



Magsaysay, former Military Governor of Zambales Military District stated that if they were paid as Lt. Col. Leidy stated they were not subject to recognition as guerrillas.



It is believed that Pelagio Battad, the San Marcelino Sector Commander knew these men were paid as civilian employees yet he submitted roster with the hopes their pay as civilians would be crealound.

The Certification by Col. Olvis of Headquarters, 14th AAA Command Training Center, specifies no date and only a certification for one man. It is believed that he was paid for his services the same as stated by Lt. Col. Leidy.

The unit does not claim to be a military organization. It is believed that with the exception of 936 officers and men of the San Marcelino Sector already recognized, the MP Company, should not be recognized because they were paid as civilian labor-

POLITICAL ASPECTS

Politics played an important role in this sector. It was the Headquarters for all of the Zambales Hilitary District and favors to friends and relatives was prevalent in many cases.

RECOLUMNICATIONS

After careful consideration of the statements made by the present members and an analysis of the documents presented, it is recommended that with the exception of those member previously recommind from this sector, the "MIP Company, San Exarctino Setor Squadron D, Nagawysny's Forces, ZID, be not favorably considered for rescontition.




