Dear Captain Johnson:

This will acknowledge receipt of your letter, dated 25 May 1948. requesting further consideration of Johnson's Guerrillas, Olongapo Sector, Zambales Military District, with regard to the revision of its recognition dates and forwarding papers in support of your request.

It is desired to inform you that pursuant to the policy of this headquarters to review the records of all recognized guerrilla units for possible revision of recognition dates, the records of the Zambales Military District were restudied. As a result of this protracted review, the Zambales Military District (ZMD), of which Johnson's Guerrillas, Olongapo Sector was a subordinate element, was favorably considered for revision of recognition dates by this headquarters on 27 February 1948. It is considered that the revision of dates accorded the Olongapo Sector constitutes just and adequate acknowledgment of the mili-tary service rendered. The inclusion of the names of deserving personnel on the revision roster was the responsibility of the commanding officer of the ZMD, Mr. Ramon Magsaysay. It is considered that decisions and selections thus made were the result of sound consideration and unbiased judgment, fully worthy of the trust and resultant credence which this headquarters places in resters thus presented for recognition.

Inasmuch as the approval by this headquarters on 27 February 1948 of the revision roster of the Zambales Military District constitutes the final determination of and action upon the official periods of recognition of all recognized elements of the ZMD, this headquarters cannot favorably consider any requests for further consideration for revision of recognition dates of any of the recognized subordinate elements of the ZMD.

The undersigned is the former Commanding Officer of Bataan M.D. and because of the geographical location of Bataan and Zambales, was very closely associated with Johnson's guerrillas from middle 1942 until the 110 eration of the area.

I knew of the association between Capt 3.5. Johnson and Capt.
McGnirs, Stt. Higgens, Stt. Oatlely and other American guerrilla operators. I knew of the beginning of the Hobnson guerrillas in May 1942
when they organized under the command of Oapt. McGnire. The organization served continuously thru the years of the compation and their
guerrilla work was claway contained, pay leyt by a continuouslawanating action against the seasy on the highways and in the reacte areas of southern Sembles. Their work in procuring waspens, and supplies
from the surrender area in betann shally found its way to my organization. The organization discontinuously found its way to my organization. The organization discontinuously sided strategier Americans in
Zambales province until liberation and no doubt, were responsible for
anythe American Lives.

In December 1942, it. Sql. E.P. Hammer, the eventual Commanding Officer of BULGA and who was living in my generalize More. at the time, visited and impacted "ichmsoring generalized", upon his return to Batanin he reported a very efficient organization and was interested in including it in his overall command. He repeated his impaction the following month.

Capt. Johnson and myself continuously corresponded with each other during the occupation. We exchanged intelligence reports and in various other ways coordinated our guerrilla affairs at all times until liberation.

The undersigned believes "Nobunceds guarrillas" have never been credited or paid for their services because the organization was never able to be proporly coordinated under any one properly subhorized organization. Wany American Commanders, at various times, attempted to assume command of Clongupo including the undersigned After the death of Onth. Modure, the original overall commander of Johnson's guarrillas, Col. Olles Marrill assumed command at the same time as Lt. Col. Remery. A little lated Lt. Col. Ameres directed Gept. Johnson's teaching from him. But in face of the mismaderstanding on the part of the american guarrillas, Johnson's Guarrillas still continued to serve with creasing the collection of the control of the control

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H I S T O R Y
OF
JOHNSON'S GUERRILLAS AND
THE PRESENT ORGANIZATION

Way back in 1982, before the dewnful of Bataca and Corregion, aggression and tyranny developed hereic lenders, whose ideals were love of country, justice and freedem. Among these loyal American Officers sent out from the fields of battle was Captain Balph McGuire of the United States Army to organize ouerfula Mevements in the Island of Luren. This energetic Officer went purposely in the dense jumples of Embales mountains to establish his Guerrilla Hendquarters. He selected from each tesm of Zambales the most capable men to lead and organized the Resistance mevement. Among the selected few in the Province whe were chosen to shoulder the responsibilities of meaning together the scattered elements into a solid block to resist the energy was Capt. EDMARD S. JOHNSON, a young energetic man who is matured in experience.

Capt. Ralph McGuire sent a written request to E.S.Johnsen to meet him at Pamerit, (outskirt of Olengape) on 12 May 1942. but due to circumstances prevailing at that time, the two were net able to centact each other. However, after the lapse of few days, M5 May 1942, Johnson received another nessage from Lt. Fla her Ogle and Sgt. Arthur Higgins, USA, Staff members of Capt. McGnire. The centents of the message rend as follows: "AKO -Upon receipt of this communication, you are hereby ordered to erganize a Resistance Mevement against the Japanese. Induct fifty (50), men whose levelty are unquestionable into the Organization. Exert the necessary pressure against the enemy especially in the Zig-gag Pass, but necessary precaution and secreoy must be be adhered to. Periodecal reports of accomplishments must be sent to this GHQ. COW". Although E.S.Johnson was not officially inducted in to the WESTERN LUZON GUERRILLA FORCES. he complied with the order. Men were screened and selected that will form the organization of the resistance movement, and while this precessing was in progress, in 25 May 1942, Johnson received an order to preceed to To Villiar, the General Headquarters of the WESTERN LUZON GUERRILLA FORCES. On 27 May 1942, Johnsen with R. Lanara, E. Careline, R. Corum and not a commanded the journey netwithstanding the fact that they have to pass the unexplored high terrains of Sambeles mountaing. It test the party three days and a half (31/2) to reach the place. A lengthy conference teck place, wherein important Hilitary topics were discussed, topics that had a direct bearing bearing on the Organization of the Resistance Meventá. It was in this eventful gathering that E.S.JOHNSON was inducted and commissioned for an example of the Resistance Meventá. It was in this eventful gathering that E.S.JOHNSON was inducted and commissioned for a Captain in the WESTERN LUZON GUERRILLA FORCES, USAFFE on 6 June 1942 and designated as Sector Commander of Olongape. Pull authority authority was vested to him to commission and recruit men into the Organization, and to secure firearms and ammunitions, to equipped the men whe will form the nuclues of the Resistance Revenent.

8 June 1942, the party left the GHq, at Villiar fer Olengape, to continue the erganizing of the movement. Upon the arrival of the party, Capt. E.S. Jehneen immediately took the preparatory steps to form the Sector, thus designating men who were commissioned to be his Staff members, Company CO's, plateen leaders and others to other assignments. Hen and wemen answered the call to join the movement by the hundreds. Capt. E.S. Jehneens and his staff members, slipped through the nights from village to village erganizing centers of resistance.

20 June 1942 - While things are getting ergenized and put to shape, Capt. E.S. Johnson was again summened by Capt. Ralph WoGuire, CO, of the Widf for another conference at Villiar. Among the Guerrilla Leaders present at the Conference were Capts. R. Magasyany, A. Francisce, A. Deceme, F. Meline, Capt. E.S. Johnson, R. Leaard, Lts. F. Careline, Blance and a hest of others. The theme of the lengthy discussions which ensued were the Military informations given by the respective Scoter Commanders. The most noteworthy phase of the Conference was the power and authority delegated to Capt. E.S. Johnson to have some of his trustworthy men to be employed in the various Japanese firms established at Clongupe, Zambales, for the sele purpose of gathering Military secrets which are of great value to the Organisation.

1 July 1942 - Due to lack of arms and amunitions, Capt. E.S. Johnson send a company under the command of Capt. Fermin Garcia te Bagao; another company under Capt. Gerardo Johnson to Saysayin Point and another company under Capt. R Lazara and P. Ramires to Mariveles to look for the much wanted materials with shight which to carry on the operation against the enemy. The party went on foot and some on big bancas. The trip was quite hagardous, but the spirity of the boys were high, even if food supplies was quite hard to obtain. After staying in their respective place for two weeks (2), the mission was a success, for they were able to to bring home many rifles, ammunitions and handgrenades. In due time the Unit had accumulated sufficient arms and ammunitions to carry on the mission against the enamy. Manw of the rifles taken were lacking in parts, but through the able management of the Ordnance Officers and men, all of them were put in good conditions. Thus, upon careful planning and training of the beys, Guerrilla warefore then began at Olong pe and its suburbs. Among the accomplishments made were on 22 July 1942 & Japanese supply trucks was ambushed in the Zig-zag pass, killing all the personnel and supplies were taken by our boys, while the trucks were pushed down the ravine: 25 July 1942 a company under Capt. E.S. Johnson has engaged a Japanese mountain patrols, killing four(4) japs whilene casualty on our side, and on 27 July 1942 the Japanese guard houses were set on fire by a plateen of sabeteurs under Lt. Cuenca. After this few engigements with the enemy, with the permission of Capt. Rolph McGuire, Capt E.S. Johnson with a company of men and some member of his staff, went to Moron, Betaan to organize the Guerrilla movement in that town, on 26 July 1942. Mayor Angeles was inducted and commissioned as Sector Commander. When the Sector had been organized and necessary instructions were given to the Unit, the party went back to Olongape. On their was back, it was in Maibaye, a barrie of Moron, that an encounter with the enemy patrol secured. After a heavy fight the entire Japa patrol of twenty three, (23) was totally wipe out, whereas on the side of Johnson's Guerrillas, seven (7) men were slightly wounded.

The party arrived at night in Olongape en 3 August 1942.

4 August 1942 - Many volunteers from all walks of life came to be enlisted in the resistance movement, but precaution of was always adhered to, as to the leyalty of every individual. The fellowing day, a report from our S-2 operatives came that American beys were being taken cared by con stain. Capt. E.S. Johnson did not lese time Deys the upon being questioned, teld him the days that they are Army beys and escaped, for Nishimete, the garrissen commander in Olengape. Steps were taken te give them the necessary food, clethings and medecines. Thre the initiative of Capt. Francisco Maliosi, he was able to precure the necessary clethings, medecines for them, which he selicit from the American missionaries who were not interened in Manila. Time and again, the missionaries did helped me in what ever things we needed as they were always eager to be of help to the resistance movement. On 15 August 1942, a runner bring word that a Lt. Martin, USA, wants to get a word from his wife who was interend in Sto. Tomas, so he was advicedby Capt. Johnson to make out a letter and will try to deliver is to his wife. So this letter was brought to Mamile and thre the help of Miss Cornelison and Miss Phili, the latter being as interpreter in the camp, was able to deliver the letter, and in return Mrs. Martin send an answer and through this co-operation the letter was delivered to the mt. to Lt. E.S.Jehnsen, two companies want to the Zig-sag Pass to ambushed

25 September 1942 - Another Company led by the CO, went again on aspecial Mission to produce for more firearms and assumitions tooks large. After staying thothe fors eight (5) days, the mission was a success for the party was able to got \$Mirty, (50) rifics of Infibéds and M-2s with almost five hundredd (500) rounds of amminitions. Conditions of the rifles were rusty and approperts were also missing on some of them. Howeverfatter oldening we hard and taking some of the parts on sens that were really eld, the rifles were put in good conditions. As many beys were being recruited and trained, it is necessary to precure for more arms and amunitions.

16 October 1942 - All the force of the intelligence service Were sent out to make a complete report on the strength of the enemy and app on the military installations around Subio Bay. After five days, reports were received which were of gent value to the plans of carrying the mission. This reports were also sent to higher headquarters.

21 October 1982 - The whole Unit was again led by Capt. E.S. Jehnsen and went to the Zig-sag pass at Half Meon beach, (Ringin), which is an ideal place to wait to ambunhed enemy trucks. The fellowing day, early in the morning twe (2) trucks were seen command as the men were in their position, they waited eagerly, and writter the signal to fire. Again, when the trucks were geing up hill.

The signal was given, and all the beys consentrated their fire on the drivers and the soldiers on the trucks. 16 Besember 1942 - A group was sent to Subic, Zambales, under Capt. Fermin Garcia to contact the Unit there under the command of Capt. H. Flores. The purpose of this mission was to have a coordantion of activities and command. The mission was a success as bhe said Unit was willing to cooperate with all the mission to be undertaken. 22 December 1942 - Lieutenant Erwin Ransey of the

As the year of 1943 ushered in, strange developments were growing up to the detriment of the scoret Organi-ation. Circles of spics were organized by the Jape who started their hencus orines against their compatriets - selling their scale and betraying their scuntry for their ewn personal safety and preservation - everlooking the fact that Filipine bleed flows in their voins. They forget their responsibilities as Filipines and the duty they ewe to their their their country. These spics were active molecs of the Japanese in detecting the existence of the scoret Organization. They reported one by one, suspects which in turn, the Japanese proscouted them without mercy. Innocent souts had been the cictims of this attractions. Hemewere deprived of their fatherly love as non were killed on the more suspicion that they were Guerrillas. Every day groups of Filipines were brought to the soutfold to unswer for orines they merce committed.

Cele proceeded to Panique where they were taken cared of by the Corps wemen and the boys. They were provided with clothes, shoes, cigarettes, and medecines for the skin desease that they had. Later, the Lts., were transferred to Banicain where they were treated by the Corps wemen, guerrillas and by the barrio felks, who did not hesitate to help them at the risk of their own lives. When they were a little hit then uses interfaced with parties for the page of the stronger, passion were given to them, or that her with forget get their worries. After a menth stay in the said barrie, Lt. Ramsey requested that this two (2) efficers be conducted to his camp at Bamban, Bataan. Upon receipt of the letter, Capt. Johnson dispatched men to take this Officers from the place where they were tothe place where they were supposedte be breught required secrety and courage as the two place are separated by a wide span of water, which was well guarded by the Japa. Japanese patrols in beats kept complete vigilance of the whole bay. But the Guerrillas defied death to help this Americans. These Officers were clothed in civilians rugged and dirty se as to avoid any suspicion incase somebody will be as see them. At we 12:00 colock, midnight when the daring trip was made. bancas sent ahead of the party for scouting purposes. After Two

hours of hazardous trip, the party safely reached Fanique. It was not till four e'clock in the morning that the said efficers were able to make that straineous hike towards Lt. Ramsey's camp, which has a distance of forty (40) kilometers, the way passing thru wilderness seldom explored and passed by human beings. It was a daring adventure, but with the determination

TO REACH its seal. Finally this party reach Pinelet, the first barrie in Bataan. The men were so tired that they rested for a while, whereupen Lt. Alvedres complained of serefeet and that he her not go any further. The party proceeded leaving Lt. Alvedres, with the assurance that a means of transportation will be provided to bring him to the camp. Upon arriving at Lt. Ramseys camp, there was an order for the arrest of Lt. Alvedres. Upon learning that Lt. Alvadres was left behind, the guicide squad was sent by Lt. Ramsey to take him, but Alvedres was gone when they reach the place. Upon the report of the squad leader that Alvedres was no where to be found, Lt. Ramsey immediately sent eperatives to hunt for the much wanted man, but the traiter had taken refuge with the enemy. Thereby Lt. Ramsey sent a lester to Capt. Johnson informing him of the incident with the instruction to be on the alert, for Alvedres might proceed to \$ Clengape and squeal on his secret organization. Capt. Johnson and most of his staff members, namely Copts. R. Lazara, F. Candeleta, L. Ramirez, C.M. Bustamante, F. Garcia and Lt. S.Gleria went to Banicain to seek refuse, and staved there for a menth, with his Hq., being transferred there.

While the Ho. . was in Banicain, activities of the Unit were as fellows: 16 April 1943 - A plateen was sent by Capt. Johnson en special mission to Bathan to procure for more fire arms and assumitions. The mission was a success for they were able to get #Grty (40) rifles and almost on thousand (1000) rounds of ammunitions .; 27 April 1948 - Groups were sent out in all villages giving lectures in building their morale, and to have more faith in the Gevt. of the United States and also of the Commonwealth of the Philippines; new members were being recruited and trained as they went from village to village.

Efter being away for almost a month, 15 May 1948, through the uncunny tricks of the then Mayor Rufine L. Vindua of Olengape, they were persuaded to to return to Olengape. In se deing, four (4) efficers, Capts. Johnson, Ramirez, p. Garoin and Lt. S. Cloria were apprehended by the Japanese Kemple Tai, (Military Pelice). They were investigated, maltreated beyond indurance. Evidently, they were released and were placed

under strdot survellance. Two weeks later, 29 May 1943, esset Capt. Jehnsen sent a plateon under the demand Of Lt. B. Valdes en a reconnaisance patrel in the vicinity of Tabuyey mountains, with Capt. Ramires, after he was again apprehinded, 600 seven (7) deed Japaness were found asset by the Japs patrel in the said vicinity after two days. Both were taken at the Japs garrissen in Subic where they were tertured beyond human endurance, 80000 without water and food for several days. But in no time three (3) men with arms from the neighboring prevince, Rampanga, had been apprehended by the femples at the cutskirt of Olongape, which ence again gave the release of Capt. Jehnsen and Ramires.

and a company went to Celis, Hermosa, Bataan to scoure one machine gun of 30 caliber and other fire arms and ammunitiens. In that instant morethen than one hundred (160) men and wemen voluntered for service and a Unit was formed under the Clengape Sector. On the way back to Zambales, 12 June 1943, --- they had encountered more than thirty - three (33) Japa patrol at the cutakirt of Colis, Bataan. Only two, (2) Japa survived and were able to escape.

15 June 1943 - Capt Johnson was again apprehended and several times in the following months, by the Kempeis, for the many incidents that were happening in the cutskirts of Olongape, such as the cutting of enemy communication lines, railread ties were burned and the reported disappearance of Japs that went to the barries. However, he was released for a tricky reason, that they want to catch Capt. Comes Johnson and the rest of his boys. The Japs gave all kinds of textures, forcing him to reveal names of his co-patriots and the secret organisation, but all these, he was able to withgrand and the Japs learnt/nothing from him.

23 June 1943 - Many of the boys were getting sick of

11 October 1943 - A plateen under Lt. D. Guenon was ordered to check on the presence of Japs at Tillin, and to see the reported wholesale cutting of logs that were being shipped to Manila.

12 October 1943 - Capt. Fermin Gercia with a company

was ordered to Lazeng where Japs were concentrated. sed, the Japs mad Taiwans at that place, causing casualties ascinst the enemies.

15 October 1943 - Capt. R. Lasara with another plateen was ordered to go to Maibaye where they harassed and ambushed the Japa that were stationed there. This guerrilla ware fare coursed panic on the enemy, as they de not venture to go out of their camplanymore. Many Jops were killed and wounded, as many were being exhuned and brought to the hospital in Olongape.

20 October 1943 - to 31 December 1943 - The rest of the Unit that were not sick were assigned to attacked the Japa trucks in the Zig-sag pass, of which this continued unabated. Lumbers and legs were hornt and sometimes let drifted to the gen; railroad ties were destroyed - as price -net even used by the company to hand logs - bridges were burned that sere used by the enemy in trone exting legs; communication lines were out in the Zig-sag pass; fuel-from trucks were stelen to be used for disinfecting wounds of the boys; oil from engines tanks were drained to be used for cleaning the arms of the Unit; and all in all the year 1943 brought to a close of sharp perils but successful operation against the enemy.

1 January 1944 - Capt. E.S. Johnson received a communication from Major Bernard Anderson, Commander Of USAFFE LUZON GUERRILIA FORCES who was at that time staying at Tayaban Province. He was requested to contact Major Anderson in an outskirt of Manila. But circumstances failed the two to meet each other, so a Lingen Officer of Major Anderson was sent to Capt. Johnson in a designated place in Manila. It was there that he, (Johnson), recived his commissioned as Captain and the power to re-organized Zambales. He then went back to the province and As sent a Liasen efficer headed by Copt. P.Baga to centact all activeunits to further on the movements.

18 January 1944 - Capts. Johnson, P. Ramirez and F. Malioni to Manila where Capt. Johnson was to be centrated, but guerrilla leaders of Manila and its suburbs. Capt. Johnson was abl a to contact leaders who were active in the movement, supplying us with news from Australia and America.

Various important encounters with the enemy ensued at places such as the encounter at and on 12 March 1944, led by

Capt. Johnson and Javaluyas where morethan thirty-five (35) Japs were surprisedly attacked and annihilated. The encounter at Tanawan mountain on 27 March, 1944, led by Capt. P. Ramirez, Lts. L. Selia, A.M. Bustamente and E. Caseja, eleven (11) Japa were killed. The encounter at Big Cut, Tig-sag page led by Capts.C. M.Bustamante, J.del Rosarie, Ltg. P. Guiang, E. Coreline and N. Bantican where seventeen Japa (17) were killed. The encounter at Ilalim on 23 April 1944, led by Capts. D. dela Ra, C. Fortunate, C. Costeles, Lts. A. Ramos. B. Tapispisan, D. Calixtre, H. Gregorie and H. Andice where thirty two (32) Japa were killed. The encounter at Pamerit on 14 May 1944, led by Capt. R. Lazara, Ltg.G. Redonde, G. Gaspar and T. Sagala where 61s (6) Japs were killed. 18 May - Carr. Johnson was nown causer a grocest to I car.; 19 May: - Carr. R. Lizara - Ish.
5 June 1944 - The Japs were getting tough and nean to the civilian population as the guerrillas continue their garinnocent fare against them. Many, men were being apprehended and executed due to mere suspicion that they were members and symphatigers of the resistance movement. As food and medecines were getting scarse, ced the boys experience to go without a neal day and Mostly the + cooking Unit survived by gathering the young bejo shoots to be esten; merertheless supplies somes once in while from friends in the form of corn, dried fish and congoes. Through all this h rdships that everybody was undergoing, the whole Unitapersonnel was determined to carry on the resistance against the enemy; their loyalty to the couse never dis. everiesced the cratitude he ered to door

26 July 1940, - Capt. E.S. Johnson was appointed Mayor of Olongapo. This appointment was recommended secretly by \$67 Colonel Cyles Nerill to the acting Governor of the Province, Jose V. Corpps. The acceptance of Capt. Johnson of the position was not for himself but to comply with the order of a high American Officer and also to serve a cover and shield to further the

Resistance Mevement without any suspicion. It was a means to evade suspicion on the part of the Japanese and a good pretensien that Capt. Jehnsen is cooperating with the Japanese in Ce-Presperity Sphere. All the personnel of the Municipality were changed and Guerrillas were placed as clerks, treasurers and pelicemen. During the incumbency of Capt. Johnson as Mayor of Olongape, many important buildingswere burne inside the Navy Yard. Construction of railways were delaped and some machineries were put out of order. The idiccy of the Japanese Kaigun even referred the matter ever to Capt. Johnson which in return, he explained that such happenings as that of the burning of buildings were due to carelessness of guards and workers - the delay of the railways was due to lack of materials for constructions and the running out of condtion of machineries were due to old parts used. The Japanese without suspicion readily believed such explanations. This sabetage of enemy properties were due occocora collinga a company de la collinga de la co escenced to the operatives planted to work for them under the leadership of Lt. L. Selis, Lt. B. Labimpune with four (4) squads of men trained to destrey enemy preperties.

All went well until a Filipine epy seld his bedy and seul to the Japanese, whe wand blinded by the propaganda of the Yellew race and by the sparkle of Japanese war notes - turned traiter to his sountry. This man, Juanite Vindua was supposed to be executed by Guerrillas on 25 December 1943, but through the intervention of Capt. Johnson, being also Xmas, he saved his life. He vouched for him and even inducted him into the organization. Vindua then behaved well and helped much in clerical work. He even participated in a few encounters with the enemy. But, in theleng run, this man showed his real diabelical self. He everlooked the gratitude he ewed to Capt. Johnson and his man.

They were knecked with brass knuckles, beaten with 2"X4", and were half drowned by sticking a water hose into their nouth, callopsessathly consequents be restarous become proposed and become because the contract of the contrac Evidences were shown cooses such as the seventy (70) rifles and the thousands rounds of ammunitions revealed by Vindua. proudly and firmly testified against the guerrillas. Death was the final sentence given them, but the arrival Kampei Tai from parlac was the only one that hindered the exeoution. On the eve of the execution, (the colonel Kampei from Tarlac had already arrived), Capes. Johnson, R. Lazara, F. Javaloff luyas, Lt. G. medende, Sgt. F. de Guia, Pfc. A. Villamueva and Pvt. I.de Guia, miraculously escaped from the cell by the aid of a pecket knife, that come Lt. G. Redende was able to hide in his watch pecket. The beys took turns in outting little by little the window railings of 2"X4" for two days and nights. They made their escaped on 2 October 1944.

shed their camp at Mt. Tanawan but moved later to Hulong Kalapakuan as spice were busy detecting as to his whereabouts. The wife of Capt. Jehnson with her youngest child was taken in custedy by the Japanese Kempei Tai in his stead. After a day and a half in the garrisson, she was released with the promise that she will induce her husband to return to the garrisson. This as a decey was done to decoy to catch Capt. Jehnson and his men. At midnight on 4 October 1944, Mrs. Jehnson and his childrens were secretly transferred to Kalapakuan to join her husband, leaving behind her eldest son, brother and brother-in-law in prison. (Reliable information was received that the guerrillas left in prison were brought to Fort Wint, Grande Island on 4 October 1944, where they were executed.)

by the Japanese, Capt. Johnson with his Staff Officers and his Service Company, went to Moren, Bataan on 6 November 1944, en a special mission to secure for more arms and ammunitions. They were able to secure few, as the Moren cutfit were also An badly in need of firearms as hundreds were configurated by the Japanese. The Moren Outfit decided during that time to be released as part of the Olengape Sector as they wanted to be under Capt. Beens of the Bataan District. The presence of Capt. Johnson at Moren was dectected by the Japanese and at Ilingin, in the outskirt of Meren, the Outfit was intercepted by a strong Japanese troop, which ensued almost Asix hours (6) fight. A good thing that experience sceuts had seen first the Japs, etherwise all of the Guerrillas cacesacapesacanscas shuld have been wiped out. One Officer, Capt. Fermin Garcia, and six(6) enlistedmen were killed, and one officer (Capt. P. Ramirez) was wounded. On the enemy's side, nineteen (19) were killed. Capt. Johnson and his men were forced to retreat as the enemy were three (3) times in number and well equipped. (10 October 1944)

by big bancas berrowed from the barrie fells of Banicain. They rested for quite a case time as they were exhausted, weary and fattired. After coefficients weeks rest, Capt. Johnson with his staff officers and a plateon of men, went to Aglae mountain to comply with the invitation has received from Cel. Gyles Merill to have a Conference. Capt. Johnson was requested to be placed under Cel. Merill's command but Cpt. Johnson could not decide right away as he was under the command of Major Anderson.

Is Nevember 1944 - Cel. Gyles Merill again sent an invitation for a conference, and Capt. Jehnson complied with the request. Upon reaching the place, Cel. Merill teld Capt. Jehnson that he (Cel. Merill) blroady sent a message, to Major Anderson to the chief of his transfer of this command. Capt. Jehnson then coded to the order. Capt. Johnson didnt mind the changing of command, what matter mest was his leve and levelty at his country, and the service that his fellowmen need from him was the privating interest in himself. His unbroken spirit and the leve to fight

the enemy was his great desire.

21 Nevember 1944 - Capt. Johnson then west back to his camp. Afen days later, some of his operatives reported that a strong Japanese troops were preparing to raid his camp. fit them moved their camp to the outskirt of Castillejos. A place was selected near a river, where the boys have access to drinking facilities, for cooking and for taking a bath. Life in the camp was such w. thrilling adventures and unforgetable experiences, The boys tasted to eat wild roots, half cooked hananas, various firmplacts place leaves and skin of carabaes. Groups were sent to asked for alms from sympathisers from place to place. The boys suffered malaria, dysentery, and all forms of skin desease. When the medical Officer car short of medecines, he substitued derita bark for quinine, guava leaves infusion for dysentery and Rifferent kind of barks and leaves for the skin desease. The camp never passed of Sunday without a mass being officiated by Capt. Fahher Tugade. under Capt. R. Lazara companies of the Unit remained in Olongape to carry on the resistance movement against the enemy in that vicinity. Although the place is a het place for the guerrillas, precautin was always practice and a vigil surveillance was practice to insure the safety of the organization.

15 December 1944 - Early part of the day dive bembers were attacking Japanese ships cutside Subic bay. The Unit stationed in Olongape were on the alert to be in action if any detectioned in Olongape were on the alert to be in action if any detectioned as landing of americans were the main topic. A plateon was sent to Banicain under Lt. I. Patarata; a plateon under Lt. Savaris was stationed at Tibawa; a company at Buton under Capt. USA of the 59th CAO band. The two were were taken immediately to the woods of Banicain for sfety precaution and where feed and clothes were provided by the guerrillas and the Gerps women. The same night, the two were transferred by banca to Tibowa, where they recuperated and restal

22 December 1944 - Again Capt. Johnson was called for a Conference by Col Cyles Merill of which he complied. It was on this memorable date that he was designated as the Commanding Officer of Squadren "D", which composed of the towns of Olonzape. Subio, Castillejes and San Marceline. The district Command was given to Major Jose V. Corpus, and Major Ramon Maganyany who was then a Capt., the executive Officer. This order was effective 23 December 1944.

23 December 1944 - An order was recived from Capt. E S.Johnson to send some Officers of the Olengape Sector, for a Conference at his camp in Castillejos. Capt. R. Lazara, being sick with malaria, delegated Capt. M. dela Ores, Capts. F. Maliosi, M. Reyes, J del Resarie with three (3) squads of enlistednen to go to Captilleies. In the conference, Capt. Johnson issued Special Order No. 5-A, dated 22 December 1944 that effective 23 December 1944, The fellowing Officers will assume command of the Olongape Sector. Squadren "D", Zambales Military District; Capt. R. Lagara - Commanding Officer; Capt. Mdela Crus - Executive Officer; Capt.F. Malicai - Adjutant; Capt. M.R. Reyes - Supply Officer. He further give power to this group to form the Staff and companies, designative efficers to their respective position. He further atressed the necessity of practise the necessary precaution since Olengape is a het place during these days. The following day, at 2.00 P.M. the party went back to Olengape. Upon arriving the Executive and Adjutant reported to the CO, all that took place in the Conference. An order was issued the same night to have all members to report at the fishpend on 27 December 1944.

27 December 1944 - Enrly in the morning gearrillag of the Olongupe Seober were assembled. This date the bandquerters staff was formed, companies were divided into plateons under able and experienced officers. From plateon loaders, company communicate and staff members were instructed as to what to do incase of an emergency. 5-2 operatives were sent out to say on enery strength and movements, As the Japa were being constantly extract and rebead by American planes, they were evenuating to the meanty hills.

80 Bosember 1990 - A conference was held among Officers of Olengape Scotor to discuss mothers pertaining the safety of the civilian population in case the Americans will make a landing in Subic bay area. 12 January 1945 - As the American between continue pounding on military bases of the Japs, they evacuated Fort Wint, Grande Is. A Plateen under Lt. I. Patarata, heisted an American flag at the middle of the field at Tibus. American pilots upon seeing this flag fly lew and drepped leaflets, the centents of which is that the American leberators have arrived already.

Squadron "D" headquarters, directing the Executive Officier of the Olongape Sgotor to blast the Kalaklan bridge at 12:00 Hid-night, 16 January 1945. To take all necessary precentons to avoid any suspicion that theperpetrators is from Olongape, Operatives were sent right away as to make the necessary plans to execute the order. The operatives reported back that the bridge was well guarded by the Japa. Due to the impossibility of carrying out the order, a numer was sent with the report and plans showing the defense of the bridge. The following day, 16 January 1945, a much order was received, ordering the Unit to postpone the blasting of the bridge, but ordered to be always on the alert for any mission to be assigned.

18 January 1945 - A Nema for all Sectors commanders ware received from Hgs. Squadren "D", to be prepared to hoist the American flag and the Philippine flag in the municipal building upon receipt of order from the headquarter. In this she date, a plateon (Commandes @ Sqdn. "D") led by Capt. C. Fortunate encountered a Japanese troop of one hundred fifty (150) men with machine guns and automatic rifles, at the ricefields of Pamatawan, Castillejes. The boys were surprised by the enemy and was fired Inspite of the odds, the boys fought gallantly and were able to kill more than thirty (30) Japs. The only advantage of the guerrillas, was the semi-concealment of their bodies by the unlevel rice fileds. But the fanatical un-rushing of the Japa cause the guerrillas thirteen (13) casualties. Capts. E.S.Johnson, F. Javaluyas, C.Bustamante, Lts. E.Caroline, V.Lara and a squad of boys went to cherescon succer the boys. The arrival of the re-inforcements attracted the Japa and the firings were directed in their position thich gave the other group to escaped. After an hour of exchanging shots, Capt. Johnson and his boys were able to clude the enemy through the mountain fastness. After two (2) hours hiding, the remaining comrades buried the dead at night.

21 January 1945 - A surprised attacked was coordenated by Sectors under Soundren "D" at the San Marceline Air Strip used heby the Japa as a Military Air Base. This mass attacked was led bu Majer Mageaysay and Capt. E.S. Johnson, starting the fight at midnight of this date. The enemy was taken by surprise completely that ecourity guards of the air strip were all killed, and airplane entices burned including gaseline dumps. Due to thesuperderity of the Japa in arms the guerrillas were forced to withdrew after inflioting this damaged. The following day, the american planes bembed and strafed the air-strip causing a big damage in the place, planes were destroyed, hangers were burned and more gaseline dumps were hit by incendiary bembs. At night the guerrillas resume their mass attacked in the air-strip assin, killing more Japa, and whatever military installations left was burned, including planes hidden in commuflaged hangers. The following morning, the rest of the Japa evacuated the area, and fled tewards Olengape, where a big force of Japs were being concentrated in the Zig-sag pass. The air-strip was compied by the guerrillas, raise an American flag and repair the damage runways to enable american planes to land. The mission being accomplished, this then was reported to higher headquarters by Col. Gyles Merill.

Because of the heavy fires of the American artillery dropping in their direction, they left and proceeded to Castillejes. At Castillejes, Capt. Johnson contacted at ence Col. Jennet of the 38th Infantry Division, USA, and was then ordered to report to General Jones of the said Infantry Division which proceeded to Olongapo. Capt. Johnson with four (4) of his Staff officers met Major General Jones at Olongapo, whereby the General asked Capt. Jehnson's co-operation in the battle of the Zig-zag pass. Capt. Jehnsen offered to General Jones the whole Unit of the Olongapo Sector under Capt. R. Lazara, and he at once went back to Castillejes and ordered all the Headquarters personnel and the Commande Troop to move to Olongape to help in the battle of the Lig-gag pass. Every day contact was made between Col. Jennet and his Aide Capt. Alejandre by Capt. Johnson and his staff. Due te the knowledge of Capt. Johnson and his Officers with the terrain of the Zig-zag pass and the mts. in the whole area, they were of great helped in indicating in the map the possible position of the enemy. The whole Unit of the Olon-ape Sector and the Commando troop were then fighting side by side with the American troops day and night. Later, General Jones had been relieved by General Chase and the order then was to report to Col. Wilson, Chief of Staff and to General Chase.

Crus reported all the informations regarding Capanese movement in Clongapo and telling them about the american forces of being at amatauan. After reporting, Capt. Grus and party went back to Clongape to inform all the guerrillas that the Smerican forces are coming to Clengapo. At about 3'00 p.m. Wan. 29, 1945/ one mine sweeper was sighted entering Subic Bay and left at about 7:00 p.m. The following morning another mine sweeper with two destroyers entered the bay and went as far as the beach of Clengape. At about 9:00 a.m., 2nd, 4t. Guillerno Redondo, guerrilla officer, with two bays rods in a banca to bring one American survivor saved by the guerrillas during the bombing of a Vapanese transport by Asserion plants, which sunk at buble Bey on Becember 17, 1944. time of the invasion of the American forces, and also inasmuch as a percentage of casualties amounting to 24.5% of total unit strength is considered excessive even under combat conditions, the roster has been screened by the undersigned, reducing casualties to the number indicated in paragraph 1 above. This reduction was effected by deleting from the submitted roster the names of those individuals who died of sickness prior to the initial recognition dates of the various units, viz.: Hq & Hq Co, 1 Feb 45; A Co, 3 Feb 45; B Co, 2 Feb 45; and Commando Troop, 8 Feb 45. This revision is considered justified in that individuals dying of natural causes before the inception of the military usefulness of the organization cannot be accepted as having died in line of military duty. One other individual, Jose Crucio, Hq & Hq Co, is listed as having died of dementia praecox during the period of recognition; his name is deleted because the nature of the malady is such that the individual would have been incapable of performing military service for a considerable period before his demise. Finally, Henry Johnson, Hq & Hq Co, listed as a 2nd Lt. KILD, 10-4-44, is reduced to the grade of Private. Other records show that this individual, a son of the CO of the organization, was only 17 years of age at the time of his death; he is not considered old enough to have had the qualifications commensurate with the commissioned rank.

2. With the aforementioned emendations, the roster has been reprepared in the form of a true copy and is thus recommended for approval as the official casualty roster of the Olongapo Sector, Squadron "D", Magsaysay's Guerrilla Forces, ZMD.
