1. The attached map illustrates the meager number of stations in the TENTH M.D. with which direct communication can be established. This is due to the fact that FERTIG has either not allowed net stations to contact us directly or has not reported the disposition of cryptographic systems which have been shipped him.

2. Today we sent a service message requesting that a report be submitted at once informing us of the exact location of eight (8) systems of which we hold a copy. We further requested that Fertig tell us which stations near spot "A" and "D" should have systems delivered to them on the next shipment.

3. Refer to the attached map:

a. The green circles represent stations/which communication can be established. It is hoped that Fertig will inform us of the disposition of the other systems which he now holds.

b. The Red circles represent stations which I believe should have direct contact with the invading forces on "D" day.

4. Captain Elveve's five (5) ground observer posts are also being equipped to act as independent intelligence stations. This office will have copies of all systems held by the observer posts as well as the Net Control for the posts.

5. Please inform me if I have picked out the correct stations for possible direct contact. I have tried to choose existing stations whose location falls as nearly as possible in important areas as well as stations which will assume the function of reporting combat intelligence on "D" day.

6. It is suggested that consideration be given the possibility of selecting members from the 978TH SIGNAL MESSAGE CENTER for duty with the invading army. Due to the peculiarities of our systems, our knowledge of place names, and our experience working with the guerilla, I think it is only logical to put our experience to the best usage.

Inasmuch as the entire aircraft is assigned for A.I.B. purposes, it will not be necessary for Lt. Ferguson to apply for priority through G.H.Q. Regulating Service.
