SUBJECT: REQUEST AS TO THE PRESENT STATUS

TO : CHIEF, GUERRILLA AFFAIRS, AFPAC, APO 500.
123 Juan Luna, Manila.

1. This Unit has been waiting to hear from your good office as to the present status of this Command.

2. Months have elapsed since I was investigated by your Office in Moragaaray, in respect to the activities of this Unit.

3. In addition, our Unit have forwarded to your Office a formal information as to the whole History of the Unit "TRIGGERS MAL-RIZALDI," which information undoubtedly reached your hands. Furthermore, the attachment paper of this Command has been also furnished to you.

4. We believe that we have complied with the pre-requisites for proper recognition. As our Unit has been in operation since the Japanese occupation as records filed at your Office will prove. Because of Hostile Acts against the enemies perhaps this Unit has a highest percentage of casualties than other Units. Many died in the hands of the enemies, and this Command feels it is their duty, to give protection to the families they left behind as the deceased were the only means of their livelihood.

5. It is, therefore, requested that this Command be informed as to the present status of our Unit.

WE, PETRONILO L. MATEO (DODO de MONTES), of legal age, married and a resident of San Juan, Rizal, and AMAÑO LANSANG, also of legal age, married, and a resident of Valenzuela Extension, Manila, after having been duly sworn according to law, depose and say:

1. That we, Petronilo L. Mateo (Dodo de Montes), Commanding Officer of the Triggers Unit, Mal-Rizaldi, ROTC or Hunters Guerrillas with the rank of Major since September, 1942 and later promoted to Lieutenant Colonel, and Amado Lansang, Executive Officer of the same Unit, with the rank of Captain since the same date and later promoted to Major, both inducted at Antipolo, Rizal, together with the other officers listed hereafter, were the organizers of the TRIGGERS UNIT - MAL-RIZALDI, ROTC OR HUNTERS GUERRILLAS, UNITED STATES PHILIPPINE ISLANDS FORCES (USPIF);

2. That on or before January 15, 1945, the Office of the Executive Officer of this Unit was raided by the Japanese Military Police in Antipolo, and most of the records of this Unit were taken by the Japanese Military Police. Part of the records kept in the attic of the Gasorio house in Antipolo which was being used as the Headquarters of this Unit in Antipolo were burned when the said house was razed to the ground during the fight for liberation of this municipality;

3. That other copies of documents of this Unit which were sent to the ~~Local~~ Headquarters ^{at Malabon} were lost or destroyed in order to prevent them from falling into the hands of the Japanese. Copies of documents entrusted to different trusted officers of this Command kept in their respective hiding places located at Ermita, Malata, Intramuros and Foco were burned as a result of the great destruction by shells and fire of the houses in these districts;

4. That copies of other documents were also buried in several places in Barrio Mayamot, Antipolo, Rizal, but a diligent search of the hiding places have not yet yielded any results. Several missions have already been sent to the mountains in Antipolo to search any records of this Unit, but the search had been in vain;

5. That we remember very well that among the records that were lost are the Roster and the copy of the general promotions of the living deserving officers of this Unit, namely:

Major Dodo de Montes, promoted to Lt. Col.
Capt. Amado Lansang, promoted to Major
Originally (1st Lt. Francisco Mat Lirio, promoted to Capt.
inducted under (1st Lt. Cipriano Manansala, promoted to Capt.
Special Order (1st Lt. Pedro Gabriel, promoted to Capt.
No. 1 of this (1st Lt. Perfecto Lansang, promoted to Capt.
Unit-Sept. 1942 (2nd Lt. Emilio C. Saturnino, promoted to 1st Lt.
2nd Lt. Eladio Mata, promoted to 1st Lt.
2nd Lt. Levy Tinio, promoted to 1st Lt.
2nd Lt. Tomas Flores, promoted to 1st Lt.
2nd Lt. Arceli Santos, promoted to 1st Lt.
3rd Lt. Jose Lansang, promoted to 2nd Lt.
3rd Lt. Juanito LERICA, promoted to 2nd Lt.
3rd Lt. Andres Mauricio, promoted to 2nd Lt.
2nd Lt. Magno Romansanta, promoted to 1st Lt.

6. That the above promotions were sanctioned and confirmed by the Division Commander after a due deliberation of the achievements of this Unit;

7. That we also certify that the copies of special orders of this command covering the induction and promotions of officers and enlisted men of this Unit were included among the lost records;

8. That after a conference with the Commanding Officer of the ROTC OR HUNTERS GUERRILLAS, the ranks of all the officers and enlisted men of this Command have been confirmed;

9. That to the best of our recollection and belief other records lost were receipts, evidencing loans made by this Command in favor of several persons, the proceeds of which loans were used in the purchase of supplies; receipts for cattle used to feed members of this Unit, among which was a receipt for 169 heads of cattle taken from Isidro Victoria of Morong, Rizal; and several other receipts evidencing supplies taken from several persons for the use of this Command;

I, SIMPLICIO VILLAMARIN, of legal age, married, native of Angono, Rizal, presently residing at No. 56 (int. 3) Santa Mesa, Manila, hereby depose and state:

1. That from 1 July, 1943 to 15 September 1944, I was employed in the Bureau of Budget and Accounts of the Puppet Republic of the Philippines;
2. That I was assigned as Accountant in the Accounting Unit for the Department of Public Instructions, then the Department of Public Works and lastly in the Philippine General Hospital, which assignments I had worked for for the purpose of carrying effectively my underground work as and Intelligence Officer of the Hunters (ROTC) Guerrillas. As an Accountant, I had to keep records of accounts of the disbursements of funds of the said agencies of the Philippine Government.
3. That my employment therat, was under the permission of my higher superiors in the HUNTERS (ROTC) Guerrillas) like Lt. Col. Tereso D. Pia, Major Antonio Liban, mainly for the purpose and objectives as cited in the preceding paragraph hereof.
4. That I was receiving a monthly salary of ONE HUNDRED TEN PESOS (Mickey Mouse Money) during my connection with the Bureau of Budget and Accounts.
5. That I left the Puppet Government without the permission of my superior in the said entity but with the knowledge of my Commanding Officer Major Antonio Liban (Liberty) of the HUNTERS (ROTC) Guerrilla Unit.

IN TRUTH HEREOF, I hereby affixed my signature on this 17th day of June, 1946, at 22 G. Reyes St., San Juan, Manila.

That he was transferred to the 4th sub-CPID, at Sampaloc, Manila under the command of Lt. Isabelo Hernandez (Guerrilla-name Lt. Benhar) January 25, 1944; (

That he was commissioned as 1st/Sgt., Combatman by Lt. Colonel Baggie, at the mountain of Maagay, Antipolo, Rizal, March 20, 1943;

That our outfit, the HUNTERS or ROTC GUERRILLAS was recognized 31 January 1945 by the 6th Army (AUS FORCES in the Philippines);

That I further certify that the induction of the non-commissioned officer, 1st/Sgt. MILANIO IMPERIAL was confirmed and authorized by Col. ELEUTERIO ADEVOSO, CO of the HUNTERS , ROTC GUERRILLAS, forwarded to the Division CP under the command of Lt. Col. Pia;

- d. That the roster was prepared in accordance with the standard table of organization prescribed by the AFWESPAC.

Attached hereto also are true copy of attachment papers of the TRIGGERS UNIT MAL-RIZALDI, dated 25th March 1945 and issued by Robert D. Patridge, Captain, TD, Comdg., Ren Co. 640 TD Bn; and mimeographed copy of the letter of commendation of Lt. Col. Henry J. Muller, Jr dated 26 Jan '46, praising the work and services rendered by the HUNTERS OR R.O.T.C. GUERRILLAS UNITS.

SUBJECT: UNIT HISTORY AND ACTIVITIES

TO : CHIEF, GUERRILLA AFFAIRS, AEWESPAC, APO 707



HISTORY

This Unit was originally known as "FTL" (Fight to the Last). Every member was required to subscribe to an oath of allegiance to the United States of America and the Commonwealth of the Philippines. Later it became known as the "TERROR OF DODO" in Rizal as well as in Manila. Finally on September 21, 1942, in Antipolo, it was decided to name the Unit as "TRIGGERS UNIT MAL-RIZALDI" and was designated as the Provost Marshall of the ROTC OR HUNTERS Guerrillas.

Immediately after the occupation of Manila by the Japanese, this Unit started planning ways of establishing a guerrilla force. After the Fall of Bataan, its work became so successful that by the later part of 1942, it had become so effective in underground resistance movement that it succeeded in organizing and bringing together several guerrilla units, antagonistic to one another, and in establishing and maintaining contact between different combat groups that could not be brought together and between the guerrilla units in Manila and those in the immediate environs of the City.

With a group of professionals as nucleus, a propaganda Bureau was created, the work of which was exclusively the writing, publication and distribution of propaganda literature and war news transmitted by radio to raise the morale of the people and counteract Japanese propaganda against the Allied Democracies, particularly against America. This work was extremely dangerous for to be caught in this act would be fatal. But there was no let up. Propaganda materials and detailed presentation of war news both in the Philippines and World Fronts were released to the public regularly twice a week. Thousands upon thousands of leaflets were thus distributed in different government offices, private residences and public places all over the city. This work was the more intensi-

fied during the time of the Japanese-sponsored Republic when declaration of war against America and the conscription of Filipino manpower were under consideration in the inner circles of the government. War was declared but the proposed conscription was not carried out.

The war news from abroad were received thru a lone radio receiving set, but this set, which was in Singalong, was captured by the Japanese on August 8, 1942 and the owner killed instantly. For sometime our source of regular war news by radio was cut off, until our technicians succeeded in making another one. Much later, we had several radio sets in operation - one in Paco, one in Sta. Ana, one in Pasay, and another in Ermita. Another was also maintained in Pasig, Rizal, until it was located by the Japanese on May 20, 1943 and the owner beaten. This man died later on as a result of this beating.

Some of the news items received during the early part of 1942 are hereinbelow quoted:



- Jan. 3, 1942 - "President Roosevelt and the British Prime Minister announced from the White House, the command in the Pacific Area of all American, British and other Allied land, sea and air forces. Commander of the British, Gen. Sir Archibald F. Wavell. U. S. Admiral Thomas C. Hart for the United Nations in the area under the direction of Admiral Wavell."
- Jan. 6, 1942 - "President Roosevelt, addressed Congress on the 'State of the Union'. This address in part stated, 'That American Armed Forces must be used in any place in the world wherein it was advisable to engage the enemy.'"
- March 17, 1942 - "The arrival of Gen. Mac Arthur in Australia with his Staff."
- April 18, 1942 - "Announcement of the first raid over Tokyo." (When this announcement was received we propagandized the fact that the AMERICANS WERE ON THE WAY.)
- April 25, 1942 - "The American Troops landed at the Island of New Caledonia, Southwest Pacific."

May 4, 1942 - "The Allied Forces landed in Madagascar." (At that time we circulated the news that the Americans were on the way to Philippines via the Indian Ocean.)

May 12, 1942 - "President Quezon succeeded in going to Australia."

It was this Unit that played with and instructed the newspaper boys to always shout "Bill na kayo nang Tribune at Taliba - Baligdig ang Balita (Buy Tribune and Taliba, the reverse of the news is true.). Later on, however, this was discovered and we stopped.

Intelligence and sabotage groups were also created. These two groups worked together and established connections with men in key offices in the government and in different Japanese and Filipino industrial activities involved in the war effort. Contacts were also made with reliable men among thousands of laborers being employed by the Japanese Army in building the network of airfields in and around Manila and reports made on intelligence and sabotage work carried out in the premises. These reports were released for transmission to men from Headquarters.

Some members of this Unit were entrusted in the dangerous work of arranging the transfer of ammunition from their sources to different points in the City from where guerrilla members could get their supplies. This was done once or twice a month if big in quantities, once every week if small in quantities.

The "TRIGGERS UNIT" stopped banditry and Jap spies by raiding several Jap Garrisons. Members of this Unit sabotaged communication line in several places and cleaned up several localities where there were known to be pro-Jap activities in progress. Several of our men were lost in action, some were captured and some others were zonified and pointed out as guerrillas by the well-known "MAGIC EYE" (The device of putting a Jap spy, generally a Filipino, behind a screen, so that he can see the accused without being seen.

The meeting places of this Unit were: Top of the Trade and Commerce Building, 123 Juan Luna, Manila; Hagdan Bato, Mandaluyon, Rizal; Philippine Trust Company, Plaza Sta. Cruz, Manila; Cu Unjieng Building, Escolta, Manila; Paco Elementary School, Paco, Manila; and in residences of some members in Ermita and Sta. Ana, Manila.



The original strength of this Unit was 1000. Later on the number was increased to 1,350. Some of the members of this Unit could not be located as the original roster was lost in Antipolo where the 8-1 took refuge when the Commanding Officer was being pursued by the Jap M.F. It is presumed that some of them might have joined other Guerrilla Organizations, or others might have lost their lives. The roster therefore that was prepared for submission to the AFWESPAC is based only upon the recovered personnel. In the preparation of our roster, the casualties were separated from those who are still known to be alive.

As of this date the number of men so far recovered are:

Upon the arrival of the American Forces from the North, contact was made at the outskirts of Manila and later at the University of Santo Tomas University. Contact units were also sent sought to cooperate with American Troops operating toward the Nielson Airfield Area.

On February 12, 1945, this command was attached to the 640th Tank Destroyer Battalion, 1st Cavalry Division, and some with 6th FA, 37 Division.

Detailed activities of this Unit are shown in the succeeding pages.

- * Casualties were reported to AFWESPAC, G-3 Guerrillas Affairs Apo 707 and a carbon copy to the HPA, Apo 501 in the accomplished form A-HPA c/o Casualty Division from time to time, as Recovered; reference to our letter dated 16 Jan'46 to AFWESPAC.

ACTIVITIES

- March 22, 1942 - Meeting in downtown district to organize a committee to contact men who could be materials for underground resistance movement.
- March 28, 1942 - Meeting in Barrio Maagay, Antipolo, Rizal, to recruit members for the underground resistance movement.
- April 12, 1942 - Meeting in Malabanca, Antipolo, Rizal, to recruit other members. People from adjoining Barrios of Pantay and Boso-boso were present.
- April 20, 1942 - Meeting in downtown district to discuss the preparation of a roster of the members recruited.
- May 1, 1942 - Contact was made by two men of the Unit with Fabling Hernandez of the Lapham Guerrillas.
- May 7, 1942 - Contact made with Miguel Ver, one of the founders of the ROTC OR HUNTERS Guerrillas. Here it was decided to combine the "FTL" with the ROTC.
- May 10, 1942 - Meeting in Antipolo, Rizal, to advise members that "FTL" will cooperate and combine with the ROTC.
- May 14, 1942 - Meeting to receive the reports of contacts made. It was agreed to concentrate on propaganda activities.
- May 28, 1942 - Meeting to receive the reports on the result of the work on propaganda and discussion on other kinds of underground work, such as intelligence and sabotage.
- June 2, 1942 - Contact made with Capt. Edwin Ramsey, founder of the "ECLGA".
- June 8, 1942 - Contact made with other guerrilla organizations regarding the matter of supplying guerrilla members in the mountains. This meeting was held in the La Perla Restaurant, Plaza Sta. Cruz, Manila.
- July 2, 1942 - Meeting in downtown district. It was agreed to send medical supplies to prisoners of war in Capas.
- July 4, 1942 - Report was received from a runner of Malabanca, Antipolo, Rizal, that the ROTC was raided by the Japanese in Antipolo. In this raid, Mike Ver, one of the founders of the ROTC Guerrillas, was killed and another member wounded.



- July 30, 1942 - A mission of two men was sent to Bataan by way of the Manila Bay to contact sources of arms and ammunition.
- Aug. 10, 1942 - Meeting to receive the collection of money intended for the purchase of arms and ammunition.
- ✓ Aug. 27, 1942 - Received from men in Bataan a shipment of 12 pistols, 6 rifles and 1,000 rounds of ammunition.
- Sept. 4, 1942 - Organized the committee to contact workers in different Japanese business firms and factories in Manila to find out what they intend to do in the future.
- Sept. 20, 1942 - Sent considerable medical supplies to Capas for the treatment of war prisoners.
- Oct. 7, 1942 - Meeting to discuss further measures in the organization of guerrilla units.
- Nov. 15, 1942 - Meeting to re-dedicate the men of the different guerrilla units to greater efforts and sincerity in their fight against the Japanese.
- ✓ Jan. 2, 1943 - Entered the town of Antipolo, Rizal, to clean up the Japanese spies and collaborators and a band of bandits.
- Jan. 5-7, 1943 - Contacted Lt. Atkinson of the U. S. Army, who escaped from Bataan during the surrender and was in hiding in the barrio of Kalatagan, Hagonoy, Bulacan. He refused to come to Manila, but later he joined another guerrilla unit in Bulacan.
- Jan. 15, 1943 - Raided the towns of Taytay and Angono, Rizal.
- Jan. 25, 1943 - Raided the town of Cainta, Rizal. Casualties: 5 men; captured: 3 men.
- Feb. 15, 1943 - Raided the town of Marikina, Rizal; encountered too many Makapilis and Japs. It took a long time to clean this town of these undesirable elements. Total casualties on our side in this mission: 15 men.
- June 2, 1943 - Raided Pinaglabanan, a barrio in San Juan, Rizal. Raid successful. Casualty: 1 man.
- July 4, 1943 - Raided Quezon City. Raid successful. No casualty.
- July 16, 1943 - Raided San Juan, Rizal, at 12:00 o'clock midnight. ~~No~~casualty. (U)
- July 25, 1943 - Back to Marikina, Rizal. Encountered a Makapili gang. Casualty: 1 man.



- Aug. 1, 1943 - Second raid in San Juan, Rizal made. We encamped in this town. It took more than a week to take control of this municipality.
- Aug. 21, 1943 - Sent an open letter to 1st Lt. Vicente and to 2nd Lt. A. Macaso, c/o 5th GST Company to have a conference for the benefit of this organization.
- ✓Sept. 21, 1943 - At 10:00 P.M. successfully raided the Jap garrison in Welfareville Camp and captured 72 rifles and 95 rounds of ammunition.
- Sept. 1943 - Raided Japanese barracks at the Balara Filter and Santolan at the same time by order received from the GHQ. Five rifles and 50 rounds of ammunition were taken. Simultaneously with the above raid, other men, with the help of several Filipino guards right in the Camp, raided the newly constructed landing field at Parang, Marikina, Rizal. All these missions proved a complete surprise to the enemy as testified by lack of any casualty on our part.
- Sept. 1943 - Raided Pagsejan, Laguna. Casualty; 1 man.
- Sept. 25, 1943 - A voluminous report of the activities of the government officials in the City and Insular governments was submitted by the member assigned to this work. This report was the result of long period of hard intelligence work.
- Nov. 1943 - Raided, Malsbon, Nevotas and Caloccan, Rizal by order received from the GHQ. Casualties; 13 men.
- Nov. 2, 1943 - Raided the Japanese garrison and ammunition depot in Sta. Mesa, Manila. The raid was successful. Two Japanese were killed. Two pistols and 50 rounds of ammunition were confiscated.
- Dec. 21, 1943 - Back again in Marikina. Fought against the gang of Simone Reyes, leader of the Makapilis in that region. Three of his men were captured and some killed. Casualties; 2 men on our side.
- Dec. 25, 1943 - Sent open letter to 1st Lt. Delo and 2nd Lt. J/ Reyes of the 4th Rizal Company PC for a conference on the matter of asking their cooperation in guerrilla activities.
- Jan. 2, 1944 - Meeting to discuss the measures to suppress the "buy and sell" business, especially in deals affecting war materials.



- Jan. 5, 1944 - Some members were ordered to enter the City of Manila to help in suppressing the "Buy and Sell" business of war materials and to be on the lookout for Japanese spies who had their hideouts in the City.
- March 1944 - Entered again the town of Angono to stop the campaign of the Makapili organization. We zonified Barrio Muson, Angono, Rizal.
- March 1944 - Entered Barrios Muntinlupa, Cupang, Sukat and Bagong Bayan.
- July 1944 - Entered the towns of San Mateo and Montalban, Rizal and raided the Jap barracks in Burgos, which was the Supply Dept of the Japanese. Casualties: 3 men.
- July 1944 - Ordered the GST Troops to report to the 44th Division HQ, ROTC OR HUNTERS Guerrillas, with their weapons and ammunition. Only 2nd Lt. A. Macaso and his men reported. 1st Lt. Vicente did not come but went away somewhere.

Sept. 15, 1944 - Sent to Headquarters a consolidated report of the latest information covering the string of airfields surrounding Manila with particular description regarding:

1. The exact boundary of each airfield and the area covered.
2. The disposition of airplanes, their make and ~~quantity~~ number.
3. The places where they were hidden and how they were hidden.
4. The location of the hangars.



- Sept. 20, 1944 - Meeting in Welfareville to arrange ways of sending some members who were wanted by the Japanese MP, to Antipolo, Rizal, for safety.
- Sept. 21, 1944 - First raid of the American planes in the City of Manila. The members were ordered to keep watch of Japanese communication lines and movement of Jap troops.
- Sept. 25, 1944 - Raided the Japanese post near the Bay View Hotel to rescue two prominent guerrilla members. The ten men who participated found only three Japanese marines at the place. All the Japs were killed but only 1 rifle and 2 hand grenades were taken from them. The men were almost overtaken by a truck load of Jap soldiers who were able to shoot down two of the ten men. The other eight got away safely.

Sept. 28, 1944 - Entered San Juan municipal building by order from the GHQ to neutralize the activities of the Precint Commander of this town in favor of Japs. There was an encounter which lasted for several hours. Casualty on our part: 1 man.

Sept. 30, 1944 - A patrol of 6 men of this Unit was passing near Nielson Airfield to contact Atilano Rivera living near said airfield but they met two Japanese marines. The two marines were immediately fired upon and killed. A .45 caliber pistol was taken from the body of one of them.

October 1-14, 1944 - Organized 12 selected men divided into two small bancas (6 men in each banca) and started from Paranaque toward Cavite skirting along the coast of Manila Bay. The purpose of this mission was to observe and detect any naval or military installation along the coast from Cavite toward Batangas. The men were disguised as fishermen and brought along with them fishing lines and tackles. These men traveled in these two bancas day and night. The two bancas were separated; one reached a point in Batangas, but the other one was forced to land in Cavite soil. The two bancas were abandoned and the men hitch-hiked overland toward the City where they eventually met and made their report.

What they saw:

- 2 destroyers in Cavite
- 1 big destroyer (may be cruiser) in Cavite
- 3 merchant ships in Cavite
- 4 sunken ships near Manila
- Many small ships (landing barges may be in Cavite).

Many laborers contacted in Cavite reported the presence of several artillery pieces along the coast and in the uplands of Cavite.

There were other ships in the Manila Bay, but the men could not identify them due to great distance.

October 1944 - During this month the Taiwan Tekko Sho, a big Japanese firm, was successfully raided three times. In these raids a total of 10 pistols and 1,200 rounds of ammunition were taken from the Japanese and Filipino guards guarding the premises.

October 1944 - Raided Dapitan garrison. No casualty.

November 1, 1944 - Three men were ordered to burn two hidden planes of the Japanese. The mission was carried out successfully at 12:00 that night, but the Japanese caught the men and the next morning an old farmer reported that he saw the Japs shoot the men and burn the body afterwards.

November 15, 1944 - Sent a consolidated report to Headquarters on the latest movement of the Japanese in the City. At first the Japanese went out of the City, during the day but returned at night. Later on they did not return anymore.

November 24, 1944 - A fully armed patrol of this Command encountered and engaged a unit of Japanese M.P.'s on Brixton Hill, Quezon City. Enemy casualties: 3 Jap M. P. officers killed, 2 Jap M. P. privates wounded. Our casualty: 1 killed and 1 wounded.

November 26, 1944 - A report was received from the Intelligence group in the city that a Japanese automobile would pass thru the town of Mandaluyon, carrying Jap officers in charge of constructing the Yamasita Line. At 3:00 P.M. the said automobile came with 6 Jap officers inside of it. We opened fire at once and killed all of them. We got a map, 4 pistols and 3 sabers.

November 28, 1944 - With 12 men of this Unit, in cooperation with other guerrilla units, a close surveillance was kept over the Japanese marines who were apparently preparing to burn the Sta. Ana Elementary School by depositing about six drums of gasoline in the premises, but they finally gave up their threat. However, they were able to burn the shoe factory located in Panaderos, also in the district of Sta. Ana, which was owned by an American businessman by the name of Mr. Hale. Fortunately, the fire, beside consuming the 4 barges in the Pasig River, did not spread to other parts of Sta. Ana.



December 3, 1944 - Started cutting off communication of the Japanese retreating to the mountains.

Feb. 3, 1945 - Upon arrival of the American Forces inside the City of Manila, we at once reported in the HQ inside the Sto. Tomas University and there we met Major Beltwell, who was in charge of the advance forces, to report our activities during the Japanese occupation. We presented to them the map of the Yamasita line and the sabers taken from the Jap officers.

In the afternoon of the same date we encountered 7 Jap snipers and killed 4 of them. One of our men was wounded in the encounter. We got 3 rifles and several hand grenades. When we were on our way to

bring our wounded man to Sto. Tomas University for treatment, we met another Jap sniper with a white paper in his hand to show that he was surrendering. We took him and surrendered him to the Americans.

- Feb. 6, 1945 - We were informed of the presence of Japanese snipers in Mandaluyon. We went to hunt for them at once and killed 8 Japs. We got their rifles, a hand grenade and one light machine gun. Two of our men were wounded.
- Feb. 7, 1945 - We cleaned up the whole town of San Juan of Japanese and later that day we met Capt. East of the 1st Cavalry Division who supplied us with ammunition. When the Americans entered San Juan the following day, not a single Japanese was found inside the town.
- Feb. 8, 1945 - We were informed by the Intelligence Group in Malabon that there was a group of Japs in the barrio of Dampalit. Some of the men were sent there and they had an exchange of fire with the Japs till 6:00 P.M. As the men could not cross the river, our men stopped the fight and came back to the City.
- Feb. 9, 1945 - We went to Marikina and patrolled the barrios of Tanong, Barangka and Jesus de la Pena.
- Feb. 10, 1945 - In the early hours of this day, a patrol was sent across the bridge and surrounded the barrios on the other side of Marikina. Ten Japs were killed. They found rifles, hand grenades and ammunition in the Jap hideouts. One of our men was hit by hand grenade shrapnels and both of his legs were cut.
- Feb. 12, 1945 - By order of the 1st Cavalry Division this Unit was attached to the 640th Tank Destroyer Company for dismounted and vehicular patrol, scouting operations of observation posts, and security outposts. We were assigned inside Fort McKinley.
During the first night of our assignment we got 10 Japs with rifles and hand grenades.
- Feb. 13, 1945 - Twenty Japs attacked one of our posts and in the encounter, 3 Japs were killed. One of our men was shot.
- Feb. 14, 1945 - ~~The men assigned to Pateros (one platoon)~~ The men assigned to Pateros (one platoon) near the shore, killed 12 Japs with arms. They got the arms and one machine gun.



Feb. 21, 1945 - We proceeded to Angono and on this date several Japs were encountered. Two of them were killed near the lake.

Feb. 22, 1945 - Patrols were sent to the mountains of Angono where they got 4 Japs. One of our men was wounded. Patrols were also sent to guard the towns of Binangonan, Morong, Baras and Cardona.

Mar. 11, 1945 - The 1st Cavalry Division was relieved and the 43rd Division assigned to take their post.

Mar. 14, 1945 - Lt. Col. Robert Stevens gave the Commanding Officer of this Unit a letter of recommendation addressed to the one in charge of the 43rd Division. Capt. Mueller who received him attached this Unit with the 103rd Inf. in the town of Taytay.

After March 14, 1945, we stayed for a few days in Taytay and later proceeded to Antipolo for patrol duty, day and night. There we captured some Japs. Later we proceeded to Teresa and there the whole force was stationed in the mountains of Pantay.

During the period covering the months of April and May, 1945, several squads consisting of men of this Unit were attached for combat duty to the 6th Field Artillery, 37th Division under the command Lt. Col. Stewart Brown, in the Baguio campaigns and its environs.

Thereafter, this command has been putting in order its collection of information, both oral and written, on the members of the USAFFE who are outright guilty or under suspicion of having committed acts of collaboration with the enemy and therefore chargeable with disloyalty to the United States Government and to the Commonwealth of Government. Such information as had been verified, had been sent to the G-2, GHQ U.S. Army from time to time.

Reports on more or less similar line with regard to civilian collaborators have been sent from time to time to Col. Holland, Chief of Police or Provost Marshal of Manila.

These activities are being continued by this Command until it finds it no longer necessary to do so.

It may be mentioned also that some members of this Unit continued working with the Americans in their individual capacity and most of them were attached to different U. S. Army Units.

TO : Whom It May Concern

1. Major Dodo de Montes (Pet. Mateo) unit of the Hunters ROTC 44th Div., was attached to my company by order of the 1st Cav Div on 22 Feb '45, and worked with me to 12 March 1945.

2. During that period my mission was security and patrol of the Division right flank, first at Fort McKinley, and later at Angono and the Morong Peninsula.

3. I used the Hunters ROTC unit for dismounted and vehicular patrol, scouting operations of observation posts, and security outposts. These assignments were carried out in an aggressive and efficient manner. During the period, the unit killed 27 enemy and captured 2 Macapilis.

4. The unit worked well with my men, with no friction. I found them to be very dependable and determined fighters.

5. In my opinion, this unit is better trained, disciplined and equipped, than any I have worked with in Luzon.

SUBJECT: ROTC-Hunters Guerrilla Forces

TO : Guerrilla Affairs Section, AFWESPAC, APO 707

1. This letter is to bring to your attention the splendid contribution to the Mike Six Operation in Southern Luzon made by the ROTC-Hunters Guerrilla Forces and to recommend that their excellent war record be given careful consideration when establishing final quota for recognition and admittance to the Philippine Army Forces. This recommendation is prompted by my desire to see the deserving members of this organization justly rewarded and by the belief that the type of former guerrilla typical of the ROTC-Hunters units will be of the greatest value to the Philippine Army Forces.

2. As G-2 of the 11th Airborne Division I received and studied the intelligence reports furnished by guerrilla organizations for several months prior to the amphibious and parachute landings at Masugba and Tagyatay. It soon became apparent that the ROTC-Hunters had the most reliable, active and widespread intelligence not in Southern Luzon, and, as a result, it was units of this organization that contacts were established by pre-landing reconnaissance patrols. The Masugba area was finally selected over several other landing areas under consideration largely as a result of the information furnished by the ROTC-Hunters. The wisdom of this choice, the accuracy of the intelligence ~~xxxxx~~ furnished, and the effectiveness of their counter-intelligence is now a matter of history. The landing caught small Jap garrison by surprise and the initial resistance was negligible. Four days subsequent to the landing, the division had advanced some seventy miles to the outskirts of Manila.

3. During the hard-fought battle for Southern Manila, the intelligence headquarters of the ROTC-Hunters was established at my request adjacent to my section. Col. Castillo, the Hunters G-2, was designated G-2 of all guerrilla forces of Southern Luzon, and all guerrilla reports were processed and evaluated by his section. By the time Manila had been secured and the division was ready to turn South for the operations in Cavite, Batangas, and Tayabas provinces, he had amassed a wealth of information which enabled us to plot accurately every major offensive installation and every troop concentration in the above provinces. I say the above advisedly since it is a matter of record. A comparison of the G-2 Estimate of the Enemy Situation in Southern Luzon based to a large extent on his reports and compiled in February 1945 compared with the G-2 History of the subsequent operations in the area compiled after the close of the campaign, furnished a permanent record and is testimony to the effectiveness of the intelligence organization of the ROTC-Hunters.

4. From the standpoint of combat contribution, the ROTC-Hunters made an outstanding record both in quantity and quality. The first contingent joined us at the beaches and along the highways to Manila. They were organized, disciplined, and eager to serve. They asked for little and accomplished whatever was requested of them in a commendable manner. ROTC-Hunters Units fought with our troops in the battle for Nichols Field and Manila, and at Ternate, Macolod, Sampiro, Malaraya, Tinong, and Mt. Malepunyo. Col. Terry Adevo, the Commanding Officer, and Lt. Col. Castillo, the G-2, volunteered and flew with the first plane into Lucena in the combined Airborne-Amphibious operation which seized the town. I feel that I reflect the opinion of all tactical commanders of the division when I commend their outstanding combat record.

5. It was my experience that there were in Southern Luzon three types of Guerrilla Units. One, the professional guerrilla or bandit type, composed of men who for the large part were guerrillas as a matter of convenience. Fortunately they were greatly in the majority. Two, the late-comers or the 1944 guerrillas, largely composed of sincere men and capable enough leaders but unfortunately included some politicians and men of influence with an eye for the future. And Three, the genuine guerrilla or "patriots" composed of men motivated by a hatred of the Japanese and a desire to liberate their country. These were the units, formed shortly after Bataan who harassed the enemy during the entire occupation and who were responsible for keeping alive the spirit of resistance and who materially hampered the success of the Japanese occupation and facilitated our operations in the Philippines. Obviously, guerrillas belonging to the third group are most deserving of any reward which can be given to them, and certainly a large representation in the Philippine Army of this type of guerrilla is desirable. In my opinion, the ROTC-Hunters fit completely within this latter group.

6. Toward the close of the operations in Southern Luzon I observed that certain guerrilla units produced imposing rosters of personnel whereas actually they had been able to physically muster only a small percentage of such a strength in the field. Here again the ROTC-Hunters proved to be a sound reliable military organization. The forces was organized into standard tactical units similar to United States Army organizations with grades and ratings commensurate with the positions held and the strength of troops in each command. Their rosters presented to our guerrilla affairs officer of the division were quite accurate and included only that strength which was physically present. A comparison of their rosters and the modest ranks of their unit commanders with those of other units in the area might give the appearance that this organization was not equal in strength to other major guerrilla units of Southern Luzon. In reality, the contribution of the ROTC-Hunters to the 11th Airborne Division, both from the standpoint of intelligence and combat forces furnished, exceeded that of any other guerrilla unit in Southern Luzon.

7. I sincerely trust that this letter will be accepted in the manner intended. It is certainly not a criticism of any of the policies of the Guerrilla Affairs Section of the AFMESPAC, nor a contention of any guerrilla unit has been unjustly treated in regard to the number or its member recognized and accepted for service in the Philippine Army. I repeat again that it is a belated recommendation that the ROTC-Hunters receive a recognition quota commensurate with their contribution to the United States Forces in the Mike Six Operations if such has not already been accomplished. It is a matter on which I had intended to contact your office personally had it not been for the sudden termination of the war and my departure from the Philippine Area.
