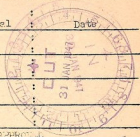

Dear Mr. Ocampo:

The Commanding General has directed that you be informed that the "General Service Troops, 6th Regiment, PND, ECLGA," purporting to be a guerrilla organization under your nominal control, is not favorably considered for recognition as an element of the Philippine Army.

A set of general requirements for guerrilla recognition, established by General MacArthur during the liberation of the Philippines, has been used as a guide in considering the record of this unit. After careful investigation and full consideration of all substantiating records and testimony of witnesses having pertinent knowledge, recognition of this guerrilla unit is not deemed to be warranted because of reasons mentioned below:

a. Record of service was not substantiated by sufficient acceptable evidence.

It is considered that the previous recognition of approximately 1791 officers and men from the Northwest Pampanga Military District, ECLGA who were recognized by the Commanding General, AFWESTPAC for their aid during the liberation of the Philippines constitutes adequate and just acknowledgment of military service.

It is requested that you comply with the provisions of Executive Order No. 68, by the President of the Philippines, dated 26 September 1945, copy attached.

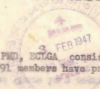

1. Request that SABOTAGE UNIT, GST, 6th Regt., Pampanga Military District, ECLGA, whose roster together with casualties of mentioned unit which were inadvertently omitted in the roster submitted and inclosed in BASIC: Ltr., HQ, GST, 6th Regt., Pampanga Military District, subj: "Request for Recognition", dated January 24, 1946, be added and inclosed thereto for the following reasons:

a. Clerk have over-looked in copying roster, and on noting duplicate copy kept in file and original of which submitted, subject personnel were discovered omitted.

b. Casualties have been clearly emphasized in sub-par., b, of mentioned basic letter, but due to clerical error same can not be found on inclosed roster of unit already submitted.

c. Personnel of this unit have also been actually and actively attached to all units mentioned in sub-par., b, of mentioned basic letter entitled "Request for Recognition", dated January 24, 1946 with medical attendants who did also serve in the same capacity as that of their designation with us to the 71st and 98th Evacuation Hospital.

2. The following is the important activities of SABOTAGE UNIT, which has been accomplished to my full satisfaction:

a. Nov. 12, 1942 Japs food stuff bound from Manila to Dagupan was thrown overboard the train, and was taken for use of my unit.

b. Dec. 27, 1942 gasoline at railroad station was and has been by them spilled and have killed two Japs guard.

c. Mar. 10, 1943 a Japs cotton inspector on an inspection tour riding a bicycle was kidnaped and killed by same at Balibago, Tarlac.

d. May 20, 1944 Japs Bodega was raided and coconut oil taken by SABOTAGE UNIT who in turn distributed it to civilians.

e. Jan. 9, 1945 train carrying guns and ammunition from San Jose was derailed at San Jacinto, Victoria, Tarlac; and Japs retreated to secure aid.

f. Jan. 17, and 18, 1945 telephone lines running in all direction of their command were cut and destroyed.

3. In view of the foregoing it is desired that favorable consideration be accorded subject officer and enlisted men whose names appear in the inclosed roster.

1. Request that GST, 6th Regiment, Pampanga Military District, 3D1GA, be given recognition, effective date to be 24 January, 1945; certificate of attachment, and reasons are herewith inclosed and furnished for the information and guidance of that Headquarters.

a. At as early as 18 January 1945 my unit was ordered to proceed to Tarlac, to meet and guide the Liberation Forces; and in Tarlac proper, (capital of the province), or or about 22, January, 1945, we encountered the last Japs garrison; numbered to about (50), and we were able to drive them up in the hills nearby.

b. On 24 January, 1945 we were first attached to 71st Evacuation Hospital, under the command of Dol. Grenade up to 30 January 1945; and from January, 1945 to March, 1945; attached to 98th Evacuation Hospital under the command of Colonel Banker; and again from March, 1945 to the early part of May, 1945, attached to 333rd Signal Corps, and from then on up to 14 July, 1945, we were actively attached to the 28th Signal Corps; and during all these period of attachment, we encounter several engagement against Japs stragglers, in which we lost no opportunity in getting all of them; and on our side we lost a few casualties as can be noted in the attached roster of unit.

c. The 28th Signal Corps was ordered to moved to Bataan, and we further served to them in the same capacity, as security guards, patrol and Military Police duties up to the time when my unit was released from attachment on 14 July, 1945, that was when above mentioned U S ARMY unit was ordered to moved again to OKI-NAWA.

d. When my unit was relieved from attachment our HQ, 6th Regt, PND, was already dissolved, (dissolution of same was effective 7 June, 1945), without having instructions received either from U S ARMY units at the time, I had no way of knowing what to do, except to establish our temporary HQ, for sometime in Tarlac

and in Porac, Pampanga, waiting for the result of our services rendered to all U S ARMY units above mentioned; I have inquired after sometime from all available Headquarters and to HPA as to whether my men appear in the recognized roster; in as much as it was our belief that having been attached actively to U S ARMY units we are automatically recognized.

3. It was not until very recently when our names do not appear in any recognized roster did we understand that we have been abandoned; after I inquired further as to what action shall I take to insure the status of my unit, did I only come to know that it was required of an abandoned guerrilla unit to submit a request for recognition before it shall be considered recognized and get paid.

2. In view of the foregoing it is believed that immediate and full consideration to subject officers and enlisted men shall be acted upon.

1. Quoted hereunder is a message from Gen. MacArthur received on four January at zero four two zero zero six:

Quote "IT IS DESIRED THAT ALL AVAILABLE MEANS BE TAKEN TO DESTROY ENEMY WIRE COMMUNICATIONS, EXCLUSIVE OF MANILA; POWER LINES, ROAD HOUSES, ROLLING STOCKS, TRUCKS, SPURS, TRACKS AND OTHER MEANS OF TRANSPORTATION STARTING IMMEDIATELY AND EXERT EVERY EFFORT THROUGH EMPLOYMENT OF ALL MEANS AVAILABLE TO RESTRICT THE MOVEMENT OF ENEMY FORCES ON THE ISLAND OF LUZON WITHOUT RELAXING YOUR VIGILANCE FOR THE ENEMY INTELLIGENCE OR REDUCING THE FULL EFFECT OF YOUR COMMUNICATION FACILITIES. IN ADDITION ALL POSSIBLE DESTRUCTION OF PLANTERS CONCEALED IN DESPERSAL AREAS AND OIL, AMMUNITION AND OTHER SUPPLY DUMPS IS DESIRED. IN FURTHERANCE OF THE CAMPAIGN OF LIBERATION AND PATRIOTIC MOVEMENT OF THE PEOPLE HAS THUS, UNDER LOCAL LEADERSHIP, THE OPPORTUNITY TO UNLEASH MAXIMUM POSSIBLE VIOLENCE AGAINST THE ENEMY. ACKNOWLEDGE (TO CABA NGAANG AND MERRILL). PASS TO MERRILL? 3nd unquote.

To : Sandoval.

1. Inclosed is a copy of General Instructions 12 Jan 45 fr Hq. Luzon Guerrilla Forces, Re this instructions you are to assign specific companies or units to specific jobs. For example one unit should be responsible for road blocks on the Porac-Angeles road north of Porac, one unit should be incharge of road blocks south of Porac. One unit should be incharge of cutting telegraph and telephone wires north of Porac, as instructed GI 12 Jan 45 and one unit to perform the same mission south of Porac. The same procedure should be carried out to cover all missions laid down in this GI. Also the same duties should be performed in the Angeles area. As instructed precaution should be taken and no lives should be lost if properly done.

2. At such time as the American Forces reach the Pasawang border advancing from Tarlac your men should attempt demolition of the installations in and about the Lara-Gutout landing fields. This action should be done under cover of darkness. At such time as the Americans advance toward these points your men should gain control over these fields and be present displaying their insignia as ordered in G.O. No.1 GHQ LWP 4 Jan 45. In the event that Japanese troops retreating from the north occupy these areas your men should have completed their demolition activities and retreat to safe area. I believe you can understand the necessity of carrying out this demolition work prior to occupation by retreating Japanese forces. If the instructions in GI 12 Jan 45 are completed the Japanese throughout these area will have no contact southwards and will therefore be partially cut off.

3. If you do not receive further orders to the contrary prior to 22 Jan 45 this action should be completed immediately following that date.

4. The main railroad line passing Angeles to San Fernando should be taken care of in connection with these instructions. Also the communication lines adjacent to this railroad and adjacent to the main road from Angeles to San Fernando. The road from Angeles to San Fernando should be block in many places.

5. I trust that your men will comply with these orders. As I said before in the event that no further orders are received by 22nd Jan 45 you should proceed to carry out these instructions. In the event that American troops should break through the Japanese forces in the north prior to that time and Japanese troops should scatter southward in large numbers telephone wires should be cut immediately and roads should be blocked. Trusting that you understand the mission laid down for your organization.

Subject: GENERAL INSTRUCTIONS.  
To : ALL USFIP Units.

1. All USFIP units in Bataan, Pangasinan and south Tarlac, shall, in the absence of specific orders to the contrary, immediately undertake the destruction of all telephone and power lines in their respective areas. In the destruction of all telephone and power lines the wire should be cut preferably in the open country away from inhabited places and long sections up to 100 meters or more if practical of the wire should be rolled up and taken away so as to avoid quick repair. Telephone poles also should be destroyed by felling.
2. Several lengths of rail, 20 to 30 lengths, preferably taken near bridges or culverts, shall be removed from every kilometer from the MNR main line and all principal spurs particularly serving Sagsay, Stoetenberg or any other enemy installations. In order to accomplish the removal of the rails, attach wire to the unmoved rail. This will serve to prevent automatic block signal equipment from indicating a break in the track. All rails so removed should be carried some distance away and dropped into the nearest river or otherwise securely hidden.
3. Entrance to all barrier roads leading from main highways are to be rendered impassable to Japanese trucks by flooding, by trenching, by plowing or by any other means available.
4. Sections of telephone wire or other wire including barbed wire may be strung across main highways at night between 2 trees on opposite side of the road and twisted taut at a level part 2 to 3 feet above the ground. If telephone wire should be used for this purpose, 4 or more strands should be twisted together. These wire obstacles should be strung away from inhabited places.
5. All gasoline, ammunition and other supply dumps in your area are to be destroyed. In most cases, this may be accomplished by using one or more "Molotov Cocktails." Wooden bridges on all main and secondary highways are to be destroyed by removal of the timbers, by cutting away wooden supports, by burning or by any other means which may be accomplished quickly and effectively within the discretion of the local officer concerned.
6. Wherever possible enemy trucks and other transportation equipment shall be destroyed. "Molotov Cocktails" are efficient against trucks and personnel in trucks in small numbers.
7. All guerrilla officers should have their men secure at least one "Molotov Cocktail" per man. Hereunder are instructions for making a Molotov Cocktail:

Secure a large glass bottle one quart to 1 liter size. Mix 3 parts of gasoline with 2 parts of crude oil or lubricating oil. Fill the bottle. Insert a strip of rag or wick to the bottom of the bottle allowing about 4 inches of one end extending outside the bottle. Cork the bottle. When the Molotov Cocktail is to be used, ignite the free end of the rag or wick and hurl the bottle against the objective splashing the liquid over the objective. In case crude or lubricating oil is not available coconut or tanguan-tangan oil may be used in the proportion of 50 % oil and 50% gasoline.

8. All the above listed instructions might be accomplished by men without arms and all guerrilla personnel should make every effort to comply with the above instructions by applying them to any new technique or conditions which may be established in your area subsequently. The fact that there are not arms to equip all guerrillas at this time should be no bar to the above listed instructions and with proper precaution and the initiative on the part of local leaders this objective may be attained with heavy damage to the enemy fighting ability and morale with a minimum loss of life on the part of the guerrillas. In fact properly placed sabotage to priority end to the demands of the situation be accomplished without the loss of any personnel.

9. As rapidly as arms become available, recognized guerrillas will be equipped according to priority and to the demands of the situation. Specific instructions for special situations will be issued as necessary.

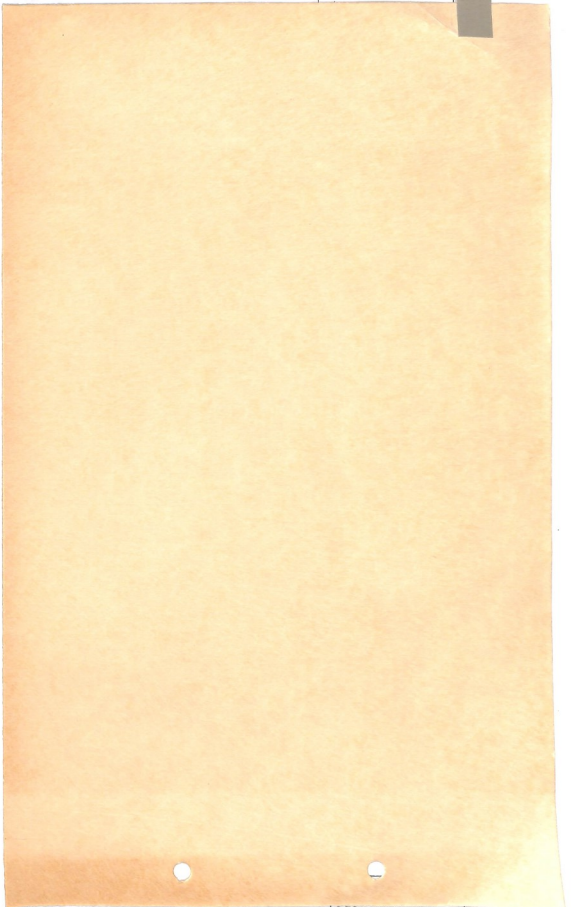
