of Kalingas, or Igorots, and formed the Intelligence Net Works in compliance with orders received from General MacArthur by Lt.Col. Martin Moses, last January 23, 1943.
3. That the members of the Outfit, their families and the loyal civilians were badly maltreated, hang, and all their belongings were taken by the Japanese and EGS during the hot mopping operations against the Guerrillas during the months of March to May, 1943, in Pinukpuk, Kalinga, Mt. Province, and dragged most of them in the Concentration Camps at Manila and Bongabong, Nueva Ecija.
4. That many of us are living under miserable conditions for lack of employment, many are sickly for lack of financial means for hospitalization. This is because we are waiting day and night our back pay as per advices from higher authorities both civil and the Army, yet none at all forthcoming.
5. That the former members of the "Kalinga Guerrilla Forces", distinguished themselves in many encounters with the enemy in Kalinga, Mayaoyao and in the Cagayan Valley during the Liberation, as the 3rd Battalion of the 11th Inf. USAFIP NL., composed most of them, under Major Joaquin Danuan, now AUS. Many died in during the encounters with the enemy, which until now not yet been compensated the widows, children and their dependents.
6. That many of them are still in the 2nd Infantry, P.A., which shows that the handful of men of Lt.Col. Ali Al Raschid, Lt.Col. Martin Moses and Lt.Col. Arthur K. Noble, during the darkest of history, were honest, faithful and loyal to duty, as the Army authorities did not like them to be discharged from the service.
7. In the name of the "Kalinga Guerrilla Forces of Northern Luzon, USAFIP, we have selected Lt. I. Hortelano and Sgt. B. Bitanga to represent us and to look into the matter for the early action for recognition as many have been recognized "Individually", as AUS, and why not all of us.

8. Lastly, we respectfully request your early anticipation of our cause, we remain.
