



General Douglas MacArthur, Philippine Army, Manila, F. I.

Dear Sir & Comrade:

I have the honor, and it gives me great pleasure, to transmit to you the following resolution which was unanimously adopted at the 29th Annual Encampment, Department Veteran Army of the Philippines, United Spanish War Veterans, held on February 22nd, 1938, at Manila, F. I.:

HESCLVED: That the 29th Annual Encampment of the Department, Veteran Army of the Philippines, United Spanish War Veterans, in Convention assembled, convey to our Comrade Major General Douglas MacArthur, and his distinguished wife, the cordial congratulations of this gathering, and of the comrades in general, upon the birth on February 21st, 1938, of a son and heir who is to bear the name of Arthur MacArthur, a name well known and dear to each member of this organization, and who, we hope, will in due time become another General MacArthur.
