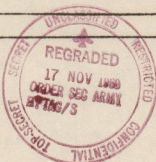

Dear Mr. Quintans:

The Commanding General has directed that you be informed that the Malisique Espionage and Sabotage Squadron, purporting to be a guerrilla organization under your nominal control, is not favorably considered for recognition as an element of the Philippine Army.

A set of general requirements for guerrilla recognition, established by General MacArthur during the liberation of the Philippines, has been used as a guide in considering the record of this unit. After careful investigation and full consideration of all substantiating records and testimony of witnesses having pertinent knowledge, recognition of this guerrilla unit is not deemed to be warranted because of reasons mentioned below:

- a. Record of service was not substantiated by sufficient acceptable evidence.
- b. The unit was not maintained satisfactorily in the field in opposition to the enemy.
- c. Activities of the unit did not contribute materially to the eventual defeat of the enemy.
- d. Unit did not show satisfactory continuity of activity and organization.
- e. Ranks of members was considered to be too high for the actual size of the command maintained in the field.

This decision on the proposed unit roster does not preclude submission for casualty recognition by those individuals who are qualified and feel justified in entering such claims. Upon request from interested individuals, appropriate forms will be forwarded.

Your attention is invited to Presidential Executive Order No. 68, Commonwealth of the Philippines, copy of which is attached, for any necessary action in connection therewith.

Report on "Malasique Espionage and Sabotage Squadron, MESS"

1. Capt B. G. Tabora Jr and 1st Lt J. C. Altman proceeded to Malasique, Pangasinan on the 20th of March 1947, to investigate the Malasique Espionage and Sabotage Squadron, MESS.

2. ALLEGED HISTORY: (See attached Unit File).

3. FINDINGS:

a. The following persons were interviewed and their statements are reflected in the findings:

Col Juan Benitez	Chief of Staff, PTMD, ECLGA
Lt Col Antonio Jimenez	CO, 1st Pangasinan Regt, PTMD, ECLGA

Cpl Benedicto Andaya	"

b. Record of service was not substantiated by sufficient acceptable evidence. The commanding officer of the Malasique Espionage and Sabotage Squadron, together with his brother, also a member of the unit, were included in the roster of the 141st Inf Regt which was not favorably considered for recognition. When the investigating team requested supporting papers, such as induction papers, promotion papers, receipts from other guerrilla units for intelligence reports or other pertinent papers to substantiate the claims of the unit, none of these aforementioned documents could be presented. Members of the unit devoted considerable time to supporting their families and served the guerrillas on a part time basis only.

c. The unit was not maintained satisfactorily in the field in opposition to the enemy. All members of the unit pursued normal civilian occupations and remained at home with their families during the Japanese occupation. The commanding officer and most members of the unit belonged to the same family. Members of the unit never operated in the field as a unit for fear of being detected by the Japanese during the occupation.

d. Activities of the unit did not contribute materially to the eventual defeat of the enemy. The members claimed activities such as espionage and sabotage but proof of these activities were not substantiated by written documents or certificates from the alleged guerrilla organizations to whom information was allegedly forwarded. Col Juan Benitez, Lt Col Antonio Jimenez and Major Pascual Pinlac were interviewed by the investigating team regarding this unit and it was stated by these three (3) recognized guerrilla leaders, who operated in the same

✓ vicinity, that the unit in question never existed, nor that they had ever received pertinent information from the unit.

e. Ranks of members was considered to be exceptionally high for an organization of so few members. In the roster submitted, one third of the members were commissioned officers.

✓ f. Unit did not show continuity of activities and organization because the commanding officer as well as his subordinates could not show any achievements accomplished during the occupation. Captain Tabora, contact team leader, who was assigned in this area during the occupation as Liaison and Intelligence Officer of the 1st Pangasinan Regiment, PTMD, ECLGA, never received intelligence reports nor heard of the existence of the unit.

g. No useful purpose will be accomplished by further investigation of the unit. There are no members worthy of recognition and the unit sustained no casualties.

4. POLITICAL ASPECTS: The unit does not appear to have any political affiliations or aspirations.

5. RECOMMENDATIONS: It is recommended that the Malasique Espionage and Sabotage Squadron be not favorably considered for recognition.

SUBJECT: Recognition of Guerilla Rank, Request for
TO: Commanding General, AFWESPAC
(Thru Adjutant General)

1. Request that the unit I have organized on or about 20 Dec. '43 known as the "MESS" (The Malasique Espionage and Sabotage Squadron) be recognized for the following reasons;

a. That this said organization has actively and faithfully worked for the common and that we have all gloriously attained;

b. That with only twelve (12) members this unit was able to accomplish the following from 20 December 1943 up to about the end of April 1945 when we disbanded said organization because the eight (8) USAFFE members have either reported or were to report for processing;

(1) Japanese troop movements, positions and activities were kept tracked of within our zone of action and people were advised to keep their products, crops and animals from possible commandeering by such troops;

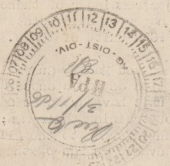
(2) Flow of food supplies and war materials to the Japanese forces have been blocked or slowed down by giving advance notice to the people of any Japanese plans to requisition food and war materials such as bamboos, lumber, etc. Upon receipt of notice from our intelligence men that the Japanese Army is in need of local transportations.

(3) Transportation facilities have been sabotaged by our unit by advising and helping the people for dismantling bull-carts and caretellas and taking their animals to remote places inaccessible to Japanese commandeering.

(4) In protection of Allied properties, our unit held in our position the products of the "Turner Estates" belonging to Mr. R. C. Turner, a U.S. national, without giving any single grain to any Japanese outfit but instead we spared some to the needy Guerillas in our town. The major remainder of these crops were then turned over to the manager of said estate as per instructions from the C.I.C. and FG&J units of the U.S. Army for proper disposition.

(5) In cooperation with the authorized Ramsey Guerilla units we furnished them vital information as to Japanese activities and the USAFFE members of our unit have acted as advisers in their organizations for purposes of training their men;

(6) Our unit has also acted as an informer to the Allied troops and furnished guides for the advance guards of the American forces that arrived in Malasique, Pangasinan on or about



9 January 1945 who showed the exact locations of the Japanese hideouts and defense lines at the Cabaruan hills.

(7) That the USAFFE members of this organization do not request for any other rank other than that of our old ranks in Bataan and the four (4) civilians as merely civilian employees;

2. In view of the above, I earnestly hope for a favorable action.



KNOW YE ALL BY THIS PRESENT:

That we the undersigned have voluntarily agreed to organized ourselves into an anti-Japanese association to be known as the "MESS" (MALASIQUI ESPIONAGE AND SABOTAGE SQUADRON):

That we agreed to uphold the dignity of our positions and to hold in strict secrecy all plans and activities of our association and never to divulge the same to relatives, friends or to any member of our family and even when captured by the enemy;

That we shall only confine ourselves to the following specific activities:

1. To keep tracks of Japanese positions, movements, and activities, etc., within and around this municipality and to hamper or delay such by any measure not detrimental to Public safety;
2. To prevent, block, or slow down of food or any supplies which may be of value to the Japanese troops;
3. To prevent, hamper or cut off access to transportation facilities by Japanese troops in order to delay their activities;
4. To cooperate with only authorized guerilla units within the Islands in matter of Espionage and Sabotage work or the like, whenever possible,
5. To protect Allied and Public life, property and interest;
6. Finally, to inform, advice, and furnish guides to any Americans or Allied troops about to Japanese concentrations, etc.
