Dear Mr. Sadsad:

The Commanding General has directed that you be informed that the "1st Regiment, Batuan Military District, East Central Luzon Guerrilla Area", purporting to be a guerrilla organization under your nominal control, is not favorably considered for recognition as an element of the Philippine Army.

A set of general requirements for guerrilla recognition, established by General MacArthur during the liberation of the Philippines, has been used as a guide in considering the record of this unit. After careful investigation and full consideration of all substantiating records and testimony of witnesses having pertinent knowledge, recognition of this guerrilla unit is not deemed to be warranted because of reasons mentioned below:

- a. Record of service was not substantiated by sufficient acceptable evidence.
- b. The unit was not maintained satisfactorily in the field in opposition to the enemy.
- c. Activities of the unit did not contribute materially to the eventual defeat of the enemy.
- d. Performance of the unit did not indicate adequate control by its leaders, because of desertion of personnel to join other units.
- e. Members of the unit did not devote their entire effort to military activities in the field to the exclusion of normal civilian occupation and family obligations.

It is considered that the previous recognition of active combat units from the 1st Regiment which were recognized by the Commanding General Sixth Army for their aid during the liberation of the Philippines constitutes adequate and best acknowledgment of military service.

It is requested that you comply with the provisions of Executive Order No. 68, by the President of the Philippines, dated 20 September 1945, copy attached.

Report on the "1st Regiment Boone's Guerrillas,
Bataan Military District"

Lt. Rollie E. Allen and M/Sgt Frank Bernhack proceeded to Dinalupihan, Bataan, on 7 August 1946 to determine whether or not the 1st Regiment, Boone's Guerrillas, Bataan Military District should be recognized by the US Army.

Record of service was not substantiated by sufficient acceptable evidence, for records or papers of any kind-origi-nals, duplicates or true copies were offered to the investiga-ting officer.

The unit was not maintained satisfactorily in the field in opposition to the enemy, as most of the members not previously recognized remained at home growing food and doing other civili-an occupations. Executive Officer estimated 800 men remained home.

RESTRICTED

Activities of the unit did not contribute materially to the eventual defeat of the enemy, for the only combat occurred when the Japs raided mountain camps and trapped the men, and this happened very seldom.

Performance of the unit did not indicate adequate control by its leaders because of desertion to form other units. Men from this unit have left it to join units with more promising prospects of recognition. Many men belonged to two or more units without their officers being aware of it.

Members of the unit did not devote their entire efforts to military activities in the field to the exclusion of normal civilian occupations and family obligation. The majority of the members on the supplementary roster of this unit remained at home and carried on with their civilian occupations.

✓ Lt. Col. Ramsey and Maj. Boone stated that the previous recognition of 1,300 members of the 1st Regiment, Boone Guerrillas EMD, constituted adequate and just acknowledgement of services rendered.

No useful purpose would be served by further investigation of this unit.

POLITICAL ASPECTS:

This unit does not appear to have any political affiliations or aspirations.

RECOMMENDATIONS:

After carefull consideration of the statements made by the present members and an analysis of the documents presented, it is recommended that with the exception of those already recognized, the "1st Regiment, Boone's Guerrillas, EMD" be not favorably considered for recognition.

Report on the "1st Regiment Boone's Guerrillas,
Bataan Military District"

In accordance with verbal orders from Chief of Section, Guerrilla Affairs Branch, G-3, AFWESPAC, Lt Rollie E. Allen and M/Sgt Frank Bernacki proceeded to Dinalupihan, Bataan, on 7 Aug 46 to determine whether or not the 1st Regt, Boone's Guerrillas, Bataan Military District should be recognized by the US Army. The following report is a summary of the investigation and the basis for the recommendation.

ALLEGED HISTORY

The 1st Regt was organized in May 1942 by Ceferino Regala under orders from Col John P. Boone, then an American guerrilla leader. Recruiting began in the town of Dinalupihan, Bataan, which was later made the headquarters of the unit. Regala assumed the rank of Lt Col and recruited from 100 men in 1942 to 25000 men in 1945.

This organization consists of Headquarters, Engineer Bn, Service Coq and three rifle battalions. All of the units were composed of men from and near Dinalupihan. A few of the men who were wanted by the Japanese lived in the hills as guerrillas while the other members lived at home supplying the guerrillas and supporting their families.

During the occupation, the units' sole activity was collecting arms and organizing more guerrilla bands. Some of the men went as far as Mariveles, Bataan to secure abandoned rifles.

On several occasions, the Japanese attacked the small camps in the mountains and the men were forced to engage in a little combat before fleeing.

When the Americans landed, Colonel Boone and his guerrilla joined the 38th Div, and fought in the battle of Zig-Zag Pass and remained later with American units until October 1945. Everyone of these men were recognized. They are the ones who lived in the mountains and suffered the hardships.

Sabotage work was practically non-existent and at most two bridges were burned.

The now unrecognized guerrillas went home shortly after the American landings to wait as reserves. By the time the liberation was over, they

had already returned to their farms.

Upon investigating the "1st Regt, Boone's Grlas" it was found that the leaders of this organization did not have adequate control over its members, nor the various battalions under their command. Men in this unit have left it to join other units with more promising prospects of recognition. Many of the men belonged to two or more units without their officers being aware of it.

The Commanding Officer of the 1st Regt, Ceferino Regala, is now being held in jail in Dinalupihan, Bataan, for the murder of three men during the occupation. One man who was killed was the Mayor of Dinalupihan and had given the guerrillas in the area much valuable information and supplies. Charges were brought against Regala by men in his own unit.

Activities of this unit during the occupation consisted mostly of gathering arms in the mountains of Bataan and individuals sabotage. Sabotage by this unit was limited to burning two bridges and cutting communication lines between Dinalupihan and Olongapo several times. In Oct 44, this unit had a fight with a guerrilla unit of Hukbalahaps who were also getting supplies in Bataan. The unit claims that the real cause of the battle was that the Huks were confiscating arms of their men.

The only combat against the Japs occurred when the Japs raided their mountain camps and trapped the men. Such incidents took place on few occasions and there were never many casualties on either side.

Men of the unit who were wanted or known by the Japs lived in the hillside camps of Bataan, food being provided by voluntary contributions of the civilians. The men not suspected of guerrilla activities lived safely at home growing rice and other commodities. Some of their crops were given to support the guerrillas. When questioned as to the number of men living at home, the Ex Off estimated that over 800 were able to continue growing crops. Another officer stated that the regiment met once a month for instructions and orders.

A letter to this office from a resident of Dinalupihan revealed that extensive recruiting of any person available in 1945 was pursued to fill out rosters before submitting them to Guerrilla Affairs Branch.

Upon the landing of the 38th Division, Col Boone attached his guerrillas to the 146th Infantry. Approximately 1,300 men from this unit were recognized as participating with the 149th Infantry. Some 800 men of the unit were left behind in their homes to serve as reserves. They were held in reserve at home due to the lack of supplies and of course these reserves were not recognized. A few men were used by the 38th Div on a labor gang. It appears that these men are the only ones now asking recognition from this regiment.

No records or papers of any kind originals, duplicates of true copies were offered to the investigating officer as evidence of valuable activities. Officers of the unit claim that all papers were given to AFWESPAC and should be in their files, but a thorough search failed to reveal any of them. Major Boone and Lt Col Ramsey recommend this unit for recognition.

POLITICAL ASPECTS

This unit does not appear to have any political affiliations or aspirations.

RECOMMENDATIONS

After careful consideration of the statements made by the presenting members and an analysis of the documents presented, it is recommended that with the exception of those already recognized, the "1st Regt, Boone's GrLas; BMD" be not favorably considered for recognition.



DETAILED ACTIVITIES OF Lieut Col ANTONIO S TRINIDAD

ORGANIZER of the Bataan Military District (USAFEE Guer)
As organizer of the Bataan Military District after having received commission from Capt. Bell, I made extensive secret campaigns throughout the whole province of Bataan traveling from place to place under the guise of peddler and at times as a merchant, propagating the doctrines and principles of the Guerrilla movement with Lieut Col. Ceferino M. Regala and Major Santiago Sadsad. We prepared a tentative program of activities; appointed the first set of temporary officers to fill important positions; established temporary Cp at Cabunayan Mount; sent out sub-organizers and gathered arms and ammunitions where we met Capt. John P. Boone who, after learning about the ideals that we pursue consented to be our Commanding Officer.

INDUCTED into the services of the Guerilla Forces of Commonwealth of the Philippines and commissioned a Major and assigned Vice-Commander of the Bataan Military District, on 15 May 42.

DESIGNATED Chief of Staff on 16 May 42 with the following important duties; General control and supervision of the different offices and sections of the GHR; assumed command in the absence of the Div. Cmdr; Reg'tl Cmdrs were directly responsible to the C of S and the latter to the Div. CO; issued orders and signed papers for the CO. On 10 Nov. 42 Cp at Cabunayan Mount raided by Japs where I was captured and confined in the Garrison at Dinalupihan, Bataan. Released several days after torture. I was Chief of Staff until 30 Dec. 44. Cp was raided again on 22 Feb. 43. While celebration for Washington's Birthday was at height, fierce fighting took place, and 35 Japs were killed with no mortalities on our side.

PROMOTED Lieut Colonel with same assignment.

APPOINTED Inspector General. As such, I made periodic tours within the whole district to fine out the conditions of the morale of the men, their health, activities, food-supplies, training received, accomplishments and I coordinated works and activities of different units; gave instructions to Liaison Officers who were under my supervision, acquaint the CO, of important informations and helped him formulate his program of military policies, aside from representing him in important conferences.

UNIT RECOGNIZED. On 1 Feb. 45 we occupied the town of Dinalupihan, Bataan, established the Dic. Cp thereat, after forcing the enemies out of the town in a fierce encounter. On 2 Feb. 45 we met the advance patrol of the 36th Div. US ARMY, established contact with them, gave them valuable intelligence information. On 3 Feb. 45 unit was attached to the 36th Div., furnished them guides and men to construct by-passes, bridges and cub strips. On succeeding dates we gave them men of different units to operate with them in different sectors of the province. On 8 Feb. 45 we formed the Alamo Scouts to do patrol duties at Pantifigan, Mariveles, and Bagac Areas under Lt. Thompson. I represented the CO in several conferences with different Commanding Officers of Allied Units.

SOEM, received instructions in military courtesy and discipline, infantry drills, chemical warfare, map reading, military tactics and strategem etc.

AUTOBIOGRPHY IN BRIEF OF BVT. LT. COLONEL ANTONIO S.
TRINIDAD, INSPECTOR GENERAL, BATAAN MILITARY DISTRICT, GFCP

I was born in the humble town of Dinalupihan, province of Bataan on May 10, 1903. There I first saw the light of day until I got married and reared a family of six (6) children two of whom are now with the guerrilla forces in Bataan. Before the outbreak of the war in this part of the Orient seas, I was a poor yet peaceful farmer with a little farm of my own tilled by the toil of my hands. Being a simple farmer, I did not only care for my own existence on the face of the earth but also nurtured in my heart of hearts a keen interest in the welfare of my fellowmen because I am of the opinion that a man has a primordial duty not only to himself but also to his country especially to those who are poor and who by reason of their poverty are most often the victims of injustices and base prejudices. I organized in the town of Dinalupihan an association so-called and termed "SOCIETY OF THE SONS OF TOIL" of which organization, I am up to date the humble President by choice of the members thereof. Thru my own initiative, I organized this association throughout Bataan and because of its legal, moral, noble and lofty aims and principles, many people did not hesitate to join under its banner and platform. Throughout the period of my incumbency as President of the aforementioned organization I have exerted all my efforts, all my energy and risked my life and spent my own money in defense of the in-born and paramount rights of the individuals members of my organization before the courts of justice, administrative tribunal and elsewhere wherever in my humble opinion their rights are set to naught and trampled upon in defiance of the laws which guarantee to every man the free enjoyment and the free exercise of certain fundamental rights.

The current war with all its heart-breaking and horrible aftermaths and tales of countless annihilated lives following the path of every war-machine in its mission of death, ruin and destruction was so painful to be borne and seen by the observing eye of the society which I founded and organized in defense of the rights of down-trodden men. On the 10th day of February, 1942, thru the help of BVE. Lt. Col. Ceferino M. Regala, Commanding Officer of the First Regiment of guerrilla in the Bataan Military District, I organized many citizens of the province of Bataan whom I considered imbued with courage, determination and love of the motherland into one organization sworn to establish a free government inspired by the moral teachings of God, by the fundamental rights of men and by the cardinal principles of human justice. In the mountain fastnesses of the province of Bataan, we gathered and organized this free government pledged to sacrifice at all costs and never to submit to the exploitation, domination and oppression of the imperialistic, fantastic and machevellian greed of the Japanese Empire. Our primordial aim is to continue our rational fight against the Japanese Forces and keep the banner of the Commonwealth of the Philippines hovering freely over the Philippine skies particularly over Bataan as far as our organization was concerned and to let sway to the principles of democracy, liberty and fraternity implanted by the Great and Altruistic American nation in this part of the globe. It was likewise our firm purpose to defend human justice which is the bulwark of all democratic governments on the surface of the earth. Nay, it was our determined desire to defend the Philippines and America against the deadly tentacles of the Japanese war-machine. Against all forms of odds, hardships, and handicaps like hunger, sickness and want of food and medicine and all sorts of human sacrifice, we were able to organize all over Bataan. We named our organization later into GUERRILLAS.

After the fall of Bataan, we met BVT. Ebl. John P. Boone in the mountain fastness of Bataan. Because we knew he is a real soldier and gentleman, we choose him to be our Commander, while I was chosen Chief of Staff and Col. Ceferino M. Regala, the commanding officer of the First Regiment in the town of Dinalupihan, Province of Bataan. Because our men rapidly increased in number we established headquarters in the mountains of Cabunayan, municipality of Dinalupihan, Province of Bataan. Side by side with the rapid increase in the number of men in our organization was the hot pursuit and investigation by the Japanese Forces of the existence of our resistance movement against them. My first encounter with the Japanese Forces was almost tragic to my life and my career of resistance against the Japanese Forces. This happened on November 10, 1942 in the mountains of Cabunayan, Dinalupihan, Bataan. I was caught by the Japanese Forces accompanied by policemen of the municipality of Dinalupihan, then, under the mayorship of Mayor Apolonio R. Diaz. I was brought to the Headquarters of the Japanese Forces in Guagua, province of Pampanga and there I suffered the worst beating and all forms of corporal punishment from the hands of the Japanese soldiers that only a hard-boiled animal or beast could withstand and suffer. After then days of imprisonment after I was transferred from the Guagua garrison to the Dinalupihan garrison of the Japanese forces I was released already badly battered by the cruel Hands of the Japanese soldiers who treated me like a beast in my prison cell since my capture in the mountains of Cabunayan. My sufferings in my prison cell did not dampen my spirit and determination to continue resistance movement against the Japanese Forces. On the other hand those untold sufferings in my prison cell only inspired me more than ever in my firm purpose to resist the Japanese Forces in Bataan. I returned to our camp in the mountain of Cabunayan a more determine guerrillero against the Japanese Forces.

On the 22nd day of February 1943, the Japanese Forces again raided our camp in the mountains of Cabunayan and there Col. Boone, Major Ramsey and Major Delanon were with me. We engaged in a fight against the Japanese Forces and Major Delanon figured mostly in leading the fight. Because of the superiority ~~of~~ in arms and men of the Japanese Forces, we retreated and the Japanese Forces were able to capture from us thirty (30) rifles, five (5) sacks of rice and various kinds of food and equipment and one (1) radio receiving set. The Japanese Forces burned our cottages in our camp at Cabunayan after that encounter. Since then the more our sufferings and sacrifices increased by hours. We slept in the midst of the forest and on the ground without even any sleeping paraphernalia nor anything to cover ourselves against mosquito bites in the midst of my forests infested with deadly malaria. Thanks to the kindness of the civilian population in the town of Dinalupihan. At the risks of their lives and in the midsts of all sorts of dangers to themselves, they sent to us food and other equipments for our use. I did not mind all these sacrifices that I suffered together with my comrades in my resistance movement against the Japanese Forces because of my fervent love of country and human justice. I pushed through and through towards the realization of my noble mission.

Upon orders to Col. Regala and Major Sadsad, my officers and men began collecting all sorts of arms that we can possible gather in Pantingan, in the boundary line of Balanga and Bagac, and also in the town of Mariveles, province of Bataan. In the course of this important mission many of my men undergo untold hardships and most of them suffered death in the hands of the Japanese Empire forces. In spite of our difficult existence in the mountains where we sought refuge with our families, our men rapidly increase in number because I believe that no person with a balanced common sense can withstand and bear the heavy cross and calvary of the Japanese beastlike cruelties against the Filipino race. While I wait for the day of the redemption of my native land from the cruel hands of the Japanese Forces, I shudder at the activities of certain bandits who take advantage of the situation and robbed their own people. I punish to the limit thieves, bandits,

and any person whom I found to lawless and commit many atrocities against the civilian population who have suffered a lot in this war like us. But never did I ever take the law into my own hands and abused my authority and power behind me even against those who have oppressed me before the outbreak of the war because I knew that the unity of the Filipino people is indispensable in the attainment of our lofty aims in our resistance movement against the Japanese Forces. The guerrilla organization that I founded and organized was entirely devoted to the welfare of my country.

Time came when my humble name became notorious among the Japanese Forces. They hunted me but to no avail. They were not able to capture me again. Following their dirty tactics, their last recourse against me was to burn my house and confiscated the little amount of property I owned at the sweat of my brow.

For almost three long and solid years I suffered all forms of hardships----- beating by the Japanese soldiers, hunger, sickness and sleepless nights and various sorts of life's travails together with my poor wife and children. But never did I lose hope and courage to carry on and on for I had the firm conviction that God, Almighty God in his Infinite Wisdom will set a day for the setting of the sun and a day of painful reckoning of cruel and inhuman nation like Japan. Thanks Heaven! At last by the help of God, the Great American nation----- the Glorious Redeemer of Human Liberties returned to Bataan to save the Filipinos from the cruel clutches of Japanese Imperialism. This is the happiest moment in my life not because my sufferings has terminated but because I believe that with the coming of the American Forces in the Philippines, my country has been relieved of its sacrifices and difficulties and oppression from the Japanese Forces.

At last the government of the castle and for the castle and for the Japanese of the Japanese Empire has been crushed to the ground by the combined efforts of the Filipino and American forces. By the help of God and by the altruism of the Great American nation, a government of laws imbued with the principles of American democracy, liberty and fraternity will soon be re-established all over liberated Philippines.
