Dear Mr. Manalac:

The Commanding General has directed that you be informed that the Sta. Mesa Unit, 44th Division, Hunters ROTC, purporting to be a guerrilla organization under your nominal control has not been favorably considered for recognition.

It is felt that the number of men recognized in the Miguel Ver Regiment, Hunters ROTC, a composite unit of the overall command under Col Eleuterio Adevos, constitutes a just and adequate acknowledgement of the military services performed by the Hunters ROTC unit.

This decision does not preclude individual requests for casualty recognition by injured personnel who desire to enter such claims. Upon request from interested individuals, appropriate casualty forms will be forwarded.

Brief History of the Sta. Mesa Unit, Manila



Even as early as the later part of 1942 when guerrilla activities flared up from all corners of the country, a group of boys who later composed the original members of the unit in Manila were already identified in the underground movements. In fact majority of them saw action during the Japanese landings in the Philippines. It was thru Capt. Amando Guarina, G-2 operative under then Capt. Bernard L. Anderson of the Anderson Guerrillas that the unit was organized sometime Nov. 1942. Several meetings were called by the original members and plans and objectives were revealed among them the following:

- a. To report to Capt. A. Guarina all places where Japanese are concentrated and to give an estimate of their strength.
- b. To recruit new members giving preference to Ex-USAFPA's to be taught guerrilla work.
- c. To propagate or spread news heard from the news in San Francisco by short wave in order to bolster the morale of the people.

Our unit enlistments increased and by the end of 1942 we had already submitted thru Capt. A. Guarina valuable information about Japanese activities in Manila outstanding among them were the following:

- a. Information about the Hakodate Dock Yards (the former Earsanawa Docks and Honolulu Iron Works) with maps and details showing exact location of the machine shop, iron shop, slipways, dockyards and gasoline tanks.
- b. Maps and details of the Engineering Island then occupied by the Japanese Navy.

Our activities were too bold that by the early part of 1943 our area was zoned by the Japanese Military Police. The majority of the members sought refuge in the provinces. After instructing the unit to lay low for a while Capt. Guarina reported to Capt. E. Anderson who was then in the Bicol region. The executive officer (Leonardo Menalao) was arrested but released forty-eight hours later for lack of evidence.

(Former Organization)

(A brief history since the unit incorporated into the 44th. "HUNTERS" Div. R.O.T.C. Guerrillas)

The Santa Mesa Unit was formally organized by orders of the Commanding Officer, 44th Div. thru Capt. Rene (tubo) Bernal with headquarters in Malabon, Rizal. The unit was organized as "Trigger Troop" or later changed to Military Police" with its Headquarters in Sta. Mesa, Manila but taking orders from Malabon. It was entrusted with the following tasks:

- a. To be a supply base for Hunters members when in Manila.
- b. To detect Filipino spies and their activities and to report them to higher-ups for proper actions.

Due to the strict Japanese surveillance of the Sta. Mesa district the "TRIGGER TROOP" were not able to function regularly aside from lack of arms. The finance and supply procurement however was very active. Cash and several pair of shoes, and a portable typewriter were submitted to the Malabon C.O. (a exact quantity of things could not be ascertained because the records were burned when the unit was captured by the Japanese Military Police.) The unit also distributed leaflets around the neighborhoods and among its sympathizers, which warns and cautions the public concerning its conduct if and when an American air-raid occurs. Typewritten news from short wave were also distributed by the members.

On July 1944 a general assembly was called by the Provost Marshall-Major Leonardo Aquino in Malabon. All Unit Commanders were present and in the meeting Lt. Lazaro Baens-C.O. of the Sta. Mesa Unit was promoted to Captain and was given charge of the Greater Manila Sector. Capt. Baens in turn divided the sector into sub-sectors and units and consequently the Roster of the Sta. Mesa Unit was changed.

The following month misfortune befell the organization with the capture of several members of the R.O.T.C. Guerrillas in Malabon with the Japs zoning of the place and among those was Capt. Lazaro Baens. The unit laid low after this for awhile, then was recalled by the P.M. - Major Leonardo Aquino, the next month, September, 1944.

The Roster again revamped, with Lt. Lt. Leonardo Mansine, former supply officer, a C.O. of the unit by it now actively and regularly functioned as a supply unit in Manila, for the G-2 thru Major-Leonardo Aquino.

This unit also contributed its share by furnishing gasoline to make the raid on the Constabulary Academy Arsenal successfully. At this time from the beginning of the U.S. air-raid up to late Nov. 1944 the Sta. Mesa Unit became aside from being a supply point a contact place for the different sectors when in Manila which took at this place for communication and supplies. Among those given help in form of cash or supplies were the following:

1. San Juan Unit-Lt. Arsenio Luna
2. Rizal (Mansaluyong) Unit-Capt. (Dado Montec)
3. Pagsanjan (Trigger) Capt. Rene Bernal (Tubo)
4. Sampaloc Unit

Then, early Nov. 1944 with Capt. Centeno of Pasig being captured and Major L. Aquino being sought after by the Japanese, the Sta. Mesa Unit was transferred to the command of Lt. Col. Hermenegildo Atienza. However due to bad transportation and dangerous communication facilities the Unit was unable to make personal contact with the C.O. Appointment was made thru Major L. Aquino. Again, after a short while with permission from Lt. Col. Atienza, the unit functioned under Capt. Inocencio Dineros as a supply unit. The C.O. Sta. Mesa Unit was again reappointed as S-4 for the 44th (Hunters Division) under Lt. Col. Johnny San Juan and Col. Narciso Pia Villa.

Supplies submitted thru Capt. I. Dineros:

1. Cash in Japanese currency
2. Battery about 15-17 plates
3. Portable Typewriter
4. Office Equipments

On 22nd Nov. 1944 the Sta. Mesa Unit Hq. was discovered thru treachery of a coaguerrilla member and important papers and documents were taken (T.W., maps, credentials, and receipts) by the Japs W.P. and all members including the C.O. Leonardo Masalac left Manila and sought refuge in Pagasañan Sector under Capt. Rene Barzal. Only the 2nd-in command, 2nd Lt. Feliciano Terralita was left to cooperate with Capt. I. Dineros.

After things quieted down in Manila, on Jan. 1945, the C.O. of the Sta. Mesa Unit began to assemble the boys again. At zero hour was approaching the Unit was organized this time as a sabotage and combat unit.

Sometime Jan. 1945 with the American Landing in Luzon the unit began its activities to secure firearms and ammunition. Thru a Chinese friend, the C.O. contacted a party of Formosan soldiers, special guards of the Bilbid Prison of P.O.W. who voiced their decision to desert the Japs. The party consisting of five soldiers surrendered their two American rifles, Bayonets, and 100 rds. of ammunition on condition that protection and subsistence be given them. The party was hidden in the house of the C.O. - secret Hq. of the Unit. The Formosans were interned by the American Forces who first entered the City.

( A DAY NARRATION OF ACTIVITIES ON 0-HOUR )

FEBRUARY 1, 1945

Since freedom of movement was already restricted by the Japanese inside Manila, we lost contact with other organizations other than those near our sector. I contacted Captain Palacios of the Hamsay Guerrillas and agreed to cooperate with his forces at the zero-hour.

At 10:00 P. M., the Japanese set fire to the residence of Leon Santos at Pareda St., which they occupied earlier. The people around started looting as the Japs vacated including the school house but they were shot at and there were some slight casualties. We gave accommodations to some of the fire victims. Fortunately no body got hurt as a result of the fire.

February 2, 1945

Because we lost contact with our organization we prepared to act independently for the meantime. Earlier this day we heard reports that a certain resident of Sta. Mesa, by the name of Carreon (who is married to a Japanese woman) has in his possession several pistols and ammunitions which the Japanese Military Police left him most probably for his defense. Carreon is a pro-Japs and has strong connections with the Japs M. P. Our first activity then was to raid the carreon strong hold. After searching the household from top to bottom we found instead of arms and ammunitions several cases of Japs' M. P. properties as clothes, boots, shoes, flags, sabers etc. This was taken by Capt. Palacios of the Hamsay Guerrillas who has assumed temporary command. We interned the whole family.

At 4:00 P. M. for the first time after three years of Jap dominations we planted the American Flag together with the Filipino banner at the foot of the Sta. Mesa bridge. Our joy was short-lived however, as our guards reported the sighting of a carretela loaded with the Japs soldiers going towards Betonda presumably to re-enforce their garrison at the Acetylene Tank Factory in Aviles street. We prepared to stop them and so we deployed on both sides of the road.

The Japs advanced unsuspectingly and at a distance of about 100 yards we started firing. At the first shot a Jap Navy officer was hit. The others seeing the plight of their G. O. were demoralized and ran towards a nearby open field. After several exchange of fire we succeeded in surrounding them. Three were killed outright, one committed suicide and the Major surrendered. We could not take prisoners so we killed him also. The horse and carretela loaded with supplies for the Aviles Garrison was captured and taken to the compounds of the National Development Co. ~~All killed were Navy officers. We did not have any casualties.~~

After the fight we held a conference regarding the defense of the National Development Co. and the Sta. Mesa District, which the Japanese attempted to burn. We were sure that they would retaliate or else send another reinforcement from their garrison in Santol District. We posted guards at strategic places and agreed to retreat to the Nat. Dev. Compound if any strong enemy force overcame us. We determined to defend the Nat. Dev. Co. at all cost and placed sentries at every approach to the compound. We patrolled the whole range ~~to make the most accurate.~~

February 3, 1945

Fortunately no Japs came up to early the next morning. They were about a company strong. So we held our fire for they were too strong for us. The last soldier in the enemy column (a Formosan we found out later) hid in an air-råd shelter and we captured him alive. After taking his rifle and ammunitions we killed him also because we could not afford to take prisoners at that time. Soon after that, major Petronilo Mateo (Dodo) of the Mandaluyong Unit came to our sector with his Rizal Force. I at once reported to him and we consolidated our forces into one. We agreed to report to Santo Tomas University Head Quarters, which was already in the hands of the U. S. Army. Dividing my men into two groups, with one group to stay in the compounds of the Nat. Dev. Co. to help in its defense. I went with Major Mateo to Sto. Tomas University and left some force against any possible Japanese infiltrations from San Juan or from the south side of the river. With the combined forces of about 80 men we reported to Major Beltwell, U. S. A. Upon requesting for more arms we were ordered to come back this afternoon. We were to bring also a captured Japanese map showing the detailed position of the Yamashita line. We went again the same afternoon with the map and Japanese sabers. Halfway we met the advanced unit of the U. S. Army. An American officer then asked us to name the place where we know there are Japanese concentrations. We pointed out several places including San Sebastian Church steeple, Japanese machinegun nests in Pina Street, Santo district, and the Aviles garrison.

We proceeded again to our temporary headquarters in the Nat. Dev. Co. compounds. We then received a report about Japanese sniper near the Sta. Mesa railroad station. It proved to be a lone Japanese whom we pursued and later on captured. However we suffered one casualty, hit thru the arm by machinegun bullet from the other side of the river.

At about five in the afternoon an American column started attacking the Aviles garrison. We cooperated in the fight being on the left flank while the Americans were on the right. After a hot exchange of fire we were ordered to fall back as it was nearing dark. We resumed the attack the next day wiping out the entire defending force of the Japanese machines.

February 4, 1945

We established our headquarters at Sta. Mesa street near the Nat. Dev. Co. The Americans occupied the compounds the same day and we cooperated with them in guarding the place.

February 5, 1945

From this date on our activities have been confined to relief work, police work and sanitation.

1. Relief work:

Establishment of a clinic at 160 Sta. Mesa with ~~approval~~ of one physician, a pharmacist and three first aiders. Medical supplies were secured thru the donations of charitable persons and drugstores. As medical supplies were running low, I requested the medical officer of the PECAU #21, Capt. Lim for help in securing medicines. After Capt. Lim inspected the clinic he was prompted to recognize it but had it transferred to the Burgos Elem. School building.

Up to the time of its transfer we have served an approximately hundred cases of slight and serious injuries. (Attached herewith is a list of our patients from the date of establishment Feb. 8, 1945 to the time it was transferred to the Pecau 21.

2. Accommodations for refugees from the south of Manila were given also at house number 165 Sta Mesa including food taken from our supply. Attached also is a list of refugees given shelter.

3. Free clothing were distributed to fire victims in Stm. Mesa.

POLICE WORK

1. Cooperated with the American Military police in our area in rounding up suspicious characters as the following:

(a) Feb. 8, 1945 -- Investigated one Mr. Bausa, resident of Sta Mesa on charge of being a member of the HAKAPILI being secretary to Pio Duran the big chief and founder of the same organization. Turned over to the Pil-American Guerrillas, they being in charge of the sector.

(b) Cooperated with a American intelligence officer in the investigation of a chinese supposed to be a Japanese.

(c) March 8, 1945 -- Apprehended chinese named Dy Chiu alleged to be a Japanese living in Pasood Sta Mesa. Released upon producing proper credentials.

2. Robbery Cases:

(a) March 8, 1945-- Apprehended one Benito del Rosario resident of our area on charge of robbery. The case was settled amicably when part of the stolen wares were returned.

(b) March 9, 1945 -- Caught red-handed one minor delinquent accused by one Mrs. Rosa Javier. Settled amicably too as the robbery was foiled.

(c) Upon request of some bonafied residents in our place I issued papers proving them to be law abiding citizens.

3. February 9 - 10, 1945- The area around Stassa are mostly fields with coque grass. For two successive days we combed every inch of ground for possibility of snipers, but produced no results except to quiet the fears of the neighbors.

SANITATION works

1. Upon request of certain persons we instructed the refugees seeking quarters in the Magt-ha School building to follow rules of sanitation as waste disposal, water procurement, cooking facilities and such. The same was done with the refugees in the Burgos Elem. School building.
