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ABADIEZ, Rufino J.

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Present Position: Elected delegate of Misamis Occidental Province to the First National Assembly; Member of the Committee on Forestry (National Assembly).

Positions since Japanese Occupation: Member of the Representative Body (Misamis Occidental Province) of the National General Assembly to ratify Constitution of the Republic.

ABADILLA, Quirico

Positions since Japanese Occupation: Former Director of Mines, Bureau of Mines, 5 February 1942, appointed by Chairman of the Executive Commission; Chairman of the Board of Examiners for Mining Engineers, Bureau of Civil Service, 2 June 1942, appointed by Chairman of the Executive Commission.

Office held during Commonwealth Period: Director of Bureau of Mines, Department of Agriculture and Commerce; Chairman of Board of Examiners for Mining Engineers, Department of Public Works and Communications.

ABALO, Eduardo

Present Position: Elected delegate of Capiz Province to the First National Assembly.

Office held during Commonwealth Period: Member of the provincial board of Capiz.

ABLEDA, Felipe S.

Present Position: Ex-officio Delegate of Mindoro Province to the First National Assembly; Provincial Governor of Mindoro, 10 April 1942, appointed by Chairman of Executive Commission; Chairman of Provincial Committee of the Kalibapi (Mindoro); Member of the Committee on Pensions and of the Committee on National Enterprises (National Assembly).

Office held during Commonwealth Period: Provincial governor of Mindoro.

ABELLO, Emilio

Age: 38

Birthplace: Negros Occidental

Education: Graduate of College of Law, University of the Philippines

Present Position: Executive Secretary of the Executive Bureau in the Office of the President.

Positions since Japanese Occupation: Assistant Commissioner of Justice, 5 February 1942, appointed by Chairman of the Executive Commission; Vice-Minister of Foreign Affairs, appointed by the President; Chairman of the three-man committee to carry out the reorganization of the Laurel Government in 1944.

Office held during Commonwealth Period: Under-Secretary of the Department of Justice.

Remarks: Abello was born in Negros Occidental on January 14, 1906. He is a graduate of College of Law, University of Philippines and was admitted to the practice of law in the Philippines in 1929. He entered the government service in 1934, first as Assistant Attorney in the Bureau of Justice, and later as Assistant Solicitor General. Subsequently he became legal adviser in the Federal Sugar Adjustment Administrative Office (Philippine Branch) and technical assistant on legal matters in the Office of the Former President of the Commonwealth of the Philippines. In 1940, he was appointed Under-Secretary of Justice, a position which he held up to the Japanese Occupation of the Philippines.

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ABRERA, Sofronio

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Present Position: Elected delegate of the City of San Pablo to the First National Assembly.

AFABLE, Dr. Valentin S.

Present Position: Elected delegate of Zambales Province to the First National Assembly; Member of the Civil Service Committee and Chairman of the Committee on Sanitation (National Assembly).

Positions since Japanese Occupation: Member of the City Board of Manila, 27 November 1942, appointed by Chairman of the Executive Commission; Member of the Afable Medical College.

Office held during Commonwealth Period: Member of Commission on Appointments.

Remarks: Afable attended the Executive Committee meeting of the Greater East Asia conference on Medical Sciences held in Manila December, 1943.

AFRICA, Candido

Present Position: Member of the newly created Council of Scientists and serving in the Department of Medical Sciences.

Remarks: Delegate to Greater East Asia Medical conference, Nanking, April, 1944; Head, Department of Parasitology, University of Philippines.

AFRICA, Francisco M.

Present Position: Chief of the Division of Cultural Relations in the Press and International Cultural Relations Bureau; Consultant on International Cultural Relations, appointed by President Laurel; Member of the Pensionado Selection Committee created by Administrative Order No. 18.

Positions since Japanese Occupation: Researcher-Writer, Division of District and Neighborhood Associations, Bureau of Local Governments, Department of the Interior, appointed by Chairman of the Executive Commission 25 November 1942.

Remarks: A lawyer and teacher, Africa has worked in the Department of Justice and has been dean of liberal arts and professor of English, political science and law in the Far Eastern University. He graduated from the University of the Philippines in 1920.

AGREGADO, Manuel

Present Position: Auditor General, appointed by the President.

Positions since Japanese Occupation: Assistant Auditor General, Budget and Auditing Office, appointed by Chairman of the Executive Commission; Chairman of the Office Equipment Distribution Committee, appointed by the President.

Office held during Commonwealth Period: Deputy Auditor General.

Remarks: Agregado was a municipal teacher and later a provincial supervising teacher. He was appointed a clerk in the district office of the Auditor of Tayabas; then deputy district auditor of Laguna; then provincial district auditor; then assistant manager in the department of Provincial and Municipal Audits. He took up higher accounting with the La Salle Extension, University of Chicago, and completed this course in 1923. Having successfully passed the required examination he was granted permission to practice as a C.P.A. In 1926 he received the degree of LL.B. from the Philippine Law School. Agregado was the treasurer of the Philippine Participation in the Golden Gate Exposition. In 1936 he was appointed Deputy Auditor General; in 1941 acting Auditor General; then Auditor General and as such was given the rank and emoluments of a Vice-Minister.

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AGUILAR, Eusebio L. (Dr.)

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Present Position: Director of Health, Bureau of Health, 5 February 1942, appointed by Chairman of the Executive Commission; Member of the Board of Nutritional Research; Member of the newly created Council of Scientists and serving in the Department of Medical Sciences; Director of the Medical Section of the Civilian Protection Service against air raids.

Office held during Commonwealth Period: Director, Bureau of Health, Department of Health and Public Welfare; Acting Director of Public Welfare, Bureau of Public Welfare, Department of Public Instruction.

Remarks: Attended the Executive Committee meeting of the Greater East Asia conference on Medical Sciences held in Manila December, 1943.

AGUINALDO, Emilio

Age: 74

Birthplace: Kawit, Cavite

Education: B.A. from San Juan de Letran College

Present Position: Member of the Council of State, appointed by the President.

Positions since Japanese Occupation: Member of Provisional Council of State; Member of Cavite Pacification Committee; Member of Preparatory Committee for Philippine Independence; Member of the Central Inaugural Committee, established by Administrative Order No. 47 to plan Ceremonies for inaugurating the New Republic.

Remarks: Aguinaldo is a native of Kawit, Cavite, born on March 30, 1869. He is a product of the San Juan de Letran College from which he graduated with the degree of Bachelor of Arts in 1893. Returning to Cavite after his graduation, he was appointed Capitan Municipal of the town of Cavite Viejo, which position he held until the outbreak of the Revolution. Before the outbreak of hostilities, he had joined the Katipunan and had formed a group of recruits who had been trained to be ready at a moment's notice. So, when the first gun was fired in Balintawak to signalize the opening of the Revolution, Aguinaldo with the aid of these men took possession of the Friar's estate at Imus, fourteen miles south of Manila. Here they captured thirteen friars, and soon the whole province of Cavite was in the power of Aguinaldo and his fellow insurgents for several months. Because of his brilliant exploit in Cavite he became the logical leader of the Katipunan upon the death of Andres Bonifacio. Emilio Aguinaldo personally conducted the affairs of the Katipunan until after the Revolution. In August, 1897, the Spanish Governor-General Primo de Rivera sent Pedro Paterno to make peace with Aguinaldo. The peace commissioner and the insurgent leader met. An agreement was made in which it was settled that Aguinaldo and his leading officers would leave the Philippines on condition that Governor Rivera pay him (Aguinaldo) a stipulated sum. Accordingly, Aguinaldo with thirty other revolutionary leaders including eight of his generals, sailed from Sual, a port in Pangasinan, for Hong-Kong. But scarcely were they a few miles away from Manila Bay when the Spaniards renewed their attacks against the Filipinos. On March 25, 1897, seventy Visayan sailors were killed in Manila by Spanish soldiers, while thousands of innocent natives were either imprisoned or executed. These acts showed that the Spanish Government did not intend to keep its promises as laid down in the pact. The Filipinos naturally believed that they had been tricked. Therefore, they renewed the insurrection. Aguinaldo and the other leaders who went with him to Hong-Kong returned at once to the Philippines. Meanwhile, war had been declared between Spain and the United States, and before the American soldiers had crossed the Pacific to take Manila, Aguinaldo had already proclaimed himself Dictator. His forces



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fought many successful battles with the Spaniards. ~~RESTRICTED~~
Manila was closely surrounded by the insurgents. Many provinces fell into their power. The government of Aguinaldo made laws and collected taxes in these provinces. In June, 1898, Aguinaldo called a congress at Cavite to form a government. Aguinaldo was unanimously chosen President of the Philippine Republic, which position he held until its downfall through the advent of the American regime in the Islands. Thus had ended the career of Emilio Aguinaldo as a revolutionary leader and as first President of the Philippine Republic. Immediately after all hostilities had been wiped out, he retired to his farm in Cavite. His one major public activity during the American regime was when he ran for President of the Philippine Commonwealth, but was defeated by Manuel L. Quezon in the elections. With the setting up of the so-called new regime, and in spite of his advanced age, he resumed participation in public affairs. He is President and Founder of the Association of the Veterans of the Revolution of the Philippines.

While an assistant professor in his college, he studied law in the same university. He graduated in 1916 and was admitted to the bar. In 1920 he was appointed professorial lecturer in economics. Benitez was formerly editor of the Philippines Herald and dean of the College of Liberal Arts before becoming dean of the School of Business Administration. She was the first Filipino Home Economics teacher in Normal School and was associated as teacher and assistant dean of Normal Hall Dormitory for nine years; President of the Asociacion de Damas Filipinas for 6 years; Member of Board of Directors of the Gota de Leche; a director of Anti-Tuberculosis Society and Associated Charities; Member of committee which represented the Philippine Islands in Institute of Pacific Relations held in Japan. She was one of the founders of the Philippine Women's College, chairman of its Board of Directors, then President for over twenty years.

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honors in the same year, he went to the United States to study in Yale University, where he got his Licentiate in Jurisprudence in 1919, and his Doctor of Civil Law degree in 1920. He was admitted to the bar in the District of Columbia and also admitted to practice before the Supreme Court of the United States. Upon his return to the Philippines in 1922, he entered the government service as Under-Secretary of Interior and in 1923 as Secretary of Interior. However, his career was marred by the cabinet crisis during the Wood regime. Becoming interested in politics, he resigned from his post and ran for Senator of the Fifth District. In the Senate, he made a brilliant record, and served in the capacity of majority floor-leader from 1928 to 1931. Meanwhile he was a professorial lecturer in the University of the Philippines; a professor in the Philippine Law School; and Chancellor of the National Teachers College. At the same time the intervals were filled with busy authorship. Among his books are: Cases on Municipal Corporation, and Local Government and Administration in the Philippines. After the expiration of his legislative term as senator, he entered the private practice of the law and soon thereafter was appointed an Associate Justice of the Supreme Court. Laurel was a member of the Constitutional Convention which drafted the Constitution of the Philippines. In 1936 the University of Santo Tomas conferred upon him the degree of Doctor of Philosophy. In 1938 he received the degree of LL.D. from the Tokyo Imperial University. In 1943 while he was visiting in Japan he was honored by the Japanese by being awarded the First Order of Merit with Grand Cordon of the Rising Sun.

Remarks: Osias was born in Balaoan, La Union, on March 23, 1889. He took his early education in the public schools of his home town, and finished the secondary course at the La Union High School. In 1905 he passed the scholarship tests and was sent to the United States to study at the Western Illinois Teachers College. He won first place in an interstate oratorical contest held at Illinois in his senior year. Soon after his graduation, he enrolled in the University of Chicago, where he stayed for two sessions, and later entered Columbia University, from which he obtained his degree of Bachelor of Science in Education in 1910. After taking post-graduate course in the Teachers College of New York City, where he specialized in educational administration and supervision, he returned to the Islands by way of Europe. His first assignment upon reaching Manila was that of instructor in the provincial high school of La Union. In 1911, he was made supervising teacher of Bacnotan, San Juan and San Fernando, La Union; and four years thereafter, was made academic supervisor of the City of Manila. This later position he held until 1915, when he was appointed division superintendent of schools in Bataan. Later he was transferred to Mindoro, where he stayed for a year and was then promoted to assistant chief of the Academic Division of the Bureau of Education. In 1917 he was sent to Tayabas as division superintendent of schools, and shortly afterwards, was made assistant Director of Education, which position he held from 1917 to 1921. He was made a member of the First Philippine Independence Mission to the United States. In 1919 he was made professorial lecturer in the College of Education, University of the Philippines. This position he held until 1921, when he finally resigned from the government service to assume the presidency of the National University. Becoming interested in politics, Mr. Osias was elected Senator from the Second district in 1925, and at the end of his term, was unanimously chosen by the legislature to be one of the Philippine Resident Commissioners to Washington. As such he was instrumental for the enactment of the Hare-Hawes-Cutting Independence Law. Returning to the Islands in 1934, he ran for senator from the Second District, but was defeated. In 1935, however, he was elected delegate to the Constitutional Convention, and in the same year was chosen Assemblyman of his district to the First National Assembly under the Commonwealth. In 1941 he was again elected senator. Osias is also known as a writer. He was the author of a series of eight Philippine Readers formerly used as textbooks in the public schools.

Remarks: Rodriguez was born on March 21, 1883, in Montalban, Rizal. He took his primary schooling in his home town and later obtained his B.A. degree from the Colegio de San Juan de Letran. He has been a saloon keeper, contractor and then farmer. In 1929 he organized, with some business men, the Luzon Surety Company of which company he became manager. He has been President of Philippine Chamber of Commerce. He was one of the Founders and Director of the Luzon Investment Company and the National Life Insurance Company. In 1909 he entered politics and was elected municipal president of Montalban for eight years. When his term expired in 1916, he ran for governor of Rizal, was elected and twice re-elected to this office. In July 1923 he was named Mayor of Manila. In 1924 he was appointed Representative from Nueva Vizcaya. During the campaign of 1925 he resigned and ran for representative of the second district of Rizal, was elected and re-elected in the following election, holding the position when he was appointed to the cabinet as Secretary of Agriculture and Commerce.

In 1919 he was elected Provincial Governor of Capiz. He was the presiding officer at the Governors convention in Manila in 1920. In 1922 he was elected to the House of Representatives and became its speaker. He was elected to the House five successive times and every time he was elected speaker. He headed legislative missions to the U.S., and worked for the passage of the Hare-Hawes-Cutting Law which was later enacted in the form of the Tydings-McDuffie Law which established the Commonwealth of the Philippines. He led in the framing of the

Philippine Constitution and was one of the foremost members of the National Assembly. He was Chairman of many councils and boards under the Commonwealth Government. Since his appointment as Chairman of the Economic Planning Board he has been elevated to the ministerial rank by President Laurel.

After the expiration of his first enlistment, he became a civil service clerk and remained in that capacity until 21 February 14, when he was appointed third lieutenant in the Constabulary. In the same year he was sent to the Constabulary Academy at Baguio. He graduated at the head of his class. His first assignment after leaving the Academy was that of field officer of the Constabulary. From that he rose through every commissioned grade in the Insular Police up to the rank of lieutenant colonel. In October, 1930 he was appointed Assistant District Commander for Southern Luzon, and previous to that he held the position as the first Filipino Provincial Commander and Deputy Governor of Lanao and Sulu from 1917 to 1924. After 20 years in the Constabulary he retired. Becoming interested in politics, he became councilor of Lingayen, and in 1922, was elected Governor of Pangasinan for two terms. Not long after his election, he was again appointed Secretary of Interior, which position he held until elevated to post of Judge of the Court of Appeals.

After passing the bar examinations he was appointed Fiscal for the Province of Marinduque, but declined the appointment. In 1906 he was appointed Judge of the Court of First Instance and was afterwards assigned to the Land Court, serving until 1909. He was then appointed member of the Philippine Commission, which position he held until 1913. He then conducted his private practice until 1925 when he was elected senator from the Fourth District which includes Manila. He was minority leader in the

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senate until 1931, when he retired from office. For several years he served as president of the Democrata Party. He was a member of the Philippine Legislative Mission to the U.S. in 1930-1931. In 1934 he was again elected to the senate and served until its dissolution through the advent of the Commonwealth.
