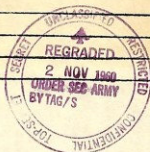

Dear Mr. Fortunado:

The Commanding General has directed that you be informed that the "Nakar's Guerrillas, Infanta Sector", purporting to be a guerrilla organization under your nominal control, is not favorably considered for recognition as an element of the Philippine Army.

A set of general requirements for guerrilla recognition, established by General MacArthur during the liberation of the Philippines, has been used as a guide in considering the record of this unit. After careful investigation and full consideration of all substantiating records and testimony of witnesses having pertinent knowledge, recognition of this guerrilla unit is not deemed to be warranted because of reasons mentioned below:

- a. The unit was not maintained satisfactorily in the field in opposition to the enemy.
- b. Activities of the unit did not contribute materially to the eventual defeat of the enemy.
- c. A definite organization was not established.
- d. Adequate records were not maintained (names, ranks, dates of enlistment or joining, dates of promotions, and necessary related information).
- e. Unit did not show satisfactory continuity of activity and organization.
- f. Members of the unit did not devote their entire effort to military activities in the field to the exclusion of normal civilian occupation and family obligations.
- g. Many members apparently lived at home, supporting their families by means of farming or other civilian pursuits, and assisted the guerrilla unit on a part-time basis only.

h. Some personnel listed as members of the unit assisted it by contributing money and supplies but did not serve in a capacity considered to justify such membership.

i. Record of service was not substantiated by sufficient acceptable evidence.

This letter constitutes the final determination of and action upon the claim for recognition of the "Nakar's Guerrillas, Infanta Sector" guerrilla unit.

Your attention is invited to Presidential Executive Order No. 68, Commonwealth of the Philippines, copy of which is attached, for any necessary action in connection therewith.

1. The "Nakar's Guerrillas, Infanta Sector", consisting of 505 men under the command of Tito Fortunado, has not been favorably considered for recognition. This is an initial investigation of an independent unit. No members have previously been recognized.
2. This unit does not comply with the requirements of the five basic points for recognition. See attached report.
3. No useful purpose will be served by further investigation of this unit.
4. Should a casualty roster be submitted or individual claims for recognition be submitted, it is recommended that they be not favorably considered.
5. This report constitutes final action by this headquarters on the "Nakar's Guerrillas, Infanta Sector" guerrilla unit.

REPORT ON THE NAKAR'S GUERRILLAS, INFANTA SECTOR

1. On the 11th and 12th of September, 1947, Lieutenant Delfin Jaranilla Jr examined the records and supporting papers of the Nakar's Guerrillas, Infanta Sector, to determine whether or not the unit should be considered for recognition.

2. ALLEGED HISTORY:

(See Unit File)

3. FINDINGS:

a. The following listed individuals were interviewed and their statements are reflected in the findings:

Lt Col Bernard L Anderson.....CO, Anderson's Guerrillas
Lt Jaime H Manzano.....CO, 1st Anderson's Bn

b. During the period between March 1943 to the liberation of the Philippines, the organizations that operated in the Infanta area were as follows: Hunters ROTC, Marking's Fil-Americans, Redor's Guerrillas and the Anderson's Guerrillas. However, only the Redor's Guerrillas and the Anderson's Guerrillas were actively engaged in guerrilla operations in the area throughout the period mentioned above. The NAKAR'S GUERRILLAS, INFANTA SECTOR never existed in the Infanta area. The unit history states that the members of the Nakar's Guerrillas in the Infanta area killed Japanese troops by getting them drunk and murdering them. Leading guerrilla officers and the civilian populace of the Infanta sector claim that no Japanese were ever dispatched of, by that method, in the Infanta area.

c. When the Anderson Battalion liberated the Infanta area, no members of the NAKAR'S GUERRILLAS, INFANTA SECTOR were attached to the unit as runners or laborers. The unit further claims that during the liberation operations in the Infanta area, the unit assisted the 1st Anderson Battalion by hauling ammunition, supplies, construction work on buildings, etc. Lt Manzano, commanding officer of the 1st Anderson Battalion, stated that any laborers used by the 7th Cavalry Regiment or the 1st Anderson Battalion, were loyal civilians pooled from the area and, furthermore, that these individuals were included in civilian payrolls and paid in full for whatever services were rendered as such.

d. The NAKAR'S GUERRILLAS, INFANTA SECTOR further claims that in October 1945, all Philippine Army troops were evacuated from the Infanta area. This is not so as the 1st MP Co and a Signal Section of the 1st Anderson Battalion remained in the

Infanta area until December 1945, when they were relieved by the Philippine Army Military Police Command Troops and transferred to Camarines Norte. At this time there were no more Japanese in the areas they had all been killed, captured, or had died of disease.

e. The unit further claims that they were instrumental in evacuating civilians to Yagit, at Dinahican, to escape the brutalities of the enemy. According to Lt Col Anderson, these civilians were evacuated to that point by elements of the 1st Anderson Battalion that had landed one month prior to the actual operations in the area for that express purpose. These civilians were taken to Polillo Island on Patrol Gunboats and Patrol crafts of the United States Navy, assigned to work with the 1st Anderson Battalion. It is definite that there were no guerrillas of Nakar's Unit in these operations.

f. Lt Manzano stated, in an interview, that he personally knows "Lieut" Policarpio Nakar, brother of Col Guillermo Nakar, and organizer of the NAKAR'S GUERRILLAS, INFANTA SECTOR, and that this individual was not active in any guerrilla operations and that he is not a prominent figure in Infanta and is incapable of attracting the confidence of the people. Lt Manzano also scrutinized the rosters submitted by the unit and personally knows a lot of individuals listed thereon. Manzano stated that the majority of the listed individuals were farmers who supported their families by engaging in normal civilian pursuits. He further stated that these people were loyal and that they assisted the guerrillas materially by supplying them with food and labor. However, as far as labor goes, the individuals have been paid. For the food procured from them, the Anderson's Guerrillas issued receipts, payable by the Claims Service Commission.

g. In the event the subject unit submits a casualty or individual claim, singly or otherwise, it is recommended that they be not favorably considered.

h. The "NAKAR'S GUERRILLAS, INFANTA SECTOR", is an independent unit and DOES NOT belong to the NAKAR'S DIVISION, ECLGA, nor to Col Guillermo Nakar's 14TH INFANTRY, nor to the ENRIQUEZ GUERRILLAS, nor to the NACOCO INTELLIGENCE NET.

4. POLITICAL ASPECTS:

This unit does not appear to have any political affiliations or aspirations.

5. RECOMMENDATIONS:

It is recommended that:

- a. the "NAKAR'S GUERRILLAS, INFANTA SECTOR", be not favorably considered for recognition;
- b. no individuals or list of individuals be recognized in an individual or a casualty status;
- c. this report constitute the final action by this headquarters on the "NAKAR'S GUERRILLAS, INFANTA SECTOR".

H-I-S-T-O-R-Y

I-Organization

Soon after the first shelling and bombing of the town of Infanta by the Japanese which began on Dec. 21, 1941, and after fixing and settling ourselves in our hiding places among the hills in the barrio of Batangan, Infanta, Tayabas, with the help of trusted friends and relatives, we organized guerrillas with a view to strengthen the morale of the people and to counteract somehow the invaders and to help America fight for democracy then the prime objective of the allied nations and the ideal of every Filipino. As members of the Civil Emergency Administration, simultaneously for food production and guerrilla organization we campaigned and the people willingly and enthusiastically joined so that before long several companies were organized with strict secrecy under solemn oath of every member of the organization. The organization was named "Ang Diwa ni Lapu-Lapu" (The Spirit of Lapu-Lapu) whose meaning was self-explanatory.

In spite of difficulties a combat company was formed after recruiting some firearms. Other companies were given their assignments accordingly.

To keep the men intact and available at all times they were assigned in food production campaign conducive to the great struggle that was forthcoming. They were made to feel the necessity of being self-supporting to warrant respect and to gain confidence of the public.

Meanwhile the fall of Bataan had been made public and not long after it, Lt. Policarpo Nakar received a letter from Col. Guillermo Nakar, his brother, advising him (Lt. Nakar) to help him (Col. Nakar) organize guerrillas in Infanta, his native town. Lt. Nakar conferred with the headquarter's personnel and after deliberation on the subject, it was agreed upon unanimously that the organization be renamed "The Nakar's Guerrilla" in honor of the most distinguished son of Infanta, Col. Guillermo Nakar then the famed guerrilla leader of the northern Luzon. Col. Nakar promised to help our organization in every way possible within his command and after learning of the existence of sufficient members of this organization he designated the undersigned Capt. Tito Fortunado as major and entrusted the responsibility of the riskful and delicate movement.

II-Undertakings

About the latter part of May 1942, through a runner we were informed of Col. Nakar's coming via Sta. Maria Laguna and Lt. Nakar by this time promoted to Captain, with his twenty strong were dispatched to meet him. Capt. Nakar and his men were surprised by the Japs in Sta. Maria that they retreated to Sampaloc, a nearby town, where they were also fired by the Japs but they luckily escaped unhurt and hid in the nearby forest where they stayed for sometime to wait for the Colonel and his men. They waited for weeks but in vain. Capt. Nakar and his men came back to Infanta almost disgusted. Some months after it was learned that Col. Nakar was in Casiguran, the northernmost town

of Tayabas. Being very eager to have him meet us, two sailboats were fitted out to fetch him and his men who were coming according to the information to bring firearms for our men in Infanta. The two sailboats arrived at Casiguran about a week after Col. Nakar had departed for the mountains because of the presence of many Japanese soldiers in the vicinity. After two months the two sailboats came back after having been chased by the Japanese.

Weeks after weeks all the year round the Japanese were coming down to Infanta hunting for Nakar's families and Nakar's guerrillas with the help of some Makapilis and Cenaps, many of our men were captured and mercilessly tortured and killed. Nevertheless our organization remained intact waiting for the opportune time to mobilize. The Nakar's family and guerrillas were trying to escape from the common enemies by hiding in swamps and forests with scarcity of food and clothing. Some came out and cleverly mingled with the Japanese pretending their friends (Tandatsai) courageous to face whatever emergency that may come out. After about six months Capt. Policarpo Nakar was captured and after having undergone brutal tortures which he heroically endured without betraying anybody, he was released by the Japs on parole, gaining the confidence of the Japanese authorities that by so doing he became very useful to the Nakar's guerrilla organizations as ^{well as to} the Fil-American and the Marking's. Capt. Nakar remained for months under the Japanese Garrison in the poblacion during which time he could report the movement and activities of the Japs for different guerrillas to consider and act upon. One the several trucks full of Japs soldiers bound for Sinoloan thru the mountains was reported to the guerrillas by Capt. Nakar and in turn, the guerrillas blockaded the said trucks and killed everyone of the Japs and burned the vehicles.

I did not encourage or enforce the "Tabang System". For me this is not good because, as what I had witnessed, there were many innocent people, young and old, who had been the victims of Japanese atrocities, just because of this "system". If there had been an encounter in a certain place and there had been Jap casualty, the civilians in that place would be the one to suffer, to be tortured to death. So I carried out a different technique. I ordered my men not to use any firearms and weapons, we became friendly to the Japs. We offered them food and much more of drinks especially alcoholic. Naturally, they got drunk and then this was our time, our chance and our victory for wiping the Japs out. Then we buried their bodies in swamps or forests secretly and of course they did not return to their respective Garrisons any more.

By the latter part of the year, 1944, food crisis was felt in Infanta, and we planned to camp our men in the Dingalan area where food was available. To survey the condition of the place, we sent Lt. Atienza with his men. Unluckily they were attacked by Japs before they arrived that place and three of the Nakar's men besides the leader, were killed. The rest of his men came back downhearted. Almost unbearable among our men but thru encouragement were calmed and were able to face with courage the rest of time.

Learning that the Japanese were going to camp in Patarayan, a barrio near the mountains to which place they had to cross, we detailed two boatmen to give the Japanese a surprise. The boatmen ferried the Japs and when they were already in the middle of the swift stream, the boatmen made the boat to capsize and let the Japs

struggled for their lives against the swift stream. Many Japanese were drowned, their guns and ammunition were carried by the current and sunk. Very few Japanese were timely rescued the boatmen were chased but cleverly escaped.

When the Anderson Bn. men raided the Japs in Batangan, Redor's Unit was stationed in the northern area to cut communications and reinforcement from that direction and we, the Nakar's Guerrillas on the Eastern area for the same purpose. Several runners were dispatched by the Japanese possibly.

Then came the most trying days for our men when we learned of the sad fate of Col. Nakar through some reliable information. True to our mission and to our sincere belief in the triumph of democracy we tried to keep out our organization and existence to do what it could even in the least extent for the good of the people. The highest point of the Japanese terrorism came in 1945 when their scheme was to confiscate all the food stuff including the rice yet in bloom at that time. As we foresaw the calamities to come from the lack of food, armed with courage, wit and intelligence the Nakar's Guerrillas stealthily harvested the rice during the nights and hide the grains in the nearby swamps that we were able to hoard sufficient food not only for our men but also for other people who had evacuated too early.

During the harvest time there were many Japanese roaming around getting people's belongings and our men were so instructed and trained to deal with them accordingly so that they could put the stray ones to eternal rest.

About the middle part of the harvest season the Japanese seized all the working animals, such as carabaos, cows, and horses. Another vital problem was forthcoming. "Let us see how to outwit the Japs" we thought. Nearly all the people had evacuated the places. Only determined Nakar's remained to take all the work. So our Liaison officer Lieut. Sofronio America, was negotiated by the Japanese authorities that they (Japanese) would give us rice seeds and work animals and we had to work in the fields. Knowing, that Japanese rule is about to terminate soon we agreed to the proposal. We got the seeds and carabaos and some days later the Americans or the Sixth Army and the Anderson forces came to put an end to the Japanese rule.

During the liberation of Infanta, Tayabas, May, 1945, the Sixth Army forces and the 1st Anderson Bn. fought side by side vs. Japanese soldiers. Nakar's Guerrilla being always ready to lend a hand became guides to the infested areas where the Japanese hid in foxholes and bushes. Japanese could not escape from being seen for Nakar's Guerrillas knew their hiding places.

Before this liberation date there was a masacre in Infanta. The C.O. of the Nakar's Guerrillas ordered all of his men as well as the town folks to go to Yagit which was the evacuation center. Then came the liberators. We, the Nakar's Guerrillas voluntarily aided them, by bringing food, boxes of bullets and other ammunitions to the Pagsangahan, Kiloloron,

Tignean, Katablingan, Bamberan, Tigbe, Podacan Creek and Abacca Creek, which took place as the firing line. In these Battles there were many American and Filipino soldiers as well as my comrades who fell and gave their lives for the common cause. Some of my men who were stationed in the C.P. of the 1st Anderson Bn. were ordered to make coffins for the casualties. They also made tables, bodegas, gunrack and officer's residences.

On October, 1945, there were no more soldiers in Infanta for they were stationed in Montalban, Rizal. I, being the C.O. of the Nakar's Guerrillas ordered my men to hunt and wipe out the Jap stragglers coming down from the mountain seizing food from the civilians especially during night time.

Now, the war is over. The survivors of these gallant soldiers who died for the common cause, the widows and orphans, are now struggling for existence. They depend upon God's mercy which is their ultimate hope, yet with this bitter feelings, they can still endure with smiles just because of the thought that their loved ones had rendered valuable services with honor to their country and to humanity.
