In accordance with verbal instructions from Chief of Section, Cuerrilla Affairs, G-3 AFMESPAC, Lieutenants Max L. Brabson and Elisso Sta. Romans on 9 Sept 1946 proceeded to Melasiqui, Pengasinan to contact the 2nd Provisional En 3rd Pangasinan Regt, in order to determine whether or not this organization should be recognized by the United States Army. The following report is a summary of the investigation and basis for the recommendation.

## ALLEGED HISTORY

During March 1942, by authority from Lt Col Edwin P Ramsey, Mr. Pascual Pinlac organized the 2nd Provisional Bn, 3rd Pangasinan Regt consisting of approximately 500 officers and enlisted men in the town of Malesiqui and surrounding barrios. Approximately 466 members from 2nd Provisional Battalion have previously been recognized.

At the time of organization, the unit had about 200 rifles with ammunition which were left behind by the Philippine Army at the outbreak of the war. During the early period of the occupation the unit was active in the pecification and conservation of the norals of the civilian population. Also, other acts of restance such as sabotage, espionage, herrassing the Japanese, intelligence and propaganda work was carried out by this unit. During November 1944, the unit received two intelligence peratives sent by GHG, SNFA from Australia. At this time the unit gathered necessary information expediting and facilitating the operatives mission.

During Jamuary 1945 the unit began operating actively by force against the Japanese in the Municipality of Malasiqui and surrounding barries. The day when the American planes bombed Malasiqui, the 2nd Provisional Bn attacked the Japanese garrison within the town killing 8 Japanese soldiers and causing the retreat of the remainder. At the same time approximately 12 rifles and some revolvers were captured. When the planes returned the following day to bomb the town they were greeted by the unit which was flying American flag from the Municipal building, Church and school buildings. When the liberation forces arrived the unit had been active in destroying enemy defense positions.

On 10 January 1945 the 632md Tamb Destroyer Bettalion, USA was contacted and the 2nd Provisional En attached itself to that unit. The 2nd Provisional En operated in coordination with the 632md En in clearing the Japanese stronghold in the Cabaruan Hills. When the 632md En in clearing the Provisional En under the command of Mejor Pascual Pinlac were moved to Urdaneta a detachment of 40 men was left behind in the town of Melaskqui for guard and patrol duty. Upon the arrival of the 6th Ranger En these men were attached to that unit for approximately one month. Their attachment assistated the 6th Ranger En by serving as guides, scouts, interpreters

and in a combat capacity. When the 6th Ranger Bn transferred from Malasiqui the detachment stayed behind as security for the town.

According to verbal reports by recognized guerrillas and civilians of the Malasiqui area, the 2nd Provisional En of which this roster is a portion, was one of the most active guerrilla units in that area throughout the occupation and liberation.

Col Juan Benites, Chief of Staff, Pangasinan-Parlac Military District (PMMD) stated that he personally knew of the Excellent work done by the Finlac brothers of the 2nd Provisional Bn. Also, Captain B. C. Tabora, FS, a member of the Guerrilla Affairs Branch stated that he had personal contact with this unit during the occupation and that he was sure it was the most active unit in that area. He recommended that the supplementary roster be recognized for the period of attachment to American Troops

It was stated by the commanding officer that, before the arrival of the American troops, only a portion of the members were armed but when the Americans reached Malasiqui the 2nd Provisional Bn became attached and it was completely supplied with arms. When the 6th Ranger left Malasiqui all issued arms were returned to them but no receipts were issued. The 4.

The Japa who were only 8 by this time were not able to fine at all. All of them were killed. About a week after, Japs hideout was found in a ferest in Pelagar. A plateen invaded the defence line of the Japs. The Japs were estimated to be arend 100 in number and were using American made firearms. It was during the fight with these Japs that Lt. Juan Tamenneng of my unit and one Officer of the T.D. buttalien were killed. This was 9th May.

When we found that Japs concentrated in one place for better defence, The T.B. bettslier, opened Artillery fire on the hidseuts of Japa on May 15. After the shelling, about 50 American soldiers and all my 40 men disected the hidseuts of the Japa We were able to find only 18 Japa fall of this were killed. The difficulty we had in the fight with the Japa is that they gradually bransfer from one place to another. When we killed all Japa that we find in a certain groups, we would hear again in other places on the fellowing days enother groups of Japaness. At knark last we found out that Japa in the Sanbales mentains were coming down through Mangateres to our hills, because of lack of feed. We get this information from a certain Japanese efficer whom we camptured right in the heart of the term proper.

June At this peried, there were still several Japanese soldiers taking refuge in the seatern part of Malesdaui, commonly known as Cobarovan Hills. These Japanese stranglers are disturbing the people around their hideouts. Occasionally, this Japanese set at high time, and steel hegs, cattles, chickens, rice and all kinds of footcutifs from the civilians; and seatchines, they repowere, maltract men and in several instances even killed insecont ivilians.

To put an end to all these barbardenests of the Hammese and ditinately to rige them ent, I divided the handful of man left under my command into three squais, each squad is designated to de partel duty in groups of barries frequented by Japa. The barries meetly evered by their outes of my patrolaare clee, Gatang, Unamie, Baktim, Palong, Ispa, Allaga, Malingoe, Lasip, Mansaiguan and Taleyan. In several instances, sepecially at high time, the patrola had elables with the Japa. I did not immediately make a direct assault on the Japa for their hidseuts could not be determined.

Finally, when my patrels had mapped out the more or less permanent hideoute of the Japs, this was on orabeut the midale of Muly, I assembled all my man. I contacted Capt. James Sawar, officer in charge of the 62md T.B. Battalion for aid. His men and my manwent to the Cabarwam Hilss for the final assault to the Japs struglers. On this finalessault, I counted 17 Japanese and found inside the cave 7 macks full office, 21 Jap rifles and several plates and other utensile, perhaps used by the Japs. On our side, only one American seldier was killed and one guerrile wounded.

From that time on, though my men continued to make patrel duty they did never encounter any Jap nor heard any information that there are still Japanese around. At this juncture, I fully believed that the last Jap has already been exterminated. In all the comparing fer the month of July, 31 Japa were counted dead and 1 Jap was captured glive.

When there are no more Jays in Malasiqui, I with the other efficers and men in the detaclment under me, followed our Batteliant Bayemben, Rusya Vi, cays. This was I September, 1945.
