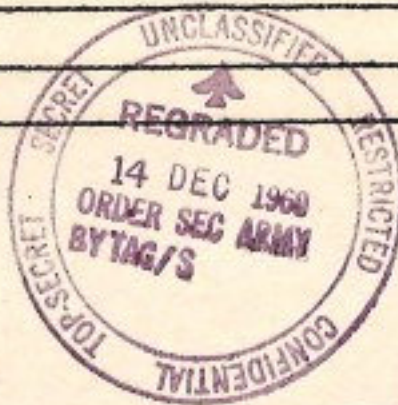

Col G. F. Lillard:

1. The Hq. & Hq Det., the Hq Bn., Service Co., Med & Supply Unit, Luzon Guerrilla Forces, (LGF), consisting of 742 men, have not been favorably considered. 217 members have previously been recognized.

2. This unit does not fulfill the requirements of the five basic points for recognition. See attached Team Leader's Report.

3. No useful purpose will be accomplished by further investigation of this unit.

4. All worthy members have been recognized and a separate casualty roster has been submitted.

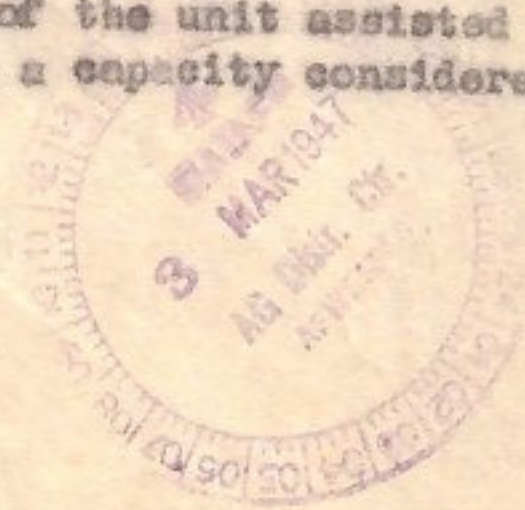
Dear Mr. Villacorte:

The Commanding General has directed that you be informed that the Service Co., Medical & Supply unit, and Intelligence Unit, Luzon Guerrilla Forces (LGF), purporting to be a guerrilla organization under your nominal control, is not favorably considered for recognition as an element of the Philippine Army.

A set of general requirements for guerrilla recognition, established by General MacArthur during the liberation of the Philippines, has been used as a guide in considering the record of this unit. After careful investigation and full consideration of all substantiating records and testimony of witnesses having pertinent knowledge, recognition of this guerrilla unit is not deemed to be warranted because of reasons mentioned below:

- a. Record of service was not substantiated by sufficient acceptable evidence.
- b. The unit was not maintained satisfactorily in the field in opposition to the enemy.
- c. Activities of the unit did not contribute materially to the eventual defeat of the enemy.
- d. A definite organization was not established.
- e. Adequate records were not maintained (names, ranks, dates of enlistment or joining, dates of promotions, and necessary related information.
- f. Unit did not show satisfactory continuity of activity and organization.
- g. Some personnel listed as members of the unit assisted it by contributing supplies but did not serve in a capacity considered to justify such membership.

Report on "Hq. & Hq. Det. and Service Co., Medical & Supply Unit, and Intelligence Unit, Luzon Guerrilla Forces, (LGF)"

1. Captain John O. Keider and Second Lieutenant James R. Benton proceeded to Natividad, Guagua, Pampanga, on 3 January 1947, to investigate the Hq. & Hq. Det. and Service Co., Medical & Supply Unit, and Intelligence Unit, Luzon Guerrilla Forces, (LGF).

2. ALLEGED HISTORY: (See attached unit file).

3. FINDINGS:

b. Record of service was not substantiated by sufficient acceptable evidence. In the attached file of the Service Company, Medical & Supply Unit, and Intelligence Unit, LGF, there are two letters submitted by Captain Rafael Villacorte as supporting evidence. They are as follows: (1) letter, subject: Certification of Services Rendered,

by William J. Gardner, 1st Lt., GMP, dated 14 Nov 1945; (2) letter from Richard C. Kadel, Lt. Col., Ordnance, to Commanding General, AFWESPAC, dated 1 Jan 1946, concerning the Luzon Guerrilla Forces. These letters, nevertheless, have reference to the respective units of Captain Salonga and Captain Villacorte; however, from their units 217 men have already been recognized. No additional supporting evidence was presented which would justify the recognition of more members. There is no supporting evidence presented to substantiate the unit's claims of having actively engaged in intelligence work, propaganda, or sabotage.

e. The unit was not maintained satisfactorily in the field in opposition to the enemy because the majority of the members remained in their respective barrioes. It is true that the unit provided security and habitation for numerous Americans but they were never active in the field as guerrillas.

d. A definite organization was not established by this unit. On 29 January 1945, 217 members, Hq. & Hq. Det., LGF, were recognized by the 6th Army as having participated with the American Forces during the Liberation Period. Later, on 24 May 1945, Major Roy G. Tuggle, Overall Commander, LGF, submitted additional rosters of the Hq. & Hq. Det., LGF, consisting of 742 members, for recognition. On these rosters Captain Rafael Villacorte was listed as Company Commander of Company C, Hq. Bn., LGF. However, on 6 December 1945, Captain Villacorte submitted a separate request for recognition with separate rosters, listing himself as the Commanding Officer of the Service Company, Medical & Supply Unit, and the Intelligence Unit, LGF, USFIP. Both of these files are attached to this report. In an interview with Captain Villacorte when asked why he had subsequently submitted a separate request for recognition with separate rosters, he stated that he had at that time possessed the opinion that the rosters turned in by Major Tuggle, 24 May 1945, would not be favorably considered for recognition. He would not state a basis for his opinion. Major Tuggle, when asked why Captain Villacorte had submitted this separate request for recognition, stated that it was his opinion that Captain Villacorte had been under some undue influence and had been forced to submit this separate request for recognition. However, it is the opinion of the investigating team that Captain Villacorte presented this request for recognition and the separate rosters of his own free will, relying on his opinion that the rosters presented by Major Tuggle, 24 May 1945, would not be favorably considered for recognition.

e. Performance of the unit did not indicate adequate control by its officers. The entire unit was never completely active in the field. Interviews with members of the unit revealed that many of the enlisted men had no knowledge of their unit and did not know their immediate superior officers and non-commissioned officers.

f. Unit did not show satisfactory continuity of activity and organization because the commanding officer, as well as his subordinates, cannot show any outstanding achievement accomplished during the occupation

nor show any supporting evidence other than having provided security and habitation for some American officers and men. (See attached unit file.) Lt. Col. B. L. Anderson, Overall Commander, Anderson's Guerrillas, who operated in provinces adjoining Pampanga, stated that he had heard that there were some Americans staying in this vicinity, but that he had not heard of any of their claimed activities until after the occupation when they started enumerating all that they had done during the occupation.

g. In an interview with Lt. Col. Edwin C. Ramsey, Overall Commander, BOLBA, he stated that he had stayed with Major Tuggle and his men for several months in 1942 before he came down to Manila. He says that the subject unit only consisted of approximately 200 members. 217 members of the unit have already been recognized.

h. The unit has no attachment papers to any American unit nor do they have any written authority from Colonel Merrill for organization. However, in the attached unit file there are the following inclosures:

Incl. 1 - Orders pertaining to 14 officers and 91 EM, Hq. & Hq. Det., LGF, from Hq. Sixth Army, dtd 14 June 1945.

Incl. 2 - Orders pertaining to Maj. Roy C. Tuggle, (LGF), from Hq. Sixth Army, dtd 14 Sept. 1945.

Incl. 3 - Orders pertaining to 1 Officer and 21 EM, Hq. & Hq. Det., LGF, from Hq. Sixth Army, dtd 14 June 1945.

It is true that the above mentioned orders pertain to members of the subject unit and do signify that part of the unit was attached to the Sixth Army. It must be noted, however, that the officers and men herein concerned have already been recognized by the Sixth Army as of 29 January 1945. Therefore, the attached orders have no bearing on the remainder of the unit which is seeking recognition.

1. No useful purpose will be accomplished by further investigation of this unit. All worthy members have been recognized and a separate casualty roster has been submitted.

4. POLITICAL ASPIRES: This unit does not appear to have any political affiliations or aspirations.

5. RECOMMENDATIONS: It is recommended that Hq. & Hq. Det., Hq. Bn., Service Company, Medical & Supply Unit, and Intelligence Unit, Luzon Guerrilla Forces, (LGF), be not favorably considered for recognition.

1. Transmitting herewith rosters of the Service Co., Medical & Supply Unit and Intelligence Unit, Luzon Guerrilla Forces, USPIF, for consideration.

2. This unit was organized in August 1942 by Capt. Richard Kadel, then Adjutant to Col. Gyles Merrill. A certificate by Lt. William Gardner and other supporting papers attached here- to testify to the invaluable services rendered by this unit to American guerrilla leaders in particular, and to the underground resistance in general.

3. This unit, although not directly attached to U. S. Army units in combat operations had also been responsible in killing Jap stragglers. Attached hereto is a brief history and activities of this unit since its organization up to the liberation of the Philippines.

4. In view of the foregoing, it is requested that this unit, which had also contributed its little share for the cause for which the American and Philippine governments had fought, be given kind consideration so that they may also be recognized for their services rendered in the guerrilla.

II. ACTIVITIES AND OPERATIONS: 1942-

15 May 1942- Lt. Col. Peter D. Calyer, Capt. Richard C. Kadel, Capt. George E. Crane, Maj. Roy C. Tuggle, Pvt. Leon O. Beck, Pvt. Placido Canja, all escaped from DEATH MARCH to Capas, Tarlac, picked up from Barrio San Jose, Guagua, Pampanga and brought for treatment, care to Barrio Natividad, Guagua, Pampanga by members of above Unit.

27 May 1942- Capt. Ralph Jehelbley, Lt. Bernard Becker, Lt. Robert B. Joring, S/Sgt. Thomas Powers all escaped from DEATH MARCH rested for two days and were taken to Tayabas by members of this Unit.

14 July 1942- Chaplain John Duffy escaped from Death March taken from Sta. Rita, Pampanga to this Headquarters.

5 August 1942- Col. Gyles Merrill- escaped from Death March taken for treatment and care from Barrio Lambac to Natividad, Guagua, Pampanga, by members of this Unit.

17 August 1942- Formal INDUCTION of members into a regular, ORGANIZED GUERRILLA UNIT designated U/ S. ARMY FORCES. Organizers and Authority- Col. Gyles Merrill, Lt. Col. Peter D. Calyer, Capt. Richard C. Kadel, Capt. George E. Crane, Maj. Roy C. Tuggle. Original strength 569 men.

24 August 1942- Maj. Volkman, Capt. Blackborne, Capt. Bell, Capt. Dosh Capt Newman heard about HQ Natividad and reported thereto for duty and assignmentx.

Maj. Volkman and Capt. Blackborne proceeded North to Pangasinan and Mountain Province.

Capt Bell- Assigned to Pampanga District.

Capt. Dosh, Capt. Newman and Chaplain Duffy- sent back to foot-hills to take charge of Fassot Camp, where several American Officers and enlisted men were in hiding.

31 August 1942- Lt. Edwin Ramsey, upon request of Col. Merrill, sent down by Col. Thorpe to confer and discuss guerrilla affairs with Natividad HQ to carry on guerrilla operations.

1 September-1942- Capt. Joseph Barker II en route to Bulacan stayed two days in Natividad Headquarters.

15 September 1942- Lt. Edwin Ramsey, Lt. Conner, Pvt. Joseph Donahue, Pvt. Robert Melheau, en route to Sierra Madre Mountains, stayed two weeks in Natividad Headquarters.

30 September 1942- Headquarters transferred for more security to Sawang, Zambales. Members of this Unit supplied GROUP with foodstuffs and acted as carriers and guides.

Route:

- 1-7 Sept. Binalaba, Florida Blanca, Pampanga.
- 8- 27 Sept. Sapang Biabas, Florida Blanca, Pampanga.
- 27- 30 Sept. Sawang Zambales.

1 Nov.- 31 December 1942- members of this Unit acted as guides, courier guards, patrols and carriers. Others were kept busy foraging for supplies of arms, ammunitions, foodstuffs and medicines sent to GHQ in Sawang.

3 November 1942- Lt. Robert Leyrer, Pvts. Frank Gyovay and Blair Robinet stayed one week in Natividad Headquarters.

5 December 1942- Pvt. John Jones coming from San Basilio, Sta. Rita, Pampanga Joined Unit in Natividad and stayed in hiding for about 6 months in this area.

III. ACTIVITIES AND OPERATIONS: 1943-

1 January- 30 March 1943- Sabotage and intelligence operations started. Troops movements, gun emplacements, enemy strength in vicinity, and other information of great value were sent, in daily reports, to GHQ SSawang. Sabotage of Del Carmen Sugar Mills- gasoline and alcohol stolen from Japs dumps; Trucks and other vehicles destroyed.

2 March 1943- Sawang Camp of Col Merrill was raided by Japanese causing breaking up of this GHQ.

3 April 1943- Maj. Roy C. Tuggle and Pvt. Leon O. Beck went down to HQ Natividad to take over and give detailed instructions as to how to carry on operations.

24 June 1943- Col. Calyer, Capt. Kadel and Capt. Crane came down from Sawang GHQx rejoined this Unit up to the coming of the Liberators.

July- December 1943- Members of said Unit engaged in intelligence operations, supply, courier, aidmen, contact men, and carriers for American Officers in Natividad and Sawang.

IV. ACTIVITIES AND OPERATIONS: 1944-

January- August 1944- Intelligence operations.

21 September 1944- Two Navy Pilots, Ensign Walter L. Naylor Jr. and Ensign Nicholas J. Rocaforte, safely bailed out in Magalang, Pampanga. Lt. William J. Gardner of Headquarters Natividad looked for these pilots and brought them to this HQ for medical care and safekeeping from the Japanese. These pilots stayed for about two months in HQ Natividad after which they were sent to GHQ Sawang. Col. Merrill contacted submarine in Pondacket, San Antonio, Zambales and pilots were picked up by sea-plane to rejoin their unit.

V. ACTIVITIES AND OPERATIONS: 1945-

9 January 1945- San Juan bridge in Guagua, Pampanga demolished by members of this unit.

14 January 1945- Sabotage of railway line from Porac to Del Carmen, Pampanga.

17 January 1945- Japs burned Barrios of Pulungmasle and Lambac, Guagua, Pampanga. Several civilians killed and wounded. Men of this unit ordered by Capt. Esteban Salonga rescued remaining civilians, give medical attention to wounded and bury the dead. No encounter with the Japs who left before the arrival of armed members of this unit.

2 February 1945- Japs communication line from Guagua, to Florida Blanca destroyed.

Intelligence operations- troops movements, troops concentrations and strength, gun emplacements- Reports sent to 6th Army Advance Units through Maj. Tuggle.

15- 13 April 1945- 48 Japanese killed in Barrio Rizal, Guagua, Pampanga. Some members of this unit were engaged in the fighting. No casualty on our side.

25 April 1945- 10 Japanese killed- Barrio Securan, Sta. Rita, Pampanga.

27 April 1945- 7 Japanese killed in Natividad, one POW turned over to Municipal Mayor of Guagua, Pampanga.

30 April 1945- 2 Japanese captured in Barrio Of Lambac, Guagua, Pamp. Turned to American Rangers.

4 May 1945- 2 Japanese killed in Barrio Ebus, Guagua, Pampanga.

3 September 1945- 1 Japanese captured in Natividad, Guagua, Pampanga. Turned over to the Municipal Mayor of said town.

II. NATURE OF ACTIVITIES:

1. FINANCE, SUPPLY, AND MEDICAL

Headquarters of Natividad was engaged for the most part in furnishing money, rice, medicine, clothing and sundry equipments and supplies to members of this HQ and to CHQ, Sawang of Col. Gyles Merrill. American and Filipino guerrillas who passed through this area and stayed awhile were given all the possible help, protection, and medical assistance by members of this unit who gave them shelter and food, and served as carriers, guides, or armed guards as the necessity and the circumstance demanded.

2. INTELLIGENCE OPERATIONS

Intelligence operations against the Japs were actively carried on from the first days of organization until Liberation Day. Intelligence reports covering troop movements, gun emplacements, troop strength and concentrations were transmitted daily to GHQ Sawang of Col. Merrill. Short-wave news were transcribe and anti-Japanese propaganda spread and circulated to bolster the morale of the members of this unit and the loyal civilians in the vicinity. Members of this unit acted as couriers, guides, carriers and contact men for GHQ Sawang.

3. COMBAT OPERATIONS

In support of landing operations, members of this unit engaged in skirmishes with Japs troops. In six engagements with the enemy 65 Japs were killed and 3 captured. Casualty on the side of this unit was only one soldier wounded.

SUBJECT: Certification of Services Rendered.

TO : Whom it may concern:

1. This certifies that I have personal knowledge that the persons, whose names appear on the attached roster, "Headquarters, Luzon Guerrilla Forces (U.S.P.I.F.) Natividad, Gua-Gua, Pampanga" were active in guerrilla activities from the early days of the surrender of our forces in Bataan to the date of liberation.

2. The Headquarters of the Luzon Guerrilla Forces were maintained at the Barrio of Natividad at the home of the Jingco family. There was never a time when there was not one or more Americans at this headquarters and at times as many as twenty-eight have been there. This was made possible by the co-operation that these people were willing to give us and by their sympathy with the guerrilla work that we were carrying on.

3. After the aerial raids by our forces commenced it was to this headquarters that I personally brought two of our American flyers, who had been shot down by the enemy, and it was there that these people named, kept them in safety until they were able to return them to an area where they could board a submarine and return to our forces.

4. It was also this Headquarters that served as the Message Center after contact was established with S.W.P.A., and these persons named served as couriers and guides during the time.

5. Recommend that all of the persons named in the attached roster be granted the recognition that they are seeking and all benefits due them.

TO: Maria, Filomena, Asynia, and Meding,

My dear Sisters,

I had hoped that after I rejoined our troops that I would be allowed to stay here long enough to see all of my friends and to bid them goodbye, but last night I received orders to leave by airplane for the United States, and am leaving tomorrow morning at 8 oclock. Col. Calyer, and Captain Crane are also leaving. Col. Merrill is very sick but they will try to send him also.

So this means that I must go now, but in spite of the fact that I am very sad in not being able to see you, yet I rejoice in the knowledge that, God permitting, I will return here soon after the war at which time I assure you, Natividad will be the first place that I will come.

I have worried about your safety in the fighting in Pampanga, and must leave without knowing that you all are safe and well. Will you please write me a letter, address: Captain Richard C. Kadel, Post Office Box 233, Cave City, Kentucky, USA. Please tell me how you are, and have Ding or Pete give the letter to an Army officer, explaining the circumstances, and asking him to mail it after censoring it. I have prayed for your safety since I have left the shelter of your house, and know that God in his eternal mercy has kept you all under the shelter of his protecting wings.

And now - the hardest part of all. I regret that I am inarticulate when I try to tell you of your thoughtful kindness and mercy in caring for some one from a strange land through all these trying times. I can only say that I have set apart, forever, a part of my heart for a shrine for you, my dear sisters, and there I will always remember and pray for you.

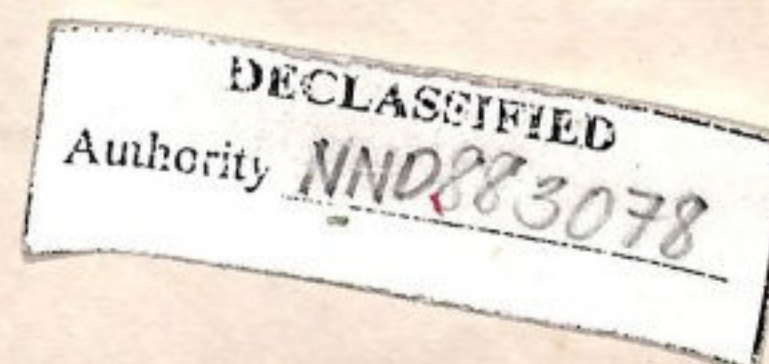
Dear Sir,

This letter is being written with the sincere hope of gaining merited recognition for some Filipino Guerrillas who served with American officers during the years of Japanese occupation in the Philippines. It is my impression that Guerrilla rosters must be certified by an officer of the Army of the United States who has personal knowledge of services rendered, and I am submitting herewith three rosters for your consideration.

During the fight in Bataan, I was commanding officer of the 17th Ordnance Co., (Armd.), as Ordnance support for the 192nd and 194th Tank Battalions of the Provisional Tank Group, commanded by Brig. General James R. N. Weaver. After the surrender, circumstances permitted me to escape from The Death March in very bad physical condition, and loyal Filipinos picked me up and nursed me back to health. Later I made contact with Colonel Gyles Merrill, and when we had somewhat recovered, Guerrilla work was started. Headquarters was established at Natividad, Guagua, Pampanga, and while at times we were forced to leave due to enemy activity, yet at all times during the Japanese occupation Natividad was used as a headquarters, message center, and collecting point for Americans who had escaped from the enemy, and later on for Navy and Army pilots and crewmen who were shot down over Clark Field area and picked up by our men. I believe I can safely say that at least thirty Americans found shelter in Natividad at various times.

The Japanese raided this area many times, and submitted many of the people there to torture and death, burning their homes and taking their food, but never at any time did any of the people assist or collaborate in any way in aiding the Japs. The Guerrillas resisted in every way possible, and not only killed Japs, but carried messages and communications, secured food and furnished medical services, furnished guards and guides, and in every possible way and at all times gave support to the resistance movement.

When American Forces landed on Luzon, I was over in Zambales Province, where Colonel Merrill had transferred his headquarters, leaving other American members of his staff in Natividad, Pampanga. At that time we were busy using air-drop supplies in securing a beach-head for Major General Chas. P. Halls' XI Corps which landed without firing a single shot in the San Antonio-Subic Bay area 29 Jan. 45. Our Guerrillas were used in the following operations which eventually drove across the northern end of Bataan, thusly sealing it off from any enemy retreat into that area.

I regret very much now that I left the Philippines at an early date, 20 Feb. 45, because I had many obligations to meet, namely recognition of loyal men and the payment of personal obligations incurred in Guerrilla work. I was under the impression that the recognition would already have been taken care of but I find now that I was in error. I have also received word that our Guerrillas in the Aglao Sector of San Marcelino, Zambales, commanded by Ramon Magsaysay and Dalmacio Rodriguez have not been recognized. These men were used by General Hall, and should by all means be recognized. I know that General Hall has not forgotten his uncontested landing, and the Filipinos who made it possible. As for me, well, he will remember the skinny American Captain who called at his office one night dressed in a freshly starched and pressed uniform, the uniform I wore out of Bataan and saved for such an occasion. Well anyhow, the next day General Halls' Aide-de-Camp dropped around to my quarters and inquired about the services of a Lavendera for the General, so I gave him mine.

In closing, sir, may I express again the sincere hope that the men whose names appear on the enclosed rosters may be duly recognized and accepted. I shall be only too glad to do anything more that is possible to assist in this matter, and only regret that I cannot appear personally to present this for your consideration.
